Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon him by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, and section two of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Amendment Act, 1915, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prohibit the importation into New Zealand of wheatmeal and ground wheat save with the consent of the Minister of Customs given on the recommendation of the Board of Trade.

Importation of Goods into the United Kingdom.

1. All restrictions on the importation into the United Kingdom of goods which are exported from and are the produce or manufacture of British Dominions have been removed, except in the case of—

- Gold, or articles containing gold, except when consigned direct to the Bank of England;
- Spirits other than brandy and rum; and
- Hops.

2. For the purpose of this concession it has been decided to accept as the produce or manufacture of British Dominions goods which owe at least 75 per cent. of their total value to Dominion or colonial labour and materials.

The notification dated 19th March, 1919, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 20th March, 1919, is withdrawn.

Regulations under the Census and Statistics Act, 1910.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the method in which the statistical information required to be furnished under section 21 (f) of the Census and Statistics Act, 1910, shall be collected by the Statistician.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE owner of every factory shall upon request, and within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish annually to the Statistician, or whomever he may appoint, the particulars specified in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto, together with the particulars specified in such one of the forms set out in the Second Schedule hereto as is applicable in accordance with the instructions accompanying those forms, and shall sign the forms and transmit them by post or otherwise to the Statistician or the officer appointed by him.

2. In the preceding regulation—

“Owner” includes the manager or person for the time being in charge of a factory; and

“Factory” includes—

(1.) All establishments engaged in the manufacture, repair, or preparation of articles for wholesale or retail trade or for export which—

(a.) Use motive power (with the exception of bakeries, butcheries, laundries, smithies, waterworks, shops engaged in retail trade only, and farmers or others using motive power for their own individual and private use);

(b.) Employ two or more hands, inclusive of working proprietors (with the exceptions specified in the last preceding subsection).

(2.) All the following, whether falling under (1) (a) or (1) (b) or not: Tanneries, bacon, butter, cheese, soap, or candle factories, brickyards, and lime-works.
