Altering Boundaries of Cook and Waikohu Counties.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section three of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the principal Act is in force:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Cook County Council on the twenty-first day of March, one thousand nine

hundred and nineteen

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Waiknown County Council on the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of such counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule

And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in

accordance with the said resolutions:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, as amended by the Counties Amendment Act, 1915, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, now being part of the County of Cook, shall, as on and from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen. being part of the County of Cook, shall, as on and from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, be deemed to be added to and form part of the County of Waikohu; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Cook and Waikohu respectively shall, as on and from the aforesaid date, be those set forth under their respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Area excluded from Cook County and included in Waikohu County.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District, being Small Grazing run 30 in Blocks I and II, Hangaroa Survey District. Bounded towards the north-west generally, Survey District. western boundaries of the said Ngatapa Settlement to the Tahora Road; thence along the middle of that road to the Wharekopae Stream; thence by a line along the middle of that stream to the Wharekopae No. 1a, Lot 2; thence by the said Lot 2 and Hangaroa-Matawai B Nos. 4 and 1 Blocks to the Hangaroa River; thence by a line to and along the middle of that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Small Grazing-run No. 30; thence to and by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Kawaimango Stream: thence by the said Kawaimango the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Kawaimango Stream; thence by the said Kawaimango Stream and Tahora Blocks 2c No. 1 Section 3 to the north-eastern corner of Section 1, Block VIII, Tuahu Survey District; thence by the last-mentioned section to the Gisborne-Waikaremoana Road; thence by a line to and along the middle of that road to Bushy Knoil Road; thence by a line along the middle of the last-mentioned road to the northernmost corner of Section 2, Block IX, Hangaroa Survey District; and thence by Section 1, Block IX aforesaid, to its south-eastern corner; thence towards the southwest by Sections 3 and 4, Block IX aforesaid, and Tauwharetoi 4B and 3B Blocks to the southernmost corner of Tau-in line with the eastern boundary of Mangapoike 2A No. 2 Block; thence to and along the eastern boundary of that block to Lot 4 of Mangapoike 2A No. 3, along the northern boundary of that block, and the northern and eastern boundary of Lot 5 of the said Mangapoike 2A No. 3 to Mangapoike No. 2D Block; thence along the northern boundary of that block to a right line running from the confluence of the Hangaroa and Ruakituri Rivers to the sea at Paritu; thence by that right line to the sea; and thence towards the east by the sea to the north-eastern corner of the Pakarae No. 1 by the sea to the north-eastern corner of the Pakarae No. 1 Block, the said Pakarae No. 1 Block and its continuation westerly to the centre of Pakarae River, and by the centre westerly to the centre of Pakarae River, and by the centre of that river to a point in a line with the western boundary of Section 2 of Block XIII, Uawa Survey District; thence by the north-western boundary of the said Section 2 to the northern boundary of Waimata North No. 1 Block; thence by the northern boundaries of the said Waimata North No. 1 Block, Small Grazing-run No. 58, Waimata North No. 1a 2, and again by Small Grazing-run No. 58 and the continuation of its northern boundary westerly to the centre of the road at the southern boundary of Small Grazing-run No. 43: on the east generally by the centre of that road to No. 43; on the east generally by the centre of that road to its intersection with the eastern boundary of Small Grazing-run No. 43a; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of Small Grazing-run No. 43a aforesaid to the eastern boundary of Waikohu County, the point of commencement: excluding the Borough of Gisborne and the Mangapapa Town District District.

Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the written consent of the Minister obtained before the work is commenced, be bare. be bare.

Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare. Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all cases be bare.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure lines or high-pressure lines, the conductors of which are bare, shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires."

Bare low-pressure and bare high-pressure electric lines erected with the written consent of the Minister shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a suitable raised platform is used the electric lines need not be so disconnected.

Where telegraph lines intersect or are menaced by the licensee's bare electric lines the licensee shall bear the cost of licensee's bare electric lines the licensee shall bear the cost of insulating, protecting, and maintaining the insulation and protection of all telegraph lines, whether erected before or after the bare electric lines, and also the cost of all special work and the maintenance thereof which the Minister of Telegraphs deems it necessary to carry out in consequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare.

(c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it is considered necessary that such bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines insulated in the manner prescribed in the first part of this clause, the licensee

manner prescribed in the first part of this clause, the licensee shall insulate such bare electric lines when requested to do

shall insulate such bare electric lines when requested to all so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(d.) When, in the opinion of the Minister, it is necessary in the interests of the public safety that the use of bare electric lines should be discontinued, the licensee shall, upon receiving notice from the Minister, substitute therefor electric lines covered in the manner prescribed by the first part of this

(e.) Low-pressure wires, whether braided or bare, which at any portion of their length are carried on the same poles or supports as bare high-pressure lines or extra-high-pressure

lines shall be deemed to be "infected" throughout their entire length by such high-pressure or extra-high-pressure lines, and shall be subject to the regulations governing highpressure and extra-high-pressure lines respectively.

5. Notices re Extensions, etc.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Wellington.

6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed ls. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

7. WIRING CONSUMERS' PREMISES .- MONOPOLY FORBIDDEN.

The licensee shall not grant or agree to grant any company, firm, or person the sole right to supply or erect the electric wiring on any consumer's premises, nor shall any consumer be required to purchase from the licensee or his assigns any material or apparatus for installing the electric wiring on such premises, or to have the work carried out by the licensee or his assigns, as a condition precedent to a supply of electrical energy being given by the licensee to the consumer.

8. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance This hoense shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

9. REQUIREMENTS OF THE MANAWATU COUNTY COUNCIL AND RONGOTEA TOWN BOARD.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Manawatu County or the Rongotea Town District except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Manawatu County Council, or between the licensee and the Rongotea Town Board.

10. OPTION OF PURCHASE IN FAVOUR OF RONGOTEA TOWN BOARD.

If at any subsequent time it should be deemed essential by the Rongotea Town Board to control its own electric lighting supply, the licensee shall, on receipt of notice in writing to that effect from the Minister of Public Works, be required to transfer to the Rongotea Town Board this license, and such equipment owned by the licensee as shall be necessary. ment for same to be according to valuation.

OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

necessity):—
1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.

2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.

3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
