And whereas it is deemed expedient to remove the absolute prohibition of the importation of grapes from the United States of America and from the Dominion of Canada:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the absolute prohibition of the introduction into New Zealand of grapes from the countries aforesaid shall be deemed to be removed when such introduction takes place in accordance with the following regulations hereby made under the said Act. Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regula-tions; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

# REGULATIONS.

1. For the purposes of these regulations—
"Diameter" means the diameter measured 2 in. above

the union:
"Fruit-tree" means any variety of apple, pear, apricot,

"Fruit-tree" means any variety of apple, pear, apricot, peach, or nectarine:

"Nursery" means any land which is used for the raising or growing of any fruit-trees, if such fruit-trees or any of them are intended for sale for replanting:

"Sale" or "sell" includes barter, and also includes offering or attempting to sell or exposing for sale, or sending or delivering for sale, or causing or allowing to be sold, offered, or exposed for sale.

2. No fruit-tree shall be sold from any nursery until such fruit-tree has been graded in accordance with these regulations by or on behalf of the occupier of such nursery, and in the case of apple or pear trees no such sale shall be made unless it is solely in accordance with the grade assigned to such apple or pear trees as the result of such grading.

3. The following are the standards for the grading of apple or pear trees:—

or pear trees:—

(1.) A (or Commercial) Grade shall include every tree whose diameter is not less than 7/16ths of an inch nor more than 10/16ths of an inch.

B (or Nursery) Grade shall include every tree whose diameter is less than 7/16ths of an inch.

C (or Special) Grade shall include every tree whose diameter is more than 10/16ths of an inch.

diameter is more than 10/16ths of an inch.

(2.) Apple or pear trees of all grades shall be well rooted, and, if branched, shall be of fair shape, and shall have not less than three branches averaging 18 in. in length.

4. The following are the standards for the grading of

apricot, peach, or nectarine trees:—
(1.) Every graded tree shall have a diameter of not less than 8/16ths of an inch.

(2.) Every graded tree shall be well rooted and branched, and of fair shape.

5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations, a margin of error in grading shall be allowed; provided that in no consignment of fruit-trees forwarded from a nursery shall there be more than five per centum, by numbers, erroneously graded; and provided further that no error in diameter shall exceed 1/16th of an inch.

6. Any occupier of a nursery who sells or allows to be sold from such nursery—

(a.) Any fruit-tree that has not been graded by himself or on his behalf in accordance with these regulations;  $\mathbf{or}$ 

(b.) Any apple or pear tree not sold solely in accordance with the grade so assigned to it— commits a breach of these regulations.

Compulsory Installation of Wireless Telegraphy in British Seagoing Ships (of 1,600 Tons Gross or Upwards) not registered in New Zealand.

WHEREAS under (Imperial) Defence of the Realm Regulation No. 37 (b), and corresponding legislation passed by the various self-governing dominions and colonies of the British Empire, every British seagoing ship of 1,600 tons gross tonnage or upwards (whatever her country of registry) is required-

- (a.) To be provided with a wireless-telegraph installation;
- (b.) To maintain a wireless-telegraph service; and
- (c.) To be provided with two certified operators, together with suitable accommodation for the apparatus and operators;

unless total or partial exemption in regard to the requirements mentioned has been obtained from the proper authorities in the ship's country of registry:

Now, therefore, I, Percival Henry Hall-Thompson, Captain in His Majesty's Fleet, and a Naval Authority under the New Zealand War Regulations, do hereby notify to all owners and masters concerned the following orders now issued by me under the provisions of paragraph (3), subsection (1), of the New Zealand War Regulations dated 30th July, 1918:—

- (a.) The regulations in regard to the compulsory fitting of wireless-telegraph installations in ships which are registered in New Zealand are as set forth in paragraph (1) of the New Zealand War Regulations dated 30th July, 1918.
- (b.) In regard to a British ship (not registered in New Zealand) which is required by the legislation of its country of registry to be fitted with wireless telegraph apparatus on the general lines indicated at (a), no such ship shall, after the 15th day of December, 1918, put to sea from any port in New Zealand unless—
  - (1.) Provided with a wireless-telegraph installation, a wireless-telegraph service, and two certified opera-

tors, as described in paragraph (1) of the New Zealand War Regulations of 30th July, 1918, for a ship registered in New Zealand; or
(2.) Unless the written permission of the New Zealand Minister of Telegraphs has been obtained for whole or partial exemption in respect of the requirements referred to.

- (c.) All applications for exemptions desired should be made forthwith to the Minister of Telegraphs on the prescribed form, and should state whether any exemption has been already granted by the authorities in the ship's country of registry; if so, to what extent, and for what reason.
- (d.) If the provisions of the orders now issued are not complied with in respect of any vessel, the master and owners of the vessel shall severally be guilty of an offence against these orders, and shall be liable under the New Zealand War Regulations Act, 1914, accordingly.

### SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

THE LINE ISLANDS. — MALDEN ISLAND. — WRECKS. — CURRENTS.

On 22nd May, 1918, a barque of 1,144 tons register, making passage from San Francisco to Melbourne, was wrecked on Malden Island, one of the small "Line Islands" of the Pacific Creamer Island, one of the small "Line Islands" of the Pacific Ocean, situated in 4° 03′ S., 155° 01′ W. On 9th June, eighteen days later, a schooner was wrecked on this island at the identical spot where the barque was wrecked, the schooner actually striking between the sunken masts of the barque

barque.

This remarkable incident calls especial attention to the dangerous character of the currents and the great necessity for caution in navigating through this region.

The equatorial and counter-equitorial currents which here provail run in opposite directions, and are sometimes of great strength, a record of more than 4 knots an hour for great strongth, a record of more than 4 knots an hour for the southern division of the former having been recorded. It has been supposed, however, that the counter-equatorial current in its limits does not extend below the Equator. It is noteworthy that the lines of division between these currents are stated to be sometimes distinctly marked and the streams of the equatorial generally at their greatest strength when near these lines of division. The embarrass-ment to the navigator from currents of such a character is manifest and should lead to special measures for the safety of the vessel. of the vessel.

The following extract from the report of the master of the barque will be found interesting: "For five days previous to the accident the ship had set steadily to the eastward, so that I decided to pass to the eastward of the island and to sight it to verify our position to ensure a safe passage through the reefs to the southward. At noon on the 21st of May I found by observation that we had set 21 miles to the castward of our course, and that we had 146 miles to go to bring Malden abeam. The island is only visible at a distance of 15 miles from a ship's deck. I therefore set a course to pass 17 miles off, and I estimated that the current would add another 6 miles to that distance, and that at daylight pass 17 miles off, and I estimated that the current would add another 6 miles to that distance, and that at daylight we should sight it from the masthead, but the current after 6 p.m. must have set very strongly to the westward and southward, for the ship struck at 3.40 a.m., the log showing only 127 miles run from noon. When on the rect I found the current setting like a mill-race to the westward; this was unexpected, and was the direct cause of the loss of the ship."
