Altering Boundaries of Rangitikei and Hawke's Bay Counties. [

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section three of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the principal Act is in force:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Rangitikei And whereas a resolution was passed by the Rangitikei County Council on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and sealed with the seal of the Council of the said county: And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Hawke's Bay County Council on the thirteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and sealed with the seal of the Council of the said county, praying for the inclusion in the Rangitikei County of that part of the Hawke's Bay County described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions: the said resolutions:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Hawke's Bay County, shall, on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Rangitikei County; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Rangitikei and Hawke's Bay respectively shall as from the aforesaid date be those set forth under their respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE ADDED TO RANGITIKEI COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Hawke's Bay and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station 30 on Aorangi; thence proceeding south-easterly along a right line in the direction of the junction of the north branch of the Waipawa River with the Makarora River to the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence northerly along the summit of that range to Trig. Station Y in Block XII, Pukeokahu Survey District; thence along a right line to a point in the

middle of the Taruarau River opposite the westernmost corner of Block 78, Maraekakahu Crown-grant District; thence down the middle of the said Taruarau River to and up the middle of the Ngaruroro River to its intersection with a right line between Trig. Stations 65A and 26 (Tawheketewhango); thence westerly along the said right line to Trig. Station 26; thence south-westerly along a right line in the direction of Trig. Station 27 to its intersection with the middle-line of the Rangitiker River; thence down the middle of that river to its intersection with a right line between Trig. of that river to its intersection with a right line between Trig. Stations 32 and 30; thence north-easterly along the said right line to Trig. Station 30, the point of commencement.

Station 65A to its intersection with the middle of the Ngaruroro River; thence down the middle of that river and up the middle of the Taruarau River to a point opposite the westernmost corner of Block 78, Maraekakahu Crown-grant District; thence along a right line to Trig. Station Y on the summit of the Ruahine Range in Block XII, Pukeokahu Survey District; thence coutbedry along the summit of the said range to thence southerly along the summit of the said range to a point due east of the source of the Kawhatau River; thence to and down the middle of the said river and of the Rangitikei River to the sea; thence north-westerly along the sea-coast River to the sea; thence north-westerly along the sea-coast to the middle of the Wangaehu River; thence up the middle of the Wangaehu River to a point due west and distant about eighteen chains from the western boundary of Block XIV, Mangawhero Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line through Okaiepe Trig. by lines from hill to hill along the summit of the said watershed to its intersection with the southern boundary of Section 63, Block XIII, Maungakaretu Survey District; thence along the southern boundary of that section to the northeastern boundary of Section 77, Block XVI, Ngamatea Survey District; thence along the said boundary and its production to the middle of Hales Road; thence northerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 70, Block IX, Maungakaretu Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the south-western boundary of Section 71, Block XII, Ngamatea Survey District, and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the middle of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of the Pungataua Block; thence northerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary, the eastern boundaries of Sections 9 and 6, Block VIII, Ngamatea Survey District, and the eastern boundary of Section 7, Block IV, Ngamatea Survey District, to the point of commencement: excluding the Boroughs of Marton and Tajhape, and the Town Districts of Hunterville, Mangaweka, and Bull's.

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Waimarino County, shall, on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Wanganui County; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Wanganui and Waimarino respectively shall as from the aforesaid date be those set forth under their respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

Nobel Peace Prize.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1920, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st of February, 1920.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history, and of philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, par. 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to par 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

The receipts for the year from subscriptions, donations, and voluntary contributions must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

Courses and distances between all the principal ports in New Zealand, also between New Zealand and Australia, Fiji, South Africa, San Francisco, Vancouver, Valparaiso, Ceylon, Suez, New York, and to England, via Cape Horn and Panama, with the return via Cape Town, have also been given, the great-circle and composite courses having been worked out to these places.

Some very valuable nautical tables and examples of problems worked by their aid are published in the Almanac, which it is hoped will greatly encourage masters and officers generally to make a practice of determining the ship's position from two stars at twilight, as these tables make the problems very easy, and also enable the observer to make sure that he is taking the right star by the easy calculation of the approximate altitude, as the calculated reductions and azimuths of several bright stars have been tabulated, and can be taken out at sight.
