Regulations as to deer "tags," per New Zealand Gazette No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Postmistress at Waikaremoana immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with the advice of number of deer shot. of number of deer shot.

8. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not less than

Special Licensing Poll to be taken on 10th April, 1919.—Notice to Returned Soldiers.

Chief Electoral Office,
Wellington, 20th February, 1919.

EVERY member of the Expeditionary Forces who has
already returned to New Zealand should make application for enrolment on the regular electoral roll of the district in which he resided before he left New Zealand. He has not lost his right to be so enrolled by reason of his absence

on military service. If on the day of the poll he expects to be resident out of that district, he can obtain an absent

be resident out of that district, he can obtain an absent voter's permit.

The rolls for the special licensing poll close finally on the 6th of March, and application for enrolment must be made on or before that date.

Returned soldiers who have already been discharged, or whose discharges will become final before the 10th of April, must observe that inasmuch as they have ceased, or will have ceased, to be members of the Expeditionary Forces they can only vote on the 10th of April as electors of a district, and cannot have their votes recorded under the special provisions permitted by the law for existing members of the Expeditionary Forces. The above applies to all returned soldiers who have already arrived, and to all returned soldiers who may arrive before the 3rd of March next.

Members of the Expeditionary Forces who arrive on or after the 3rd of March and before the 10th of April will not be finally discharged until the 11th of April, and will remain members of the Expeditionary Forces and be entitled to record their votes as such under the special regulations provided in

their votes as such under the special regulations provided in that behalf.

# BIRTHS AND DEATHS IN 1918.

Both birth and death rates for 1918 are abnormal, the former on account of the war, the latter owing to the unprecedented influenza epidemic of the last quarter of the year.

The number of births registered during 1918 (25,867) is the lowest recorded in any year since 1907, and the rate (23.45 per 1,000) is the lowest in the history of registration in New Zealand, the next lowest being that for 1899 (25.12 per 1,000).

On the other hand, the number of deaths registered in 1918 (16,364) is easily a record, being 5,768 or over 50 per cent. more than in 1916, which previously ranked highest. The rate (14.84 per 1,000), though greatly above the normal of recent years, was nevertheless exceeded on several occasions prior to 1875.
