Declaring a certain Area added to the County of Waikohu to be included in Ngatapa Riding thereof.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the boundaries of the Counties of Cook and Waikohu were altered by the exclusion of a certain area from the County of Cook and the inclusion of such area in the County of Waikohu:

And whereas it is desirable that the area so added to the County of Waikohu should be included in the Ngatapa Riding of that county:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twenty-two of the Counties Act, 1908, do hereby declare that the area included as aforesaid in the County of Waikohu shall as on and from the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, be included in the Ngatapa Riding of the said county, and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

NGATAPA RIDING, WAIKOHU COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay Land District bounded by a line commencing on Mangatapere Trig. Settlement; thence along the north-eastern boundary of that settlement to the northernmost corner of Section 3, Block X, Waikohu Survey District; thence along the north-western and western boundaries of the said Ngatapa Settlement to the Tahora Road; thence along the middle of that road to the Wharekopae Stream; thence up the middle of that stream to Wharekopae No. 1A, Lot 2; thence along the south-eastern boundary of the said Lot 2, the south-eastern boundaries of Hangaroa-Matawai B No. 4 and B No. 1 to the Hangaroa River; thence to and along the middle of that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Small Grazing-run No. 30; thence to and along the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Kawaimango Stream; thence up the said stream and along the western boundary of Small Grazing-run 62 to the north-eastern corner of Section 1, Block VIII, Tuahu Survey District; thence along the northern boundary of that section, across the Mangatahae Stream; thence along the north-eastern boundary of Lot 21, the eastern and northern boundaries of Lot 24, the northern boundary of Lot 23, and the north-eastern and western boundaries of Lot 18, all of Tahora No. 2c 1 Section 3 and No. 2f Section 2 blocks; thence across the Ruakituri River and the production of the western boundary of Lot 18 to its intersection with a right line between Puketapu and Mangapohatu Trig. Stations; thence north-westerly along the said right line to Mangapohatu Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Mangatapere Trig. Station, the point of commencement.

And whereas, in pursuance and exercise of the authority so conferred upon him, the Governor-General has, by the several Orders in Council hereinafter more particularly referred to, prohibited the exportation of certain classes of goods :

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, it is necessary in the public interest to revoke the said Orders in Council, and in lieu of the prohibitions therein contained to prohibit the exportation of the goods set forth in the Second Schedule hereto :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-seven of the Customs Act, 1913, and section twenty-four of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council referred to in the First Schedule hereto (prohibiting the export of the goods therein mentioned), and in lieu thereof doth, with the like advice and consent, prohibit to the extent set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, the exportation of the goods specified in that Schedule.

HIS Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the authority conferred by section fifteen of the Repatriation Act, 1918, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations under that Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. If any person, with intent to obtain for himself or for any other person financial assistance under the Repatriation Act, 1918, wilfully deceives or does any act with intention to deceive the Repatriation Board, or any district or local Board or committee established under that Act, or any officer of the Repatriation Department, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

2. If any person having received financial assistance under the Repatriation Act, 1918, wilfully commits any breach of the conditions on which that assistance was granted, or wilfully uses any money so received by him for any purpose other than that for which it was granted to him, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding £20.

3. If any person having purchased tools, equipment, or other chattels wholly or partly with moneys received by him by way of financial assistance under the Repatriation Act, 1918, sells, pledges, or otherwise disposes of such tools, equipment, or other chattels without the consent in writing of an officer of the Repatriation Department, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding £20.

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, it is necessary in the public interest to revoke the said Orders in Council :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, and section two of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Amendment Act, 1915, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Orders in Council referred to in the Schedule hereto.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section sixty-two of the Public Trust Office Act, 1908, and section ninety-six of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, and of all other powers authorizing him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations, to take effect on the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

REGULATIONS.

1. THERE shall be an officer of the Public Trust Office called the Custodian of Deeds and Securities (hereinafter referred to as "the Custodian").
2. The Custodian shall be one of the Custodians of Securities of that office pursuant to the provisions of section 96 of the Public Revenues Act, 1910.
3. The duties of the Custodian shall be—
 - (a.) Those imposed upon him by Part XI of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, as one of the Custodians of the Securities of the Public Trust Office;
 - (b.) The custody of documents of title (other than those affected by Part XI of the Public Revenues Act, 1910) held by the Public Trustee at the Head Office in Wellington;
 - (c.) Such other duties as may from time to time be imposed on the Custodian by the Public Trustee.
4. In case of the temporary absence from duty of the Custodian by reason of illness or any other cause, the Public Trustee may appoint some other person to carry out his duties during the period of such absence. Such person while so acting shall perform all the duties and may exercise all the powers of the Custodian.
5. Clause 32 of the regulations made under the Public Trust Office Act, 1908, on the 20th day of March, 1914, and gazetted on the 26th day of March, 1914, is hereby amended by substituting the words "the Assistant Chief Accountant" and "the Custodian of Deeds and Securities of the Public Trust Office" for the words "the Public Trustee" and "the Accountant of the Public Trust Office."

Regulations made by Public Service Commissioner in respect of Junior Professional Officers of the Hector Observatory, Department of Internal Affairs, attending Science Lectures, Victoria College.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred upon him by the Public Service Act, 1912, the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto with respect to junior professional officers of the Hector Observatory, Department of Internal Affairs, attending Science lectures at Victoria College. The said regulations shall have effect from and after the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

1. THESE regulations shall apply to junior professional officers appointed or transferred to the Hector Observatory, Department of Internal Affairs, and who have passed the Matriculation Examination in the subjects prescribed for them.

2. The Commissioner may, on application, grant leave to any such officer to attend lectures at Victoria College for a term not exceeding three years, and, in the case of Honours, one whole session, subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The application must be approved by the Government Astronomer, such approval to be contingent on satisfactory work and behaviour.

(b.) Term reports on attendance and progress at the classes will be obtained from the Professors in charge; and if these, in the opinion of the Commissioner, show that the concession is being abused, or that the student is not utilizing it to the best of his ability, then the Commissioner may cancel the leave granted hereunder.

(c.) The leave granted may be on the following conditions:—

(i.) Term of three years—two half-days per week, on full pay;

(ii.) Honours, whole session—half-pay, with a maximum of £100.

(d.) An agreement must be entered into with the Department to refund all college fees which may be paid by the Department, and also all half-pay allowances received, should the leave granted be cancelled or the officer, within three years after completion of his college course, leave the Department for any reason whatsoever, save sickness or injury or dismissal through no fault of his own.

3. An officer who has been granted leave under these conditions must obtain a degree in Bachelor of Science before passing from Class F to Class E, and the obtaining of such degree will be considered by the Commissioner as satisfactory proof of his efficiency.

4. On return to full duties after completion of course the Commissioner may review the officer's classification, and will make due allowance for such officer's improved standing.

year, a correct list of their Officiating Ministers within the meaning of the Marriage Act, 1908, of each of the said religious bodies.

The Church of the Province of New Zealand, commonly called the Church of England.
The Presbyterian Church of New Zealand.
The Roman Catholic Church.
The Methodist Church of New Zealand.
All Congregational Independents.
Baptists.

All Hebrew Congregations.
The Society of Friends.

In default of any person having ecclesiastical authority over any of the religious bodies named above, the name of the Officiating Minister of any congregation of such religious body may be certified to by two recognized office-bearers thereof.

A minister of religion not connected with any of the aforesaid bodies must send to the Registrar-General in the month of December in each year a certificate signed—

- (a.) By the recognized head in New Zealand of the religious body to which he belongs; or
- (b.) By two duly recognized ministers of such religious body; or
- (c.) By ten adult members thereof, who append to their signatures their description as being such members, declaring that such minister is their Officiating Minister, the said signatures and descriptions being attested by some person who shall verify the signatures to the certificate as the genuine signatures of the persons whose they purport to be, by a statutory declaration signed by such person and appended to the certificate.

Neglect in sending the certificate will deprive the minister of his status as an Officiating Minister under the Marriage Act.

N.B.—It is requested that the *Christian names* and the *addresses* of the several ministers may be specified in the lists sent in to the Registrar-General.

In order to obviate the necessity for further inquiry, it is also requested that the reason for omitting the name of any minister be stated (such as on account of death, absence from New Zealand, or as the case may be).

Regulations as to the Taking of the Votes of Members of the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces for the Purposes of the Next General Election and Licensing Poll.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of November, 1919.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section eighteen of the Expeditionary Forces Voting and Electoral Rights Amendment Act, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

Voting by Members of the Expeditionary Forces in New Zealand.

1. For the purpose of taking the votes of members of any Expeditionary Force in New Zealand, the Chief Electoral Officer may appoint such additional polling-places as he thinks fit, and for each such polling-place shall cause to be appointed a Deputy Returning Officer and such clerks, if any, as he deems necessary.

2. For the purpose of taking the votes of members of the Expeditionary Force who are inmates of hospitals, sanatoria, or other public institutions, and who by reason of illness or other incapacity are unable to come to a polling-booth, a Deputy Returning Officer may visit such places and record the votes of all such members of the Expeditionary Force who desire to vote.

3. (1.) If a member of the Expeditionary Force entitled to vote under these regulations is unable personally to mark the voting-papers, the Deputy Returning Officer or one of his clerks may, at the request of the voter, mark the voting-papers in his presence and in accordance with his instructions.

(2.) In any such case the Deputy Returning Officer or clerk shall endorse on the voting-papers a statement that the voting-papers have been marked by him at the request of the voter.

Voting by Soldiers on Ships.

4. (1.) If any vessel leaves England with members of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force on board at any time before the day appointed for the taking of the licensing poll, the High Commissioner shall cause to be supplied to the Military Officer in charge a ballot-box or ballot-boxes, together with a sufficient number of voting-papers for the taking of the votes of the members of the Expeditionary Force on board such vessel.

(2.) The votes recorded on troopships at sea under these regulations shall be counted in New Zealand, and a Returning Officer shall be appointed for the purpose.

(3.) For the purposes of the said Act the day for conducting the licensing poll at sea shall be Tuesday, the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

(4.) The Military Officer in charge shall on the said day cause a poll to be taken of all men on the vessel entitled to vote, and shall not count the votes, but shall forthwith after the close of the poll securely seal the ballot-box or ballot-boxes and shall deliver the same, or cause the same to be delivered, to the Returning Officer in Wellington, or to a person authorized in writing by or on behalf of the said Returning Officer to receive the same.

(5.) The said Military Officer shall also cause to be delivered to the said Returning Officer in a sealed parcel all documents used in connection with the poll, and all unused and spoilt voting-papers.

(6.) As soon as practicable after the receipt of any voting-papers pursuant to the foregoing clauses, the Returning Officer shall count the votes and transmit the results to the Minister of Justice through the Chief Electoral Officer.

Voting by Soldiers in Samoa.

5. (1.) For the purpose of taking the votes of members of the Expeditionary Force who may be in Samoa, the Chief Electoral Officer shall appoint a Returning Officer, who shall in turn appoint such Deputy Returning Officers and clerks as he deems necessary.

(2.) At the close of the poll at any polling-place the Deputy Returning Officer in charge shall transmit the boxes to the Returning Officer, who shall count the votes and transmit to the New Zealand Government by wireless or other expeditious means the following particulars:—

- (a.) The total number of votes recorded;
- (b.) The number of informal votes;
- (c.) The number of votes recorded in favour of national continuance;
- (d.) The number of votes recorded in favour of State purchase and control; and
- (e.) The number of votes recorded in favour of national prohibition.

(3.) After transmitting the results as aforesaid the Returning Officer shall, at the first convenient opportunity, forward in a sealed parcel all voting-papers and other documents connected with the poll to the Chief Electoral Officer in Wellington.

Voting by Soldiers in Great Britain.

6. (1.) For the purpose of taking the votes of members of the Expeditionary Forces who may be in Great Britain on election day, the High Commissioner for New Zealand, or some person authorized by him in writing in that behalf, shall appoint such polling-places and such Deputy Returning Officers and clerks as he thinks necessary.

(2.) Every Deputy Returning Officer so appointed shall be furnished with a sufficient number of voting-papers for taking a poll at the polling-place or polling-places for which he is appointed.

7. (1.) At the close of the poll at any polling-place the Deputy Returning Officer in charge shall not count the votes, but he shall securely seal the ballot-box or ballot-boxes and shall forthwith forward the same to the High Commissioner at his office in London.

(2.) He shall also, as soon as practicable, forward to the High Commissioner in a sealed parcel all documents used in connection with the poll and all unused and spoilt voting-papers.

8. (1.) On receipt of any voting-papers by the High Commissioner as aforesaid the High Commissioner shall cause the votes to be counted, and shall forthwith cable to the New Zealand Government the following particulars with respect to each polling-place, that is to say:—

- (a.) The total number of votes recorded;
- (b.) The number of informal votes;
- (c.) The number of votes recorded in favour of national continuance;
- (d.) The number of votes recorded in favour of State purchase and control; and
- (e.) The number of votes recorded in favour of national prohibition.

(2.) After cabling the results as aforesaid all voting-papers and other documents used in connection with the poll shall be retained in the High Commissioner's Office for twelve months, and may then be destroyed.

General.

9. (1.) For the purpose of the foregoing regulations as to the taking of the votes of soldiers in Great Britain or Samoa, scrutineers may be appointed as follows:—

- (a.) One scrutineer for each polling-place may be appointed on behalf of persons in favour of national continuance.
- (b.) One scrutineer for each polling-place may be appointed on behalf of persons in favour of State purchase and control.
- (c.) One scrutineer for each polling-place may be appointed on behalf of persons in favour of national prohibition.

(2.) Every person appointed as a scrutineer under this regulation shall, before acting, be required to make the same declaration as if he were appointed pursuant to the Licensing Act, 1908.
