Regulations for the Protection of Life and Property on Ships.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this fourth day of November, 1918.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section two hundred and thirty-two of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council make regulations, *inter alia*, for regulating matters relating to the protection of the life and property of passengers and others on board ships :

And whereas it is desirable to make the regulations hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said section, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations, and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The master of every British ship engaged in the coasting trade of New Zealand, when proceeding through that part of Cook Strait included within a straight line drawn from Cape Palliser to Cape Campbell, and a straight line drawn from Cape Egmont to Cape Farewell, or when proceeding through the waters within fifty miles of that portion of the northern coast of New Zealand commencing at Cape Brett on the east coast and extending round to Hokianga on the west coast, shall before entering and while passing through the above-mentioned areas have all boats swung outboard with boat-covers off and all gear in readiness for the immediate lowering of the same into the water.

2. When the master of any such ship finds it impracticable for that ship to proceed with the boats swung outboard as prescribed above, he shall report in writing to this effect to the Superintendent of Mercantile Marine, who shall make an inspection, and, if satisfied that the boats and all other life-saving appliances are ready to be put out and lowered with the utmost despatch, shall give a certificate in writing to that effect, whereupon the last preceding regulation shall not apply to that ship.

3. The master of any such ship who omits to observe or commits a breach of these regulations is liable to a fine not exceeding £50.

Regulations relating to Pearl-shell Fisheries in the Cook Islands.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section fifty-three of the Cook Islands Act, 1915, the Governor-General in Council is empowered to make all such regulations as he thinks necessary for the peace, order, or good government of the Cook Islands :

And whereas it is expedient to make regulations with respect to pearl-shell fisheries in the Cook Islands :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Cook Islands Act, 1915, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act ; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN these regulations—

“ Resident Commissioner ” means the Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga :

“ Fishing reserve ” means any reserve established or set aside for public pearl-shell fishing at the islands of Penrhyn or Manihiki, or hereafter set aside elsewhere within the Cook Islands for that purpose.

2. No pearl-shell of a diameter of less than 4½ inches shall be taken from any fishing reserve or purchased in or exported from any of the Cook Islands.

3. No person shall fish or dive for pearl-shell in any fishing reserve unless he is the holder of a license granted under these regulations.

4. Every such license shall expire on the 31st day of March in each year.

5. All licenses to use a diving-machine or to fish and dive for pearl-shell shall be in the respective forms in the Schedule hereto, and shall be issued by the Resident Agent.

6. Every application for a license shall be made in writing to the Resident Agent, who may refuse any application for a license for a diving-machine made by any person not of British birth.

7. At any fishing reserve diving-machines may be used for diving for pearl-shell for such period in each year and within such limits as may from time to time be appointed by the Island Council (with the approval of the Resident Agent) of the island within which such fishing reserve is situated.

8. The Island Council of any island in which a fishing reserve is situated with the approval of the Resident Agent may from time to time fix a close season for the whole or

any part of such reserve during which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish for pearl-shell in the said reserve, or in any part thereof so closed.

9. (1.) The following fees shall be payable to the Resident Agent on the issue of licenses under these regulations, and shall form part of the Public Revenues of the Cook Islands :—

(a.) Diving-machine license, per annum, £20.

(b.) Diving and fishing license for a Native other than a Native of the island in which the fishing reserve is situated, per annum, £1.

(c.) Diving and fishing license for a Native of the island in which the fishing reserve is situated, no fee.

(2.) The same fee shall be charged for a license for any portion of a year as for a whole year.

10. Every person who commits a breach of these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, in default of payment thereof, to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months.

11. Any of the powers conferred by these regulations upon an Island Council with the approval of a Resident Agent may be exercised by the Resident Commissioner.

MANGAORONGO ROAD BOARD.

TRAFFIC ON ROADS BY-LAW, 1918.

IN pursuance and exercise of powers vested in the Board by the Road Boards Act, 1908, and its amendments, and by the Public Works Act, 1908, and its amendments, and every other power it thereto enabling, the Mangaorongo Road Board makes and ordains this by-law.

1. This by-law may be cited or referred to as "The Traffic on Roads By-law, 1918," and shall come into force on the 7th day of November, 1918.

2. In this by-law, except where inconsistent with the context,—

"Clerk" means the Clerk of the Mangaorongo Road Board;

"Board" means the Mangaorongo Road Board;

"Road district" means the Mangaorongo Road District;

"Inspector of Vehicles" means the person for the time being appointed by the Board to inspect vehicles for the purposes of this by-law; and if there be no such person for the time being, then the expression shall mean the "Clerk";

"Motor" means any vehicle propelled by mechanical means;

"Horse vehicle" means any vehicle drawn or intended to be drawn by one or more horses;

"Owner" of any vehicle includes a bailee thereof entitled to the use and possession or profits of such vehicle;

"Heavy traffic" means heavy traffic as defined by section 139 of the Public Works Act, 1908.

A vehicle shall be deemed to ply for hire for the carriage of passengers or goods whenever on any road or public place the driver or person in charge of such vehicle engages, offers, or solicits to carry any passengers or any goods for a money payment to or from any place within the Road District of Mangaorongo.

3. No person, being the owner, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle, shall cause or permit the same to ply for hire for the carriage of passengers or goods in the road district, or any part thereof, unless such vehicle be licensed under this by-law and have thereon a number-plate as in this by-law provided.

4. The owner of any vehicle desiring to use the same to ply for hire for the carriage of passengers or goods within the road district, or any part thereof, may apply to the Clerk for a license for such vehicle. The application shall be in writing, and shall state:—

(a.) The description of the vehicle;

(b.) The number of horses or other means of traction to be employed;

(c.) The maximum number of passengers or the maximum weight of the load to be carried; and

(d.) The full name, occupation, and address of the owner.

On receipt of any such application the Clerk shall cause the vehicle therein mentioned to be inspected by the Inspector of Vehicles. If the Inspector be satisfied that the vehicle is a fit and proper one for carriage of passengers or goods, as the case may be, and that suitable accommodation is provided for the passengers or goods to be carried, the Clerk may issue a license for such vehicle on payment of the prescribed fee. The license shall be signed by the Clerk, and shall state the particulars referred to in clauses lettered (a), (b), (c), and (d) as enumerated in this section or paragraph. Every license shall be in force from the date of issue till the 31st day of December following; provided that, in the case

of cream-cartage contractors, licenses may be issued for twelve months from the date of issue.

5. The following fees shall be payable in respect of each license issued under section 4 hereof:—

Provided that the total amount of fees payable under this section by any one owner in any one year shall not exceed £7.

6. The owner of any vehicle licensed under section 4 of this by-law shall cause to be fixed to his vehicle a number-plate having thereon the initial letters of the Board's name (namely, M.R.B.), the number of the license, and the maximum weight of the load or maximum number of passengers to be carried; the letters and figures on such number-plate to measure each not less than 2 in. in height.

7. No person, being the owner, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle, shall permit or cause the same to be driven on any road under the care, control, or management of the Board unless the tires of the wheels of such vehicle are of the width mentioned in the following schedule:—

For the months of May, June, July, August, and September in any and every year,—

Width of Tires of Wheels.	Maximum Weight of Load carried to each Pair of Wheels.
2 inches ..	10 cwt.
2½ " ..	15 "
3 " ..	18 "
4 " ..	20 "

Provided that during the above months no load of more than 25 cwt. to each pair of wheels shall be drawn or propelled over any road under the care, control, or management of the Board.

Provided also that where the load exceeds 20 cwt. to each pair of wheels, the tires of the wheels shall be not less than 5 in. in width.

For the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April in any and every year,—

Width of Tires of Wheels.	Maximum Weight of Load permissible to each Pair of Wheels.
2 inches ..	15 cwt.
2½ " ..	20 "
3 " ..	25 "
4 " ..	30 "

Provided that the wheels of any vehicle carrying a load of more than 30 cwt. to each pair of wheels during the above months shall have tires not less than 5 in. in width.

8. It shall be lawful for the Inspector of Vehicles, or any other person authorized by the Board, to stop any vehicle upon any road under the care, control, or management of the Board, if, in the opinion of such Inspector or other person, the wheels of such vehicle are not of the width required by this by-law, and to detain such vehicle until the width of the wheels and the weight or measurement of the load can be ascertained, and to take all steps necessary to ascertain such width and weight; and any driver failing to stop his vehicle or to give such information as aforesaid (namely, as to the width of the tires of his vehicle and the weight carried in such vehicle) when required by any person so authorized by the Board shall be deemed to commit a breach of this by-law.

9. For the purpose of computing the weight of load of any vehicle under the provisions of sections 7 and 8 of this by-law the following quantities of the things or materials hereinafter mentioned shall be deemed to weigh one ton:—

- Sawn timber, 500 sup. ft.
- Firewood, 3/5ths of 1 cord.
- Bricks, 300.
- Boulders, gravel, stone, or sand, 1 cubic yard.
- Potatoes, 12 sacks.
- Oaten sheaf of chaff, 27 sacks.
- Coal, 1½ cubic yards.

10. No person shall drive or cause to be propelled upon any metalled road under the care, control, or management of the Board any vehicle having runners or sleds in contact with the metalled road.

11. No person shall erect or cause to be erected on the side of any road in the road district any platform, stage, or other erection for the purpose of holding any goods to be loaded on to any vehicles upon such road, unless such platform be duly

authorized by the Inspector of Vehicles or other person appointed by the Board. Any person erecting any such platform, stage, or erection as aforesaid, even with the aforesaid authority, shall be responsible for and shall indemnify the Board from and against any accident, injury, damage, loss, expenses, claim, or demand caused by or arising out of the erection of such platform, stage, or erection, or in any way connected therewith.

12. No person or persons shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, upon any road under the care, control, or management of the Board (or upon any part thereof) his or their milking-cows if such cows can be driven upon, over, or across the land owned or occupied by such person or persons; provided that any person, being the occupier of land within the road district, may apply to the Board for a permit to drive his milking-cows over any road or portion thereof, and in the case of every such application the following provision shall apply:—

If the Board is satisfied that because of standing crops on the land in question, or because of some other valid reason, the enforcement of this section of the by-law would cause undue hardship to any person, then the Board may issue a permit to the applicant to drive milking-cows upon the road in question. Such permit shall be signed by the Clerk, and shall state—

- (a.) The full name, occupation, and address of the applicant;
- (b.) The number of cows to be driven;
- (c.) The maximum number of times per week the said cows may be driven upon the said road;
- (d.) A description of and the approximate length of the road upon which the cows in question may be driven;
- (e.) The date on which the permit is issued and the date upon which the permit will expire.

13. Every person guilty of a breach of this by-law, or of any of the provisions thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each and every such breach.

The resolution to make this by-law was passed by way of special order at a special meeting of the Mangaorongo Road Board held on the 20th day of August, 1918, and was confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the Board held on the 17th day of September, 1918.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1918.

The changeable weather of September was typical of Spring, but, unfortunately, cold winds and sharp frosts were somewhat frequent, and in consequence the growth in vegetation was generally not as forward as is desired or expected at this time of the year.

Rainfall was below the average in all except the Wanganui and Otago Districts and in parts of Westland.

Unsettled and boisterous conditions were experienced between the 5th and 8th and the 16th and 19th, when intense westerly areas of low pressure held sway.

During the former period electrical disturbances were experienced in the northern districts, and on the 18th a severe thunderstorm, accompanied with heavy hail showers, occurred about Cook Strait.

Small depressions passed in the south on the 22nd, 25th, and 31st, and these were responsible for frequent showers.

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, EXTINCTION OF LIGHTS, AND
DISCONTINUANCE OR WITHDRAWAL OF AIDS TO NAVIGATION.

I. PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.

Manila Bay.

The south channel into Manila Bay is closed to traffic and is protected by mines; this channel extends from Caballo Island on the north to Restinga Point on the south.

The north channel between Corregidor Island and the shore of Bataan Province to the northward is closed to inward-

bound traffic from sunset to sunrise, except to certain vessels engaged in public service. Vessels are, however, permitted to leave Manila Bay by the north channel without restriction as to time.

Obedience to the above regulations will be enforced by vessels of the United States Navy and by the shore batteries.

Failure to comply with any of the above regulations may result in the destruction of the offending vessels.

Subic Bay.

Subic Bay is closed to traffic; any unauthorized vessel attempting to enter the port does so at her peril.

II. HONG KONG.

Cape Collinson light is extinguished.

Green Island light is normally extinguished, but will be exhibited when the local typhoon signals are hoisted, and will be shown until the signals are hauled down.

III. SWATAU.

The following regulations have been made by the local military authorities at Swatau with reference to the existence of mines in the approaches to that port, and are now in force:—

1. Vessels are forbidden to proceed by the channel northward of Sugar Loaf Lighthouse.
2. All vessels, including men-of-war, must enter and leave the port by the channel to the southward of Sugar Loaf Lighthouse.
3. All vessels, including men-of-war, when entering and leaving, must, when at a distance of 3 miles from Sugar Loaf Lighthouse, slow down to a speed not exceeding 6 knots.
4. Vessels leaving or approaching Sugar Loaf Lighthouse may not anchor within a distance of 4 miles outside and 2 miles inside thereof, nor throw overboard heavy articles, to do so being dangerous.
5. A guardboat will be stationed by the authorities, which in case of changes in the minefield will approach and guide incoming and outgoing steamers.
6. All incoming and outgoing men-of-war and armed steamers should give twenty-four hours' notice of their expected arrival or departure to the Swatau police.
7. If vessels, including men-of-war, disregard the above rules and thereby incur risks, the local authorities will not accept responsibility.
8. The time for leaving and entering the port is fixed for the hours between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

IV. RUSSIAN MARITIME PROVINCE.

All lights are liable to be extinguished and aids to navigation discontinued or withdrawn on the coasts of the Russian Maritime Province.

V. SANDWICH ISLANDS, HONOLULU.

All lights in Honolulu Harbour are extinguished, and the harbour is closed by night.

VI. SOCIETY ISLANDS, TAHITI.

Leading-lights for Papiete Pass are extinguished.

Note.—This notice is a revision of former notice.
