Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Wellington.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following

regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red-deer may be destroyed in the following parts of the Wellington Acclimatization District, namely:—

All that area commencing at the Onoko Lake, thence northward along the west side of the Wairarapa Lake to Featherston, thence along the railway-line to Eketahuna, thence eastward in a direct line to the sea at Castlepoint, thence northward along the coast to the Waimata River, thence in a direct line westward to Mangatainoka, thence westward to Palmerston North, thence along the railway-line to Paekakariki, thence south-east to the sea at Petone, thence along the coast to the point of commencement at the Onoko Lake.

Also all that area within a line commencing at the mouth of the Kawhatau River, thence westward along the river to its source at the summit of the Ruahine Ranges, thence northward to Motopuha, thence south-east to Te Rotoiti, thence southward to Moawhango, thence to the point of commencement at the mouth of the Kawhatau River.

Also the Counties of Featherston and Wairarapa South, excepting therefrom all that part of the said counties lying to the westward of the Wellington-Napier Railway line, and excepting also all that area of land in the Huangarua Survey District, being Sections 29 to 41 (inclusive), 59, 71, 72, 75, 79, 83, 90, 93, 97, 98, and part of Sections 70, 74, 78, 82, 86, 89, 91, 92, 94, 95, 96, 87, and 84 (in the occupation of Mr. John Martin and Mr. Featherston Johnston, and known as the Puruatanga Estate or Station).

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society at Wellington, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill within the said areas red-deer of either sex and of any age which in the opinion of the said secretary or of the said authorized persons should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof until the 30th September, 1919.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red-deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of the person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

CIRCULAR TO OWNERS AND MASTERS OF BRITISH MERCHANT SHIPS.

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY IN MERCHANT SHIPS.—RELAXATION OF RESTRICTIONS.

I. Disposal of Documents.

Two copies of this circular are to be supplied to every British merchant ship fitted with W/T.

2. One copy is to be kept in the W/T office, the other by the master.

3. This circular is to come into force at noon, G.M.T., on Thursday, 1st May, 1919, when the following action is to be taken on board merchant ships, if this has not already been done:—

(a.) Circulars to owners and masters of British merchant ships dated 22nd January and 12th March, 1919, are to be destroyed.

(b.) Para. 3 of circular letter to shipowners and masters of the British mercantile marine, dated 23rd Novem-

ber, 1918, issued by the Director of Trade Division, Admiralty, already deleted, is to be marked "See circular of 10th April, 1919."

(c.) The following documents are to be handed to the nearest Shipping Intelligence Officer or other distributing authority for destruction,—

C.B. 733D (3) W/T Instructions for Merchant Vessels, 1918. Addendum No. 3 (1 copy).

Mercantile Tables (all editions up to and including No. 35).

(d.) The following documents are to be withdrawn from use and kept on board, but need no longer be regarded as confidential. They will be replaced later by revised instructions.

Note.—Before Parts I and II are put away, the pencil amendments ordered by the now obsolete Addendum No. 3 (see (c) above) are to be rubbed out in both copies.

(ii.) Commercial Call Signs (C.B. 832A), and Supplements.

(iv.) Notices to Mariners concerning Time Signals, Weather Reports, &c.

II. Restrictions on Use of W/T.

All restrictions on the use of W/T in ships are removed, except in the following waters:—

- North Sea.
- English Channel, east of a line joining Dungeness and Boulogne.
- Baltic.
- Northern Russian waters.
- Mediterranean, Black Sea, and Sea of Marmora.

2. In the above waters W/T communications are permitted as follows:—

- (i.) Between masters and owners on matters concerning the safety and working of the ship. Messages must be in plain language.
- (ii.) Between masters and naval authorities. Messages must be in plain language; except in the Baltic and Northern Russian waters, where all messages must be in code. A special code (NOT the Mercantile Tables) is being supplied for this.
- (iii.) Official messages from accredited Ministers or officials of H.M. Governments, or officers of the naval or military forces, travelling in their official capacities as passengers on board, to Government Departments, or naval or military authorities on shore. Should such officials require to send messages of any other description, they should be shown these instructions as constituting the master's authority for refusing to have messages despatched.
- (iv.) *Private telegrams* are forbidden.

It should be borne in mind that stations belonging to foreign Governments are not yet all open to public correspondence.

3. In order to avoid delay in making distress signals whilst in the above waters the master is responsible that the W/T office is informed whenever the vessel enters any of these zones. Whilst in these zones the operator is to be kept supplied, while on watch, with the position of the vessel. This is to be communicated to the operator in writing, and is to be corrected every half-hour.

4. Owners wishing to divert their ships, when in or approaching the above waters, must send the telegram to "Director Mercantile Movements, Admiralty, London," in the following form:—

"Following for master, steamship [*Name of ship*], [*Name of wireless station, if desired*], begins [*Text of message and signature*]."

5. Prepayment by the sender for these messages will be:—

- (i.) Telegraph charge from office of sender to Admiralty for the whole message.
 - (ii.) Telegraph charge from Admiralty to the W/T Station
 - (iii.) Coast charge
 - (iv.) Ship charge
- } For the address, text, and signature of the actual W/T message.

6. In the event of danger from mines preventing the despatch of such a message, the telegraph office of origin will be informed by telegram that the message has been stopped by Admiralty, in which case the sender will be entitled, on application, to the refund of unexpended charges.

1. THE compulsory routing of British merchant vessels will cease from Monday, 28th July, inclusive, from which date the responsibility of obtaining the latest information of danger areas, &c., devolves entirely upon the masters.

2. The orders contained in C.B. 415 ("War Instructions for British Merchant Vessels") and in the new publication (entitled "Admiralty Instructions for British Merchant Vessels") which replaces it, and is now in course of issue, which direct masters to call for route instructions, are cancelled from that date, except for special voyages which may be specified later.

3. The closing of the special naval route-giving offices will commence on 28th July, but the offices at a few special ports will be kept on for one or two months in order to assist and advise masters who wish for it.

4. The offices which will be kept open will probably be—

5. Masters are advised to consult the above offices, at which all assistance possible will be given to them.

6. The information regarding mines is now published in "Mine Warnings to Mariners," issued by the Admiralty, and printed in green.

7. The New Zealand Marine Department receive from the Admiralty an advance telegraphic copy, called a "Route-warning Telegraph," sent immediately a "Mine Warning to Mariners" is prepared, and the "Route-warning Telegrams" are thus far in advance of the printed "Mine Warnings."

8. Reproductions of the telegraphic "Route-warning Telegrams" issued by the New Zealand Marine Department will be printed in red, and will contain the serial number of the Admiralty "Mine Warnings" to which they correspond.

9. The different areas for which Admiralty "Mine Warnings to Mariners" are issued are as specified in New Zealand Notice to Mariners No. 39 of 1919 (Admiralty "Mine Warning" No. 2 of 1919).

10. The only warnings which will, until further notice, be obtainable from New Zealand Collectors of Customs will be those relating to the area defined in Admiralty "Mine Warning" No. 2/1919, as "South Atlantic, Indian Ocean, Red Sea, and Pacific."

The current warnings for the other eight areas mentioned in Mine Warning No. 2 may be obtained from the Marine Department upon a clear week's notice being given to that Department through any Collector of Customs.

Vessels which are, however, intending to call at any of the ports mentioned in paragraph (4) above are recommended to wait until their arrival there for the latest information in regard to any area *except* "South Atlantic, Indian Ocean, Red Sea, and Pacific" (which is obtainable in New Zealand).

11. In spite of the discontinuance of compulsory routing, the attention of mariners is called to the fact that it is most important to maintain the utmost care to avoid mine-fields.

Masters should obtain and study all "Mine Warnings," marking the information contained therein on their charts, keep the charts corrected, and should consult (in New Zealand) the Marine Department, and, elsewhere, the various reporting officers, with a view to obtaining the latest telegraphic amendments.

Geographical Decision of Mine Warnings to Mariners.

THE areas used for classifying mine warnings are as follows:—

Arctic.—All water north of 61° N. Mine warnings for this area are divided as follows: General; Russia, North Coast.

North Atlantic.—Northern limit, 61° N.; eastern limit, 11° W. and the coast of Africa; southern limit, the Equator; western limit, America. Mine warnings for this area are divided as follows: General; United States of America.

English Channel and West Coast of United Kingdom.—Northern limit, 61° N.; eastern limit, 5° west of Cape Wrath, the western and southern coasts of Scotland and England to Dungeness, then to Boulogne; southern limit, French coast to Ushant, and 48° 29' 00" N.; western limit, 11° W. Mine warnings for this area are divided into four portions, viz.: General; west coast of United Kingdom; English Channel, northern portion; English Channel, southern portion.

North Sea.—Northern limit, 61° N.; eastern and southern limits, Norwegian coast to 9° E., then to Danish coast, then by North Europe to Boulogne, and then to Dungeness; western limit, the eastern and northern coasts of England and Scotland to Cape Wrath, then the meridian of 5° west. This area is divided as follows: General; North Sea, Area No. I; North Sea, Area No. II; North Sea, Area No. III; North Sea, Area No. IV; North Sea, Area No. V; east coast of England, war channel.

Baltic.—All of the Baltic Sea, and the Gulf of Bothnia, east of 90° E.

West Coast of France, Spain, and Portugal.—Northern limit, parallel of 48° 29' 00" N.; eastern and southern limits, the west coast of France, Spain, and Portugal, as far as the meridian of Tarifa Point, then across to the African Coast; western limit, meridian of 110° W.

Mediterranean.—All of the Mediterranean and Black Sea east of Tarifa Point and north of Suez. Mine warnings for this area are divided as follows: Mediterranean, Area No. I, Area No. II, Area No. III, Area No. IV, Area No. V, Area No. VI, Area No. VII, Area No. VIII.

South Atlantic, Indian Ocean, Red Sea, and Pacific.—All except the above—viz., Atlantic south of the Equator, and all Pacific, China, Indian Ocean, and Red Sea, &c.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the committee of the Canterbury Jockey Club at a meeting held on the 28th day of January, 1919, at Christchurch, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. Alexander Boyle, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. Alexander Boyle, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. Beauchamp Lane seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

CANTERBURY JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Canterbury Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 4th day of July, 1911, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Christchurch Racecourse situated in the district of Christchurch, and known as the Riccarton Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

- (a.) Bookmakers.
- (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The foregoing regulations of the Canterbury Jockey Club were made and passed by the Canterbury Jockey Club on the 28th day of January, 1919, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
