Amending Regulations for the Military Forces of New Zealand.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend, in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations for the Military Forces of New Zealand made on the twenty-second day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen; and I do hereby declare that the amendments hereby made shall take effect as from the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

SECTION IV.

Reserve of Officers.

1. PARAGRAPH 122 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

"122. Officers on the Reserve of Officers will be called upon to perform such annual training as may from time to time be laid down by the General Officer Commanding. Should any officer neglect to carry out this annual training his name will be removed from the Reserve of Officers."

2. After paragraph 124 add the following:—

"124A. The commission of an officer on the Reserve of Officers who is fit for military service, but who neglects to serve when recalled for duty, shall be cancelled."

Retired List.

3. Paragraph 126 is amended by adding the following sentence at the end of the paragraph: "Service on the Reserve of Officers shall count as half time towards the fifteen years' commissioned service above mentioned."

Retirements.

4. After paragraph 132 add:—

"132A. An officer of the Territorial Force shall be liable to be summarily dismissed from the Defence Forces at any time for misconduct."

5. Paragraph 133 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

"133. An officer of the Territorial Force may be required to resign his commission if he is—

- (1.) Absent without leave for more than three months;
- (2.) Unsatisfactorily reported on in two successive years;
- (3.) Found to be medically unfit.

Any officer required to resign his commission on the ground of being unsatisfactorily reported on may, within one month of being so required, appeal, and such appeal will be forwarded for consideration by a Board of Officers nominated for that purpose by the General Officer Commanding. If after three months of being so required to resign, or in the case of appeal after three months from the promulgation of the decision of the Board of Officers, any officer so required to resign neglects or refuses to do so, his commission shall be cancelled under section 5(a) of the Defence Act, 1909."

SECTION VIII.

Annual Training in Camp.

6. Paragraph 259, as amended by *New Zealand Gazette* dated 18th June, 1914, is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

"259. Every officer and soldier of the Territorial Force will be required to carry out annual training in camp as prescribed in paragraph 247. Attendance at a hospital or other selected institution (for N.Z.M.C.), in defence-works, or at manœuvres may be counted as annual training in camp. Officers of the Unattached List will be called upon to perform such annual training as may from time to time be laid down by the General Officer Commanding. Should any officer fail to carry out this annual training his commission will be cancelled."

Approving the Women's Mutual Aid Society's Fund under the War Contributions Validation Act, 1914 (No. 2).

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section two of the War Contributions Validation Act, 1914 (No. 2), (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted as follows:—

Contributions, whether in money or kind, may be made by any local authority or body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate, other than private trustees under a settlement or will,—

- (a.) For the relief of distress occasioned by the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, whether such distress exists in New Zealand or elsewhere in the British Dominions, or in any country allied to His Majesty;
- (b.) For any patriotic objects approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor-General.

Provided that every such contribution is paid either—

- (i.) Into a public fund established by the Government, or by any local authority, for the purposes of such relief of distress, or patriotic objects; or
- (ii.) Into a fund established by persons other than the Government or a local authority, where such fund and the conditions of control and expenditure thereof are approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor-General:

And whereas certain persons in the Provincial District of Auckland have formed themselves into an association known as the Women's Mutual Aid Society for the following purposes—namely, to raise funds for patriotic purposes, as follows:—

- (1.) For benefit of sick and wounded soldiers and their dependants;
- (2.) Assisting recruiting, including the providing of personal equipment, where necessary;
- (3.) Providing necessaries and comforts for men at the front and in hospitals;
- (4.) Providing contributions to hospital ships and institutions who are ministering to the needs of our soldiers and their dependants;
- (5.) Raising money for the entertainment of men going to and returning from the front:

And whereas the said Society has established a fund for the promotion of the objects hereinbefore expressed, and has submitted the said fund and the conditions of control and the expenditure thereof for approval, as required by the hereinbefore-quoted provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby approve for the purposes of the said Act—

- (1.) The fund hereinbefore referred to, established by the Women's Mutual Aid Society; and
- (2.) The conditions of control and expenditure of the said fund, as set out in the rules adopted by the said Society on the ninth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

nador. The signals are made at 11 h. 00 m. 00 s. and 21 h. 00 m. 00 s. standard time, corresponding to 14 h. 00 m. 00 s. and 0 h. 00 m. 00 s. G.M.T. respectively, as follows:—

Preparative Signals.

A series of the letter "X" of the Morse code from 10 h. 57 m. 00 s. and 20 h. 57 m. 00 s. followed by three *dashes* ending at 10 h. 58 m. 00 s. and 20 h. 58 m. 00 s.

First Series of Time-signals.

From 10 h. 58 m. 08 s. and 20 h. 58 m. 08 s., the letter "N" of the Morse code, repeated every 10 seconds, the *dot* being made at each even 10 seconds; followed by three *dashes* ending at 10 h. 59 m. 00 s. and 20 h. 59 m. 00 s.

Second Series of Time-signals.

From 10 h. 59 m. 06 s. and 20 h. 59 m. 06 s., the letter "G" of the Morse code, repeated every 10 seconds, the *dot* being made at each even 10 seconds; followed by three *dashes* ending at 11 h. 00 m. 00 s. and 21 h. 00 m. 00 s.

The *dashes* are of about one second and the *dots* of about a quarter of a second duration, each sign being separated from the one which immediately follows in the same group by an interval of about one second duration.

Remarks.—Should the signals fail they will be repeated half an hour later.

Note.—The note "W/T Time Signal" is to be substituted for "W.T." at Rio de Janeiro on the undermentioned chart.

URUGUAY.

RIO DE LA PLATA.—MONTE VIDEO APPROACH.—POSITION OF TELEGRAPH CABLE.

Position.—English Bank Light-vessel: Lat. 35° 6¼' S. long. 55° 54¼' W.

Details.—From a position close westward of the above light-vessel a telegraph cable runs in a north-westerly direction to a position in lat. 34° 58' 00" S., long. 56° 10' 45" W., thence in a more northerly direction towards the inner end of the East Breakwater.

Remarks.—The position of the telegraph cable is to be shown on the charts by a pecked line, and the following cautions are to be inserted:—

HIS Excellency the Governor-General has it in command from His Majesty the King to publish the following Letters Patent constituting the office of Governor-General of New Zealand, further Letters Patent amending the same, and Instructions relating to the execution of that office, and the Commission appointing the Governor-General.

NEW ZEALAND.

LETTERS PATENT PASSED UNDER THE GREAT SEAL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM, CONSTITUTING THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR-GENERAL AND COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF THE DOMINION OF NEW ZEALAND.

Letters Patent, dated 11th May, 1917.

George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

Recites Imperial Act 26 & 27 Vict., c. 23.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Twentieth-sixth and Twentieth-seventh years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to alter the Boundaries of New Zealand," the Colony of New Zealand was defined as comprising all Territories, Islands, and Countries lying between the one hundred and sixty-second degree of East Longitude and the one hundred and seventy-third degree of West Longitude and between the thirty-third and fifty-third parallels of South Latitude:

Recites Governor's Proclamation of 21st July, 1887.

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of July 1887, issued by the Governor of New Zealand under authority of Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, bearing date the eighteenth day of January 1887, the Islands situate in the South Pacific Ocean between the parallels of 29 degrees and 32 degrees South Latitude and the meridians of 177 degrees and 180 degrees West Longitude, known as the Kermadec Group, were, from and after the first day of August, 1887, annexed to and became part of the Colony of New Zealand:

Recites Governor's Proclamation of 10th June, 1901.

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of June 1901, issued by the Governor of New Zealand by authority of an Order by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in His Privy Council dated the thirteenth day of May 1901, made by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the Colonial Boundaries Act 1895, the Boundaries of the Colony of New Zealand were on and after the eleventh day of June 1901 extended so as to include the islands of the Cook Group, and all other the Islands and Territories which were then or might thereafter form part of Our Dominions situate within the following boundary line, viz.: A line commencing at a point at the intersection of the 23rd degree of South Latitude and the 156th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich, and proceeding due North to the point of intersection of the 8th degree of South Latitude and the 156th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich, thence due West to the point of intersection of the 8th degree of South Latitude and the 167th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich, thence due South to the point of intersection of the 17th degree of South Latitude and the 167th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich, thence due West to the point of intersection of the 17th degree of South Latitude and the 170th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich, thence due South to the point of intersection of the 23rd degree of South Latitude and the 170th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich, and thence due East to the point of intersection of the 23rd degree of South Latitude and the 156th degree of Longitude West of Greenwich:

Recites Royal Proclamation of 9th September, 1907.

And whereas by Royal Proclamation, bearing date the ninth day of September, 1907, His said Majesty did ordain, declare, and command that on and after the Twentieth-sixth day of September 1907 the Colony of New Zealand and the territory belonging thereto should be called and known by the title of the Dominion of New Zealand:

Recites Letters Patent of 18th November, 1907.

And whereas, by certain Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Eighteenth day of November

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1907, His said Majesty did constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Dominion of New Zealand (therein called the Dominion) and that appointments to the said Office when vacant should be made by Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet:

And whereas it has been represented to Us that it is expedient that the designation of the Officer administering the Government of Our Dominion of New Zealand should be changed from Governor and Commander-in-Chief to Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief and it has accordingly become necessary to make provision for the office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand:

Revokes Letters Patent of 18th November, 1907. Constitutes the Office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Dominion. Boundaries.

I. Now therefore We do by these presents revoke and determine the above-recited Letters Patent of the Eighteenth day of November 1907 but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder. And We do by these presents constitute, order, and declare that there shall be a Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand (herein-after called the Dominion), comprising the Territories, Islands, and Countries forming the Colony of New Zealand as defined in the above-recited Act, passed in the Session holden in the Twentieth-sixth and Twentieth-seventh Years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to alter the Boundaries of New Zealand," together with the further Islands and Territories included within the Boundaries of the Colony of New Zealand by the above-recited Proclamations of the Governor thereof, dated respectively the Twenty-first day of July, 1887, and the Tenth day of June 1901; and that appointments to the said office when vacant shall be made by Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

Governor-General's powers and authorities.

II. We do hereby authorize, empower, and command Our said Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief (herein-after called the Governor-General) to do and execute all things that belong to his said Office, according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent and of such Commission as may be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us, through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Dominion.

Publication of Governor-General's Commission. Oaths to be taken by Governor-General. Imperial Act 31 & 32 Vict., c. 72.

III. Every person appointed to fill the Office of Governor-General shall, with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his Office, cause the Commission appointing him to be Governor-General to be read and published at the seat of Government, in the presence of the Chief Justice, or some other Judge of the Supreme Court of the Dominion, and of the Members of the Executive Council thereof, which being done, he shall then and there take before them the Oath of Allegiance, in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Thirty-first and Thirty-second years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intitled an Act to amend the Law relating to Promissory Oaths; and likewise the usual Oath for the due execution of the Office of Governor-General and for the due and impartial administration of justice; which Oaths the said Chief Justice or Judge is hereby required to administer.

Public Seal.

IV. The Governor-General shall keep and use the Public Seal of the Dominion for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Public Seal.

Executive Council: Constitution of.

V. There shall be an Executive Council for the Dominion, and the said Council shall consist of such persons as were immediately before the coming into force of these Our Letters Patent Members of the Executive Council of New Zealand, or as may at any time be Members of the Executive Council of the Dominion in accordance with any Law enacted by the Legislature of the Dominion, and of such other persons as the Governor-General shall, from time to time, in Our name and on Our behalf, but subject to any Law as aforesaid, appoint under the Public Seal of the Dominion to be Members of the Executive Council of the Dominion.

Grant of lands.

VI. The Governor-General, in Our name and on Our behalf, may make and execute, under the said Public Seal, grants and dispositions of any lands which may be lawfully granted and disposed of by Us within the Dominion.

Appointment of Judges, Justices, &c.

VII. The Governor-General may constitute and appoint, in Our name and on Our behalf, all such Judges, Commissioners, Justices of the Peace, and other necessary Officers and Ministers of the Dominion as may be lawfully constituted or appointed by Us.

Grant of pardons. Remission of fines. Proviso. Banishment.

VIII. When any crime has been committed within the Dominion, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor-General may as he shall see occasion, in Our name and on Our behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders if more than one; and further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court, or before any Judge, or other Magistrate, within the Dominion, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence for such period as the Governor-General thinks fit; and further may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures, due or accrued to Us. Provided always that the Governor-General shall in no case, except where the offence has been of a political nature unaccompanied by any other grave crime, make it a condition of any pardon or remission of sentence that the offender shall absent himself or be removed from the Dominion.

Suspension or removal from office.

IX. The Governor-General may, so far as We Ourselves lawfully may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, remove from his office, or suspend from the exercise of the same, any person exercising any office or place within the Dominion under or by virtue of any Commission or Warrant granted, or which may be granted, by Us, in Our name, or under Our authority.

Summoning, proroguing, or dissolving any Legislative Body. Appointment of Members.

X. The Governor-General may exercise all powers lawfully belonging to Us in respect of the summoning, proroguing, or dissolving any Legislative Body, which now is or hereafter may be established within the Dominion, and in respect of the appointment of Members thereto.

Succession to the Government. Lieutenant-Governor. Administrator. Proviso. Lieutenant-Governor, &c., to take Oaths of office before administering the Government. Duties and authorities under Letters Patent.

XI. In the event of the death, incapacity, or removal of the Governor-General, or of his departure from the Dominion, Our Lieutenant Governor, or, if there be no such Officer in the Dominion, then such person or persons as We may appoint under Our Sign Manual and Signet, shall, during Our pleasure, administer the Government of the Dominion, first taking the Oaths herein-before directed to be taken by the Governor-General, and in the manner herein prescribed; which being done, We do hereby authorise, empower, and command Our Lieutenant Governor, and every other such Administrator as aforesaid, to do and execute during Our pleasure all things that belong to the Office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent, and according to Our Instructions as aforesaid, and the Laws of the Dominion.

Governor-General may appoint a Deputy during his temporary absence.

XII. In the event of the Governor-General having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government or from the Dominion, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Dominion, constitute and appoint Our Lieutenant Governor, or if there be no such Officer, then any other person to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor-General during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor-General by these Our Letters Patent, as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others. Provided, nevertheless, that, by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid, the power and authority of the Governor-General shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected, otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

Officers and others to obey and assist the Governor-General.

XIII. And We do hereby require and command all Our Officers and Ministers, Civil and Military, and all other the inhabitants of the Dominion, to be obedient, aiding, and assisting unto the Governor-General, or such person or persons as may from time to time, under the provisions of these Our Letters Patent, administer the Government of the Dominion.

Power reserved to His Majesty to revoke, alter, or amend the present Letters Patent.

XIV. And We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time

to revoke, alter, or amend these Our Letters Patent as to Us or them shall seem meet.

Publication of Letters Patent.

XV. And We do direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be read and proclaimed at such place or places within Our Dominion as the Officer administering the Government thereof shall think fit, and shall commence and come into operation on the day fixed by him by Proclamation.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent bearing date the Eleventh day of May 1917, We did constitute the Office of Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand:

And whereas by the Fifteenth Clause of the said Letters Patent provision was made for the publication and the coming into operation of the said Letters Patent:

And whereas We are minded to make other provision in lieu of the said Clause:

Now know ye that We do hereby declare Our Will and Pleasure and direct and ordain as follows:—

I. The aforesaid Fifteenth Clause of the aforesaid Letters Patent of the Eleventh day of May 1917 is hereby repealed and revoked, and the aforesaid Letters Patent shall be construed and take effect as if the following Clause had been inserted in lieu thereof:—

Publication. Commencement.

“XV. And We do direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be published within Our Dominion at such time and in such manner as the Officer administering the Government thereof shall think fit. They shall commence and come into operation as from the Twenty-eighth day of June 1917, and that date shall be and shall be deemed for all purposes to be the date of their commencement.”

Power reserved to His Majesty to revoke, alter, or amend the present Letters Patent.

II. And We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power and authority, from time to time, to revoke, alter, or amend these Our Letters Patent as to Us or them shall seem meet.

Publication of Letters Patent.

III. And we do direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be published within Our Dominion at such time and in such manner as the Officer administering the Government thereof shall think fit.

INSTRUCTIONS PASSED UNDER THE ROYAL SIGN MANUAL AND SIGNET TO THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AND COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF THE DOMINION OF NEW ZEALAND.

GEORGE R.I.

Dated 11th May, 1917.

Instructions to Our Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand, or in his absence to Our Lieutenant Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Dominion.

Preamble. Recites Letters Patent, constituting the Office of Governor-General.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent bearing even date herewith We have constituted, ordered, and declared that there shall be a Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief (therein and herein-after called the Governor-General) in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand (therein and herein-after called the Dominion):

And whereas We have thereby authorised and commanded the Governor-General to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet or by Our Order in Our Privy Council or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Dominion :

Now know you that We do by these Our Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet direct and enjoin and declare Our will and pleasure as follows :—

Interpretation.

I. In these Our Instructions, unless inconsistent with the context, the term "the Governor-General" shall include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Dominion, and the term "the Executive Council" shall mean the members of the Executive Council for the Dominion who are for the time being the responsible advisers of the Governor-General.

Oaths to be administered by Governor-General.

II. The Governor-General may, whenever he thinks fit, require any person in the public service to take the Oath of Allegiance, together with such other Oath or Oaths as may from time to time be prescribed by any Law in force in the Dominion. The Governor-General is to administer such Oaths or cause them to be administered by some Public Officer of the Dominion.

Governor-General to communicate Instructions to Executive Council.

III. The Governor-General shall forthwith communicate these Our Instructions to the Executive Council, and likewise all such others, from time to time, as he shall find convenient for Our service to impart to them.

Quorum, Executive Council.

IV. The Executive Council shall not proceed to the despatch of business unless two members at the least (exclusive of the Governor-General or of the member presiding) be present and assisting throughout the whole of the meetings at which any such business shall be despatched.

Governor-General to take advice of Executive Council.

V. In the execution of the powers and authorities vested in him, the Governor-General shall be guided by the advice of the Executive Council, but if in any case he shall see sufficient cause to dissent from the opinion of the said Council, he may act in the exercise of his said powers and authorities in opposition to the opinion of the Council, reporting the matter to Us without delay, with the reasons for his so acting.

In any such case it shall be competent to any Member of the said Council to require that there be recorded upon the Minutes of the Council the grounds of any advice or opinion that he may give upon the question.

Laws sent home to have marginal abstracts. Journals and Minutes of Parliament.

VI. The Governor-General is to take care that all laws assented to by him in Our name, or reserved for the signification of Our pleasure thereon, shall, when transmitted by him, be fairly abstracted in the margins, and be accompanied, in such cases as may seem to him necessary, with such explanatory observations as may be required to exhibit the reasons and occasions for proposing such laws; and he shall also transmit fair copies of the Journals and Minutes of the proceedings of the Parliament of the Dominion which he is to require from the clerks, or other proper officers in that behalf, of the said Parliament.

Regulation of power of pardon.

VII. The Governor-General shall not pardon or relieve any offender without first receiving in capital cases the advice of the Executive Council, and in other cases the advice of one, at least, of his Ministers; and in any case in which such pardon or relieve might directly affect the interests of Our Empire, or of any country or place beyond the jurisdiction of the Government of the Dominion, the Governor-General shall, before deciding as to either pardon or relieve, take those interests specially into his own personal consideration in conjunction with such advice as aforesaid.

Judges, &c., to be appointed during pleasure.

VIII. All Commissions granted by the Governor-General to any persons to be Judges, Justices of the Peace, or other officers, shall, unless otherwise provided by law, be granted during pleasure only.

Governor-General's absence. Temporary absence.

IX. The Governor-General shall not quit the Dominion without first having obtained leave from Us for so doing under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, except for the purpose of visiting the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, or the Governor of any neighbouring Colony or State for periods not exceeding one month at any one time, nor exceeding in the aggregate one month for every year's service in the Dominion.

Governor-General's absence and departure from the Dominion. Interpretation clause.

X. The temporary absence of the Governor-General for any period not exceeding one month shall not, if he have previously informed the Executive Council, in writing, of his intended absence, and if he have duly appointed a Deputy in accordance with Our said Letters Patent, nor shall any extension of such period sanctioned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State and not exceeding fourteen days, be deemed a departure from the Dominion within the meaning of Our said Letters Patent.

Revokes Instructions of 18th November, 1907.

XI. From and after the date of the coming into operation of Our above-recited Letters Patent of even date, the Instructions issued to the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand under the Sign Manual and Signet of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, bearing date the Eighteenth day of November 1907 shall, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, be revoked.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this Eleventh day of May 1917, in the Eighth year of Our Reign.

NEW ZEALAND.

COMMISSION PASSED UNDER THE ROYAL SIGN MANUAL AND SIGNET, APPOINTING THE RIGHT HONOURABLE THE EARL OF LIVERPOOL, G.C.M.G., M.V.O., TO BE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AND COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF THE DOMINION OF NEW ZEALAND.

GEORGE R.I.

Dated 12th May, 1917.

George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To Our Right Trusty and Right Well-beloved Cousin, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Greeting.

Appointment of the Right Hon. the Earl of Liverpool, G.C.M.G., M.V.O., to be Governor-General.

We do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

His duties and powers under Letters Patent.

II. And We do hereby authorise, empower, and command you to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Eleventh day of May 1917, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, according to such Orders and Instructions as you may have already received, or as you may hereafter receive from Us.

Commission of 9th September, 1912, superseded.

III. And we do hereby appoint that so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed Oaths and have entered upon the duties of your Office, this Our present Commission shall supersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the Ninth day of September 1912, appointing you to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Dominion of New Zealand.

Officers and others to take notice, &c.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in Our said Dominion, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this Twelfth day of May 1917, in the eighth year of Our Reign.

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 589, as against 620 in February—a decrease of 31. The deaths in March were 280—a decrease of 2 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 164, females 116. Forty-seven of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 16.79 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-eight of these were under one year of age.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
