WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and published in Gazette of the ninth day of that month, certain lands in Wakamarina and Heringa Survey Districts, Marlborough Land District, were, inter alia, set apart as and for State forests in terms of the New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885:
