141. Applicants for enlistment must be between the ages of eighteen and twenty-five years, be unmarried, and have passed the Fourth Standard of education, or its equivalent, and will be required to pass a medical examination in accordance with Appendix I of these regulations.

In special cases, as set out hereunder, the above conditions may be relaxed in the interests of the service, and, subject to the approval of the General Officer in Charge Administration, the following may be accepted for enrolment:—

(a.) Men who have attained the age of seventeen years and six months, and are specially recommended by the Officer Commanding Regiment, Royal New Zealand Artillery.

(b.) Ex-soldiers of the Regular Forces, Royal New Zealand Artillery, and Foreign Service Branch of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force, whose ages exceed twenty-five years, and who are married.

No relaxation of the physical standard will be allowed, and no candidates showing other than good physical development will be considered for enrolment.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Kawhia County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the instalments in respect of principal and interest and also the other charges on a loan of £200, authorized to be raised by the Kawhia County Council, under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, for the purpose of metalling portions of the Oparau to Oparau Ferry Road for the first time, the said Kawhia County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of twopence three-farthings (2¾d.) in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Oparau Special Rating Area, comprising all that area in the County of Kawhia contained within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at the westernmost corner of Pirongia West No. 1 Section 2D; towards the north generally by the Oparau River to its confluence with the Okupata Stream; thence towards the north generally by the said Okupata Stream to the north-eastern corner of Waihinu No. 1, Sec. 2E; towards the east by Rotoiti No. 1 Sec. 2F; towards the south by Pirongia West No. 1B No. 2 Sec. 2, Crown land, and No. 1B; thence towards the south generally by the Kawhia-Pirongia Road to the point of commencement.

And that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the 17th day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six and a half years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Manawatu Hunt Club at a meeting held on the 1st day of March, 1919, at Palmerston North, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. S. R. Lancaster, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. S. R. Lancaster, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. J. Crook seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

MANAWATU HUNT CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the

Manawatu Hunt Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 13th day of October, 1917, and doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Manawatu Racing Club's course situated in the district of Palmerston North, and known as the Awapuni Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.

(c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of housebreaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The foregoing regulations of the Manawatu Hunt Club were made and passed by the Manawatu Hunt Club on the 1st day of March, 1919, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
