IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of prescribing the time and method of the election of the elective member of the Post and Telegraph Promotion Board constituted under the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context, "the Board" means the Promotion Board constituted under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918.

2. The elective member of the Board shall be elected by ballot to be taken on the second Wednesday in February, 1919, and on the same day in every third year thereafter. Such member shall hold office until his successor comes into office.

3. As soon as possible after the 1st day of January, 1919, and thereafter at the same period in every third year, there shall be prepared by the Secretary, Post and Telegraph Department, an alphabetical list of voters, comprising the officers of the Post and Telegraph Department. Such list shall be retained at the General Post Office, and may be inspected prior to the date of election by officers entitled to vote.

4. Only officers whose names are on such list shall be entitled to vote; provided that the validity of any election shall not be questioned on the ground that a name wrongly appears on such list or has been omitted therefrom.

5. The Returning Officer for the election shall be the Chief Inspector, Wellington, or the person for the time being performing the duties of such Chief Inspector. There shall be two Scrutineers—namely, the Assistant Postmaster, Wellington, and the Assistant Superintendent of the Telegraph Office, Wellington, or the person or persons performing the duties of either or both of those officers.

6. Candidates for election shall be nominated in writing by not less than three officers entitled to vote, and nominations must reach the Returning Officer at Wellington on or before the last Wednesday of January in each election year. The consent of the candidate to nomination must appear on the face of the nomination-paper and be signed by him.

7. Should there be only one nomination, the officer nominated shall be declared to be duly elected.

8. Should there be more than one nomination, a poll shall be taken on the second Wednesday in February.

9. After the date for receiving nominations is past, the Returning Officer shall cause ballot-papers, in the form or to the effect of the following, to be printed and supplied to all officers entitled to vote:—

Election for Member of Promotion Board under the Post and Telegraph Department Act, 1918.

Hunter, Charles Richard.
Jones, John.
Morgan, Edward.
Robinson, George.
Smith, William.

NOTES.—The voter may vote for *only one candidate*. The voter is to strike out, by drawing a line through the name with pen and ink or with pencil, the name of every candidate for whom he or she does not intend to vote.

The voter must take care not to leave uncanceled the names of more than one candidate; otherwise the vote will be invalid. The ballot-paper is to be folded up so that the contents cannot be seen, and is to be transmitted to the Returning Officer.

10. The ballot-paper shall contain a list of all the persons nominated (and of no other person), each person's name being inserted once only, and the list being arranged alphabetically in the order of the candidates' surnames. Each paper shall

have a number corresponding with that on the list of voters. Such number shall be written by the Returning Officer on the left-hand bottom corner of the paper, and shall be covered by the corner being folded and gummed down before the paper is sent to the voter.

11. All ballot-papers shall be transmitted by post to the Returning Officer at Wellington, in envelopes which will be provided for the purpose, and must reach him not later than 5 o'clock p.m. on the second day after the day of the election.

12. No officer shall in any case be compelled to record his vote, but the ballot-paper must be sent to the Returning Officer in any case in which a vote is not exercised.

13. Immediately after the last day fixed for the receipt at Wellington of ballot-papers, the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the Scrutineers, proceed to ascertain the total number of votes recorded for each candidate, and the Returning Officer shall cause the result to be published in the Post and Telegraph Department's Official Circular, and shall declare as duly elected the candidate who obtains the highest number of votes. The voting-papers shall, after being counted, be enclosed in a sealed packet and be retained by the Returning Officer. They shall not be opened unless a scrutiny be demanded, when such scrutiny shall be conducted by the Returning Officer and the two Scrutineers. The papers will remain in the Returning Officer's custody for two months, and will then be destroyed. If a scrutiny be demanded, application therefor must be made in writing to the Returning Officer within fourteen days after publication of the result aforesaid.

14. Whenever there is an equality of votes at the election and the addition of one vote will entitle any of the candidates to be elected, the Returning Officer shall himself record such additional vote.

15. If the elective member of the Board dies or, by notice in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Department, resigns his office, or ceases to be an officer of the Department, then and in any such case his seat shall become vacant, and a successor shall be elected, who shall hold office for the residue of the period during which his predecessor would have held the same if he had remained a member of the Board.

16. When a vacancy has occurred as aforesaid, the Secretary of the Department shall forthwith direct the Returning Officer to hold an election to elect a successor.

17. The Returning Officer shall, within seven days after receiving such direction, appoint a day for holding the election, and publish notice thereof in the Post and Telegraph Department's Official Circular. Such day of election shall not be earlier than twenty days nor later than thirty days after such notice has appeared.

18. The electoral roll to be used at an extraordinary election shall be the same list as is used at an ordinary election, but the latter shall be revised and corrected so as to include only those officers in the Department one month before the day on which the extraordinary election is to be held. Candidates must be nominated in the same manner as is required for an ordinary election, and nominations must be received by the Returning Officer not later than ten days before the day of election.

19. The election shall be carried out in the same manner as is provided for an ordinary election.

Arrivals and Departures in 1918.

Census and Statistics Office, Wellington, 20th January, 1919.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1918, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1918 was 11,906, and the departures during the year numbered 11,660, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 246.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 1,176 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 445 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 8,282 persons, and the departures thereto as 9,477 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 2,448 and 1,738 persons respectively.

Of the 11,906 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 1,379, or 11.58 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 11,660 departures the children numbered 1,154, or 9.90 per cent.

The arrivals and departures shown do not include members of the Expeditionary Forces.

GOVERNMENT STATISTICIAN'S Report on the Vital Statistics of the Four Metropolitan Areas and of the Nine Suburban Areas of the Dominion for the Month of November, 1918:—

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 597, as against 704 in October—a decrease of 107. The deaths in November were 1,803—an increase of 1,404 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 1,090, females 713. One hundred and twelve of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 6.21 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-two of these were under one year of age.

Notice making and levying Rates under the Hauraki Plains Amendment Act, 1911.

I, DAVID HENRY GUTHRIE, Minister of Lands, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Hauraki Plains Amendment Act, 1911, do hereby make and levy upon the unimproved value of all lands liable to be rated pursuant to that Act a rate on a graduated scale as specified in the Schedule hereto, according to the classification of the land.

Destruction of Mines around the New Zealand Coast.

THE following details relative to the destruction of mines around the New Zealand coast are promulgated for the information of all concerned:—

AWARDS FOR DESTRUCTION OF MINES AROUND THE NEW ZEALAND COAST.

1. ALL merchant vessels navigating New Zealand waters are to make every endeavour to destroy or sink mines when sighted.

This may be done by rifle fire at a distance of not less than 200 yards.

If a mine is thus discovered or sunk, a reward not exceeding £5, or in special cases £10, will be paid.

No compensation is payable for damage sustained in destroying or sinking mines.

2. Attention is drawn to the "Instructions for Inspection, Destruction, and Reporting of Mines" previously promulgated, a copy of which is given at the end of this memorandum.

3. Merchant vessels should not attempt to salve mines. If they cannot destroy or sink them in accordance with paragraph 1 above, they should report the position to the nearest Naval Authority by wireless telegraphy in plain language, or, if not fitted with wireless telegraphy, by visual signal or telegraph at the first opportunity.

Any other shipping sighted subsequently to the discovery of a mine should be warned of its position.

If the mine is moored, the position should be marked.

4. In the case of any vessel, at the request of a Naval Authority, exploding on the bottom a mine that can be verified as having been previously sunk in the position stated, but not exploded, a reward not exceeding £5 will be paid.

5. For reporting a drifting mine (if such report leads to the destruction of the mine) a reward not exceeding £5, or in special cases £10, will be paid.

The reward will not be paid unless every reasonable attempt to destroy the mine has been made.

6. For the first intimation of enemy moored mines proved to be accurate and valuable, and delivered at the earliest possible moment, a reward not exceeding £10 will be paid.

7. The reward for the first report of a mine washed up on shore, in cases where the mine is ultimately recovered or destroyed, will be £1.

8. No payment will be made for divergence from course or for loss of fishing.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR INSPECTION, DESTRUCTION, AND REPORTING OF MINES BY MERCHANT SHIPS IN NEW ZEALAND WATERS.

(Referred to at paragraph 2 above.)

A. Inspection.

It is desirable that mines and other suspicious objects met with at sea should be examined as closely as possible, and an accurate description noted.

A suspicious object must be approached with the utmost caution, and as accurate an examination as possible carried out whilst passing at close range.

Unless bad weather prevents, it is advisable to lower a boat in order to carry out a detailed examination without the risk incurred by attempting to manœuvre the ship into close proximity to the object.

Great care must, however, be exercised to prevent the boat from touching any part of the mine, since a blow, or even a slight jar, on one of the detonating horns is sufficient to explode the mine.

B. Destruction.

Mines on the surface should, wherever possible, be sunk by rifle fire at a range of not less than 200 yards.

It must be borne in mind that if a bullet should chance to strike one of the detonating horns the mine will explode, and serious damage may result to the ship should the mine be too close to her.

C. Reporting Mines.

The following particulars should be noted wherever possible:—

- (a.) Accurate position where supposed mine was seen.
- (b.) Date and hour.
- (c.) Distance at which seen.
- (d.) Shape.
- (e.) Appearance.
- (f.) Colour.
- (g.) Whether floating freely on surface or moored.
- (h.) Whether it had horns, and (if so) how many, and whether one of them was in a central position.
- (i.) If moored, and (if so) at what depth.
- (j.) Any other details which can throw light upon whether it is a mine or a harmless buoy.
- (k.) Whether it was sunk.
- (l.) Whether position marked by buoy.

The conditions under which rifles and special hard-cased bullets are supplied may be obtained on application to the New Zealand Defence Department's Ordnance Sections at Wellington, Auckland, Lyttelton, or Dunedin.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Railways Act, 1914, and the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Ohai Railway Board hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest and sinking fund and other charges on the loan of thirty thousand pounds (£30,000), authorized to be raised by the said Board, under the above-mentioned Acts, for the purposes of redeeming twenty-five thousand pounds (£25,000) worth of debentures hypothecated by the said Board to the National Bank of New Zealand, and of expending the sum of ten thousand pounds (£10,000) for the purpose of constructing such additional railways within and extending beyond the limits of the district of the said Board as may be authorized under the said Local Railways Act, the said Ohai Railway Board hereby makes and levies a differential special rate on all rateable property in the Ohai Railway District on the basis of the capital value classified A, B, and C respectively in the classification of the said lands made in pursuance of section 43 of the Local Railways Act, 1914, and duly certified on the 30th day of September, 1916—that is to say, on all lands in the said district classed A, a special rate of 2s. 9d. in the pound sterling; on all lands in the said district classed B, a special rate of 3½d. in the pound sterling; and on all land classed C in the said district, a special rate of 1½d. in the pound sterling. And such special differential rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and shall be payable on the first day of March in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six and one-half years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

I certify that the above resolution making a special rate was duly passed at a meeting of the Ohai Railway Board held on the 27th day of December, 1918.

MANGAORONGO ROAD BOARD.

RESOLUTION CARRIED AT SPECIAL MEETING OF MANGAORONGO ROAD BOARD, 15TH OCTOBER, 1918.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Mangaorongo Road Board hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the instalments in respect of principal and interest and also the other charges on a loan of £3,000 (three thousand pounds) authorized to be raised by the Mangaorongo Road Board, under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, for the purpose of metalling main roads—such metalling to start at the meeting of the roads at the corner of Section 29c 2A 3, Rangitoto-Tuhua, Block VI, Mangaorongo S.D., and thence to proceed in a south-easterly direction until the road divides at Section 2, Block VII, Mangaorongo S.D.; thence to continue in two direc-

tions, one continuing to the south to the nearest corner of Section 2, Block XI, Mangaorongo S.D., and in the other in a south-easterly direction to the south-east corner of Section 1, Block XII, Mangaorongo S.D.—the said Mangaorongo Road Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of 3d.
