A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eleventh day of that month, the land described in the Schedule hereto was declared to be a reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908:

And whereas the said land is no longer suitable for scenic purposes owing to the absence of scenic bush thereon:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section eight of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby revoke the reservation for scenic purposes over the land described in the Schedule hereto.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and published in *Gazette* of the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, certain lands in Oteramika Hundred, Southland Land District, were, *inter alia*, set apart as and for State forests in terms of the New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885:

And whereas, the said license having expired, the company has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy that portion of the foreshore hereinbefore mentioned in order to maintain the said booms constructed thereon, and it is advisable to grant the said license for the period and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on plan marked M.D. 2888 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of maintaining the said booms constructed thereon; such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 18th day of September, 1919, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the company may be required to remove the booms at its own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned booms in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary

lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said booms and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such booms, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The company shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the booms, or by contact with them, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on its part.

9. In case the company shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said booms for a period of thirty days;

(3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or

(4.) WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor-General in Council may from time to time make regulations, which shall have general force and effect throughout the Dominion, or particular force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein, for, amongst other things, prescribing conditions and restrictions for the regulating of fishing and the taking of fish, and for prohibiting the use of any particular engines, tackles, or apparatus for taking any fish :

And whereas it is desirable to prohibit the taking of fish by trawling and the use of trawl-nets in a portion of the Bay of Plenty :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall haul or use a trawl-net for the purpose of taking fish in that portion of the Bay of Plenty which is within three miles of high-water mark of ordinary spring tides of that portion of the mainland lying between the northern head of Whangamata River entrance and Koronohina Point. As the said portion of the Bay of Plenty is delineated on the plan marked M.D. 3063, deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and thereon coloured pink.
2. Any person committing a breach of clause 1 of these regulations is liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

*Regulations relating to the Importation of Potatoes into the  
Commonwealth of Australia.—Notice No. 1984.*

Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce,  
Wellington, 29th October, 1919.

THE following particulars, taken from the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* of 18th September, 1919, of the restrictions on the importation of potatoes into the Commonwealth are published for general information:—

The Proclamation published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* of 18th October, 1917, is repealed, and it is now proclaimed that the importation of potatoes into any part of Australia from any country is prohibited unless—

1. They are accompanied by an official certificate, dated and signed by a responsible officer of a Government Department of the country of origin, identifying the potatoes, specifying the quantity, and certifying—

(a.) That at the date of the issue of the certificate they were free from *Phytophthora infestans* (known as Irish Blight); *Synchytrium endobioticum* (known as potato canker, black scab, warty disease, and cauliflower disease in potatoes); *Spongospora subterranea* (known as powdery scab); and all other serious diseases.

(b.) That they were grown in the country named.

(c.) That they were grown on premises known after due investigation not to be or to have been during the preceding twelve months infected with any of the said diseases.

(d.) That they were packed in the country of origin in clean, new packages.

2. The bags, crates, or other packages containing the potatoes are marked on the outside with the name of the country of origin and with other distinguishing mark or marks.

3. The potatoes, after being landed, are planted in quarantine in a quarantine station, and after having matured are, with the product of their cultivation, found on inspection to be free from disease.

Provided that no consignment of potatoes shall exceed 14 lb. in weight, unless the potatoes are imported by or on behalf of a State Government:

Provided further that the Minister may permit potatoes which are certified by a Quarantine Officer to be free from disease, to be imported under and subject to such conditions as the Minister may think fit to impose, for use as food.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
