A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing registration districts known as the Morrinsville and Te Aroha districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two registration districts, the names whereof shall be the Morrinsville and Te Aroha districts, and the boundaries whereof shall be conterminous with the boundaries of the marriage districts bearing the same names, as are set forth in a Proclamation of even date herewith, made under the provisions of the Marriage Act, 1908.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the second day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

A PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Morrinsville and Te Aroha districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

MORRINSVILLE DISTRICT.

Morrinsville District.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north by the northern boundary of Piako County from the confiscation boundary-line to the western boundary of Block XII, Waitoa Survey District; thence towards the east generally by the said Block XII to the north-eastern boundary of Lot 12A of Section 24, Block XI, Waitoa Survey District; thence by the north-eastern, north-western, south-western, and south-eastern boundaries of Lot 12A aforesaid to the western boundary of Block XII, and by the said Block XII and Block XVI, Waitoa Survey District, and Block XII and Block XVI, Waitoa Survey District, and Block IV, Maungakawa Survey District, to the northern boundary of Pourewa Block, and by the northern boundary of that block to the Waitoa River; by that river to the eastern boundary of Kerihoni, Pakarau, Matakirae, Te Waikaukau, Kiwitahi, Te Konehu, and Tawahakapuoro Blocks to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned block; thence towards the south-east by Hinuwera No. 2 Block, Whitehall Settlement, and part of the south-eastern boundary of Maunganui Block to the confiscation boundary-line; and thence towards the south-west by the confiscation boundary-line to the place of commencement. line to the place of commencement.

TE AROHA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west by a right line from the confluence of the Piako and Waitoa Rivers running in the direction of the confluence of the Ohinemuri and Waihou Rivers to the Waihou River; thence towards the east generally by the Waihou River to the southern boundary of the Patuwhao Block; thence again towards the north-west by the said Patuwhao Block and its southern boundary produced to the Waitawheta River; thence towards the east generally by that river to its intersection by a right line drawn between Te Aroha Mountain and the mouth of the Waihi River; thence by that line to the Tauranga confiscation boundary-line; thence by the said confiscation boundary-line to the Wairere Stream; thence towards the south-east generally by the Wairere Stream to the Waihou River; thence towards the south-west generally by the Waihou River to the south-eastern corner of Section No. 12, Block X, Wairere Survey District; thence by the south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 12 and 14 to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Pourewa Block; thence by the northern boundary of the said Pourewa Block to the western boundary of Block IV, Maungakawa Survey District; thence towards the west by the western boundary of the said Block IV, and the western boundaries of Blocks XVI and XII, IV, and the western boundaries of Blocks XVI and XII, Waitoa Survey District, to the south-eastern boundary of Lot 12A of Section 24, Block XI; thence by the southeastern, south-western, north-western, and north-eastern boundaries of that lot to the western boundary of Block XII, Waitoa Survey District, and by that boundary to Block All, Waitoa Survey District, and by that boundary to the northern boundary of Piako County; thence towards the south by the said northern boundary to the Piako River; and thence again towards the west by the Piako River to the place of commencement.

Authorizing the Sale of Portion of the Inglewood Town Improve-ment Endowment, under the Inglewood Borough Endowment Disposal Act, 1915.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

(3.) The upset price of each lot shall be the value of the land plus the value of the improvements on the land, such values to be determined, prior to the sale, by arbitration in the manner prescribed by section nine of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1912.

(4.) Every purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately after such sale a deposit of one-fifth of the purchasemoney of the property purchased by him, and shall; within one calendar month after the date of such sale, complete his purchase, and pay in cash the full purchase money of the property purchased by him (less such deposit as aforesaid), subject to the provision of clause five hereof.

(5.) In the event of the person requesting any sale becoming the purchaser of the fee-simple of the piece of land being sold at his request, he shall pay to the Council, within one month from the date of such sale, the full purchase price in cash less the deposit payable by him as provided in clause four hereof, and also less the value of improvements on the said land.

(6.) In the event of a sale to a person other than the person requesting such sale, the Council shall immediately upon receipt of the full purchase-money from the purchaser of the property sold pay to the person requesting such sale the value of the improvements on the land.

(7.) The auctioneer's commission and all other charges (7.) The auctioneer's commission and all other charges incidental to a sale or to the offering of the property for sale shall in every case be borne and payable by the person requesting such offer for sale, excepting where such property when offered for sale as aforesaid at public auction is purchased by a person other than the person requesting such sale as aforesaid, in which case the auctioneer's commission and all other charges incidental to such sale (excepting the cost of valuation and advertising) shall be borne by the purchaser of such property, and be paid in cash on completion of the purchase of such property.

WHEREAS, there being no harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Colonel Henry Smart Elgar Hobday (hereinafter called "the licensee ") has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the fore-shore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, in the Heathcote Estuary, at the foot of Mount Pleasant Road, Sumner, in order to erect and maintain a jetty thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred and fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 5031, showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended

And whereas it is expected to that it means should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, on which the jetty is to be erected, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said jetty thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 los., and thereafter an annual sum of £1, payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said jetty, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty,

the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said jetty without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned jetty in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels, provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister. Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said jetty and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such jetty, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Har-bours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said jetty shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above highwater mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that

purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained. obtained.

Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the written consent of the Minister obtained before the work is commenced, be bare.

Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare. Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all cases be hare.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure lines or high-pressure lines, the conductors of which are bare, shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires."

Bare low-pressure and bare high-pressure electric lines erected with the written consent of the Minister shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a suitable raised platform is used the electric lines need not be so disconnected. need not be so disconnected.

6. WIRING CONSUMER'S PREMISES.—MONOPOLY FORBIDDEN.

The licensee shall not grant or agree to grant any company, firm, or person the sole right to supply or erect the electric wiring on any consumer's premises, nor shall any consumer be required to purchase from the licensee or his assigns any material or apparatus for installing the electric wiring on such premises, or to have the work carried out by the licensee or his assigns, as a condition precedent to a supply of electrical energy being given by the licensee to the consumer consumer.

7. Inspection of Works.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

8. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

9. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of elec-tricity between the generating-stations and any of the sub-stations to which this license applies.

10. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

11. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensec shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensec of any liability theretofore incurred under this licensec. this license.

12. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental of one peppercorn per annum if demanded.

13. Granting of other Water-rights.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said river, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said river. the said river.

If the licensee fails or neglects-

(a.) To use or maintain the said works, after completion, so as to secure the full benefit of the undertaking; or (b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein

imposed,then and in any such case the licensee shall be liable to a fine of £50 for every week or part of a week during which such default or neglect continues; or the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

15. SERVICE OF NOTICE.

Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, this license shall not be revoked, and no proceedings shall be taken for the recovery of a fine in respect of the breach thereof, unless and until notice in writing of the intention so thereof, unless and until notice in writing of the intention so to revoke the license or to take such proceedings has been served upon the licensee, or placed upon some principal or conspicuous part of the works, and default has been made by the licensee in repairing or remedying the breach or breaches specified in the said notice for the following periods:—

(a.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor-General can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.

(b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor-General is of such a nature as to require the revoca-tion of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice.

16. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

17. Surrender of License.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-

lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

18. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for poses "shall including hting purposes.

19. Area of Supply.

The area of supply comprises the Opunake Survey District (including the Town of Opunake), and that portion of the Oeo Survey District bounded on the north by the Opunake Survey District, on the west and south by the Tasman Sea, and on the east by the Oeo River, as indicated by a distinctive border coloured red on the plan marked P.W.D. 45414, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

20. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (c) and (e) of clause 2 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 3,300 volts between the terminal.

21. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

22. Notices re Extensions, etc.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices recommencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at New Plymouth.

23. REQUIREMENTS OF EGMONT COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Egmont County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Egmont County Council.

(d.) When, in the opinion of the Minister, it is necessary in the interests of the public safety that the use of bare electric lines should be discontinued, the licensee shall, upon receiving notice from the Minister, substitute therefor electric lines covered in the

manner prescribed by the first part of this clause.

(e.) Low-pressure wires, whether braided or bare, which at any portion of their length are carried on the same poles or supports as bare high-pressure lines or extra-high-pressure lines shall be deemed to be "in-fected" throughout their entire length by such highpressure or extra-high-pressure lines, and shall be subject to the regulations governing high-pressure and extra-high-pressure lines respectively.

(f.) In the event of any dispute as to whether or not telegraph lines are menaced by the electric lines the decision of the Minister of Telegraphs shall be

4. Wiring Consumers' Premises.—Monopoly forbidden.

The licensee shall not grant or agree to grant any company, firm, or person the sole right to supply or erect the electric wiring on any consumer's premises, nor shall any consumer be required to purchase from the licensee or his assigns any material or apparatus for installing the electric wiring on such premises, or to have the work carried out by the licensee or his assigns, as a condition precedent to a supply of electrical energy being given by the licensee to the consumer.

5. REQUIREMENTS OF ELTHAM COUNTY COUNCIL.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION,

CR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.

2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.

3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
