Declaring a certain Area added to the County of Piako to be included in certain Ridings of such County.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, the boundaries of the Counties of Piako and Ohinemuri were altered by the inclusion in Piako County of a part of Ohinemuri County: And whereas it is desirable that the area so added to the Piako County should be included in the Morrinsville, Waitoa, and Waihou Ridings of that county:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twenty-two of the Counties Act, 1908, do hereby declare that the area included as aforesaid in the Piako County shall, as on and from the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, be included in the Morrinsville, Waitoa, and Waihou Ridings of the said county, and that the boundaries of those ridings shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF MORRINSVILLE RIDING, PIAKO COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded, commencing at the north-western corner of the Piako County, towards the north by the Hauraki Plains County to the

Piako River; towards the east by the Piako River and the Waiharakeke Stream to the south-eastern corner of part Maungatapu Block (shown on deposited plan 1038A); thence towards the south and west by the aforesaid part Maungatapu Block to where it junctions with a small stream running northwards to the Piako River, and by said stream to the Piako River; thence by the Piako River in a south-westerly direction to the Topehahae River, and by that river in a southerly direction to the southern corner of Te Mutu No. 1 Block; thence northerly along the western boundary of that block and westerly along the northern boundaries of Tahuroa No. 2, Tahuroa, Tahuroa No. 3, and Tahuroa No. 4 Blocks to the western boundary of the Piako County, and in a north-westerly direction along said county boundary to place of commencement.

BOUNDARIES OF WAITOA RIDING, PIAKO COUNTY.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north from the Piako River to the Waitoa River by the Hauraki Plains County; towards the east generally by the Waitoa River; and towards the south and west generally by Pakarau Pa B Blocks and Kahutopanga Block and the Morrinsville Riding hereinbefore defined.

BOUNDARIES OF WAIHOU RIDING, PIAKO COUNTY.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north from the Waitoa River to the Waihou River by the Hauraki Plains County; towards the north-east generally by the Waihou River; towards the south and south-east by the road forming the southern boundary of Sections 27, 25, 24, 23, and 22 of Block XII, Aroha Survey District, Sections 19B and 17 of Block XI, Aroha Survey District, and road forming the south-eastern boundaries of

Te Kapa and Waiheke No. 3 Blocks, and again towards the north-east generally by the Piranui Stream to the northern boundary of Hungahunga No. 2 Block; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner of Lot 1, D.P. 8932; thence following the north-eastern boundary of the said Lot 1 to the south-eastern corner and its production across a public road; thence by the said road forming the northern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 7060; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said Lot 3; thence by the eastern, the south-eastern, and south-western boundaries of Lot 5, D.P. 2841, and part of the south-western boundary of Lot 4 of the same deposited plan to the northernmost corner of Section 1, Block VIII, Maungakawa Survey District; thence by the north-western boundary of the said Section 1, across a public road, and again by the north-western boundary of the said Section 1 to the right bank of the Waitoa River; thence by that bank of the Waitoa River to the point of commencement.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Member of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Member of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight of Justice of the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, at the Government House at Wellington, this seventeenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

WHEREAS by section ten of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, it is provided that the triennial election of members of the various River Boards throughout the Dominion shall be held on the first Monday in November: And whereas it is expedient to extend the time for holding such election of members of the Waitatarua Drainage Board:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section twenty-four of the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act, 1913, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby extend the time for holding the triennial election of members for the Waitatarua Drainage District; and doth hereby order and declare that in the aforesaid river district the said triennial election shall be held and take place on Monday, the fifteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

THE HONOURABLE SIR WILLIAM FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, as amended by the Animals Protection Amendment Act, 1910, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby suspend the operation of section ten of the said Animals Protection Amendment Act, 1910, for the period ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, with respect to the species of birds indigenous to New Zealand mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

HAWKS of all species.

Kea, or mountain parrot.

Shags of the following species: Black shag (*Phalacrocorax sulcirostris*); white-throated shag (*Phalacrocorax brevirostris*); sea-shag (*Phalacrocorax novæ-hollandiæ*, *Phalacrocorax carbo*).
