Land withdrawn from State-forest Reservation

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and published in *Gazette* of the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, certain lands in Jacob's River Hundred, Southland Land District, were, *inter alia*, set apart as and for State forests in terms of the New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885:

And whereas the bush upon the land described in the Schedule hereto (being part of the lands so set apart) has been cut, and it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be rescinded in so far as it relates to the land described in the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-eight of the State Forests Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby rescind the Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, hereinbefore referred to, in so far as it relates to the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of

the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations made by the said Order in Council of the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, by adding to the proviso therein the following rivers and streams and their tributaries: "The Pakuratahi Stream (Hutt County) and the Makuri River (Pahiatua County)."

The holder of a trout-fishing license may fish for salmon and trout in any river from the 1st day of October, 1919, to the 30th day of April, 1920; provided that no person shall take or catch more than six salmon in any one day.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six, subsection one, of the Appropriation Act, 1915, it is provided that, notwithstanding any Act to the contrary, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority or for any Harbour Board, during the present war with Germany, to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than by way of bank overdraft within the limit of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any other authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the loans set out in column "B" therein:

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the raising of the loans hereinafter mentioned by the several local authorities set out in the Schedule hereto, provided that the rate of interest at which the loans or any of them are to be raised shall in no case produce to the lender a return exceeding five and one-quarter pounds per centum per annum; and it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Appropriation Act, 1915, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor-General in Council to the raising of the loans hereby authorized.

Native Minister, any Maori Council has failed properly to carry out the duties imposed upon it by section eight of the Maori Councils Amendment Act, 1903, with respect to the registration of dogs, or to enter into an arrangement with a European local authority as authorized by that section, the Governor-General may by Order in Council confer upon any such European local authority all the powers and functions of the Maori Council with respect to the registration of dogs in the district of that Maori Council:

And whereas the Native Minister is of opinion that the Tauranga Maori Council has failed properly to carry out its duties with respect to the registration of dogs owned by Maoris, or to enter into an agreement with a European local authority as authorized as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section sixteen of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby confer all the powers and functions with regard to the registration of dogs hitherto held by the Tauranga Maori Council upon the Tauranga County Council.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Woolsey Allen, jun., of Dargaville (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Grahamsfern, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to maintain thereon a wharf, erected in accordance with plan marked M.D. 2183, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for a period of three years, computed from the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee for the period mentioned, and upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the wharf is erected, as more particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for such wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 2183, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2, in advance, payable on the 1st day of March, dating from the 1st day of March, 1919, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the wharf without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of three years, computed from the 1st day of March, 1919, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges are altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister, by the Harbourmaster at Kaipara, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Regulations under the Distillation Act, 1908.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-sixth day of August, 1919.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Distillation Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. EVERY still for which a license has been issued under the Distillation Act, 1908, and the premises upon which it is situated, shall at all times be open to the inspection of an Officer of Customs or other person deputed for that purpose by an Inspector of Distilleries.
2. The following provisions shall apply to stills licensed under section 12 of the Distillation Act, 1908 :—
 - (a.) Every licensed still in the possession of the owner or occupier of any vineyard shall be kept under the Crown lock when not in use.
 - (b.) At least three days before the licensee intends to use his still he shall give notice to the Collector of Customs of such intention, in the form numbered 1 of the Schedule hereto, stating the particulars therein required.
 - (c.) Any Officer of Distilleries, Officer of Customs, or Officer of Police shall have power to take, without payment, a sample not exceeding in quantity one quart of any wine or lees of wine, or other liquor intended to be distilled. He may also ascertain the exact quantity of wine, lees of wine, or other liquor presented for distillation.
 - (d.) After any distillation has been completed, any residues or low wines containing spirit may, at the option of the licensee, be either destroyed or retained for the next operation, in which latter case the quantity thereof shall be ascertained and the said residues or low wines shall be placed under the Crown lock.
 - (e.) All spirits produced shall be kept in casks or other containers approved by an Inspector of Distilleries. Such casks or containers shall be numbered consecutively, and each shall have legibly painted thereon the name of the licensee and the words "Spirits for fortifying Wine," with figures representing the number of gallons contained therein; also the date of distillation.
 - (f.) Before any distillation is commenced the Officer shall take an account of all wine, lees of wine, or other liquor intended to be distilled, and after distillation has taken place he shall take an account of the quantity and strength of the spirits produced.
 - (g.) The cellar or storeroom required to be provided by section 109 of the Distillation Act, 1908, shall be kept for the storage of spirits and the spirituous residues of distillation only.
 - (h.) When spirits are required for fortifying wine the licensee shall give notice in writing to the Collector or Officer in the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto, stating the amount required and the quantity of wine to be fortified.

(i.) The Officer shall see that any spirits delivered are actually used in fortifying wine made by the licensee, and the Officer shall certify to that effect upon the form numbered 2 in the Schedule hereto.

DEFINING STOCK ROUTE THROUGH AVONDALE ROAD DISTRICT.
 FROM and after the coming into force of this by-law,—

1. No person shall drive, or cause or suffer to be driven, any loose cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or goats through the Avondale Road District except by the following route, which the Avondale Road Board hereby declares to be the stock route for this district, viz.—

(a.) For cattle, &c., coming from the western (New Lynn) side: By way of Karaka Street to its junction with Taylor Street, thence by way of Taylor Street, Sewell Street, Donovan Street, and White Swan Road.

(b.) For cattle, &c., coming from the eastern (Mount Albert, Mount Roskill) side: By way of White Swan Road, Donovan Street, Sewell Street, Taylor Street, and Karaka Street.

Provided that this by-law shall not apply in case of loose cattle, horses, sheep, or pigs being driven to any *bona fide* destination for delivery in or from any *bone fide* point of origin within the Point Chevalier Road District.

2. No person shall drive, or cause or suffer to be driven, any horses or cattle (not in harness or yoke) in herd or mob exceeding five head, or sheep, pigs, or goats in a herd or mob exceeding twenty-five, along any part of the Great North Road between the junction of Station Road and the Great North Road, or along Blake Street, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

The penalty for breach of either of above by-laws shall be a fine not exceeding £5 for every breach.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
