WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (here-inafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs and make inquiring reservainspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor-General; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation: mendation:

(1.) The fees for a private mail-bag are as follows:—

(a.) For a private mail-bag carried by a mail contractor for a year ended

31st December, £2; for a second bag, if the quantity of correspondence requires it, £1.

(b.) For a private mail-bag carried by a mail contractor for a half-year ended 30th June or 31st December, £1; for a second bag, if the quantity of correspondence requires it, 10s.

(c.) For a private mail-bag, if delivery is taken at the post-office where it is made up, for a year ended 31st December, £1.

(d.) For a private mail-bag, if delivery is taken at the post-office where it is made up, for a half-year ended 30th June or 31st December, 10s.

(e.) For a private mail-bag carried otherwise than by a mail contractor—

When the cost of carriage does not exceed the foregoing fees set out in (a), (b), (c), and (d), the foregoing fees as so set out.

When the cost of carriage exceeds the foregoing fees set out in (a), (b), (c), and (d), £1 per annum plus the actual cost of carriage.

A duly proportionate part of such fees for any period before the year or half-year as aforesaid begins is payable as follows: If the period does not exceed three months, the fee therefor is to be added to that due for the succeeding year or half-year, and the total collected; if the period is greater than three months, the fee to the end of the half-year next ensuing after the date of the application may be accepted.

(2.) The bag will measure 20 in. by 36 in., and will be supplied by the Department, together with a lock and key, at the cost of the person requiring it. A key will also be held by the Post Office. The bag must be kept in repair by the person requiring it.

(3.) The Postmaster must securely lock the bag before despatching it, and it must be returned to the Postmaster in the same manner.

(4.) No charge is made to any person or persons, after the first holder, sharing in the use of a private mail-bag. The persons using a bag after the hirer must give to the Postmaster at the place at which the bag is made up written orders for the disposal of their correspondence, and must forward the written consent of the hirer to the enclosing

(5.) In cases in which parcels for a private-bag holder are too numerous or too large to go into the private bag or bags paid for, the bag-holder must take delivery of the parcels from the nearest post-office or make his own special arrangements for their

parcels from the nearest post-office or make his own special arrangements delivery by the mail contractor or otherwise.

15. Mail contractors are bound to convey and deliver, free of charge to the holders, all private bags given to them by Postmasters or under their instructions, but are not required to deviate from the prescribed mail-route, and are on no account to be delayed. Should a return bag not be ready at the appointed time and place, the contractor is not required to wait for it.

Regulations under the Distillation Act, 1908.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in me for this purpose vested by sections 10 and 118 of the Distillation Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I. Arthur Mielziner Myers, Minister of Customs, do hereby make the following regulations under the Distillation Act, 1908.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person to whom a permit or license to keep and use a still has been issued under sections 10 and 118 of the Distillation Act, 1908, shall make, or permit to be made, any alteration in or addition to such still without the permission of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries.

2. Every still for which a permit on license has been installed.

2. Every still for which a permit or license has been issued as aforesaid, and the premises upon which it shall be used, shall at all times be open to the inspection of an officer of Customs, or other person deputed for the purpose by an Inspector of Distilleries.

3. Every still licensed as aforesaid, which is to be used for the distillation of ethers or chemical compounds of which spirits form a part, shall, when not in use, be kept under the Crown lock, or shall be otherwise secured to the satisfaction

of an Inspector.
4. No person shall, without the permission of an Inspector or of an officer of Customs, remove any lock or break any seal, or remove or in any way interfere with any device or means adopted for the security of any still licensed as afore-

5. Every person to whom a license to keep and use a still has been issued as aforesaid shall include in the bond to be entered into by him under section 11 of the Distillation Act,

 $1908,\ a$ condition that these regulations shall be complied with so far as they apply to the still which such person has been licensed to keep.

6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing regulations, the Chief Inspector of Distilleries may exempt any person holding a license as aforesaid under the Distillation Act, 1908, from any provision of such regulations.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1919.

In most parts of the Dominion fair weather ruled during April, and the rainfall was once again considerably below the normal.

Along the east coast south of Banks Peninsula, and in Otago, however, the total rainfall was considerably in excess of the average, some Observers remarking that it was the wettest April on record.

Numerous disturbances passed in the south during the month, but as they were apparently of slight intensity they were not responsible for such a widespread rainfall as was desired.

MINE WARNING TO MARINERS.

MARINERS are hereby informed that the South Atlantic, Indian Ocean, Red Sea, and Pacific Zone defined in Mine Warning to Mariners No. 2, paragraph 8, is considered clear of moored mines, with the exception of the mined areas in the vicinity of Three Kings (North Island, New Zealand) and Cape Farewell (South Island, New Zealand), details of which are given below.

Navigation in this zone is unrestricted except as laid down in sections 2 and 3.

2. THERE KINGS (NEW ZEALAND, NORTH ISLAND).—Mines are laid on a line joining lat. 34° 6′ S., long. 172° 40′ E., and lat. 34° 19½ S., long. 172° 48′ E. Vessels are not to approach within too miles of this line in any disasting.

within ten miles of this line in any direction.

3. CAPE FAREWELL (New Zealand), South Island).—

Mines are laid on a line between lat. 40° 7′ S., long. 172°

42′ E., and lat. 40° 28½′ S., long. 172° 26′ E. Vessels are to avoid the area bounded on the north by the parallel of lat. avoid the area bounded on the north by the paramet of lat. 39° 55′ S., on the east by the meridian of longitude passing through Farewell Spit Lighthouse (long. 173° 1′ E.), on the south by the land, and on the west by the meridian of longitude passing through Kahurangi Point (long. 172° 13′ E.).

WIRELESS METEOROLOGICAL INFORMATION TO AND FROM SHIPS AT SEA.

GENERAL REMARKS.

It is earnestly hoped that all concerned will assist in making the wireless meteorological service a success. Negotiations are now in hand to extend and unify the system of collecting weather data by wireless from ships at sea all over the world, and at the same time to organize the free transmission of weather bulletins from a sufficient number of wireless stations to admit of ships being constantly supplied with reliable weather reports and forecasts wherever they may be.

It should be borne in mind that the needs of ships at sea in regard to information regarding the weather will march hand in hand with the requirements of aircraft. The importance of this service will therefore be constantly increasing, and its success or failure will largely depend upon the coand its success or failure will largely depend upon the cooperation of ships at sea in providing the data, without
which accurate forecasting is impossible. The matter does
not depend solely upon the efforts of the ships selected tofurnish the data. The essence of success lies in rapidity in
passing such data by wireless from the ship to the coast
station, and thence to the central meteorological office. It
follows, therefore, that all ships not taking an active part in
supplying data should use the greatest care not to interfere
with the transmission of the wireless messages to the shore.

3. The following particulars refer to the scheme now being

3. The following particulars refer to the scheme now being undertaken by the British Meteorological Office. This notice will, however, be subject to revision from time to time, and endeavours will be made to include in each revision all information available to date of the weather bulletins issued by the wireless stations of the world. Earnest endeavours are being made to obtain international agreement as to the form of these weather bulletins, and to the methods and times of transmissions. It is hoped that the messages will eventually all be made in an international code at fixed times, so arranged that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for time-signals is being evolved.

COLLECTION OF WEATHER DATA FROM SHIPS.

4. Certain ships are being asked to supply data regularly three times a day whenever they are within a certain distance of any of some six or eight "observation points" in the north-eastern Atlantic.

north-eastern Atlantic.
5. In addition to the regular observations, which are taken at 0100, 0700, and 1300 Greenwich time and sent as soon as possible to Malin Head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK) coast stations, these ships may, on request from either of these coast stations, send special data messages at other times.
6. The procedure for a ship which intends to send a data message will be as follows: As soon as it has been decided to make the data message (i.e., normally at about 0100, 0700, or 1300) the ship makes to "all ships" (CQ) the word "weather,"* followed by a number which indicates the "observation point" (see para. 4 above), near which she is at the time.

at the time.

* Application is being made to Berne to allot an international three-letter abbreviation to mean: "Am about to make weather data from observation point number."

7. This warning message will not be answered by any ship or station; it is merely designed—

(a) "Informall ship within range that a report is about."

(a.) To inform all ships within range that a report is about to be made and that they should therefore avoid interfering.

(b.) To inform all other ships supplying weather data, which may be in the vicinity of the same observation point, that, one ship having decided to make a report, it is unnecessary for them to make one also.

8. About five or ten minutes after the ship has made the

8. About five or ten minutes after the ship has made the warning as above, she may be expected to transmit the data message itself. The normal or regular "data message" consists of four groups of five figures each; the special data message is of two groups of five figures each. All data messages bear the one word "weather" as the address, and conclude with a "time of origin" of four figures. The message will be sent to Malin Head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK), according to the position of the "observation point." † Application is being made to Berne to allot an international three-letter abbreviation to mean: "Following are normal (or special) weather data."

(or special) weather data."
9. It should be noted that several of the observation points

9. It should be noted that several of the observation points are so far out to sea that the coast stations, although provided with extra sensitive receiving gear, will be unable to read the messages unless all ships help by keeping quiet. In particular, ships working near Malin Head or Valentia should be on the watch for the coast station making "Go on" (K) or "Repeat" (UD) to a ship whose transmission they themselves cannot hear. It is hoped that ships will so co-operate in this matter that it will be unnecessary to arrange international "silent periods" to enable these long-range data messages to be read by the coast stations.

10. The coast stations, on receiving these data messages, will possibly have to forward them to London by wireless. They would use continuous wave for this purpose, and would therefore not be heard by ships not fitted with special receivers. Ships should therefore be prepared to find that Valentia or Malin Head could not attend to calls for a few minutes after receipt of one of these data messages.

11. The "special" data messages referred to in paragraph 5 above are only made when the Meteorological Office finds its information pointing to the existence of peculiar conditions in a certain area. In such cases the office directs Valeatia or Malin Head to ask for reports. The shore station then sends to "any British ship supplying weather data" the word "weather" followed, if necessary, by the number of the observation point from which a special data message is desired. This word would not be answered by ships; but ships addressed, which were in the vicinity of any (or of the specified) observation point, would verify their position, make the warning signal to "All ships," take observations, and pass in the special data message as above described for the regular message.
