WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), as amended by the Rabbit Nuisance Amendment Act, 1918, it is provided that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, on petition in that behalf from a majority of the ratepayers therein, constitute and declare any part of New Zealand defined in such Order in Council a district for the purposes of Part III of the said Act:

And whereas a petition in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has been received, asking that the lands described in the Schedule hereto be constituted and declared a rabbit district for the purposes of Part III of the said Act:

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by that section, and by section one hundred and eleven of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913 (as amended by section eight of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend for a further period of eighteen months the Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and gazetted the eighteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, prohibiting all alienation of the Native land specified in the Schedule hereto, other than alienation in favour of the Crown.

Prescribing Dues for the Use of Mr. William Nepean McIntosh's Wharf at Orapiu Bay, Waiheke Island.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the eleventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 109, of the sixteenth day of the same month, William Nepean McIntosh, of Onehunga (hereinafter called "the licensee"), was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Orapiu Bay, Waiheke Island, as shown on plan marked M.D. 4496, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect thereon a wharf as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for a period of fourteen years computed from the eleventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen :

And whereas it is considered expedient to prescribe dues to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the dues set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be taken and received by the licensee for the use of the said wharf.

SCHEDULE.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay for the use thereof as follows, that is to say :—

For every vessel a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any vessel laying at the said wharf, or shall lay at the said wharf undergoing repairs or fitting-out only, or shall lay off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

GOODS WHARFAGE.

Every person who shall use the said wharf for landing or shipping any goods shall, before using same, pay dues as follows, that is to say :—

1. For all goods landed on the said wharf, a rate of 2s. 6d. per ton, weight or measurement, at the option of the licensee.
2. For every head of cattle or horses landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 2s. 6d. per head.
3. For every yearling or calf so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1s. per head.
4. For every head of sheep or small cattle so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 6d. per head.
5. If any ship shall use the said wharf for the discharge of any goods or cargo after the usual working-hours, or on wharf holidays, such ship shall pay to the licensee for the use of the said wharf a charge at the rate of 1s. per ton on all goods or cargo so discharged from such ship.

This charge will only be made when, in the opinion of the Wharfinger, it is necessary to employ labour to stack or remove cargo in sheds in consequence of the discharge of such goods or cargo as aforesaid.

PASSENGERS.

For every passenger who shall land on or be shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1s.

GOODS STORAGE.

Any person storing goods on wharf or in shed may be charged for such goods at the following rates :—

For every package or parcel—	
Not exceeding 30 lb. in weight, per day or part of a day	s. d. 0 1
Exceeding 30 lb. but not exceeding 100 lb., per day or part of a day	0 2
Exceeding 100 lb. but not exceeding 5 cwt., per day or part of a day	0 3

Storage to be charged on the expiration of twelve hours after goods have been landed on the wharf.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendments shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendments shall have effect from and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

AMENDMENTS.

REGULATION 181, as amended on the 8th April, 1914, 29th July, 1915, 11th April, 1918, and the 11th September, 1919, is hereby further amended by deleting the programmes in the subjects (4) Elementary Home Science and (5) Geography, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

(4.) *Elementary Home Science.*—Two papers, (a) and (b):—

(a.) British and metric systems of measurements. Measurement of the volume of solids and liquids. Use of the balance. How to find the relative density of solids and liquids. Principle of Archimedes. Principle and use of hydrometer, lactometer. Expansion by heat of solids, liquids, and gases. Thermometers. Conductors and non-conductors. Ventilation and heating of rooms.

Simple experiments illustrating chemical action, the difference between chemical compounds and mixtures and between physical and chemical change. Solution, crystallization, emulsion. Simple experiments involving air and the light thrown on the properties of its constituents thereby. Oxidation, and the formation of oxides. Combustion (fire, candle, Bunsen burner and its application to gas stoves). The important properties of carbon and of hydrogen. Simple experiments illustrating the properties and composition of water; hard and soft water; chief impurities of water; distillation; ice and steam.

An elementary study of sulphuric acid, of caustic soda, and of chalk, common salt, and blue vitriol as examples of acids, alkalis, and salts respectively.

(b.) Simple experiments and investigations bearing on the following: (1) The chief properties of acetic acid, fats and oils, soaps, sugar, starch, gluten, and albumen; (2) composition and action of common baking-powder; (3) milk, its composition, impurities, and preservation; (4) the proportion of water in different foods; (5) changes in foods due to the agents of digestion; (6) changes in weight and character of foods in cooking; (7) principles on which the various methods of cooking foods are based.

(5.) *Geography.*—(a.) Physical and Mathematical Geography, as follows: The approximate size and form of the earth; its daily rotation; the north and south line; latitude and longitude, meridians and parallels, local time; annual revolution of the earth round the sun; the altitude of the sun at the equinoxes and at the solstices; the inclination of the earth's axis to the plane of its orbit; the length of the day; the zones, the seasons, winds and currents (treated in an elementary way), trade-winds, monsoons. Rudimentary notions of climate. Phases of the moon, eclipses and tides (elementary). Scales of maps and easy map-reading. The work of rain, ice, rivers, and the sea. Vegetable life at different seasons and in different zones. Typical animal life in different parts of the earth.

(b.) The physical, political, and economic geography of the British Empire.

(c.) An elementary knowledge of the geography of the rest of the world (including great geographical discoveries, and the chief trade routes of the world).

(The requirements are based on the programme of work prescribed for Standard VI in Public Schools, but will be somewhat more advanced in character.)

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1919.

During the month of August the total rainfall exceeded the average in the southern half of the South Island and in the Hawke's Bay and Gisborne districts of the North Island, while elsewhere it was generally deficient. Precipitation was usually of a showery nature, but fairly general rains occurred about the 1st, between the 15th and 17th, and from the 28th to the close of the month.

Disturbances were somewhat frequent and chiefly of a westerly type, with lowest pressure passing south of the Dominion. The most notable depression, however, was a cyclone which apparently developed off the New South Wales coast about the 25th, and came within effective distance of the Dominion on the 28th. Its centre passed down the west coast of New Zealand between the 28th and 31st, and on the morning of the latter day was located off Puysegur Point. During this period stormy conditions were experienced in many parts. Anti-cyclones were in evidence at various times, but owing to their centres passing too far north or south they were never favourable to settled conditions over the Dominion as a whole. Though brief periods of fair weather were experienced in different parts, the weather generally was of an unsettled nature.

MANAWATU RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Manawatu Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 27th day of August, 1917, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the property situated in the district of Manawatu, and known as the Awapuni Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.
3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—
 - (a.) Bookmakers.
 - (b.) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
 - (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
