A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Land Act, 1908, the lands enumerated in the first column of the Schedule hereto were temporarily reserved as endowments for primary education, upon the dates specified in the second column of the said Schedule:

SCHEDULE.

CHARGES, AFTER ORDINARY HOURS, FOR TELEGRAMS RELATING TO SICKNESS, DEATH, OR OTHER URGENT MATTERS.

37. TELEGRAMS relating to sickness or death or other urgent matters (but expressly excluding those relating to wagers or bets) may be accepted and transmitted from any to any telegraph office or telephone bureau at any time outside the ordinary hours of business on week-days or Sundays (provided the attention of the terminal office can be obtained) on prepayment of the following rates and fees :—

Where the Postmaster is resident on the premises—

Outside ordinary hours : Reopening fee, 1s. ; special delivery fee, 1s. ; tariff, ordinary.

On Sundays and holidays, outside the hours prescribed for telegraph business : Reopening fee, 1s. ; special delivery fee, 1s. ; tariff, Sunday or holiday, as the case may be.

Where the Postmaster is not resident on the premises—

Outside ordinary hours : Reopening fee, 2s. 6d. ; special delivery fee, 1s. ; tariff, ordinary.

On Sundays and holidays, outside the hours prescribed for telegraph business : Reopening fee, 2s. 6d. ; special delivery fee, 1s. ; tariff, Sunday or holiday, as the case may be.

When in attendance for Press, testing, or departmental business, other than telegraphic : Reopening fee, nil ; special delivery fee, 1s. ; tariff, ordinary.

The reopening fee is to be charged on one telegram alone if more telegrams than one are handed in together by the same person. The special-delivery fee includes the charge for reopening the receiving office—namely, the office which receives the message from the forwarding office, and for effecting delivery of the message within the free delivery.

If officers are required to remain in attendance pending the receipt of a reply, the person at whose request the office was reopened must pay for the whole time of such attendance as overtime at the rate fixed by the Department's regulations.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made on the nineteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE General Account required to be kept, under section 34 of the Act, of the receipts and expenditure of the General Fund for each calendar year shall show—

- (a.) The amount standing to the credit of that fund on the 31st day of December in the preceding year and included in the credit balance of the Board's cash account on that day.
- (b.) All sums received by the Board as part of the General Fund during the year.
- (c.) All sums which during the year have been credited to the General Fund and charged to any special fund as the cost of the administration of that special fund.
- (d.) All sums which during the year have been transferred from the General Fund to any special fund.
- (e.) All sums which during the year have been paid out of the General Fund, and the objects of such expenditure.
- (f.) The balance standing to the credit of the General Fund on the 31st day of December of that year and included in the credit balance of the Board's cash account on that day.

2. Every special account required to be kept, under section 34 of the Act, of the receipts and expenditure of a special fund for each calendar year shall show—

- (a.) The amount standing to the credit of that fund on the 31st day of December in the preceding year and included in the credit balance of the Board's cash account on that day.
- (b.) All sums received by the Board as part of that special fund during the year.
- (c.) All sums transferred from the General Fund to the special fund during the year.
- (d.) All sums which during the year have been charged against the special fund and credited to the General Fund as the cost of the administration of the special fund.
- (e.) All sums which during the year have been paid out of the special fund, and the objects of such expenditure.
- (f.) The balance standing to the credit of the special fund on the 31st day of December of that year and included in the credit balance of the Board's cash account on that day.

3. In addition to the foregoing accounts of the general and special funds the Board shall, in pursuance of section 38 of the Act, prepare in each calendar year a statement of its assets and liabilities as at the end of the preceding year, in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

4. In addition to the foregoing accounts of the general and special funds and of assets and liabilities, the Board shall in each calendar year, in pursuance of sections 38 and 39 of the Act, prepare an account of its income and expenditure for the preceding year, in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

5. When any money out of the Board Fund is used for the purpose of purchasing building or other material and it is not known or does not appear at the time of the purchase to what fund or funds the cost of such material is ultimately chargeable, then all moneys expended on such material shall be charged in the first instance to the General Fund, and

at such time or times as a proper allocation can be made the Board shall charge to each special fund the amount of the expenditure on such material properly chargeable thereto.

6. The forms used by the Board for all books, accounts, and documents required by the Minister of Education for the proper carrying into effect of the provisions of these regulations shall be such only as are approved by the Minister, and the Board's accounts and books shall at all convenient times be subject to inspection by an officer appointed by the Minister.

7. The accounts of each Board for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1919, and for each subsequent year shall be prepared in accordance with these regulations.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Rupert George Skilton, of Puramahoi, Nelson (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at the mouth of Onekaka River, Golden Bay, as shown on plans marked M.D. 5021, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the said wharf will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plans have, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is desirable that a license under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid should be granted and issued to the licensee for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto necessary for the erection and maintenance of the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the said wharf as shown on plans marked M.D. 5021.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the said wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

2. Licenses to kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wellington, and the Postmasters at Palmerston North, Bull's, Foxton, and Marton, on payment of a license fee of 20s., in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Acts and these regulations.

3. No licensee shall be allowed to take or kill more than one stag or buck of not less than six points, and one hind; and, further, the said Chief Postmaster and Postmasters shall not issue more than one license to take or kill deer to the same person.

4. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

Generally the issue of further permits should be restricted to the raising of funds to be expended by incorporated societies and those administering funds for the direct benefit of soldiers and dependants.

As this arrangement will tend to materially decrease the number of permits, the monthly returns of permits issued hitherto supplied to the War Funds Office by Mayors, Chairmen of local bodies, and other persons authorized may be discontinued. In the absence of a return it will be assumed that no permits whatever have been issued, but it is desirable in order to supervise collections that notification should be given in every case where permits are granted.

Where any doubt exists as to whether a particular permit should be issued, a collect telegram to the Department will receive prompt attention.

Export of Hides and Calf-skins.—Permits for Export.

Customs Department,
Wellington, 5th March, 1919.

WHEREAS by Order in Council of the 16th day of April, 1918, the export of hides and calf-skins to any destination is prohibited save with the consent of the Minister of Customs: And whereas it is expedient to publish, for the information of all whom it may concern, the conditions on which such consent will be given: Now, therefore, it is hereby publicly notified as follows:—

1. The notice dated 6th December, 1918, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 12th December, 1918, is hereby cancelled.

2. Applications for permits for the export of hides and calf-skins must be made in writing to the Collector of Customs at the intended port of shipment.

3. The Board of Trade will at the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin appoint representatives of the tanners of New Zealand, and no permit will be granted unless the applicant satisfies the Collector of Customs at the intended port of shipment, by the production of documentary evidence and in such other manner as the Collector may require, that the hides or calf-skins have been offered for sale to the tanners of New Zealand through such representatives at each of the said ports at prices not exceeding those specified in the First Schedule hereto (or such other prices as may from time to time be substituted therefor by the Minister of Customs on the recommendation of the Board of Trade), and have been refused in such circumstances as to show that the goods are not required for local purchase at those prices.

4. No permit will be granted for the export of hides or calf-skins by or on behalf of any tanner carrying on business in New Zealand or by or on behalf of any person who has purchased hides or calf-skins from any such tanner.

5. Every application for a permit shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

6. When the ultimate destination is not the United Kingdom or a British possession, such further conditions and restrictions as the Minister of Customs thinks fit will be imposed on the grant of permits.

powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Timaru Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 27th day of July, 1919, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Timaru Racecourse Reserve situated in the District of South Canterbury, and known as the Timaru Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The foregoing regulations of the Timaru Trotting Club were made and passed by the Timaru Trotting Club on the 17th day of February, 1919, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
