ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-first day of May, 1919.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Waipa, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the land comprised in the said area be included in the Mangahoe Drainage District as constituted under the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of such drainage district in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the said Mangahoe Drainage District by including in such district the area of land described in the said petition and in the First Schedule hereto ; and doth hereby declare that the boundaries of the said drainage district, with such addition as herein provided for, shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE ADDED TO MANGAHOE DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west by the Waipa County from the westernmost corner of Section 1, Blocks VIII and XII, Puniu Survey District, to the Puhue-Hairini Road ; thence towards the north-east generally by that road, the northern and north-eastern boundaries of Puhue No. 2 No. 13 Block, by the north-eastern boundaries of Puhue No. 2 No. 11 Block, and the northern boundary of Maungatautari 4E No. 1 Block ; thence towards the east generally by the eastern boundary of Maungatautari 4E No. 1 Block to a public road intersecting 4E No. 1 aforesaid ; thence by that road to its intersection with the main Kihikihi-Waotu Road ; and towards the south by that road to the place of commencement.

*Amending the License authorizing the Dunedin City Council to erect Electric Lines in Part of the Provincial District of Otago.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this twelfth day of May, 1919.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations prescribing the conditions on which any license may be issued under the said section :

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, the Dunedin City Council was authorized to erect electric lines in part of the Provincial District of Otago subject to certain terms and conditions (hereinafter called the "said terms and conditions") :

And whereas application has been made by the Dunedin City Council to amend the said terms and conditions, and it is expedient to make such amendments accordingly :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of every other power in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion doth hereby amend the said terms and conditions as follows :—

AMENDMENTS.

1. Clause 2 : By inserting, after the word "volts" in the sixth line, the words and figures "or 11,500 volts."

2. By substituting the following clause in lieu of clause 4 :—

"4. NEUTRAL WIRES.

"The neutral point of one or more of the generators in service shall be earthed.

"The neutral point of each star connection of the 35,000 volt system shall be earthed at one point and one point only. The neutral of the primary distribution at 3,300 volts or 11,500 volts shall be earthed at least at one point and may be earthed at several points. The earth may be used for the neutral return for transformers not exceeding 20 kilowatts at 1,900 volts or 6,600 volts situated more than four miles from the Chief Post-office, Dunedin. The neutral point of each secondary distributing system shall be earthed at one point and one point only. The earth shall not be utilized as the return for any low-pressure circuits."

3. Clause 8 : By inserting, after the word "volts" in the 27th line, the words and figures "and 11,500 volts."

4. Clause 9 : By substituting in the 5th line the words "extra high pressure" for the words and figures "a pressure of 35,000 volts."

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities invested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following amendments in the regulations for educational bursaries made by Order in Council dated the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen ; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

AMENDMENTS IN REGULATIONS.

CLAUSE 1 thereof is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "of either sex" following "person," and by the sub-

stitution therefor of the words " who is a ' teacher,' as defined in section 2 of the Education Act, 1914, or undertakes to serve as a ' teacher' for three years, and."

Clause 7 thereof is hereby amended by the deletion of the words " on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector."

Clause 10 thereof is hereby deleted.

*Consenting to the Raising of Loans by certain Local Authorities.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six, subsection one, of the Appropriation Act, 1915, it is provided that, notwithstanding any Act to the contrary, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority or for any Harbour Board, during the present war with Germany, to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than by way of bank overdraft within the limit of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any other authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the loans set out in column " B " therein :

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue :

And whereas an application has been made by the trustees having control of the war fund known as the Kaponga Wounded Soldiers Fund to transfer the fund held by such trustees, entitled "The Kaponga Wounded Soldiers Fund," to the Taranaki Provincial War Relief Association (Incorporated):

And whereas the Governor-General in Council is satisfied that such fund can be administered by the Taranaki Provincial War Relief Association (Incorporated) for substantially the same purposes as those for which that fund was established:

And whereas it is considered desirable to consent to such transfer:

#### *General Harbour Regulations.*

#### LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this seventh day of May, 1919.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-three of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations, to be known as "General Harbour Regulations," for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section:

And whereas it is desirable to make the following General Harbour Regulations for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following General Harbour Regulations.



## GENERAL HARBOUR REGULATIONS.

1. ALL machinery, as distinguished from running-gear, used for loading or discharging cargo into or from ships, hulks, lighters, or storeships, or in handling cargo discharged from or loaded into ships, hulks, lighters, or storeships, whether such machinery is on the vessel or not, shall from time to time be inspected by an Inspector of Machinery. An Inspector may order any alterations or repairs to be made to any such machinery that he considers necessary, and the owner shall forthwith have such alterations or repairs carried out. An Inspector may prohibit the use of any such machinery until the alterations or repairs have been executed to his satisfaction, and an owner shall not use nor permit to be used the machinery during the time such prohibition is in force.
2. All running-gear and all subsidiary appliances, whether such gear and appliances are used on the ship or not, used for shipping or discharging cargo, including coal, on to or from ships shall from time to time be inspected by a Surveyor of Ships or other officer appointed for the purpose. Such Surveyor or other officer may prohibit the use of any gear or appliances which he considers unfit for use, or he may order any alterations or repairs that he thinks necessary to be made. The owner shall carry out the order of the Surveyor or other officer, but he may appeal against it to the Marine Department if he thinks fit to do so.
3. Every winch used on board a ship for working cargo or for lifting the vessel's anchors shall be inspected annually by a Surveyor of Ships when he is making the annual survey of the ship, and any repairs or alterations which the Surveyor may order shall be carried out forthwith by the owner.
4. When a ship is in a dock or on a slip the propeller shall not be turned until the foreman in charge of the men working on the ship has advised the engineer in charge of the ship's engines that the men working on planks or in the ship are clear of the propeller.
5. When the boilers on a ship are being cleaned the engineer in charge shall see that the stop-valve of the working boiler is locked during the whole of the time that the work is being carried out, and such engineer shall see that the temperature of the boilers does not exceed 100° F. while men are employed in them.
6. Deck cargo on lighters shall only be carried in such quantity and in such positions as may be permitted by a Surveyor of Ships.
7. Lighters and launches employed in the shipping and discharge of cargo on and from ships in roadsteads shall carry two approved lifebuoys and sufficient lifebelts to give one for each person employed or carried on such lighter or launch.
8. Every lighter and every steam or motor boat engaged in connection with working cargo on, to, or from ships in roadstead harbours shall carry at least six bluelights for signal purposes.
9. When coal is being discharged in baskets from a ship by means of a bull-rope on to a stage so that it may be put directly into carts or other vehicles, such stage shall not be less than 3 ft. 6 in. in width, and it shall be properly fixed and supported so that it may be firm and steady.
10. A T iron used for working a bull-rope when working cargo on a ship shall be securely bolted to the hatch-coaming, and the T of such iron shall be not less than 3 in. in diameter.
11. Proper and efficient bridles to the satisfaction of a Surveyor of Ships or other person appointed for the purpose of these regulations shall be securely attached to the ends of fore and aft beams, with lanyards provided so that such beams may be shipped and unshipped without danger to the men doing the work.
12. When thwartship hatch-beams are used bridles of sufficient length with shackles attached shall be kept available on board the ship and fit for use, and shall be used on such beams (when they are being shipped or unshipped) in such a manner as to make it unnecessary for men to leave the deck.
13. When fore and after hatch-beams are made of wood the ends shall be properly shod with iron.
14. No hook for attaching coal-baskets to slings shall be used until the design of it has been approved by the Marine Department; provided that this regulation shall not come into force until the expiration of six months from the date of these regulations.
15. Every person in New Zealand who manufactures rope for sale shall attach to each coil a certificate showing the breaking-strain of such rope.
16. When working cargo no person shall put a load of greater weight on any chain or rope than the weight given as a safe working-load in the tables issued by the Marine Department giving safe working-loads for chains and ropes of various sizes.
17. When cargo is shipped on or discharged from a ship or hulk during the night-time electric light shall be used for lighting purposes whenever it can be obtained, and sufficient lights in clusters or otherwise shall be provided to give a

good working-light. At ports where electric current on the wharves and quays is under the control of Harbour Boards, such Boards shall provide connecting plugs where necessary on wharves and quays to which movable clusters of lights can be attached.

18. When a vessel is in dock a gangway plank from the ship to the dock head shall be provided, and on one side of the plank there shall be a side rail or stanchions with ropes hove taut through them, the top rail or rope being not less than 3 ft. 3 in. high. Such gangway shall be securely fixed.

19. When men are working on stages outside a ship which is in dock or on a slip all latrines shall be kept locked, and all discharge-pipes shall be so closed that no discharge can be made from them.

20. When cargo is being shipped on or discharged from lighters sufficient space shall be left below for the convenience of the men engaged in the work, and if there is any dispute as to the space the matter shall be decided by a Surveyor of Ships or other officer appointed for the purpose of these regulations.

21. If any dispute shall arise as to the number of gangs of men that should work in a hold the matter shall be decided by a Surveyor of Ships or other officer appointed for the purpose of these regulations, and the men employed in the gangs shall work in accordance with his decision.

22. If complaint is made to a Surveyor of Ships or other officer appointed for the purpose of these regulations that a man is unfit to work cargo through being under the influence of liquor, or if a Surveyor or such other officer is of opinion that a man is unfit from such cause to work cargo, he may prohibit such man from working for such period as he considers necessary under the circumstances, and the other members of the gang shall continue to carry on work.

23. When coal is being worked in ship's bunkers such bunkers shall be lighted by electric light when electric current is available.

24. When coal is being discharged from ships or hulks by means of trams stout planks of uniform thickness and of a total width of 30 in. shall be provided by the master and securely fixed alongside the tramline, or as an alternative stout planks of uniform thickness and of a total width of 24 in., with stanchions and a lifeline on one side, shall be provided.

25. In the case of ships registered in New Zealand, and of hulks whether registered in New Zealand or not, all hatch landings on coamings or beams shall be not less than 2½ in. in width; provided that this regulation shall not come into force until the next annual overhaul in the case of each such ship, and until the expiration of six months from the date of these regulations in the case of hulks.

26. If any person engaged in working cargo in a hold of a ship complains to a Port Health Officer that the condition of such hold is insanitary, such officer shall examine the hold, or cause the same to be examined by a competent person. If in the opinion of the Port Health Officer the condition of the hold is insanitary, such officer shall, by notice in writing served on the master of the ship, require the master to take all steps necessary to remedy the conditions of the hold, and in particular to take such steps as may be specified in the notice, and the master shall forthwith comply with such notice. At ports where there is no Port Health Officer the Marine Department may appoint officers to whom complaints may be made, and such officers shall exercise the duties and have the powers of Port Health Officers for the purposes of this regulation.

27. If a Surveyor of Ships or other officer appointed for the purpose of these regulations considers it necessary for the safety of those working cargo below deck on a ship that "chipping" should not be carried on on the ship while cargo is being worked, he may instruct the master that it must be discontinued for such time as he thinks necessary, and the master shall see that such instructions are carried out forthwith.

28. When persons are working on the outside of a ship the master shall have a man kept on deck whose duty it shall be to prevent interference with ropes fastened to the deck, and to prevent anything from being thrown overboard which might injure the persons working on the side.

29. In cases where in loading and discharging cargo on or from a ship any obstruction prevents the person working the bull-rope from being clearly seen by the winchman, the master of the ship shall employ an additional man to communicate signals from the winchman to the bull-rope man.

30. If any person fails, refuses, or neglects to do anything required by these regulations, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interferes with the doing of anything enjoined or authorized to be done, or wilfully does anything prohibited by these regulations, every such person in any case so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £100.

*Regulations under the Education Act, 1914.—Engineering Bursaries.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this twelfth day of May, 1919.

Present :

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section one hundred and twenty-five of the Education Act, 1914, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the award of bursaries for the purpose of promoting the study of subjects comprised in Engineering courses of University standard; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## REGULATIONS.

1. An Engineering bursary tenable at any school of engineering and technical science belonging to or recognized by a University may, on the recommendation of the controlling authority of any technical school or college in New Zealand, and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed, be awarded to any person who—

- (a.) Has passed the Preliminary Examination in Engineering of the University of New Zealand, and has obtained at the examination not less than 45 per cent. of the maximum number of marks assigned in each of the subjects (a) Physical Science and (b) Drawing; and, further, has satisfactorily completed at a technical school in New Zealand an approved course in Engineering occupying not less than four continuous years and not less than four hundred hours in each year: or
- (b.) Has satisfactorily completed at a technical school in New Zealand
  - (i) an approved preparatory course in Engineering occupying not less than two continuous years and not less than four hundred hours in each year; and (ii) has, further, in succession thereto, satisfactorily completed an intermediate course in Engineering at recognized technical classes, occupying not less than three continuous years and not less than one hundred and fifty hours in each year; and (iii) has served as an apprentice or pupil in some branch of Engineering (civil, mechanical or electrical) for a period of not less than three years; and (iv) has passed such examinations or obtained such certificates as the Director of Education may approve.

2. Application for the award of a bursary under these regulations must be made on the form provided by the Education Department, and must be lodged, together with the necessary certificates, with the Secretary of the controlling authority on or before the 1st day of March in any year; and the Secretary shall thereupon transmit the applications, together with the recommendation of the controlling authority, to the Director of Education at Wellington, New Zealand.

3. Every such application shall be accompanied by evidence satisfactory to the Director as to the character and health of the applicant.

4. The holder of a bursary shall enter on such course at a school of engineering and technical science recognized by the University of New Zealand as may be approved by the Director.

5. There shall be paid to or on behalf of each holder of a bursary the amount of the fees payable by him in respect of the course so taken by him with the approval of the Director.

6. If the bursar is obliged to live away from his home in order to prosecute his studies, he shall, in addition to the fees as aforesaid, receive an allowance at the rate of £50 per annum; and a bursar who lives at home, but is obliged to travel more than four miles daily each way in order to attend the classes, shall be entitled to a refund of the actual cost of travelling not exceeding £10 in any year.

7. A bursary under these regulations shall not be tenable (i) with a New Zealand University Junior Scholarship, a New Zealand University National Scholarship, a New Zealand University Bursary, a New Zealand Educational Bursary, nor (ii) with any other scholarship, studentship, exhibition, or bursary, or combination thereof, of a greater value than £50 per annum.



8. A bursary shall become vacant by failure on the part of the holder to satisfy such conditions as the Director of Education may deem necessary. Generally, such conditions shall include the passing of the college examinations in subjects of the course on which he enters, and the attainment of success in connection with the examination for the degree or for the associate-ship, as the case may be.

9. The term of a bursary under these regulations shall in general be three years if the holder so long fulfils the prescribed conditions, but under special circumstances, on the recommendation of the Engineering faculty concerned, the bursary may be extended for a further term, provided that the whole period of the bursary so extended shall in no case exceed five years.

10. The bursary must be held continuously, except in the case of illness or special circumstances approved by the Director.

11. On receipt of an unfavourable report on the conduct, progress, or diligence of the holder of a bursary from the Engineering faculty concerned, the tenure of the bursary shall forthwith be determined; and the holder shall, if the Director so requires, refund the fees paid during the current year on his behalf.

12. Every applicant for a bursary under these regulations shall enter, by his parent or guardian, or some other person approved by the Director, into a bond the condition of which shall be that the applicant shall during the continuance of the bursary faithfully observe the conditions of these regulations, and that in default of such observance the applicant or other obligor, as the case may be, shall forthwith pay into the Public Account a sum equal to the total amount payable by way of refund under the last preceding regulation.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, it is, *inter alia*, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of a road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part thereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas by subsection two of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, and clause (b) of subsection one of section thirteen of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that such approval may be either absolute or subject to such conditions with respect to the building-line as the Governor-General by Order in Council thinks fit to impose, and may refer to one or both sides of the road or street :

And whereas the Devonport Borough Council, the local authority having control of the portion of street described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as the said portion of street, has passed the following resolution—viz., "That Buchanan Street and Rattray Street, abutting on the property of the late Mr. William Philcox, be exempted from the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen, subsection one, of the Public Works Act, 1908" :

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far as it refers to the eastern side of the said portion of street, subject to the condition herein-after mentioned :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution to the extent hereinbefore mentioned, subject to the condition that no building, or part of a building, shall be erected at any time on the eastern side of the said portion of street within a distance of thirty feet of the centre-line of the said portion of street.

2. Every person holding stocks of the articles mentioned in the preceding regulation, or of any of these articles, and every person having orders placed for supplies from abroad of these articles or of any of these articles, shall, on request, within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish particulars as to the quantities thereof at a date or dates to be specified by the Statistician, together with details as to his usual annual requirements and as to his average weekly sales.

3. In order to comply with the last preceding regulation every such person shall fill up and supply to the Statistician, or to any officer authorized by him in writing, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions accompanying that form, and shall sign the form, certifying to the correctness of the particulars entered therein.

*Closing a Public Road at Rarotonga, Cook Islands.*
