Proclaiming a Road-line laid out through Subdivisions of Taumataoteo Block to be a Public Road.

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto was, by an order of the Native Land Court made on the nineteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, duly laid out as a road-line in pursuance of section one hundred and seventeen of the Native Land Act, 1909:

And whereas by section two of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1918, it is provided that where any road-line has heretofore been laid out under the said section one hundred and seventeen and has not been proclaimed as a public road, then such road-line may be proclaimed as a public road under section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, subject, however, to the conditions prescribed by section fifty-one of the last-mentioned Act and section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that in the public interest the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-line as a public road has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned, in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-line should be proclaimed as a public road:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New

Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, do hereby proclaim as a public road the road-line described in the Schedule hereto.

NOTE.—A good winter month, with sunshine considerably above the mean of previous years; and precipitation, the major portion of which was recorded from the 13th to the close of the month, was of a showery nature, the total fall being 52 per cent. below the average. Total bright sunshine 134 hours 20 minutes, and three sunless days. Hail fell on the 25th. Frost was recorded on the grass on thirteen mornings, the lowest reading being 18.5° on the 2nd. Mean earth temperature at 1 ft. was 48.2°, and 51.9° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 42.5°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.272 in.; and mean relative humidity, 79 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1919.

High atmospheric pressure was continuous in the northern districts during the first half of June, and (except on the 10th and 11th, when a moderate westerly depression passing in the south accounted for changeable and squally conditions in parts) the weather during this period generally proved fair, with cold nights. Between the 16th and 24th an intense and extensive antarctic disturbance held sway, and was responsible for boisterous conditions, particularly on the 22nd, when the barometer at the Bluff fell as low as 28.78 in. The trough passed to the eastward on the 23rd, but a secondary disturbance at this time developed in the north, and on the 25th very heavy rain fell in parts of Hawke's Bay, several stations recording over 6 in. for the twenty-four hours. Some snow was also reported along the east coast of both Islands on the 25th and 26th. On the 28th pressure again decreased in the South, and the last three days of the month proved very unsettled in districts with a westerly aspect.

The aggregate rainfall was considerably above the average in South Otago and in the Hawke's Bay and Wanganui districts, and slightly so in parts of Canterbury and Westland, while elsewhere it was generally below.

Amendment to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations (relating to the training of cadets, Electrical Engineering Branch, Public Works Department) made under the said Act on the twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, as amended by notice published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, further amend the said regulations in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto. Including the suburban portions, the rate at Dunedin is the highest, Auckland next highest, Wellington and Christchurch with equal rates following.

Conferring on Matau River Board certain Powers of a Drainage Board.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of August, 1919.

Present:
HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, that the Governor-General may, subject to such restrictions, modifications, and conditions as he thinks fit, from time to time by Order in Council confer upon any specified River Board such of the powers of a Drainage Board as he thinks fit: And whereas it is expedient to confer on the Matau River Board certain of the powers of a Drainage Board:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him in that behalf by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby confer upon the said Board all the powers exercisable by a duly constituted Drainage Board under section fourteen, sections seventeen to thirty (inclusive), and sections thirty-eight to forty (inclusive) of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and section two of the Land Drainage Amendment Act, 1908, subject, however, to the following restrictions, modifications, and conditions, namely:—

1. Section 14 shall only apply with respect to the powers conferred by this Order in Council.
2. All drainage-works to be constructed shall be paid for out of the proceeds of special loans secured by special rates over defined areas.
3. All special rates in respect of drainage-works shall be levied on a graduated scale according to a classification made by the Board of the rateable property within the area affected by the works.
4. Separate accounts shall be kept in respect of all drainage operations, and all moneys received in respect thereof shall be paid into a separate bank account.
5. Moneys payable as compensation in respect of land taken for drainage-works shall be paid out of the separate bank account.

6. Sections 38 to 40 shall only apply to the raising of special loans for the purpose of exercising any of the powers conferred by sections 17 to 30.

7. The powers conferred by this Order in Council shall be exercised subject to the provisions of section 88 of the Land Drainage Act, 1908.
