A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor-General by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the said petition and in the Schedule hereto, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

And whereas it is desirable that the said area be constituted a town district:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Kaikohe Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five members.

SCHEDULE.

KAIKOHE TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, situated in Block XV, Omapere Survey District, bounded, commencing at the north-eastern corner of Taraire No. 1B 1c Block, towards the north generally by the Mangamutu Stream to the north-eastern boundary of Taraire No. 1F 1d Block; towards the north-east generally by Taraire No. 2 Block, by the Mangamutu Stream aforesaid, and the Wairoa River to the boundary between Kohewhata Nos. 6 and 40 Blocks; towards the south generally by the aforesaid Kohewhata No. 6 Block and its south-western boundary to a point the production of the south-eastern boundary of Kohewhata No. 47

Block; thence to and by the aforesaid boundary of Kohewhata No. 47 Block, 1682, 50, and 37.5 links; thence by right lines intersecting the last-mentioned block, 402.5, 912.3, and 664.7 links, to the north-eastern corner of Kohewhata part No. 69 Block, and by that block to its north-western corner; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Rangihamama C Block, by that block and Rangihamama No. 1 Block, by the Waikaka Stream, by Tuhuna Nos. 16 and 15 Blocks, by the crossing of the Taheke-Ohaeawai Road to the south-east corner of Tuhuna No. 11 Block, by its southern boundary, by the Waikotihe Block and the south side of the road forming the southern boundary of Tuhuna No. 7B Block, part of the northern boundary of Tuhuna No. 7D Block, and intersecting Tuhuna No. 7c Block; towards the west generally by Tuhuna No. 6 Block and Tuhuna No. 2 Block; and towards the north-west generally by Taraire No. 1o 3, No. 1c (part), and No. 1r (parts) Blocks, to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned block, by the northern boundaries of Taraire No. 1z 2, No. 1v (part), No. 1x 1b (part) Blocks, the crossing of a public road, by the eastern boundary of Taraire No. 1d 2 Block, and that boundary produced to a public road, and by that road to a point the production of the south-eastern boundary of Taraire No. 1d 1b 6 Block; thence to and by that boundary and by Taraire No. 1B 1c Block to the point of commencement: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

**A PROCLAMATION.**

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in *Gazette* of the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, certain road-lines laid out through the Arapawanui Block were proclaimed as public roads in terms of section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas an error was made in the description of the said road-lines in the Schedule to the Proclamation hereinbefore referred to, and it is desirable that the said Schedule should be amended:

Now, therefore, I Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby amend the Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine

hundred and nineteen, hereinbefore referred to, by omitting from the Schedule thereto the words "portion of Arapawanui Block No. 2, Block XIV, Moeangiangi Survey District," and substituting therefor the words "portion of the Arapawanui Block intersecting and adjoining Arapawanui Nos. 2 and 3 Blocks, situated in Block XIV, Moeangiangi Survey District"; and by omitting the words "Adjoining Arapawanui Block No. 1, Block XVI, Maungaharuru Survey District," and substituting therefor the words "Portion of Arapawanui Block intersecting Arapawanui No. 1 Block, situated in Block XVI, Maungaharuru Survey District."

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on him by section three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the following Treasury Regulations, and doth direct that the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the gazetting thereof.

## REGULATIONS.

17A. It shall be the duty of every Head of a Government Department, or other officer of the Service, to afford all information which the Treasury may at any time require regarding the receipt and expenditure of public moneys, and the accounting for such moneys, supplies, or stores under his control. The Permanent Head of the Treasury may at any time, by writing under his hand, instruct any officer of his Department, or other fit person, to inspect any books, accounts, contracts, and other documents, or stores and supplies, or other public property held by any Department of the Service, and upon the production to the Permanent Head of a Department of such writing as aforesaid by the officer or person so instructed such Permanent Head shall afford facilities for such inspection.

17B. No officer of the Public Service shall write off Departmental charge any losses or deficiencies in cash, stores or supplies, debtor balances, claims abandoned, or debts irrecoverable by the Crown, nugatory expenditure (meaning thereby any payment of public moneys involving an immediate and formal loss, or the payment of money in return for which no services have been rendered), or the cash values of issues in kind to any person whomsoever by way of allowance, without the authority of Parliament, which must be obtained in the annual Appropriation Act.

## SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
