W HEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, inter alia, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on

the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of purchase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor-General may by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly, and shall become Crown land:

For all journeys where an officer, non-commissioned officer, or man is not obliged to be absent from his headquarters for a full day of twenty-four hours, actual and reasonable expenses shall be paid up to an amount in no case exceeding the full daily rate above authorized for personal expenses on production of a statement giving the details of the nature of such charges. The maximum charge allowed for meals is 2s. 6d, in New Zealand.
- (b.) Officers up to and including the rank of Colonel or members of the New Zealand Army Nursing Service travelling by train may claim, in lieu of the ordinary travelling-allowance, an allowance of 17s. 6d. for the day of departure or return, provided they have incurred the cost of a sleeping-berth on the train, a receipt for which must be produced. Such allowance shall cover a period of twenty-four hours from the time of departure or return, or the whole period occupied in travelling if such period is less than twenty-four hours.
- 113. Where it is necessary for an officer to proceed direct to sea from his headquarters, an allowance of 5s. for the first night and 2s. 6d. for each subsequent whole day spent at sea shall be payable in lieu of the above rates. This allowance is only paid when travelling on duty singly, and cannot be drawn for voyages taken on transports, troopships, or ships carrying small bodies of troops.
- 114. Porterage includes the cost of the employment of a porter to handle luggage at a wharf, hotel, or railway-station, and must be paid for out of the daily allowance. The conveyance of personal luggage from or to a railway-station or wharf or other terminus, to or from the home of an officer travelling

on public service, or to or from the hotel or boardinghouse at which he is staying shall not be regarded as porterage, and may be allowed, provided that cab-hire is not charged for the same journey.

- 115. Vouchers for travelling-expenses must show full details of place, date, and time of arrival and departure, and state definitely nature of the duty on which the claimant was travelling. Receipts must be provided for all individual items of expenditure exceeding 5s. in amount. Motor-car hire will only be passed when it is the cheapest or only mode of conveyance and is authorized by the General Officer Commanding. In all cases the least expensive conveyance available must be employed, but if public transport is available it must be utilized.
- 116. 

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this third day of April, 1919.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL. W HEREAS by section twelve of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the creation, abolition, merger, union, division, or other alteration of any constituent or combined district shall not in itself have any operation so as to affect the then existing membership of the Board, and that the Governor-General may from time to time by Order in Council, whenever in his opinion it becomes necessary so to do, make such provision with respect to the representation of any part of any constituent or combined district as he thinks fit:

And whereas by the said Act the City of Wellington was And whereas by the said Act the City of Wellington was made a constituent district for the election of four members, and the Counties of Hutt and Makara, the Boroughs of Onslow, Karori, Miramar, Petone, Lower Hutt, and Eastbourne, and the Town Districts of Johnsonville and Upper Hutt were made a combined district for the election of two members of the Wellington Harbour Board:

And whereas by Proclamation of the Governor-General the City of Wellington and the Borough of Onslow have be-

come one united borough by the name of the City of Wellington, as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and it is necessary to make provision for the representation of the districts hereinbefore mentioned on the Wellington Harbour Board:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that four members of the Wellington Har-bour Board shall be elected by the electors of the City of Wellington as now constituted, and two members by the Makara, the Boroughs of Karori, Miramar, Petone, Lower Hutt, and Eastbourne, and the Town Districts of Johnson-ville and Upper Hutt, in lieu of four members by the electors of the City of Wellington as constituted prior to the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and two members by the electors of the combined district of the Counties of Hutt and Makara, the Boroughs of Onslow, Karori, Miramar, Petone, Lower Hutt, and Eastbourne, and the Town Districts of Johnsonville and Upper Hutt; and doth hereby select and appoint the Petone Borough Council to be the principal authority for the purpose of such elections. to be the principal authority for the purpose of such elections by the electors of the said combined district as hereby altered.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Waimate Plains Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 15th day of June, 1917, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Egmont Racecourse situated in the District of Hawera, and known as the Egmont Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the New Zealand Gazette.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act,

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

(a.) Bookmakers.
(b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and book-

makers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful

visible means of support.

visible means of support.

(c.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Caming Act, 1908 an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The foregoing regulations of the Waimate Plains Trotting Club were made and passed by the Waimate Plains Trotting Club on the 18th day of March, 1919, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
