(a) The electric lines upon which programs are engaged.

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a suitable raised platform is used, the electric lines

need not be so disconnected.

b.) Where telegraph lines intersect or are menaced by the licensee's bare electric lines, the licensee shall bear the cost of insulating, protecting, and maintaining the insulation and protection of all telegraph lines, whether erected before or after the bare electric lines, and also the cost of all special work and the maintenance thereof which the Minister of Telegraphs deems necessary to carry out in con-Telegraphs deems necessary to carry out in con-sequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare.

(c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it is considered necessary that such bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines insulated in the manner prescribed in the first part of this clause, the licensee shall, at his own expense, insulate such bare electric lines when requested to do so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, North Canterbury.

I N exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red deer may be destroyed in the North Canterbury Acclimatization District

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations 1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, dated 13th February, 1919, the Secretary of the North Canterbury Acclimatization Society at Christchurch, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection. physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1919.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid the dates and name of person by whom and as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The said Secretary may, with the authority of the said society, authorize the sale, either by auction or otherwise, during the currency of these regulations of deer destroyed pursuant to these regulations, and of the meat and skins of such deer; provided that the proceeds derived from such sale shall be devoted to patriotic purposes.

4a. The said Secretary shall, on or before the 31st day of January, 1920, furnish a statement of the moneys received from such sale and of the patriotic purpose or purposes to

which they were devoted.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Most of the wireless time-signals at present transmitted are sent by means of an automatic arrangement operated by

the pendulum of a chronometer situated at some observatory. the pendulum of a chronometer situated at some observatory. In such cases absolute reliance may be placed upon the accuracy of the signal. There are, however, many stations in the world which are very suitably situated for transmitting time-signals to ships which could otherwise not receive them, where it would be difficult or impossible to establish an automatic system. In such cases "hand" signals may be provided; but in general these signals should not be trusted to be accurate within closer limits than about two seconds.

It is borned that all wireless time-signals will expertually be

to be accurate within closer limits than about two seconds. It is hoped that all wireless time-signals will eventually be standardized, so that there shall be only two kinds of signals transmitted, the automatic signals being all alike and quite distinctive from the hand signals. It is further expected that arrangements will be made for all time-signals to be transmitted at times so selected that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for wireless weather bulletins is being evolved.

ATLANTIC COAST.

 $Nets \ and \ Defensive \ Sea \ Areas.$

Vessels approaching a port of the United States may expect to find patrol vessels some distance off shore as well as close to the harbour entrance.

All incoming vessels must be identified before being per-

mitted to proceed.

mitted to proceed.

Upon approaching a port or defensive sea area where vessels are stationed the incoming vessel should obtain from the patrol a pilot or information that will enable said vessel to proceed. No vessel should proceed until identity has been established and permission has been given by the patrol.

Harbour entrance patrol vessels, in addition to the regular commission pennant, fly the jack forward during the day, and may show three lights—white, red, white—in a vertical hoist at night.

Directions from these boats must be obeyed, as they are in possession of the latest information regarding the nets,

possession of the latest information regarding the nets,

in possession of the latest information regarding the news, mines, and channels.

Speed limit in defensive sea areas is five knots.

Merchant vessels must show their national colours, and the International Code signal designating their names. They will receive pilots or instructions from the patrol vessels.

An incoming naval vessel must exchange recognition signals, and after having passed the outer limits of a defensive sea area shall proceed as directed. Should the shore defences make the demand signal, or other inquiry regarding the make the demand signal, or other inquiry regarding the identity of the vessel, the proper answer must be given.

No vessels are permitted to pass through defensive sea areas except those which have been given authority to do so.

Recognition signals need not be exchanged with vessels on

the inner side of defensive sea areas.

When demand is made by any fort, shore station, or patrol vessel a naval vessel approaching from seaward shall immediately answer the demand by making the prescribed recognition

When the identity of the vessel is already known to the fort, shore station, or patrol vessel the demand may be omitted. Coast-defence commanders will consider as hostile any vessels attempting to enter without making recognition signals when demanded.

I. BOSTON HARBOUR.

The following regulations have been published for the information and guidance of all persons having control of vessels, other than naval vessels, entering the defensive sea area of the Port of Boston.

The designated entrance to the defensive sea area of the Port of Boston is the Boston light-vessel. The outer limit of the defensive sea area of the Port of Boston is a line drawn

The defensive sea area of the Fort of Boston is a fine drawn from Strawberry Point to Spouting Horn.

Vessels desiring to enter the Port of Boston will, on approaching the designated entrance, fly their national colours together with their International Code number and speak the official pilot-boat stationed between the Graves light-and-whistle buoy and Boston light-vessel, and there obtain permission to cross the defensive sea area, which will be given in the nature of a password or pass letters. Vessels speaking the pilot-boat will slow down to such speed as will speaking the pilot-boat will slow down to such speed as will give ample time to answer routine inquiries from the pilot-boat. Vessels receiving permission to cross the defensive sea area will proceed to the vicinity of Finns Ledge buoy and speak the patrol-boat stationed at that point, giving the password or letters received from the pilot-boat, and receive instructions, if necessary, before passing in through the gate in the submarine net. In case the pilot-boat is not on her station, or if by reason of thick weather she cannot be seen by the approaching vessel, the latter may proceed to the patrol-boat stationed in the vicinity of Finns Ledge buoy. At that point the authority of the vessel to proceed, or to go outside and anchor, will be decided by the station patrol-boat. Vessels will answer hails from patrol-boats within the defensive sea area by giving the password or letters obtained from the pilot-boat and answering any routine questions that may be asked, slowing down if necessary.

No vessel will attempt to pass in through the gate in the

No vessel will attempt to pass in through the gate in the submarine net without first speaking the patrol-boat stationed in the vicinity of Finns Ledge buoy. After passing in through the gate in the submarine net all vessels will proceed to the station vessel on the inner limits of the defensive sea area—i.e., half a mile west of Deer Island light—and receive permission to proceed, or to anchor, and any other instructions

Vessels desiring to cross the defensive sea area outward bound will speak the station-boat at the inner limits—i.e., half-a-mile west from Deer Island light—and there obtain permission and the necessary password or letters and intermittions as may be necessary

structions as may be necessary.

Vessels crossing the defensive sea area without the password or letters may be required to return to the station-boat—i.e., inbound, the pilot-boat stationed between the Graves light-and-whistle buoy and Boston light-vessel; outward bound, to the station-boat half a mile west of Deer Island light.

Speed of vessels within the limits of the defensive sea area

limited to 5 knots.

Naval vessels will use such force as may be necessary to insure compliance with the above regulations.

II. NEW YORK AND APPROACHES.

Vessels bound to New York from Chesapeake Bay, after reaching the parallel of lat. 40° 14′ N., should keep to the eastward of a line drawn in a 0° (N. 10° E. mag.) direction through Ambrose light-vessel until Scotland light-vessel bears 293° (N. 57° W. mag.), when course may be shaped for the entrance.

The area to the southward and westward of the lines mentioned above is entirely prohibited to vessels from sunrise to sunset; at night this area is not restricted.

Net N 31 is across The Narrows in New York Bay at Fort Hamilton, where the U.S.S. "Amphitrite" is moored as station-ship. The gate is at the western end. All vessels must have a regular licensed pilot, except public vessels and such coastwise shipping as may be authorized by law not to take local pilots.

to take local pilots. Vessels must comply with the regulations for crossing defensive sea areas while in these waters. Vessels inward bound or outward bound approaching The Narrows must proceed at a moderate speed and keep close to the western side of the channel, passing to the westward of the light-buoy off Quarantine. They must be identified and receive instructions from the station-ship before proceeding. There is also a patrol vessel off White Stone at which vessels passing that point will be required to stop upon

HE DELAWARE RIVER.

Net A 41 closes the channel of the Delaware River at Fort Delaware.

Vessels desiring to pass in either direction must obtain permission from the patrol-boats, which will be stationed as follows :-

For incoming vessels, in the channel below Reedy Island.

For outgoing vessels, in the channel off New Castle.

Vessels approaching the patrol-boats must slow or stop until identified, and must show their colours and the International Code letters designating the name.

At night the signal to stop will be a red star fired by the

When the channel is clear for passage the station-ship off Fort Delaware will show by day the signal T X B, and at night a white light over a red light. This must not be taken as a signal to proceed unless permission has first been given by the patrol-boat.

PANAMA.

PANAMA CANAL. — MIRAFLORES APPROACH. — BEACONS TEM-PORABILY DISCONTINUED.—GAS-BUOY ESTABLISHED.

On account of dredging operations beacons 9 and 11, in the approach to Miraflores Locks, have been temporarily discontinued.

A gas-buoy with pyramidal superstructure, painted black, showing an occulting white light every 2 seconds—thus, light I second, eclipse I second—will be maintained to mark the edge of the navigable channel.

The channel will be permanently marked when dredging operations are completed.

GAS-BUOY ESTABLISHED.

On 11th February, 1919, a gas-buoy was established to mark the edge of the navigable channel in the southern approach to the Miraflores Locks. The gas-buoy is moored in 36 ft. at mean low water at the intersection of the range formed by beacons 5 and 7 in line and the prolongation of the centre line, west wing wall, Miraflores Locks.

2. From 10 h. 58 m. 00 s. to 10 h. 58 m. 50 s. time-signals made by dash and point, the points corresponding with the exact tens of the seconds. Three long dashes will terminate

the minute.

3. From 10 h. 59 m. 00 s. to 10 h. 59 m. 50 s. time-signals. 3. From 10 h. 59 m. 00 s. to 10 h. 59 m. 50 s. time-signals, made by two dashes and one point, the points coinciding with the exact tens of the second. Three long dashes terminate the minute, as with the former.

In case an accident should disturb or prevent the emission of the signals at 11 h. and 21 h., these will be repeated a half hour later from 27 m. to 30 m., being joined to the call the word "Correccao."

At 20 h. 55 m. will be made the time-signals corresponding to 21 h. following the same rule.

These signals will be in complete agreement with the rules of the international convention which met in Paris in the year 1912.

CHILE.

VALPARAISO RADIO STATION,-WEATHER INFORMATION SENT DAILY.

From 15th January the Valparaiso Radio Station will transmit once a day with the same wave-length as that by which the hour is given, which is 1,100 meters, the meteorologic conditions of certain points of the coast and of the island Juan Fernandez.

the that these signals may be received without difficulty by all vessels they will be transmitted very slowly. Following will be given the barometric pressure in millimeters, but suppressing the figure of the hundreds—thus, to indicate a pressure of 753 millimeters the figure 7 will be suppressed and the number transmitted will be 53 mitted will be 53.

In continuation of this number 53 comes another figure which indicates the direction of the wind, from 1 to 8, corresponding to—1 to north, 2 to north-east, 3 to east, 4 to south-east, 5 to south, 6 to south-west, 7 to west, 8 to north-

Lastly comes another figure which indicates the force of the wind according to the Beaufort scale; but when strengths greater than 8 are to be indicated they will be given in words,

nine, ten, eleven, and twelve.

In case of it not being possible to communicate the meteorologic conditions of any of the stations the word "no" will precede the distinctive letter of that station; and if only a part of the information is given, for the omitted part will be substituted the letter X

If the weather is not good in the ports indicated by the bulletin there will be added in ordinary language some of the words: Temporal (gale), neblina (fog or mist), lluvia

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Patangata County Council hereby resolves as follows:—
That, for the purpose of providing the instalments in respect of the principal and interest and also the other charges on a loan of £900, authorized to be raised by the Patangata County Council, under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, for the purpose of erecting a bridge over the Manawa-angiangi Stream, on the Te Tohi Road, the said Patangata County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 13/16d. in the pound upon the rateable value of all property of the Manawa-angiangi Bridge Special Rating area, comprising the following lands—viz., Section 1, Block XIII, Porangahau S.D.; Section 2, Block XIII, Porangahau S.D.; and 1,600 acres of the north-eastern portion of Lot 2, S.G.R. 75, Block XV, Mangatoro S.D. And that such rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of July and the 1st day of July and the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of July and the 1st day of January in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six years and a half, or until the loan is fully paid off.
