And whereas on the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, a license was issued to the Frankton Town Board authorizing it to erect electric lines in the Frankton Town District, and on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, a license was issued to the Hamilton Borough Council authorizing it to erect electric lines in the Borough of Hamilton, and on the thirteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, a further license was issued to the Hamilton Borough Council authorizing it to erect electric lines in portion of the County of Waipa:

And whereas on the first day of April, one thousand nine

hundred and seventeen, the Boroughs of Frankton (formerly the Frankton Town District) and Hamilton were constituted

3. COVERING OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Electric lines at low pressure shall be covered throughout Electric lines at low pressure shall be covered throughout with triple braiding, thoroughly impregnated with weather-proof compound; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the written consent of the Minister obtained before the work is commenced, be bare. Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the written consent of the Minister obtained before the work is commenced, be here be bare.

Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare. Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all

ses be bare.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure lines or high-pressure lines the conductors of which are bare shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires."

Bare low-pressure and bare high-pressure electric lines erected with the written consent of the Minister shall be subject to the following conditions:

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a suitable raised platform is used the electric lines need not be so disconnected.

(b.) Where telegraph lines intersect or are menaced by the licensee's bare electric lines the licensee shall bear the neesse's pare electric lines the neesse shall cear the cost of insulating, protecting, and maintaining the insulation and protection of all telegraph lines, whether erected before or after the bare electric lines, and also the cost of all special work, and the maintenance thereof, which the Minister of Tele-

maintenance thereof, which the Minister of Telegraphs deems it necessary to carry out in consequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare.

(c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it is considered necessary that such bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines insulated in the manner prescribed in the first part of this clause, the licensee, at his own expense, shall insulate such here electric lines when requested shall insulate such bare electric lines when requested

to do so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(d.) When, in the opinion of the Minister, it is necessary in the interests of the public safety that the use of bare electric lines should be discontinued, the licensee shall, upon receiving notice from the Minister, substitute therefor electric lines covered in the

ter, substitute therefor electric lines covered in the manner prescribed by the first part of this clause.

(c.) Low-pressure wires, whether braided or bare, which at any portion of their length are carried on the same poles or supports as bare high-pressure lines or extrahigh-pressure lines shall be deemed to be "infected" throughout their entire length by such high-pressure or extra-high-pressure lines, and shall be subject to the regulations governing high-pressure and extrahigh-pressure lines respectively.

(f.) In the event of any dispute as to whether or not telegraph lines are menaced by the electric lines the decisio of the Minister of Telegraphs shall be final

decision of the Minister of Telegraphs shall be final.

4. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

5. Notices re Extensions, etc.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), shall be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Hamilton.

6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 5d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes, provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

7. Wiring Consumers' Premises.—Monopoly forbidden.

The licensee shall not grant or agree to grant any company, firm, or person the sole right to supply or erect the electric wiring on any consumer's premises, nor shall any consumer be required to purchase from the licensee or its assigns any material or apparatus for installing the electric wiring on such premises, or to have the work carried out by the licensee or its assigns, as a condition precedent to a supply of elec-trical energy being given by the licensee to the consumer.

8. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions of the regulations, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. BRAZIL.

EAST COAST.—RIO DE JANEIRO APPROACH.—RAZA ISLAND LIGHT.—CHARACTERISTIC.

The commanding officer of the U.S.S. "Westerdyk" reports that Raza Island light has been changed to show alternating flashing red and white every 5 seconds; total period, 10 seconds. Approx. position: 23° 3′ 40″ S., 43° 8′ 45″ W.

HAWAIIAN ISLANDS.

PEARL HARBOUR.—RADIO TIME-SIGNAL.—FURTHER Information.

The high-power radio station at Pearl Harbour, in longi-ide 157° 58' west, will, on 16th June. 1919 hegin unofficially tude 157° 58' west, will, on 16th June, 1919, begin unofficially to send a daily time-signal at Greenwich midnight (1.28 p.m. local time). The signals will be sent out simultaneously by high-power arc at 11,200 meters, and 5 K.W. spark system at 600 meters.

On and after 1st July, 1919, the signals will be considered official.

NORTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

SHOAL REPORTED.

Captain William Olson, of the schooner "S. G. Wilder," reports that on 6th March, 1919, in latitude 8° 17′ N., longitude 173° 25′ W., he passed close to a shoal approximately 100 ft. in diameter. The depth of water on the shoal,

s close as soundings could be gotten, was approximately as close as 3 fathoms.

Note.—This is in a portion of the ocean not well sounded, where other dangers whose existence is doubtful are charted.

EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO.

NETHERLANDS EAST INDIES.—DISTRESS-SIGNALS WITH REGARD TO HYDRO-AEROPLANES.

Netherlands hydro-aeroplanes in the East Indies when in distress will make the following signals by means of pyrotechnic lights :-

Signal.

Signification. (a.) A white pyrotechnic light Aerodrome to send a motorboat.

Aeroplane requires immediate assistance.

All persons observing these signals should in case (a) communicate by telephone to the aerodrome, and in case (b) send a boat to assist the hydro-aeroplane with all possible despatch.

AUSTRALIA.

SOUTH COAST, SPENCER GULF.—POINT LOWLY LIGHT.—LIGHT TO BE TEMPORARILY EXTINGUISHED.—PROVISIONAL LIGHT TO BE ESTABLISHED.

Mariners and others are hereby notified that the flashing white light with red sector on Point Lowly will be temporarily extinguished, and that a provisional flashing white light of low power, having the undermentioned characteristics, will be exhibited in its place, from about 2nd October, 1919, to about 22nd October, 1919:—

Position.—Lat. 33° S., long. 137° 47′ E.

Details.—Provisional light; to be exhibited from existing tower

Character.—Flashing white light, showing one flash every twelve and a half seconds, thus—flash 2½ secs., eclipse 10 secs.

Remarks.—The existing light will be extinguished from about 2nd October, 1919, to about 22nd October, 1919, pending repairs to the apparatus. During the interval the provisional light described above will be exhibited from the existing tower. The red sector shown at present from the existing light will be omitted from the provisional light, which will show white to seaward.

WIRELESS DIRECTION-FINDING STATIONS.

1. Wireless direction-finding (D.F.) stations are stations set up ashore equipped with receiving apparatus which enables them to ascertain the direction from which wireless signals transmitted by another station emanate.

2. The accuracy with which bearings can be taken depends on the conditions outlined below; but, although in general the bearings taken by a station within the sector over which it is designed to work can generally be considered accurate to within two degrees, the administrations controlling these stations cannot accept any responsibility for the consequences

to within two degrees, the administrations controlling these stations cannot accept any responsibility for the consequences of a bearing being inaccurate.

3. It is, however, pointed out that if at least three D.F. stations can be employed, and if they are so situated as to give intersecting bearings, considerable reliance can be placed upon the result of three simultaneous bearings thus obtained, provided that the "triangle of error" (sometimes called the "cocked hat") formed by the intersection of the bearings is small.

4. In order to obtain the greatest possible degree of accuracy, it is important that the ship should not transmit with too much power. Signals should, however, be fairly strong and clear; great care must be taken to keep the note and strength steady, and to pay strict attention to specing.

spacing.
5. It must be borne in mind that it is impossible for the majority of existing D.F. stations to distinguish between a bearing and its reciprocal (i.e., there is always a possible error of 180°), and that bearings are often unreliable at night and in very bad weather, also when the direction runs roughly parallel with the coast-line

parallel with the coast-line.
6. The methods of asking for and giving bearings and the waves to be used will shortly be standardized by International

agreement; and the particulars of the D.F. stations will eventually appear in the International list of radio-telegraph stations. Meanwhile, each country is publishing regulations governing the use of its own D.F. stations as set out below.

It should be noted that there are two principal systems

of D.F. stations at present in use, viz.:—

(a.) Where each D.F. station is fitted with transmitting and receiving gear and works independently of others :

(b.) Where several D.F. stations (all of them usually near a harbour entrance or difficult passage) are linked together by special land telegraph lines, being thus controlled by one station which alone is fitted with transmitting apparatus. The controlling-station in such cases is not necessarily a D.F. station, but may be an ordinary coast station.

Example.—A snip s.s. Nonsuch, call sign XYZ, calls up Chebucto Head in the ordinary way and, on receiving "K" (go on), makes the message as follows:—

"Call" S Radio Nonsuch 1, 5, 10 (day of month) 10.50

M (time) = Officer in Charge Chebucto Head = Request bearing = Master + XYZ.

11. The D.F. station will then acknowledge receipt of the

message, and, if not ready to take the bearing at once, will direct the ship to wait.

direct the ship to wait.

12. When ready to take the bearing, the D.F. station will make "K" (go on), whereupon the ship will make the figure "2" thirty times, commencing with the "Call" and ending with the "Cross" and her own call signal.

13. If the D.F. station is not satisfied with the bearing, it will make the "repeat" sign (?) and the ship will again make the figure "2" as above, but only twenty times.

14. In default of such request for a repetition, the D.F. station does not transmit until it is ready to give the bearing. To do so, the station calls the ship and sends (as a government.)

To do so, the station calls the ship and sends (as a government message) the TRUE bearing of the ship from the station in degrees from 0° to 359°, the angles being measured from true north (0°) clockwise through true east (90°), true south (180°), and true west (270°).

20. The station will, if necessary, direct the ship to wait, and, when ready for taking the bearing, will make "K" (go on)

21. The ship will then transmit-

(i.) Her own call signal repeated for 30 seconds.
(ii.) A "dash" 5 seconds long.

(iii.) Her own call signal thrice.
(iv.) A "dash" 5 seconds long.
(v.) Her own call signal thrice, then a "dash,"

(v.) Her own call signal thrice, then a "dash," and so on for one complete minute (i.e., for 1½ minutes in all), finishing with "K" (go on).

22. The station then calls the ship, and makes "QTE" followed by the true bearing in degrees (0° to 359°) as in para. 14, and the name of the D.F. station which obtained the bearing, or else "QTF" and the position in latitude and longitude. All numbers will be spelt out in words.

23. The ship acknowledges receipt by repeating back, in figures, the bearing or bearings or the position, as the case may be.

24. When working with independent stations ships should always ask for bearings. Controlling stations may be requested to give bearings or positions as the master may elect.

Note.—Ships with Marconi apparatus can adjust their transmitting gear very nearly to this wave (using reduced power) by cutting out half the primary transmitting condenser and adjusting the A.T.I. till the earth lamp shows maximum current in the aerial. The primary slider should be "all in."

27. The actual procedure to be adopted by ships requiring bearings will depend upon what stations are concerned. It should be observed that if the stations to be called do not all keep watch on the same wave (e.g., Malin Head and Larne), bearings should be asked for separately. If, on the other hand, the stations to be called all keep watch on the same wave (e.g., Lizard and Carnsore), they should be called up-together and the bearings taken in one operation. If, how-ever, two or more stations are linked by special land lines (e.g., Peterhead and Berwick), only one of them should be called up (i.e., the nearest of them which is fitted with trans-mitting apparatus). In such cases, however, the ship must specify in the preliminary signal the D.F. stations which are required to supply bearings.

28. The following abbreviations are to be used:-

Signal. Meaning.

QTE? "What is my true bearing from you (or from ——)?" "Your true bearing from me (or from — — degrees. was -

29. The ship calls the station or stations on the appropriate wave, making "QTE?" in conjunction, if necessary, with the

call signals of the stations from which bearings are required, and also (if the call is NOT made on 450 metres) by the figures "450," signifying that the ship will shift to 450 metres for the taking of the bearing. The ship then awaits instructions.

Example 1.

A ship whose call signal is XYZ requires bearings from Peterhead (BVL) and Berwick (BVG), and thinks that the latter is nearest.

The ship, having first shifted to 450 metres, calls Berwick

thus:— "Call" BVG BVG de XYZ QTE BVL BVG ? She then awaits instructions.

Example 2.

The ship requires a bearing from Seaview (BXK). ship has to use 600 metres to call Malin Head (GMH). She calls on 600 metres, thus:—

She then gets ready to shift to 450 metres and awaits

30. The station or stations called then make the necessary arrangements and, when ready, answer in alphabetical order of their call signals (if more than one was originally called) and make "K" (go on) preceded by "450" if 450 had been made in the original call.

Example 1.

Berwick, in Example 1 above, warns Peterhead by land line and, when both are ready, makes on 450 metres: "Call" XYZ de BVG K.

Example 2.

Malin Head, in Example 2 above, warns Seaview by land line and then makes on 600 metres:—
"Call" XYZ de GMH 450 K.

Malin Head then shifts to 450 metres so as to be ready to give the result when received by wire from Seaview.

31. On receiving "K," the ship, having shifted transmitting wave to 450 metres (if not already done), then makes her own call signal for 45 seconds and awaits the result.

$Example \ 1.$

The ship, in Example 1 above, makes on 450 metres:—
"Call" BVG de XYZ XYZ XYZ, &c. (for 45 seconds) XYZ.

Example 2.

The same as Example 1, reading GMH for BVG.

32. The station or stations then reply (in alphabetical order, if more than one) either asking the ship to repeat (?) or giving the result. The result is given by the signal QTE followed as necessary by the call signal and by a group of three figures (000 to 359) indicating the true bearing from 0° to 359°, reckoned as in paragraph 14, of the ship from the station. Several bearings can be combined into one message, each bearing immediately following the call signal of the station which took it. The time of handing in is always expressed in Greenwich mean time for all messages giving bearings to merchant ships.

Example 1.

Peterhead, in Example 1 above, is not satisfied with the bearing and informs Berwick. Berwick makes on 450 metres:—
"Call" XYZ de BVG?

The ship at once complies by making on 450 metres:—
"Call" BVG de XYZ XYZ XYZ, &c. (for 45 seconds) XYZ.

Peterhead is then satisfied that the bearing is 130° and informs Berwick, while Berwick finds that its own result is 37°. Berwick therefore makes 450 metres:—

"Call" XYZ XYZ de BVG 1 9.45 M (time) — QTE BVL 130 BVG 037 + BVG.

Example 2.

Seaview, in Example 2 above, gets a satisfactory bearing of 329° and informs Malin Head. The latter makes on 450

metres:—
"Call" XYZ XYZ de GMH 2 10.46 S (time) = QTE BXK 329 + GMH.

Example 3.

Had the ship merely asked Lizard (BVY) for a bearing, Lizard, finding it to be 246°, would make on 450 metres:—

"Call" XYZ XYZ de BVY 1 7.6 M (time) = QTE 246 + BVY.

33. The ship, on receiving the result, acknowledges receipt in the ordinary way, and makes the "end of work" sign. This sign is then repeated by the station or stations concerned. It is important that the "end of work" sign should not be

omitted, since it not only indicates that the operation is finished, but it also shows that all concerned are about to resume watch on their normal wave.

Vessels desiring to obtain a bearing from compass-stations which operate independently should call the station from which the bearing is desired, and request bearings by means of a conventional signal given below. Simultaneous bearings from two or more compass-stations can be obtained by making the call include the other compass-stations desired.

Vessels desiring to obtain their positions from harbour-entrance compass-stations should carry out the same proce-dure, with the exception that they call the compass-control station instead of the compass-station.

When bearings are requested simultaneously from two or

more independent compass-stations, the compass-station which is farthest north will supply the ship with its bearing first; the others will then follow in the order of their north to south or east to west geographical location.

The following abbreviated signals will be used until further notice :-

What is my true bearing? Signal. QTE ?

Your true bearing is ÕΤΕ degrees from ---- Radio Compass-station.

OTF?

What is my position?
Your position is latitude —— longitude —

The radio compass-station (or compass-control station for harbour-entrance compass-stations) will answer requests for bearings and positions in the customary manner of answering calls and follow their call letters with "K" if they desire to take the bearing at that time, "QRX" if they desire the vessel to stand by, or other abbreviated signal authorized by International Regulations by International Regulations.

On being told to "K," vessels desiring bearings or positions

will transmit their radio call letters for 30 seconds and then

make dashes 5 seconds long for one minute, making their call letters three times between each 5-second dash, and terminating with the conventional signal "K" (go ahead).

At the expiration of the direction-determining signals the

At the expiration of the direction-determining signals the radio compass-station (or compass-control station) will call the vessel, make "QTE," and send the bearing in degrees (0 to 359) and the name of the compass-station which obtained the bearing, or "QTF," and the position in latitude and longitude. Bearings and positions will always be transmitted to the vessel in words, to avoid error.

The vessel acknowledges receipt of bearings and positions by making the call letters of the station transmitting the bearing or position once, "DE," vessel's radio call letters, and then repeats the bearing or position received, using numerals.

Independent radio compass-stations keep watch on 600 metres, and this wave-length should always be used to call these stations; but as soon as they answer naval vessels will shift to tune "M" (952 metres), all transmission from the vessel being carried out thereafter on this wave-length.

the vessel being carried out thereafter on this wave-length.

The control stations for harbour-entrance radio compassstations keep watch on 600 and 952 metres. Naval vessels
will call these stations on 952 metres and carry out all tests
and communication with them thereafter on 952 metres.

Merchant vessels will call all radio compass and compasscontrol stations on 600 metres and carry out all tests and
communication with them thereafter on this wave-length.

Vessels should note that shore radio compass-stations can
not distinguish between the bearing of a ship and its reciprocal
unless the reciprocal bears inland. There is, therefore, a possibility of an error of 180 degrees; in such cases the decision is
left to the ship as to which is her correct bearing.

Subject to the foregoing, bearings should be accurate
within 1 degree of arc. When bearings from three or more
compass-stations are not over 1 degree of arc in error but
do not meet at a fixed point, the centre of an area enclosed

do not meet at a fixed point, the centre of an area enclosed by the bearings can generally be taken as the approximate position of the vessel.

The primary object of these radio compass-stations is to assist in the navigation of vessels during atmosphere of low visibility. They are operated by the Navy Department, and there is no charge for the service.

There follows a complete list of shore radio compass-stations

on the Atlantic and Gulf coasts and their corrected positions. All of these stations are not, however, in operation as yet.

RADIO TIME-SIGNALS.
