but did not provide for the filling of extraordinary vacancies:

3. If no such appointment is made within two months after the happening of the vacancy, the Governor-General may, by Warrant under his hand, make the required appoint-

ment.

4. No person shall be eligible to be elected or appointed as a member of the Waimate Hospital committee to whom subsections (2) (a) to (f) inclusive of section 19 of the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, apply.

5. The aforesaid regulations of the 24th day of February, 1910, are amended by the addition of the following:—

1. STIPENDIARY Magistrates shall receive travelling-allowance

2. The allowance shall be for each day of twenty-four hours. The day shall be deemed to commence at the hour of departure from headquarters.

3. For any portion of a day the rate shall be one twenty-fourth of the full daily rate for each hour's absence.

4. In computing the time of absence, a fraction of an hour, if less than half an hour, shall not be taken into account, but half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour.

5. When a Magistrate leaves and returns to headquarters

the same day, actual and reasonable expenses only shall be

6. Nothing in these regulations shall preclude the Minister from authorizing temporary special rates or amounts for travelling to meet special cases.

7. The cost of transport by land or sea will be paid by the Government, or when paid by the Magistrate travelling the same will be refunded to him on production of vouchers, but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of 5s. and under, and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and the extent of the journey is stated.

8. Public conveyances must be used where available, and the cost of motor-cars or special conveyances will not be allowed unless specially authorized.

9. All vouchers for travelling allowances or expenses must be made out in detail on the proper Treasury form, must state definitely the duty on which the Magistrate is travelling, and must be signed and certified by the claimant, and certified as correct by the Permanent Head of the Department or

other authorized authority.

10. No Magistrate shall leave his district without the authority of the Minister of Justice or some officer authorized by

- 1. The lessee of any land under section 329 of the Land 1. THE lessee of any land under section 329 of the Land Act, 1908, shall, before making any improvements on the land comprised in his lease, whether by the way of erection of any building or buildings in, over, or about any mineral or other spring, the felling of bush, or the alteration of the configuration of the land adjacent to any such spring, or otherwise, obtain the written consent of the Minister of Lands Lands.
- 2. The lessee shall take all reasonable care of the land comprised in his lease, and shall not divert or alter, or allow to be diverted or altered, any spring in any manner what-soever, except with the written consent of the Minister of Lands.
- 3. The lessee shall not sublet, transfer, or otherwise part with the possession or occupation of the whole or any part of the area comprised in his lease without the written consent lessor first had and obtained.
- of the lessor first had and obtained.

 4. The lessee shall, within six months from the date of his lease, securely fence in the land with a legal fence within the meaning of the Fencing Act, 1908.

 5. The lessee shall with all reasonable despatch remove, or cause to be removed, all noxious weeds or plants growing upon the land comprised in his lease, and thereafter shall, during the currency of the term of such lease, keep the land clear and free of all such noxious weeds or plants,

- 6. The lessee shall, within one year from the date of his 6. The lessee shall, within one year from the date of his lease, erect upon the said land proper bath-houses, with all baths, dressing-rooms, lavatories, and other conveniences for the use by the public of the water from the hot spring or springs situated upon the land, and shall at all times thereafter maintain all such buildings, erections, baths, lavatories, and other conveniences in good order and condition at his own expense in all things. The plans and specifications of such buildings and erections shall be submitted to the Minister of Lands for his approval, and erection shall not be commenced until written notice of such approval has been obtained.
- 7. The aforesaid bath-houses, baths, dressing-rooms, and other conveniences shall be kept open for the use of the public at such reasonable hours as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the lessee shall provide all necessary attendance, towels, and other appliances for the use and enjoyment by the public of the baths, dressing-rooms, lavatories, and other conveniences, and shall provide refreshments at reasonable hours.

 8. The lessee shall be entitled to make and levy for the use

8. The lessee shall be entitled to make and levy for the use of the baths, dressing-rooms, lavatories, and other conveniences, for attendance and appliances, and for refreshments provided, such charges as the Minister of Lands shall from

time to time approve.

9. The lessee shall be entitled to make rules for the use and enjoyment of the aforesaid baths, dressing-rooms, lavatories, and other conveniences, for the maintenance of good order, decency, and cleanliness therein, for the prevention of nuisances and the exclusion of undesirable characters, and generally for securing and promoting the public convenience and enjoyment thereof, provided that such rules shall first be approved by the Minister of Lands.

10. The lessee shall construct and maintain in good order and condition all such gardens, beds, paths, steps, plantations, and other conveniences as may be required for access to or enjoyment of the purposes for which the land leased is

granted.
11. The lessee shall construct and maintain in good order and repair all such tanks, reservoirs, or dams as may in the opinion of the Minister of Lands be necessary for the conservation of water from any spring or springs upon the land

Now, therefore, I, David Henry Guthrie, Minister of Lands, do hereby, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 2 of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1915, and of every other power me thereunto enabling, authorize the laying-off of such road of a width of 33 ft.; providing always that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect or cause to be erected any building at a less distance than 33 ft. from the middle-line of such road.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1919.

Nearly all parts of the Dominion experienced less than the average rainfall for October, the only districts having an excess being the Auckland peninsula and the southernmost portion of the South Island. The month was marked by very changeable weather, which was brought about by frequent westerly disturbances. The most intense of these occurred during the first three days, and was closely followed by a cyclone which ruled between the 4th and 6th. The latter was responsible for rain generally and very heavy rain in the northernmost districts. Other storms of the westerly type passed on the 10th, 14th, 21st, 22nd, and 31st. A well-developed anticyclone dominated between the 23rd and 28th, and during this period fair weather prevailed over the Dominion as a whole.

Vegetation showed only medium growth in most parts, while in Otago it proved very backward.

OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
