A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the City of Wellington and of the Borough of Onslow, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such city and borough, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, have prayed the Governor-General that such city and borough (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim that the said City of Wellington and the said Borough of Onslow are hereby constituted one united borough, and also that the said borough so constituted is a city by the name of the City of Wellington, and also that the boundaries of the said city so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

And I do also proclaim that the said borough shall be an undivided borough, and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council thereof shall be fifteen, exclusive of the Mayor.

And I do hereby appoint John Richard Palmer (the Town Clerk to the existing City of Wellington) to be the Town Clerk temporarily of the said united borough; and I do hereby appoint James Ames (the Returning Officer to the said existing city) to be the Returning Officer temporarily to the said united borough.

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

Amending Regulations as to Shipment and Landing of Petroleum.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this eleventh day of March, 1919.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the ninth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 163, of the twelfth day of the same month, regulations were made with respect to the landing, shipping, transhipping, and removal

of petroleum:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette No. 15, of the thirteenth day of the same month, additional regulations were

made amending the aforesaid regulations:

And whereas it is desirable to make new regulations in substitution for the regulations of the fourth day of February,

one thousand nine hundred and nineteen:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section thirty-three of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations amending the regulations of the ninth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen (hereinafter called "the said regulations"), which shall be read with and form part of such regulations, and shall be in substitution of the amending regulations of the fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and sintees. nineteen.

REGULATIONS.

On such vessel entering the port, and so long as the vessel remains in port with more than 2,000 gallons of petroleum on board the master shall, between sunrise and sunset, display at the masthead a red flag of not less size than 24 in. square, and shall, between sunset and sunrise, when his vessel is at anchor, display at the masthead a red light; and whilst the vessel is berthed at any wharf use a red light for his gangway lamp."

"(2.) On or before the arrival in port of any oversea vessel the master or owner shall inform the Harbourmaster of the quantity of petroleum on board, and of the manner in which it is stowed."

6. Clause 6 of the said regulations is amended by omitting

paragraph (a), and substituting the following, viz.:—

"(a.) The holds or spaces in which such petroleum is to
be stowed are separated from all other spaces in be stowed are separated from all other spaces in which cargo may not be stored (such as engine and boiler rooms, crews quarters, passengers quarters, and galley) by watertight or airtight bulkheads, or by other means approved in writing by a Surveyor of Ships.

"Where other cargo is carried in the same hold with petroleum, it shall be stowed in such manner as to avoid damaging the receptacles containing the netroleum."

Clause 6 is further amended by omitting paragraph (b).

11. Clause 11 of the said regulations is amended by adding thereto the following words—viz., "or other person appointed for the purpose."

11a. No person shall take a steam locomotive moving by its own power into the vicinity of a vessel loading or discharging petroleum, or down or up a wharf at which such a vessel is lying, whilst she is engaged in loading or discharging petroleum, unless each locomotive is fitted with effective spark-arresters.

spark-arresters.

11B. No person shall couple a wagon containing petroleum directly on to a locomotive, but shall put at least two wagons which do not contain petroleum between them.

12a. The Minister may, if he thinks fit, and upon such conditions (if any) as he thinks fit to impose, suspend the operation of any of these regulations, either generally or only so far as vessels of any specified class or size are concerned. cerned.

12B. On the annual survey of a ship the Surveyor of Ships shall, if required by the master or owner to do so, issue a certificate as to the vessel's fitness to carry petroleum. Such certificate shall be issued subject to the condition that it may be withdrawn at any time if the Minister or Surveyor

deems it necessary to do so.

Amending Regulations under the Land and Income Tax Act, 1916.

Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said hoppers and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such hoppers, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Har-bours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8.  (c.) Such other officers as may from time to time be appointed to the New Zealand Army Medical Depart-

PART II.—NEW ZEALAND ARMY MEDICAL CORPS. Establishment.

3. The New Zealand Army Medical Corps is hereby con-

stituted, and established as part of the Permanent Force.

4. The establishment of the New Zealand Army Medical Corps shall consist of such number of warrant officers, noncommissioned officers, and men as may from time to time be authorized by the Minister of Defence.

PART III.-GENERAL.

Administration and Control.

5. The New Zealand Army Medical Department and the New Zealand Army Medical Corps will be administered and controlled by the Director of Medical Services.

Qualifications for Enrolment.

6. Candidates for enrolment in the New Zealand Army Medical Corps must be between the ages of nineteen and forty-six years, and before acceptance will require to pass a medical examination. Preference of selection will be given to candidates who possess qualifications as chemists, nurses, operating-room attendants, or masseurs.

Pay and Allowances.

7. The pay and allowances for officers of the New Zealand Army Medical Department, and warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men of the New Zealand Army Medical Corps, will be as laid down in the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations.

Promotion.

8. Promotion to any rank below that of warrant officer in the New Zealand Army Medical Corps will be made by the Director of Medical Services from amongst those members of the corps who have passed the necessary examinations and are recommended by their commanding officers. Promotion to warrant rank will be subject to the approval of the Commandant.

Discharae.

9. Any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or man of the New Zealand Army Medical Corps who proves unsuitable may be discharged at any time, subject to the approval of the Director of Medical Services.

Sick-leave and Medical Attendance.

10. Sick-leave and medical attendance will be granted as laid down for the New Zealand Permanent Staff in the Financial Instructions and Allowance Regulations.

Records.

11. The Director of Medical Services will be responsible for the safe custody of all documents relating to the attestation and service of members of the New Zealand Army Medical

Corps.

12. All attestations, promotions, appointments, reversions, and discharges will be notified in corps orders.

THE undernoted information received from the Netherlands Minister for Foreign Affairs, London, regarding the admission into and expulsion of foreigners from Holland, is published for general information:—

Pursuant to Article 2 of the law of 13th August, 1849 (Bulletin of Laws No. 39), governing the admission and expulsion of aliens, every alien desiring to be admitted to the Netherlands must be furnished with a passport from the competent authority of his own country, endorsed by a diplomatic or consular officer accredited by the Government of this country. of this country.

As the scarcity of provisions in the Kingdom obliges the Queen's Government to take measures to restrict the influx of aliens into the Netherlands, I have given instructions to of alens into the Netherlands, I have given instructions to diplomatic and consular officers to endorse no passports as from the 15th November last except after having obtained in each special case the authority of the Royal Passport Office, which will decide in my name. This authorization will not be accorded unless the necessity for the journey is demonstrated to the satisfaction of the above-mentioned The endorsement will mention the duration of stay (in this country), and also the date on which the applicant would pass the frontier. Seeing that the Royal Passport Office will require a certain time in which to examine each case submitted to it, it is advisable to recommend those desiring to obtain endorsement to ask for it some time before the date on which they require to make use of it.

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 620, as against 670 in January—a decrease of 50. The deaths in February were 282—a decrease of 123 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 149, females 133. Twenty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 10.28 per cent. of the whole number. Twenty-three of these were under one year of age.

 - (a.) Bookmakers.
 (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful
- visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
