WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor-General; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereunder shall be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work is not required for such public work the Governor-General may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was taken for the purposes of a road: And whereas such road has been stopped, and it is desirable to declare the land contained therein to be Crown land:

And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor-General to declare such land to be Crown land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and of all other powers in anywise enabling

me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and that such land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly.

exported from, any place which on the said fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, was situated in any of the following States—namely, Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria, and Turkey; and doth further hereby declare that goods shall be deemed to be manufactured or produced in a place situated in the said States of Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria, and Turkey if not less than five per centum of the fair market value thereof, as estimated in accordance with the provisions of the Customs Act, 1913, with respect to goods liable to *ad valorem* duty, has its source in such States; provided always that the territories of Alsace-Lorraine shall not be deemed to be part of the State of Germany for the purposes of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fifth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and three, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 86, of the twelfth day of the same month, Carl Schrader, of Kohukohu, Hokianga (hereinafter called "the licensee"), was licensed under the Harbours Amendment Act, 1883, to occupy a part of the foreshore on the Mangamuka River, Hokianga Harbour, in the Provincial District of Auckland, in order to erect and maintain thereon booms, as shown on the plans marked M.D. 2608 (two sheets), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for a period of fourteen years from the fifth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and three :

And whereas, the said license having expired, the licensee has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a renewal of the license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further period, and it is desirable to grant the same subject to the terms and conditions and for the period hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid for the purpose of maintaining the said booms thereon ; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £4, such annual payments to date from the 5th day of November, 1917, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for three years computed from the 5th day of November, 1917, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the booms at his own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee one month's previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand. Provided that in any case the licensee shall remove all logs in the booms and the booms themselves to the satisfaction of the Harbourmaster at Hokianga before the expiration of this license.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned booms in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels ; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said booms and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such booms, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the booms, or by contact with them, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on his part.

9. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said booms for a period of thirty days ;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions ; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever ; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined ; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said booms to be removed, and may recover the cost incurred by any such removal from the licensee.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on plan M.D. 5088 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf in accordance with the said plan; such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the erection of the said wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5088.

3. All persons shall, at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date thereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

11. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

12. In case the Council shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

13. The erection of the said wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the Council of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-nine of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that in the case of lands between high- and low-water marks which belong to the Crown, and on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for purposes of navigation, the Governor-General in Council may grant occupation licenses for periods not exceeding twenty-one years, at such rent and on such conditions as he thinks fit, and any such lease may contain a provision authorizing the lessee to reclaim the land the subject of the lease without complying with the requirements of section forty-one of the said Act:

And whereas it is desirable to license Mijo Vujcich (hereinafter called "the licensee") to occupy a part of the land between high- and low-water marks, belonging to the Crown, in the Tapuwae River, Hokianga Harbour, on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for the purposes of navigation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy those parts of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which are particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid wharves in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto ; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall, as from the twenty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, be charged and taken for the use of the said wharves, or any of them.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore occupied by the said wharves, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2038, 2179, and 2420.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £6 in advance, dating from the 21st day of December, 1919.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharves, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharves without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharves in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels ; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. The company shall clear all trucks and trollies off the tramways on the wharves at the close of each day's work.

8. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharves and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last-known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

10. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for five years from the 21st day of December, 1919, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

13. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharves, or either of them, may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

14. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them ;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves for a period of thirty days ;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved ; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever ; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

And whereas it is desirable that the company should be licensed to use and occupy a further portion of such tidal land and tidal waters required for a further extension of the wharf :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license the said company to use and occupy such portions of the tidal land and tidal waters of Whangarei Harbour required for the extension of the said wharf as shown on plan marked M.D. 5095 (two sheets), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

And whereas section ten, subsection two, of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, provides that the poll of ratepayers shall be taken not less than one nor more than three weeks after the day of the last publication of the notice of intention to raise the loan :

And whereas section ten, subsection four, of the said Act provides that the voting-paper shall contain full particulars of the notice of intention to raise the loan, or a statement giving the purpose and effect of that notice :

And whereas certain irregularities or defects occurred in the proceedings taken in connection with the said loan, in that the poll of the ratepayers upon the said proposal was taken within one week after the day of the last publication of the notice of intention to raise the loan, and in that the voting-paper placed before the ratepayers did not contain full particulars of the notice of intention to raise the loan or a statement giving the purpose and effect of that notice :

And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by such irregularities or defects, and it is expedient to validate the same :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section one hundred and eleven of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the proceedings in connection with the said loan shall be valid to all intents and purposes as though the requirements of subsections two and four of section ten of the said Act as above mentioned had been strictly complied with, and that the proceedings shall not be called into question by reason only of the irregularities or defects aforesaid.

*Amendments in the Regulations for Manual and Technical Instruction.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this seventeenth day of November, 1919.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set out below in the regulations relating to manual and technical instruction in force on the coming into operation of this Order (hereinafter referred to as the said regulations); and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## AMENDMENTS IN REGULATIONS.

CLAUSE 31 of the said regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "dated signature," the following words: "Such supervision must include periodical visits, not less than once in each month during the school session, by the managers or a committee appointed by the managers, or, where the classes are administered by the controlling authority directly, by a committee appointed by the controlling authority."

The following regulations are hereby substituted for clauses 40 to 48 inclusive and clause 96 of the said regulations:—

## A. Continuation Classes.

40. Continuation classes may be held in the subjects named in Divisions I and II of this clause.

*Division I.*

- (1.) English, to include composition and the study of the work or works of some standard author or authors.
- (2.) French, German, Italian, Maori, Latin, Greek, or other approved language; the teaching to include in every case a reasonable amount of continuous reading-matter, and, in the case of a living language, to be directed to the practical end of giving the pupils the power of speaking and corresponding in the language.
- (3.) Arithmetic, including commercial arithmetic, accounts, and mensuration up to the standard of Class S. VII of the public-school syllabus.
- (4.) Geography, including commercial geography.
- (5.) English history, civics, general history, constitutional history, commercial history.
- (6.) Elocution.
- (7.) Vocal music, which must include singing from notes, and the elements of the theory of music.
- (8.) Physical training.
- (9.) Swimming and life-saving.

*Division II.*

- (1.) Elementary woodwork, elementary metalwork.
- (2.) Elementary hygiene, first aid, ambulance-work, elementary home nursing.
- (3.) Elementary cookery, elementary dressmaking, needlework.
- (4.) Elementary drawing, &c.

41. Payment will not be made in respect of a recognized continuation class for any of the subjects 1-7 inclusive of Division I of clause 40 hereof for more than two hours a week or eighty hours a year, or, in the case of subject 8 or subject 9, for more than one hour a week or forty hours a year, or, in the case of subject 8, unless the students taking the subject also attend at least one other recognized continuation or technical class during the same year.

**B. Technical Classes.**

42. Technical classes may be held in the subjects named in the following divisions:—

*Division I.*

Elementary commercial subjects, and subjects of commercial routine, such as elementary correspondence and précis-writing, copying, indexing, filing, shorthand, typing, and the mechanical operations concerned with postage, telegraphing, and banking.

*Division II.*

Higher commercial subjects, such as actuarial arithmetic, book-keeping and accounting, banking and currency, mercantile and commercial practice and law, economics of industry and commerce, elementary mathematics, elementary practical mathematics, and practical plane and solid geometry.

*Division III.*

Mathematics and science as applied to specific industries, machine construction, building-construction, metallurgy, mineralogy, chemistry of commerce, engineering (civil, mechanical, electrical, mining, sanitary, &c.), architecture, building and allied industries, printing and process industries, electrical industries, wood- and metal-working industries, agricultural and horticultural industries, and similar subjects.

*Division IV.*

More advanced mathematics having a practical direction in application to industrial processes, and the various branches of natural and physical science, home science and applied science, where laboratory practice occupies at least half the total time for which payment is claimed.

*Division V.*

Art and Art-crafts:—

Free drawing in outline or in light and shade, or painting in monochrome from casts of ornament, objects, plant-forms, drapery, landscape details, details or whole of animal forms or human figure. Free-arm and blackboard drawing. Design. Painting ornament. Principles of ornament. Modelling from casts or photographs of simple ornamental devices. Architectural drawing and design. Mural decoration. Drawing from actual measurements of structures, &c. Painting still life, flowers, landscapes in colours. Drawing, painting, or modelling anatomical studies of animal forms or of the human figure. Modelling design, modelling in relief or in the round, drapery, plant and animal forms, or the human figure from casts or from nature. Painting animal forms or the human figure in colour. Figure composition. Various subjects of applied art.

*Division VI.*

Domestic science:—

Home-making and home-keeping; personal and domestic hygiene; home-nursing; cookery; laundry-work; needlework; dressmaking; millinery, &c.

*Division VII.*

Teachers' classes for subjects of manual and technical instruction for the Class D and Class C Examinations.

43. In addition to the practical work necessary for the demonstration of subjects in Divisions III, IV, V, and VI of clause 42 hereof, at least half the total time for which payment is claimed must be devoted to individual practice by the students working with their own hands. Such practical work should not be less than a continuous hour and a half in any one lesson, and must in the case of subjects relating to specific trades be so arranged as to be illustrative of the principles taught, and should not be directed merely to developing dexterity in the practice of trade processes.

44. Capitation for wood-carving, art needlework, and other art-craft classes will be paid at the rate for Division V of clause 42 only when the instruction is based upon studies and designs made by the students themselves, and adapted to the work by the students themselves. Similarly capitation for dressmaking classes will be paid at the rate for Division VI of clause 42 or Division II of clause 40 hereof, as the case may be, only when the method of instruction does not involve reference to or the use of charts or of curved or specially graduated scales.

Otherwise capitation for classes in such subjects will be paid at the rate specified for Division I of clause 40 hereof.

45. (a.) Payment on account of the attendance of students at recognized technical and continuation classes may be made at the following rates per hour attendance:—

where the divisions correspond respectively with those enumerated in clauses 40 and 42 hereof; provided that, in the case of an approved class for advanced or special work, the Director may approve an annual grant equivalent to not more than 7s. 6d. per class hour in lieu of the capitation payments herein specified; provided further that where the average attendance at a recognized class under one teacher exceeds thirty capitation shall be paid as for an average attendance of thirty.

(b.) Progress payments on account of capitation payable under clauses 45 (a) and 46 hereof may be made during the year.

46. In addition to the capitation payable under clause 45 hereof, capitation at the rate of 3d. per hour attendance will be paid on account of the attendance of students who attend under regulations for compulsory attendance of young persons at technical and continuation classes, or under clauses 89 and 94 of the said regulations; provided that an addition to the rate of payment of one-half thereof may be made in respect of the attendances of such students at approved classes held more than two miles from a town of not less than two thousand inhabitants.

47. Not more than two hundred and forty hours' instruction in continuation subjects, and not more than four hundred hours' instruction in all subjects taken, may be counted in respect of any student for the purposes of capitation payable under clauses 45 and 46 hereof in any year.

### III. COLLEGE CLASSES.

48. All the subjects in Divisions II, III, IV, V, VI, and VII of clause 42 hereof may be recognized as subjects of technical instruction in college classes.

49. No claim may be made in respect of the attendance of a student in any subject that he takes in the ordinary course of his university studies for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, or Bachelor of Laws, or Bachelor of Medicine, or for the ordinary Degree of Bachelor of Science. In other respects the conditions are the same as for classes under clause 42 hereof.

The following regulations are hereby substituted for clauses 55 and 56 of the said regulations:—

55. The Minister may make grants in aid of the maintenance of buildings or the purchase of furniture, fittings, and apparatus of a permanent character—*i.e.*, not requiring to be replaced from year to year—for the use of technical and continuation classes or of manual-training classes other than those referred to in clauses 15 (c) and 27 (c) of the said regulations; provided that no grants will be made to repair or replace apparatus broken; provided further that grants in aid of maintenance shall not exceed two-thirds of the actual cost, and shall only be made in the case of buildings held by an Education Board as controlling authority.

56. The following, among others, may be regarded as permanent apparatus: Casts, models, flat examples, books on art and technical subjects, machine and hand tools, but not drills, files, &c., which require replacing from year to year, scientific apparatus, but not glassware such as retorts, test-tubes, &c., which require periodical replacement.

Clause 60 of the said regulations is hereby amended by substituting for the words "All grants for" the words "All grants in respect of."

Clause 92 of the said regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "prescribed for group courses."

Clause 95 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "of the subjects prescribed for group courses," and by the substitution therefor of the words "related subjects."

*Prohibiting the Exportation of Sugar, Jam, Confectionery, and other Articles of Food preserved with Sugar.*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section forty-seven of the Customs Act, 1913, as extended by section twenty-four of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, prohibit the exportation of any goods the prohibition of the exportation of which is in his opinion necessary in the public interest :

And whereas in the opinion of the Governor-General it is necessary in the public interest that the exportation of sugar, jam, confectionery, and other articles of food preserved with sugar should be prohibited to the extent and in the manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-seven of the Customs Act, 1913, and section twenty-four of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby prohibit the exportation of sugar, jam, confectionery, and other articles of food preserved with sugar, from the said Dominion, save with the consent of the Minister of Customs given on the recommendation of the Board of Trade.

*Waimarino Acclimatization District redefined.*

IN exercise and pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby appoint those parts of the said Dominion described in the Schedule hereto to be a district under and for the purposes of the said Act, and I do hereby declare that such district shall be known as the Waimarino Acclimatization District, and I do hereby revoke the previous notifications defining the said district.

*Subsidies to Public Libraries in Country Districts.*

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the sum of £3,000 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries in country districts.

The distribution will take place about the 1st March, 1920, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary, Education Department, Wellington, on or before the 28th January, 1920.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge; in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds fifteen hundred. The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contributions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the distribution of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library

derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1919, and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

DECLARATION.

I, [Name], of [Place of abode], [Occupation], do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am Chairman [or Secretary, or Treasurer] of the [Name of institution]; that during the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1919, the receipts of the aforesaid institution for the maintenance of the library only were as follows: From rates levied by a local governing body under Part I of the Libraries and Mechanics' Institutes Act, 1908, or the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, pounds shillings and pence; from the subscriptions of members, pounds shillings and pence; from voluntary contributions other than members' subscriptions and from net proceeds of entertainments, pounds shillings and pence; that the library is public in the sense of belonging to the public, and is not under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; that the information hereinafter furnished by me in the appendix hereto is correct in every particular; that the abstract of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and payments of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received in the year 1919 was expended in the purchase of books for the library; [and that by the rules of the library the reading-room is open to the public free of charge].
