Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circum-stances permit the lines may, with the written consent of the Minister obtained before the work is commenced, be bare. Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare. Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all eases here.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure lines or high-pressure lines, the conductors of which are bare, shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires." Bare low-pressure and bare high-pressure electric lines erected with the written consent of the Minister shall be subject to the following conditions :— (a) The electric lines when which weathing are appended

- Telegraphs deems necessary to carry out in con-sequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare. (c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it
- is considered necessary that such bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines insulated in the manner prescribed in the first part of this clause, the licensee, at his own expense, shall insulate such bare electric lines when requested to do so by the Minister of Telegraphe do so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

 (d.) When, in the opinion of the Minister, it is necessary in the interests of the public safety that the use of bare electric lines should be discontinued, the licensee shall, upon receiving notice from the Minister, substitute therefor, electric lines covered in the manner prescribed by the first part of this clause.
 (e.) Low-pressure wires, whether braided or bare, which at any portion of their length are carried on the same
- any portion of their length are carried on the same poles or supports as bare high-pressure lines or extra-high-pressure lines shall be deemed to be "infected" throughout their entire length by such high-pressure

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or extra-high-pressure lines, and shall be subject to the regulations governing high-pressure and extra-high-pressure lines respectively.

(f.) In the event of any dispute as to whether or not telegraph lines are menaced by the electric lines, the decision of the Minister of Telegraphs shall be final.

5. NOTICES re EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary; Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Wellington.

6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 10d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 5d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting pur-poses" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

7. WIRING CONSUMERS' PREMISES .- MONOPOLY FORBIDDEN.

The licensee shall not grant or agree to grant any company, firm, or person the sole right to supply or erect the electric wiring on any consumer's premises, nor shall any consumer be required to purchase from the licensee or its assigns any material or apparatus for installing the electric wiring on such premises, or to have the work carried out by the licensee or its assign approximately approximately the sense. or its assigns, as a condition precedent to a supply of electrical energy being given by the licensee to the consumer.

8. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions of the regulations, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. The hours of attendance to be observed by officers not subject to special regulations or departmental arrangements in that behalf, or not specially exempted by the Commissioner or by the Permanent Head, shall be from 8.30 o'clock a.m. to 12.30 o'clock p.m., and from 1.30 o'clock p.m. to 4.30 o'clock p.m., except on Saturdays, when the hours of attendance shall be from 8.30 o'clock a.m. to 11.30 o'clock a.m. Where the nature of the work will not, in the public interest, admit of the general observance of this regulation the Permanent Head shall recommend, and the Commissioner shall prescribe, the hours of duty. The Commissioner may also at any time, by notification in the New Zealand Gazette, alter such hours of business from such date as he may determine, and such amended hours shall then continue until altered by a similar notification.

Regulation No. 10 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor :---

10. Attendance-books shall be accessible for record and signature before 8.30 a.m., 12.30 p.m., 1.30 p.m., and 4.30 p.m. every day. At 8.35 a.m. and 1.35 p.m. a line shall be ruled under the last signature therein by the officer deputed to do so. This regulation may be modified by the Commissioner to suit the special requirements of any Department. If at any time the hours of commencing and closing work are altered, the times herein mentioned shall also be altered in conformity thereto.

Regulation No. 13 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor :----

13. Any officer not subject to special regulations in that behalf, or not specially exempted, arriving at his office after 8.35 a.m. or 1.35 p.m., or such other time as he is required by Regulations 8 and 10 to be in attendance, shall report himself to the officer in charge or subcharge, who shall record the time of his arrival in the attendancebook; and if a satisfactory explanation be not forthcoming, his conduct shall be brought under the notice of the Permanent Head as a breach of the regulations.

Regulation No. 22 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor :---

22. Any officer may be temporarily transferred from one branch of a Department to another by the Permanent Head, and may be required to perform any and every duty assigned to any officer in any class; provided that such transference shall not be continued for a longer period than twenty-eight days without the consent of the Commissioner.

The following new regulation is hereby made :---

92A. The elected member shall be deemed to be a member of the Board on and from the day on which the Returning Officer declares him to be duly elected.

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163A. The Commissioner may, if he thinks fit, from time to time transfer from the General Division to the Seventh Class of the Clerical Division any person who has served for at least two years in the General Division, and who has passed the examination prescribed for candidates for appointment to the Clerical Division; provided that on transfer an officer shall not be entitled to receive a salary in excess of the amount that he would have received had he been appointed in the first instance as a Cadet to the Seventh Class of the Clerical Division. Every person so transferred shall, so far as seniority for promotion is concerned, be placed at the bottom of the class to which he is transferred.

Regulation No. 173, as amended on the 2nd March, 1916, is hereby further amended by deleting the words "and 15th September if it is accompanied with a receipt for a late fee of one pound," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "and 22nd September if it is accompanied with a receipt for a late fee of ten shillings."

Regulation No. 181, as amended on the 1st April, 1914, the 29th July, 1915, and the 11th April, 1918, is hereby further amended by deleting the programmes in the subjects (22) Woodwork and (23) Metalwork, and inserting in lieu thereof the following :--

(22.) Woodwork.—Drawing.—How to test the accuracy of drawing-instruments, and rectify errors; construction of plain scales; drawing to scale from dimensioned sketches or from models or articles made in the workshop; hand sketching; plans, elevations, sections (easy cases only), and oblique projections of geometrical solids the surfaces of which are bounded by straight lines, and of articles made in the workshop.

Tools and Timbers.—The classification, description (illustrated by hand sketches), proper uses, and correct handling of tools, care of tools; hardening, grinding, and sharpening; the functions of their several parts; the mechanical principles underlying their construction and manipulation.

A knowledge of the geographical distribution, appearance, and general character (including structure of trunk and limbs) of trees from which the timbers in common use in New Zealand are obtained; the countries and ports from which New Zealand receives its supplies of foreign timbers; the forms in which timber is brought into the market; the growth, felling, conversion, seasoning, storage, and preservation of timber; measurement of timber; selection of timber for particular purposes; methods of working hard and soft woods; appearance, characteristic properties (including specific gravity), and defects of timbers. Candidates may be required to identify specimens of timbers in common use.

Bench-work.—Measuring and setting out work; dressing a piece of timber truly; principles to be observed in designing joints and fastenings; the construction of useful and ornamental articles providing opportunities for practice in the following processes, fasteningdevices, and joints: Processes—sawing, planing, paring, grooving and trenching, slotting, gouging, cutting curves, shaping and filing, chamfering; fastening-devices—nails, screws, glue dowels, pins, cleats, keys, and wedges; joints—the ordinary joints, including haunched mortise and tenon, bridle, mitre, common dovetail.

The examination in woodwork will consist of a written examination and a practical test.

In addition, every candidate in the subject of woodwork is required to hand to the Supervisor at the examination a piece of woodwork copied from a typical example or designed by him, as a specimen of his work performed under ordinary workshop conditions. The specimen is to be made during the two months immediately preceding the date of the examination, and is to be accompanied by the freehand sketch or the finished drawing from which the piece of work was executed. With the specimen of work there must be sent a certificate signed by the Class Instructor and the Director of the school that the work is the candidate's unaided effort, executed without the supervision or direction of the Instructor.

(23.) Metalwork.—Drawing.—Use of T square and set-squares, compasses, dividers, and protractors. How to test accuracy of drawing-instruments, and how to rectify errors. The use of the foot rule, metric rule, and callipers; calculations based on measurements taken by these; candidates will be expected to measure with approximate accuracy to one-hundredth of an inch. Making approximately accurate hand sketches of simple geometrical solids and of objects such as tools, simple machine parts, &c.; the use of squared paper for hand sketching. Construction of plain scales; plans, elevations, sections, and oblique projections of geometrical solids the surfaces of which are bounded by straight lines, and of simple objects based thereon. Drawing to scale from actual parts, dimensioned photographs, or partially completed dimensioned sketches, such tools and simple machines or machine parts, instruments, &c., as pupils who have taken a two-years course in metalwork or in elementary mechanical engineering should be familiar with.

Instruments, Tools, Materials, &c.—The description, use, and care of the various measuring and testing instruments, hand tools, and simple machines used in metalwork or elementary engineering. The description of simple mechanical operations. Methods of setting out work from drawings, and the various operations involved in the completion of a simple piece of metalwork. Characteristic properties of the commoner metals used in metalwork, such as iron, steel, copper, brass, zinc, and sheet tin, and their preparation for workshop requirements.

Bench and Forge Work.—Exercises requiring the use of the hammer, chisel, file, and scraper; easy exercises involving the cutting, bending, and joining of cold sheet metal; various methods of fastening metals, such as riveting, screwing, soldering, and brazing; very elementary forge work, such as bending, drawingdown, upsetting (but not welding), hardening, and tempering a cutting-tool, such as chisel, cross-cut, flat, drill, or lathe tool.

The examination in metalwork will consist of a written examination and a practical test.

In addition, every candidate in the subject of metalwork is required to hand to the Supervisor at the examination a piece of metalwork copied from a typical example or designed by him, as a specimen of his work performed under ordinary workshop conditions. The specimen is to be made during the two months immediately preceding the date of the examination, and is to be accompanied by the freehand sketch or the finished drawing from which the piece of work was executed. With the specimen of work there must be sent a certificate signed by the Class Instructor and the Director of the school that the work is the candidate's unaided effort, executed without the supervision or direction of the Instructor.

The regulation is hereby still further amended by adding the following :---

(24.) Machine Drawing.—Use and care of drawing-instruments, including scales, pencils, pens, compasses, dividers, protractors, setsquares, and T square. How to test the accuracy of drawing-instruments, and how to correct errors. Hand sketching in plan, elevation, and section. Use of squared paper. Measuring simple machine parts, determining position of centre lines, and dimensioning sketches. Sketching simple machine parts from memory. Drawing centre lines, and completing plans, elevations, and sections to scale in pencil from dimensioned sketches of simple machine parts. Tracing in ink, and dimensioning, &c. Construction of scales, projections of simple solids, simple loci, point paths of the slider-crank, and four-crank chains; construction of ellipse, parabola, hyperbola, and sine curve, or elevation of the helix; the representation of screws. Details of nuts, bolts, studs, rivets, cotters, keys, pins, and other fastenings and locking devices.

Every candidate for examination in machine drawing will be required to hand to the Supervisor at the examination his note-books for the previous year's work, together with a specimen or specimens of work done in the drawing office within a period of three months preceding the date of examination, such specimen work to be accompanied by a certificate signed by the Class Instructor and the Director of the school that the work is the candidate's unaided effort, executed without the supervision or direction of the Instructor.

(25.) Workshop Practice .- The use of scales, callipers, and micrometer and vernier callipers, measurement to ordinary tolerances in fitting and machine work. Simple workshop calculations, including questions involving elementary mensuration, elementary geometry of the straight line and triangle, and algebra to the solution of simple The characteristics and properties of the commoner equations. metals and alloys employed in metalwork, such as iron, steels, copper, brass, zinc, aluminium, &c.

The description, use, and care of setting-out, measuring, and testing instruments and of hand tools. The setting-out of a simple piece of work from the drawing. Bench, forge, and lathe work of a very simple character, drilling, hand riveting, soldering, and brazing.

The examination will consist of a written examination and a practical test.

Every candidate for examination in workshop practice will be required to hand to the Supervisor at the examination his note-books for the previous year's work, together with a specimen or specimens of work done in the workshop within a period of three months preceding the date of examination, such specimen work to be accompanied by a certificate signed by the Class Instructor and the Director of the school that the work is the candidate's unaided effort, executed without the supervision or direction of the Instructor.

Regulation No. 197 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor :-

197. Except in Departments in which special regulations apply, no officer appointed to the Clerical Division after the 1st April, 1913, shall receive a salary exceeding £180 per annum until he shall have passed a practical test in the following subjects :-

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F OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free. By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to con-tinue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed. The following classes of deaf children are admitted to

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a chari-table or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child re-sides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
