THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by section two hundred and seventy-two of the Public Works Act, 1908, as amended by section six of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1910, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize the Minister of Public

Works, within the Land District of Wellington, to erect, construct, provide, and use such works, appliances, and conveniences as may be necessary in connection with the utilization of water-power from the Mangahao and Tokomaru Rivers for the generation and storage of electrical energy, and with the transmission, use, supply, and sale of electrical energy when so generated; also to use electrical energy so generated in the construction, working, or maintenance of any public work, or for the smelting, reduction, manufacture, or development of ores, metals, or other substances; also to raise or lower the level of the said rivers, and impound or divert the waters thereof into the Mangaore Creek; also to construct tunnels under private land, or aqueducts and flumes over the same, erect poles thereon, and carry wires over or along any such land without being bound to acquire the same, and with right of way to and along all such works and erections; and also to supply and sell electrical energy, and recover moneys due for the same.

Altering Boundaries of Woodlands Drainage District, County of Piako.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this seventh day of May, 1919.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Piako, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the land comprised in the said area be included in the Woodlands Drainage District as constituted under the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of such drainage district in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the said Woodlands Drainage District by including in such district the area of land described in the said petition and in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such addition as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 84, of the twentieth day of the same month, James Prouse, Richard Prouse, Norman Saunders, Alexander Saunders, and James Percival Prouse, trading under the style or firm of "Prouse and Saunders" (hereinafter called "the licensees"), were granted a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at West Wanganui, in the County of Collingwood, as shown on plans marked

M.D. 2749 and 2764, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf, sheds, and tramway, as shown on the said plans, such license to be subject to the terms and conditions thereon expressed and for a period of fourteen years from the date thereof:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 63, of the twenty-sixth day of the same month, the licensees were granted a license under the said Act to occupy a further part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at West Wanganui, as shown in red on the said plan M.D. 2764, for the purposes of constructing an extension to the said wharf and a shed as shown on the said plan M.D. 2764, such license to be subject to the terms and conditions therein expressed, and for a period of fourteen years from the seventeenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and four:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 61, of the eleventh day of the same month, the licensees were granted a license under the said Act to occupy a portion of the foreshore of West Wanganui, as shown on plan marked M.D. 3065, for the purpose of constructing a tramway, in lieu of the foreshore for which a license was granted to the licensees for such purpose by the first hereinbefore-recited Order in Council:

And whereas, the said licenses having expired, the licensees have made application for a further license under the said Act to occupy those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark for which licenses were granted by the hereinbefore-recited Orders in Council, and for the purposes therein stated, for a period of fourteen years computed from the date of the said licenses, and it is advisable to grant the same subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf and shed, as extended, and the tramway are constructed, as shown on the said plans marked M.D. 2749, 2764, and 3065, for the purpose of maintaining the said structures thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the wharf, sheds, and tramway, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2749, 2764, and 3065.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £5 in advance, payable on the 17th day of October, dating from the 17th day of October, 1918, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf, sheds, and tramway without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf, sheds, and tramway in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit from the wharf and maintain at their own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, sheds, and tramway and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or sheds or tramway, requiring them, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 17th October, 1918, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees, or any of them, in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf, sheds, or tramway may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf, sheds, and tramway for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any Act for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council, without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

SCHEDULE.

CLAUSE I of the said regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the following words: "The number of managers shall be not less than five nor more than nineteen."

Subclause (3) of clause 6 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the following words: "For the purpose of this regulation a grant in money made towards the cost of such land or buildings may, if the Minister so decides, be deemed to be a grant of land or buildings, and the annual value thereof, reckoned as a terminating annuity for such period as the Minister may determine, be deemed to be the contribution of the grantor."

Regulations under the Education Act, 1914.—Compulsory Attendance at Continuation and Technical Classes.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this seventh day of May, 1919.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section one hundred and twenty-four of the Education Act, 1914, as amended by section thirty-seven of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations relating to the compulsory attendance of young persons at a technical school or at continuation classes or technical classes; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. EXCEPT as otherwise provided in section 124 of the Education Act, 1914, as amended by section 37 of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, or in these regulations,—

- (a.) All young persons who are resident within the school districts named in Part I of Schedule I hereto shall attend such continuation or technical classes as are provided for them for not less than four hours in each of thirty weeks between the days severally specified in Part I of Schedule I hereto for each school district in each year.
- (b.) All boys over fourteen years of age but not over seventeen years of age who are resident within the school districts named in Part II of Schedule I hereto shall attend such continuation or technical classes as are provided for them for not less than four hours in each of thirty weeks between the days severally specified in Part II of Schedule I hereto for each school district in each year.
- (c.) All young persons who are resident within the school districts named in Part III of Schedule I hereto shall attend such continuation or technical classes as are provided for them for not less than two hours in each of thirty weeks between the days severally specified in Part III of Schedule I hereto for each school district in each year:

Provided that a boy who is undergoing military training in accordance with the regulations for the time being in force under the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, shall not be required to devote more than six hours altogether in each week to military training and to attendance at classes under these regulations.

2. The preceding regulations shall not apply to any young person who—

- (a.) Is shown to the satisfaction of the controlling authority of the technical school or classes to be under full-time instruction in the public school, secondary school, technical high school, or other registered school; or
- (b.) Is shown to the satisfaction of the controlling authority to be under suitable and regular instruction elsewhere for a number of hours in each year, being not less than the number of hours during which he would otherwise be required to attend the continuation or technical classes; or
- (c.) Has gained an Intermediate Certificate or obtained a qualification that is recognized by the Minister of Education as equivalent thereto; or
- (d.) Holds a certificate of exemption under regulation 3 hereof.

3. (i.) The Director of the technical school or classes may issue a certificate exempting any young person from attendance, in whole or in part, if he is satisfied that the said person—

- (a.) Is unable to attend by reason of physical or mental infirmity; or
- (b.) Is medically unfit to attend; or
- (c.) Is unable to attend by reason of circumstances directly affecting the livelihood of the family of which he is a member.

(ii.) The name of every young person in respect of whom a certificate of exemption is issued, together with the reason for the issue of such certificate, shall be noted by the Director in the register referred to in regulation 6 hereof.

4. The course of instruction shall be determined by the Director of the technical school or classes as far as possible in accordance with the individual needs of the pupil, with due regard to the wishes of parents, guardians, or employers of the pupil, and to the crafts and industries practised in the district (including Agriculture, if so practised, and the domestic arts), and shall in all cases include instruction in English, including history and civics, and in personal hygiene and first aid, and where practicable, in the case of girls, instruction in home nursing. Attention must also be given to physical training where this is not otherwise provided for.

5. A young person shall be deemed to be in attendance at a class if he is present at the time prescribed in the Regulations for Manual and Technical Instruction for the marking of the attendance register, and remains present until the closing of the class.

6. (a.) The Director of the technical school or classes shall keep a special register of all young persons residing within the school district to whom these regulations apply, and shall report to the Education Board the names and addresses of young persons who fail to attend classes regularly in accordance with these regulations.

(b.) On receipt of such report the Education Board shall take such action as it may deem necessary in accordance with the provisions of the Education Act, 1914, and its amendments.

7. Every parent, guardian, and employer within any school district to which these regulations apply, having under his control or in his employment young persons to whom these regulations apply, shall forward the names and addresses of all such young persons to the Director of the technical school or classes on or before the 1st day of June, 1919, and not later than the first Monday in February in each succeeding year. Every employer in such school district shall also, within seven days of the date of employment, forward to the Director of the technical school or classes the name of every young person to whom these regulations apply who enters his employment during the (yearly) period of compulsory attendance at continuation or technical classes.

8. In any school district any parent or guardian, or the employer with the consent of parent or guardian, may agree with the Director of the technical school or classes for any young person to whom these regulations do not otherwise apply to become a compulsory student under these regulations, and the form of such agreement shall be that set out in Schedule II hereto.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

WAIMATE DISTRICT HUNT CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Waimate District Hunt Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as “the said club”), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Waimate Racecourse situated in the District of Waimate, and known as the Waimate Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
