WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work is not required for such public work the Governor-General may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was taken for the purpose of a road: And whereas such road has been stopped, and it is desirable to declare the land contained therein to be Crown land:

And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor-General to declare such land to be Crown land:

WHEREAS the portions of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway from Pongakawa to Taneatua and from Taneatua to Opotiki (hereinafter termed "the said railway") are portions of a railway the construction of which is authorized by the Railways Authorization Act, 1913, and the Railways Authorization Act, 1915, respectively:

And whereas the said railway has been partly constructed, and it has been determined to construct and maintain a further portion of the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Public Works Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said further portion of the said railway shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section two hundred and seven of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that a Harbour Board shall have power, by by-laws under the said Act, to do all or any of the things mentioned within the limits of the harbour, including, amongst other things, power to regulate the use of wharves and other landing-places, and generally regulate the traffic on the same, fix scales of dues, tolls, and charges to be paid for the use of wharves, and fix scales of dues for the storage of goods, and otherwise as mentioned in the said section :

And whereas it is enacted by section nine of the said Act that in harbours where there is no Harbour Board the Governor-General in-Council shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities by the said Act conferred upon Harbour Boards, and may exercise the same in accordance with the said Act under regulations to be made in the manner provided in section two hundred and seven :

And whereas, by Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 56, of the seventeenth day of the same month, the Waiapu County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Te Araroa, Waiapu County, as a site for a wharf :

And whereas, there being no Harbour Board for Te Araroa harbour, the Council has asked that certain regulations may be made and dues fixed for the use of the said wharf

under the control of the Council, and it is desirable that this be done :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the said harbour, and to the wharf therein which is under the control of the Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE Council shall not be bound to receive for storage any goods for shipment outwards, nor shall it be held responsible for the safety of any goods deposited in the cargo-shed.

2. Whenever in the opinion of the Council's Wharfinger goods are wholly unprotected or insufficiently protected, or packed so as in his opinion to require additional labour in handling or to involve the Council in additional risks, an extra charge for labour shall be imposed upon such goods of 2s. per ton on inward goods and 1s. per ton on outward goods.

3. The Council will not be responsible for robbery, breakage, damage by vermin, fire, or water used in extinguishing fire, sustained by goods while in the Council's custody for the purpose of shipping or delivering after landing from the wharf, unless in cases of proved negligence.

4. All goods in respect of which the Wharfinger elects not to supply labour, or which shall not be tallied by the Wharfinger, shall not be deemed for any purpose to be in custody of the Council as wharfingers, nor shall the Council be responsible for their safe custody or for any loss or damage that may be occasioned to the same in any manner whatsoever.

5. No claim will be entertained by the Council in respect to goods landed unless such claim has been received by the Chairman of the Council in writing within thirty days after the departure from the berth of discharge of the vessel out of which such goods were, or are alleged to have been, landed, and then only in cases of proved negligence.

6. The Council will not be responsible for the wrong delivery or non-delivery of goods which are erroneously or defectively marked, or which have old or imperfectly erased marks thereon. The Council will not be responsible for any claim arising from delay in delivery of goods from any cause whatsoever.

7. The Wharfinger may order the ship to cease work if in his opinion the goods landed are being damaged by water.

8. All complaints against the Wharfinger or any person under his direction must be made to the Chairman of the Council in writing.

9. The Council does not hold itself responsible for the safe custody of packages containing acids, chemicals, or other dangerous goods.

10. Every person who uses the wharf for landing or shipping any goods shall pay to the Council wharf dues at the following rates, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. THE general manager for New Zealand of every fire-insurance company shall, upon request, within such time or times as he may be required by the Statistician so to do, furnish annually to the Statistician, or whomever he may appoint, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions accompanying this form, and shall sign the form and transmit it by post or otherwise to the Statistician or the officer appointed by him.

2. In the preceding regulation—

“The General Manager for New Zealand” shall include the manager, secretary, clerk, or other responsible authority or person for the time being in charge of a fire-insurance company carrying on business in the Dominion ; and, in the event of there being no such general manager for the Dominion, shall include the person or persons in charge for the time being of any branch or branches of such fire-insurance company carrying on business in New Zealand :

“Fire-insurance company” means any association, person, or persons, incorporated or unincorporated, who, within New Zealand, carry on the business of fire insurance either alone or in common with any other business ; and includes companies registered or established out of New Zealand, and mutual associations as well as proprietary.

*By-laws, New Zealand Government Railways.—By-laws regulating Passenger Traffic on the Railways.*

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Government Railways Act, 1908, I, William Herbert HERRIES, Minister of Railways, do hereby make the by-laws set forth in the Schedule hereto, regulating the passenger traffic on the Government railways, and I do hereby declare that such by-laws shall come into force on the 4th day of August, 1919.

SCHEDULE.

BY-LAWS.

1. (a.) No person shall travel or attempt to travel on a railway without having previously obtained a permit in writing so to do from a railway officer.

(b.) Such a permit will be granted only in respect of a specified journey, and will be granted only on its being established to the satisfaction of the railway officer that such journey is reasonably necessary, and that it is not merely or principally for pleasure or any other non-essential purpose.

(c.) No person shall purchase or attempt to purchase a railway ticket for any journey unless and until a permit for that journey has been duly obtained.

(d.) Every person who has obtained a permit for any journey as aforesaid shall carry the permit with him on that journey, and shall show and deliver up the same whenever required so to do by any railway officer for any purpose whatsoever.

(e.) This by-law shall not apply to persons making a journey for which tickets at suburban fares in accordance with regulation (51) Part (1) of the railway tariff gazetted on the 17th day of December, 1912, are issuable.

(f.) This by-law shall not apply to a person travelling on a railway under the authority of a season ticket or free pass, or in pursuance of a contract entered into before the coming into operation of this by-law entitling him to travel on that railway.

2. No person shall obtain or attempt to obtain any such permit as aforesaid by knowingly making any false representation to any railway officer, and no person shall transfer or attempt to transfer any such permit, and no person shall use or attempt to use any such permit which has been issued to or in the name of any other person, and no person shall use or attempt to use any such permit for any other journey or on any other day or days than that or those in respect of which the same was issued.

3. Any person who commits a breach of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £10.

*Regulations respecting Foreign Orders and Medals.*

Department of Internal Affairs,

THE following revised regulations respecting foreign Orders and Medals are published for general information.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING FOREIGN ORDERS AND MEDALS  
APPLICABLE TO PERSONS IN THE SERVICE OF THE CROWN.

*Orders.*

1. It is the King's wish that no subject of His Majesty in the service of the Crown shall accept and wear the insignia of any foreign Order without having previously obtained His Majesty's permission to do so, signified either—

- (a.) By Warrant under the Royal Sign-manual; or
- (b.) By restricted permission conveyed through His Majesty's Private Secretary.

2. Permission given by Warrant under the Royal Sign-manual will enable the insignia of the foreign Order to be worn at all times and without any restriction.

Restricted permission will only enable the insignia to be worn on the occasions specified in the terms of the letter from the King's Private Secretary conveying the Royal sanction.

3. Full and unrestricted permission by Warrant under the Royal Sign-manual is contemplated in the following cases:—  
For a decoration conferred—

On an officer in His Majesty's naval or military forces lent to a foreign Government; on an officer in His Majesty's naval or military forces attached by his Government to a foreign navy or army during hostilities; or on any British official lent to a foreign Government and not in receipt of any emoluments from British public funds during the period of such loan.

Red Cross and kindred services will only be regarded as "valuable" for the purposes of these regulations when they have been rendered in a war in which the Empire has itself been engaged, and when the decoration for the wearing of which permission is sought has been conferred by an Allied State.

4. Restricted permission is contemplated for decorations which have been conferred in recognition of personal attention to the Head of a foreign State, and which are therefore of a more or less complimentary character, and will, as a rule, only be given on exceptional occasions when in the public interest and for political reasons it is deemed expedient that the acceptance of a foreign decoration should not be declined. Restricted permission will generally be given in the following cases:—

For a decoration conferred—

(1.) On British Ambassadors or Ministers abroad when the King pays a State visit to the country to which they are accredited;

(*Note.*—A State visit is defined as one on which the King is accompanied by a Minister or high official in attendance.)

(2.) On members of deputations of British regiments to foreign Heads of States;

(3.) On members of special missions when the King is represented at a foreign coronation, wedding, or funeral; or on any diplomatic representative when specially accredited to represent His Majesty on such occasions; and such members of his staff who actually attend the ceremonies in their official capacity;

(4.) On naval and military Attachés only after completion of five years' service at the post to which they are appointed in that capacity.

5. Restricted permission will not be given to—

(1.) British Ambassadors or Ministers abroad when leaving;

(2.) Members of British missions announcing the accession of a Sovereign;

(3.) British officers attending foreign manoeuvres;

(4.) Naval officers of British squadrons visiting foreign waters.

6. The desire of the Head of a foreign State to confer upon a British subject in the service of the Crown the insignia of an Order must be notified to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs either through the British diplomatic representative accredited to the Head of the foreign State, or through his diplomatic representative at the Court of St. James.

7. When His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall have taken the King's pleasure on any

such application, and shall have obtained His Majesty's permission for the person in whose favour it has been made to wear the insignia of a foreign Order, he shall signify the same to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, in order that he may cause a Warrant, if it be a case for the issue of a Warrant as defined in Rule 2, to be prepared for the Royal Sign-manual.

When such Warrant shall have been signed by the King, a notification thereof shall be inserted in the *Gazette* stating the service for which the foreign Order has been conferred.

Persons in whose favour such Warrants are issued will be required to pay to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department a stamp duty of 10s.

8. The Warrant signifying His Majesty's permission may, at the request and at the expense of the person who has obtained it, be registered in the College of Arms. Every such Warrant as aforesaid shall contain a clause providing that His Majesty's license and permission does not authorize the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining to a Knight Bachelor of His Majesty's realms.

9. When a British subject in the service of the Crown has received the Royal permission, full or restricted, to accept and wear the decoration of a foreign Order, he will not be allowed to accept and wear the decoration of a higher class of the same Order without His Majesty's approval, which will only be given if the higher honour is being conferred in circumstances contemplated by these regulations.

*Medals.*

10. Medals conferred by the Head or Government of a foreign State for saving or attempting to save life at sea or on land may be accepted and worn without His Majesty's special permission.

11. Other medals, with the exceptions specified below, are subject to the regulations in the same manner as Orders, but permission is given by letter and not by Royal Warrant.

12. In the case of medals for Red Cross services, permission will only be granted in the conditions laid down in Rule 3 above.

13. Applications for His Majesty's permission to wear medals conferred by private societies or institutions and commemorative medals cannot be entertained.

14. The King's unrestricted permission to accept and wear a foreign war medal will only be given to (1) officers of His Majesty's military or naval forces if serving with a foreign army or navy with His Majesty's license, and (2) military or naval Attachés or other officers officially attached to foreign armies or navies during hostilities.

15. In exceptional cases, when for special reasons it is deemed expedient that the acceptance of the medal should not be declined, His Majesty will grant restricted permission. Such cases will be judged on their merits, and the circumstances in which the medal may be worn will be specified in the letter conveying His Majesty's permission.

*General.*

16. The term "person in the service of the Crown" includes persons in receipt of a salary or pension from public funds, or holding a Royal commission in any part of His Majesty's dominions, protectorates, or possessions.

17. Ladies are subject to the regulations in all respects in the same manner as men.

*Foreign Office, 31st December, 1918.*

REGULATIONS RESPECTING FOREIGN ORDERS AND MEDALS  
APPLICABLE TO PERSONS NOT IN THE SERVICE OF THE  
CROWN.

*Orders.*

1. It is the King's wish that no subject of His Majesty shall wear the insignia of any foreign Order without having previously obtained His Majesty's permission to do so, signified either—

- (a.) By Warrant under the Royal Sign-manual; or
- (b.) By restricted permission conveyed through His Majesty's Private Secretary.

2. Permission given by Warrant under the Royal Sign-manual will enable the insignia of the foreign Order to be worn at all times and without any restriction.

Restricted permission will only enable the insignia to be worn on the occasions specified in the terms of the letter from the King's Private Secretary conveying the Royal sanction.

3. The full and unrestricted permission by Warrant under the Royal Sign-manual is designed to meet cases where the decoration may be said to have been earned by some valuable service rendered to the Head of the State conferring it, or to the State itself. Application will be made to His Majesty for full permission by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of

State for Foreign Affairs on behalf of any person who, not being at the time in the service of the Crown, is either in the salaried employment of a foreign State or has rendered valuable services within the period of two years immediately preceding the notification of the decoration to His Majesty's Government as prescribed under Rule 5.

The expression "valuable services" must be construed as meaning some service rendered to a foreign Head of State or Government specifically, and must be indisputably valuable in the strict sense of the word. Though such services need not necessarily be gratuitous, as in the case of a person actually in the employ of a foreign Government, they must be unconnected with any transaction of a commercial or financial character brought about in the ordinary course of business. The term "valuable services" does not therefore, as a general rule, apply to services connected with the fulfilment of Government or municipal contracts, the financing of Government or municipal loans. It also does not include the presentation of objects of value to public museums and institutions, pecuniary donations or endowments, personal performances, services in connection with exhibitions and industrial congresses, services in the domain of art, literature, science, education, and agriculture, services rendered by British subjects in the capacity of honorary foreign Consular Officers.

Red Cross and kindred services will only be regarded as "valuable" for the purposes of these regulations when they have been rendered in a war in which the Empire has itself been engaged and when the decoration for the wearing of which permission is sought has been conferred by an Allied State.

4. Restricted permission is contemplated for decorations which have been conferred in recognition of personal attention to the Head of a foreign State or member of a Reigning House, and which are therefore of a more or less complimentary character. Restricted permission is as a rule only given on exceptional occasions, when in the public interest and for political reasons it is deemed expedient that the acceptance of a foreign decoration should not be declined.

5. Both in the case of full and in that of restricted permission the matter will be submitted to the King by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

The desire of the Head of a foreign State to confer upon a British subject the insignia of an Order, or the fact that he has done so, must be notified to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs either through the British diplomatic representative accredited to the Head of the foreign State, or through the diplomatic representative of the latter at the Court of St. James. His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall be under no obligation to consider claims that are not brought to his notice through one of these channels.

6. When His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall have taken the King's pleasure on any such application, and shall have obtained His Majesty's permission for the person in whose favour it has been made to wear the insignia of a foreign Order, he shall signify the same to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, in order that he may cause a Warrant, if it be a case for the issue of a Warrant as defined in Rule 2, to be prepared for the Royal Sign-manual.

When such Warrant shall have been signed by the King, a notification thereof shall be inserted in the *Gazette*, stating the service for which the foreign Order has been conferred.

Persons in whose favour such Warrants are issued will be required to pay to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department a stamp duty of 10s.

7. The Warrant signifying His Majesty's permission may, at the request and at the expense of the person who has obtained it, be registered in the College of Arms. Every such Warrant as aforesaid shall contain a clause providing that His Majesty's license and permission does not authorize the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining to a Knight Bachelor of His Majesty's realms.

8. When a British subject has received the Royal permission, full or restricted, to accept and wear the decoration of a foreign Order, he will not be allowed to accept the decoration of a higher class of the same Order without His Majesty's approval. His Majesty will in such cases grant permission only if the promotion in the Order is conferred for fresh services which come within these regulations.

9. These regulations apply only to Orders of chivalry. Decorations conferred by private societies and decorations of a purely academic nature, and all decorations not being Orders of chivalry, may be accepted without His Majesty's permission, but must not be worn.

Exception is made in the case of a few foreign Orders which, though not in strictness Orders of chivalry, yet are

of such a high distinction that, for the purpose of these regulations, they are to be considered and treated as Orders of chivalry.

#### Medals.

10. Medals, with the exceptions specified below, are subject to the regulations in the same manner as Orders, but permission to wear is given by letter and not by Royal Warrant. No permission is needed to accept a foreign medal if it is not to be worn.

11. Medals for saving or attempting to save life at sea or on land conferred on behalf of the Head or Government of a foreign State may be accepted and worn without His Majesty's special permission.

12. In the case of medals for Red Cross services, permission will only be granted in the conditions laid down in Rule 3, paragraph 3, above.

13. Applications for His Majesty's permission to wear medals conferred by private societies or institutions and commemorative medals cannot be entertained.

14. His Majesty will not grant permission to wear any foreign war medal if the person on whom it is to be or has been conferred was during the war acting in contravention of the Foreign Enlistment Act.

#### General.

15. Ladies are subject to the regulations in all respects in the same manner as men.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1919.

During the first half of the month conditions were dominated by an extensive anticyclone, and, though at times the weather was dull and misty, this proved a decidedly dry period over the whole of New Zealand. On the 17th a cyclonic disturbance made its appearance north-west of the Dominion; its centre was located in the north on the 18th and 19th, and passed off East Cape on the 20th. This storm brought some good rains, particularly over the North Island, and terminated the drought which had persisted for such a considerable time in these parts. From the 26th to the close of the month unsettled and showery weather prevailed when a small disturbance of a similar type to the above ruled in conjunction with a moderate westerly low-pressure area. On the 26th snow fell in many parts of the South Island.

Frosts were of frequent occurrence, especially in the South Island, and some particularly severe ones were recorded. The total rainfall exceeded the average in the North Auckland district, but all other parts of the Dominion experienced considerably less than the mean, the percentage below ranging from 12 per cent. in the extreme South to as much as 80 per cent. at some stations in the Canterbury District.

EAST COAST.—RIVER THAMES APPROACH.—ALEXANDRA CHANNEL.—INTENDED ALTERATIONS IN BUOYAGE.

Date of Alterations.—On or about 24th June, 1919.

1. Intended alteration in description of North-west Shingles buoy:—

Position.—At a distance of one mile, 7½ cables, 248° (S. 82° W. mag.), from North-west Shingles beacon. North-west Shingles beacon, lat. 51° 31½' N., long. 1° 11½' E.

Details.—The present spherical buoy will be replaced by a can buoy, painted in black and white chequers and fitted with a staff and cage.

2. North Girdler buoy to be re-established and description altered:—

Position.—At a distance of 2 miles, 6 cables, 239° (S. 73° W. mag.), from North-west Shingles beacon.

Details.—This buoy, which was withdrawn for war purposes, will be replaced in position, but will be painted in black and white vertical stripes instead of as formerly.
