Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Legislative Council Amendment Act, 1918, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and appoint that the Legislative Council Act, 1914, shall (except as provided by sections two and five of the Legislative Council Amendment Act, 1918) commence on the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one. nine hundred and twenty-one

WHEREAS the lands specified in the Schedule hereto WHEREAS the lands specified in the Schedule hereto are State forests under the control of the Commissioner of State Forests appointed under the State Forests Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), and the said lands are now no longer required for State-forest purposes: And whereas plans showing the extent and position of the said lands, and a statement of the reasons why they are no longer required for State-forest purposes, have been laid before both Houses of Parliament for a period of thirty days, and no resolution has been passed by either

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section twenty-eight of the said the powers conferred by section twenty-eight of the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion doth hereby revoke the Proclamations specified in the said Schedule, so far as they relate to the lands described in the said Schedule, as from the date of the publication hereof in the New Zeeland Gazette; and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after such date the parcels of land described in the said Schedule shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the Schedule shall be no longer subject to the provisions of the said Act.

Regulations for the Grading of Teachers.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-third day of December, 1919.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and its amendments, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations in force for the grading of teachers, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth below; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

THE GRADING OF TEACHERS.

- 1. The Director of Education (hereafter referred to as the Director) shall, by and through the Inspectors of the Department, proceed annually to grade in accordance with the regulations herein contained the certificated teachers employed in public schools, together with certificated training-college students who have completed their training-college course.
- 2. (i.) Certificated teachers who are not in the employment of an Education Board on the 31st day of December in any year but who were included in the grading-list then current may be graded in the following year, but if not so employed during that year they may be graded in any subsequent year only on application to the Senior Inspector of the district in which they were last employed. Any such application must reach the Senior Inspector not later than the 1st day of February. Certificated teachers who have not been graded and who are not in the employment of an Education Board may be graded on application to the Director not later than the 1st day of February in any year.

(ii.) Any teacher in the service of an Education Board or any training-college student who for the first time becomes certificated after the grading-list is completed shall be entitled to be graded forthwith as from the date on which his certificate is issued.

- (iii.) Certificated teachers who are for the time being employed in Native schools and special schools under the Education Department may be awarded grading-marks by the Inspector or Inspectors instructed thereto by the Director, but the grading of any such teacher shall have effect only in respect of any subsequent employment or application for employment of the teacher in the service of an Education Board.
- 3. The Inspectors of each education district acting together shall in accordance with these regulations assign grading-marks to all the certificated teachers employed in the public schools by the Education Board of the district on the 31st day of December preceding, and shall, through the Senior Inspector of the district forward such grading-marks to the Director:

Inspector of the district, forward such grading-marks to the Director:
Provided that training-college students who hold teachers' certificates shall be assigned grading-marks by the Inspectors of the district in which the training college attended is situated, after consultation with the Principal of the training college concerned.

- 4. For the purpose of assigning grading-marks to the teachers of any district the Inspectors shall, in the manner prescribed in clause 5 hereof, provisionally divide the teachers to be graded in that district into six groups, as follows:—
 - Group 1—Sole teachers with salary of Grade I, and assistants with
 - salary of Grade 1 or 2. Group 2—Head or sole teachers with salary of Grade II, and assistants with salary of Grade 3.
 - Group 3—Head or sole teachers with salary of Grade III, and assistants with salary of Grade 4 or 5.
 - Group 4—Head teachers with salary of Grade IV, and assistants with salary of Grade 6 or 7.
 - Group 5—Head and assistant teachers with salary of Grade V.
 - Group 6-Head teachers with salary of Grade VI or VII.
- 5. (i.) The grade of salary for the purposes of the preceding clause shall be the grade of salary as set out in columns 1, 2, and 3 of the tables

forming Parts I and II of Schedule IV in clause 1 of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers and payable to the teacher on the 31st day of December preceding.

(ii.) A teacher who holds or who has held a permanent position shall be placed in the group warranted by the grade of salary of his permanent position or his last permanent position, as the case may be:

Provided that-

(a.) The head teacher of a district high school, unless he is already in Group 6, shall be placed in the group next above that in which he would otherwise be placed under the above provisions:

(b.) Teachers in charge of part-time schools shall in all cases be grouped as if their grade of salary were determined by clause 30 of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers gazetted on the 13th November, 1919, which for this purpose shall not be modified by the proviso to clause 9 of the same regulations:

(c.) A teacher who previously had occupied a position that would under these regulations have placed him in a higher group than the one determined by his present position may, with the permission of the Director, be graded in such higher group if the Inspectors report that the teacher's efficiency has been maintained in all respects:

(d.) Native-school teachers and teachers of special schools shall be grouped as if they received the grade of salary for positions in schools of corresponding grades under the Fifth Schedule to the

Act.

(iii.) Except in the case of teachers who hold a permanent position but are temporarily filling another position, or of temporary teachers who have held a permanent position, or of permanent relieving teachers, all temporary and relieving teachers shall be placed in Group 1.

(iv.) Training-college students entitled to be graded shall be placed in

Group 1.

- (v.) In the case of any teacher or student placed in Group 1 under the provisions of subsection (iii) or subsection (iv) hereof, or of any teacher who has not previously held a position under an Education Board, the Director may, on the recommendation of the Inspectors, direct that such teacher or student shall be placed in a group higher than Group 1.
- 6. For the purpose of grading, marks shall be assigned by the Inspectors on the following basis, namely:—

To the total marks thus ascertained shall be added in each case the quota as prescribed for each group under the provisions of Regulation 13 hereof. Such quota shall be for the purpose of weighting the value of the marks in the successive groups in recognition of the relatively higher qualifications demanded by the higher positions. The combined total of the marks and the quota shall determine the grading of the teachers.

7. Marks for skill in teaching, for personality and discipline, for organization and management, and for environment shall in the first case be assigned with special relation to the teacher's efficiency in the class of positions occupied by him up to the time of grading, and shall be assessed in all essential respects on a basis of comparison with teachers in the same group:

Provided that after the marks for the teachers in each group have been provisionally determined, the Inspectors, having regard to the grading of the teachers of the district as a whole, may make such adjustment as they consider necessary to bring into due relation the marking in the various

groups

Provided further that when any teacher is to be graded in a higher group than that in which he was last graded, the marks to be awarded on the judgment of the Inspectors shall be reassessed according to the higher standard of marking in such higher group, so that, except for any special operation of Regulation 9, the total of these marks, added to the quota mark, shall, in general, be increased only by such number of marks as represents the increased efficiency of the teacher since the previous grading.

8. In assigning marks under the several headings above stated Inspectors shall be guided by the following table of comparative values:—

- 9. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 6 hereof, the maximum marks assignable to assistant teachers for organization and management shall be as follows:—
 - (a.) An assistant teacher who has held the position of head or sole teacher for at least one year in a school with a yearly average attendance of not less than nine shall be eligible for 10 marks.
 - (b.) In addition to the assistant mistress referred to in subclause (g) hereof, the senior male assistant and the senior female assistant teacher in a school in Grade VII shall, unless they are otherwise eligible for 15 marks, be eligible for 10 marks.
 - (c.) An assistant teacher who holds or who for at least one year has held the position of sole or senior assistant in the secondary department of a district high school with a yearly average attendance of at least twenty secondary pupils shall be eligible for 10 marks.
 - (d.) An assistant teacher who has held the position of temporary head teacher of a school in Grade II, or in a higher grade, for a period of at least one year shall, with the approval of the Director, be eligible for 10 marks.
 - (e.) An assistant teacher who for a period of at least two years has held the position of head teacher of a school of Grade III, or of a higher grade, shall be eligible for 15 marks.
 - (f.) An assistant teacher shall be eligible for 15 marks if he has been head or sole teacher of a school in which the salary allocated to the position at the time he occupied it would, if determined under the present scale of salaries, have placed him in the same group as that in which he is now placed.
 - (g.) The assistant mistress placed by the headmaster in charge of the infant department of a school of Grade Vc or upwards, or who has previously held such a position for a period of not less than two years, shall be eligible for 15 marks. For the purpose of this subclause the description "assistant mistress placed by the headmaster in charge of the infant department" shall be held to include the senior teacher in a side school with a yearly average attendance of not less than eighty-one.
 - (h.) All other assistant teachers shall be eligible for 5 marks.
- 10. Marks for environment shall be awarded for the teacher's taste and care with respect to the school and its surroundings, and for evidence of the teacher's value as a useful factor in the life of the community:

Provided that any teacher eligible to be graded may, through the head teacher, forward to the Senior Inspector information on any matters relating to his eligibility for marks for environment.

11. Marks for academic attainments shall be based on the class of teacher's certificate held, and shall be given as follows: For certificate of Class E, 3 marks; Class D, 6; Class C, 9; Class B, 12; Class A, 15:

Provided that a teacher who is awarded a higher class of certificate after the grading-list has been completed shall be entitled to receive the additional grading-marks for the higher certificate as prescribed in this clause, and the consequent alteration in his grading shall be notified to each Education Board and in any supplement to the grading-list that may be issued

12. Teaching service shall be reckoned in accordance with Regulations 5 and 6 of the Regulations for the Examination and Classification of Teachers, and shall include service up to the 31st day of December preceding. For each complete two years of service so reckoned 1 mark up to a maximum of 10 marks shall be assigned.



13. The quota of additional marks for which provision is made by Regulation 6 shall for the respective groups be as follows:—

- 14. (i.) It shall be the duty of the Director to secure and maintain a reasonable degree of uniformity in the standard of marking in the various districts, and to this end he may, as he thinks fit, confer with all the Senior Inspectors conjointly.
- (ii.) If by the decision of such conference it is held that the standard of grading in any district departs to an unreasonable extent from that of the remainder of the Dominion the Director shall instruct the Inspectors of the district or districts concerned to adjust their standard of marking accordingly.
- 15. From the grading-marks forwarded to the Director by the Senior Inspectors of the various districts shall be compiled annually a general graded list of teachers, which shall be duly published in accordance with the Act before the 30th day of June. Every such general list shall contain—
 - (a.) The names of all teachers graded as herein provided, arranged in order, and consecutively numbered in accordance with the totals of the grading-marks assigned:
 - (b.) The name in each case of the district in which the teacher was graded, the nature of the position occupied, and such other information as the Director may determine:
 - (c.) The names of all certificated teachers in the Dominion, whether graded or not, and the class of certificate held by each teacher.
- 16. Each teacher who is graded under these regulations shall be supplied by the Director of Education with the separate marks on which his grading was determined, the information thus supplied to be treated as confidential.
- 17. Any teacher who considers that he has good grounds for objection to the position assigned to him on the graded list may, not later than thirty-one clear days after the publication of the list in the New Zealand Gazette, lodge an appeal by letter with the Director of Education, Wellington, giving the complete and definite grounds on which the appeal is based, and every such appeal shall be dealt with as hereinafter provided.
- 18. All the appeals from each district shall be sent to an Appeal Board in the district concerned. Such Appeal Board shall consist of a Chairman appointed by the Minister, who shall be Chairman of all Appeal Boards, a representative of the Department not being an Inspector of the district, and a representative selected by the certificated teachers of the district in such manner as the Director may determine.
- 19. The Appeal Board in each district shall consider the appeals sent in from teachers in the district only with respect to the definite grounds stated in each appeal. In any case where the Board decides that an appellant's grading is too low or too high, a report to that effect shall be made to the Director, who shall refer the case to the Inspector or Inspectors concerned, with an instruction to regrade the teacher in accordance with the decision of the Board. The result of the appeals dealt with in all the districts shall be published in a supplementary Gazette as soon as possible after the hearing of the appeals is concluded.
- 20. Teachers who may be entitled to benefit by the special provisions of clauses 5 (ii) (c), 5 (v), or of clause 9 of these regulations are required to notify the Director accordingly not later than the 1st day of February in each year, stating the name of the school, the position held, period of tenure with dates, rate of salary, and any other necessary particulars in connection with their claim to come under any of the regulations referred to. Likewise, teachers who by reason of broken service or of service in more than one district are in any danger of having a portion of their claim for service overlooked are required to forward to the Senior Inspector of their district by the same date all relative particulars of such service as herein mentioned.

shall be deemed to include the term 'headmistress.'"

"Wharf" has the same meaning as in the Harbours Act,

"Wharfinger" includes every person actually in charge of any wharf for the time being.

WHARVES.

2. In the absence of any special regulations to the contrary for any stated wharf, the time any vessel shall be permitted to occupy a berth at any quay, jetty, or wharf for the purpose of either loading or discharging cargo shall be not more than two days for vessels under 100 tons register, and one day additional for every further 50 tons of the register burden of

3. Upon the completion of the loading or discharging of his vessel, or upon the termination of the time allowed hereunder, whichever sooner occurs, the master shall forthwith remove his vessel from and vacate the berth occupied by it.

4. The master of any vessel loading or discharging at any quay, wharf, or jetty shall be deemed accountable for the proper slinging and landing of all goods, and responsible for any damage that may occur either from the breakage of slings or from the goods being improperly slung or improperly handled handled.

5. It shall be the duty of the master to cause proper tarpaulins to be stretched from the wharf to the vessels loading or discharging as aforesaid, and to be there maintained while

cargo or ballast is being handled or shipped.

6. In case any vessel does or causes any damage to any wharf or any part thereof, or to any machinery or building thereon or appertaining thereto, then and in any such case the master of such vessel shall forthwith report the occurrence to the Wharfinger by telegraph, or by at once reporting to

the Wharfinger in person.

7. Any damage done or caused as aforesaid may be repaired by the Council, and the cost thereof shall be recoverable by the Council from the master and owner of any such vessel,

or either of them, in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

8. All goods landed on any wharf, or brought thereon for shipment, shall be placed as the Harbourmaster, Wharfinger, or other authorized person directs, and so as to keep all mooring posts or rings free and all rails or tramways clear.

9. Before any vessel or boat is removed from any wharf, 9. Before any vessel or boat is removed from any wharf, the master or other person in charge of the said vessel or boat shall cause all dirt or rubbish to be thoroughly cleared from the portion of the said wharf occupied by such vessel or boat, and to be deposited at such places as may be appointed by the Wharfinger or other person in charge.

10. No boat shall be made fast to any steps or landing-

place or so near thereto as to obstruct the approach of other vessels, nor shall any boat lie longer alongside than is required

the driven, taken, or worked, any cart, vehicle, or horse on any wharf on which carts, vehicles, or horses are permitted by the Wharfinger or person in charge to be taken, at other than a multiple page. a walking-pace.

(b.) If such cart or vehicle is drawn by one horse, the person in charge shall walk at the head and lead the horse, and no person shall ride on any wharf, but shall dismount and lead his horse.

(c.) Every person driving or taking any vehicle on any such wharf shall remain in attendance thereon, so as to have

control of his horse or horses.

12. All watermen, stevedores, carters, and other persons employed on any wharf or any public landing-place shall be under the control of the Harbourmaster, Wharfinger, or other person in charge, and shall obey all orders given by such person in charge.

13. No person shall in any way obstruct or impede traffic on any wharf, nor make use of any provoking, abusive, obscene, or other improper language thereon.

14. (a.) No person shall, otherwise than as specifically permitted by these regulations, obstruct or impede ingress to or egress from any wharf by any vessel, boat, or cable, or in any other way.

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(b.) If in breach of this clause any person obstructs or imordered so to do by the Wharfinger or other person in charge, remove such obstruction, then, irrespective of the penalty to which such person is liable for such obstruction, the officer in charge may remove, cast off, or cut any such obstruction, and may recover the cost of so doing from such person.

15. The Wharfinger shall have the power, on authority of the Chairman of the Council, to close the wharves, or any of them, or any portion thereof, whenever in his opinion it is advisable to do so, and no person shall enter upon any wharf or portion of the wharf so closed without the consent of the Wharfinger.

16. The master of every vessel lying at a wharf shall give way to any mail-steamer, whether discharging cargo or passengers, and shall either vecate his berth or assist the master of the mail-steamer to moor alongside his vessel, and allow the man-secamer to moor alongside his vessel, and allow the passengers and cargo to be shipped and unshipped over and across the deck of his vessel, as the case may require, under such conditions as the Wharfinger may impose.

17. The master of every vessel, whether carrying passengers or not, when lying alongside any wharf shall fix, and at all times keep fixed, a safe and proper gangway from such vessel to the wharf; such gangway shall have side rails or stanchions with ropes rove taut through same, the top rail or rope being not less than 3 ft. high, and he shall also keep a gangway net properly secured beneath the gangway, and shall at all times throughout the night (that is to say, from sunset to sunrise) show and exhibit a proper light fixed to each gangway, and shall conform to and obey all orders the Wharfinger may give regarding the position, size, and kind of such gangways and regarding the position, size, and kind of such gangways and lights.

(b.) Such bill of lading, freight-list, manifest, or other account shall contain full particulars of the weights and measurements of such goods according as freight is payable, and the master shall pay to the Wharfinger or other person in charge all wharfage charges on such goods according to the real bearington contained.

19. The Wharfinger may order any vessel to be removed from any berth alongside any wharf whenever such removal shall in his opinion be proper for the general accommodation of the shipping, and any person who shall fail to obey such order shall be liable to a penalty.

20. The master of every vessel lying alongside any wharf shall have closed for use, or shall have properly screened and protected, in a manner to be approved of by the Wharfinger. all openings out of which water, steam, or other fluid is liable to be discharged, so as to ensure that such steam, water, or other fluid shall not fall on or wet the deck of such wharf.

21. Every person, when on any wharf, whether employed on the wharf or not, shall be under the control and shall obey the orders of the Wharfinger, police, or other constable, and shall immediately leave such wharf if ordered to do so by any of them.

22. Every person in charge of any vehicle shall, when on any wherf, be under the control of the Wharfinger, and shall immediately upon being so required by the Wharfinger remove such vehicle to any part of such wharf which the Wharfinger may direct, and shall, if so required by the Wharfinger, immediately remove such vehicle from any

wharf.

23. No person shall smoke in or about any shed the property of the Council. No person shall be admitted in any shed unless he or she has legitimate business therein, and no person shall remain in any shed after being directed by the Wharfinger to withdraw therefrom.

24. No child of tender years shall be allowed on any wharf unless accompanied by an adult.

25. No person shall place any placard, notice, or advertisement on any portion of any shed, waiting-room, or office, without the previous permission in writing of the Council.

GOODS WHARFAGE.

26. Every person who uses any wharf under the control of the Council for landing or shipping any goods shall pay to the Council wharf dues as follows, provided that wharfage shall not be charged on bona fide shipments from one wharf to another of such wharves within the control of the Council,

(a.) For all bricks, per 100 superficial feet, 2d.
(b.) For all bricks, per 100 bricks, 4d.
(c.) For all ship's ballast carted over or on a wharf, 1s. per ton.

(e.) For all goods (unless otherwise in these by-laws specially provided for) landed or shipped from any wherf, a rate of 2s. per ton weight or measurement, whichever is the greater, per ton weight or per ton measurement. Per ton weight means 20 cwt; per ton measurement means 40 cubic feet. Weight shall be gross weight —i.e., including covering; measurement shall be outside measurement of all packages.

- (f.) Boxes, jars, packages, or parcels not exceeding 6 cubic feet shall be charged each 3s.
- (g.) Boxes, jars, packages, or parcels exceeding 6 cubic feet shall be charged each 6d.
- (h.) For every horse or head of cattle, 1s. each.
 (i.) For every sheep, pig, or goat, 2d. each.

and were found to be in good order or otherwise, and that such receptacles were (or were not, as the case may be) properly closed. If a Surveyor of Ships is not satisfied that the receptacles are properly closed, he may direct the master as to how they are to be closed, and the master shall forth-

they are to be closed, and the master shall forthwith see that effect is given to his directions.

(d.) Permit any Superintendent or Surveyor, or any Collector or other officer of Customs, to be present at any drill, and to inspect any entry made in the official log, in pursuance of section 15 of the hereinbefore-recited Act.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Post and Telegraph HEREAS by section eleven of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, as amended by section eighteen of the Post and Telegraph Amendment Act, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Acts"), the Governor-General in Council is empowered to make regulations authorizing the Postmaster-General to accept for safe custody any documents or articles of value of a prescribed kind or kinds, and prescribing the conditions of such acceptance and the charges to be paid in respect thereof:

5. A receipt, hereinafter called a safe deposit certificate, shall be given for each packet accepted from a depositor for

6. A depositor may inspect his packet free of inspection charge four times during each calendar year. Additional inspections may also be made on payment of a fee of 6d. for each inspection.

7. A depositor desiring to inspect or withdraw his packet

must produce his safe-deposit certificate.

8. A depositor desiring to inspect or withdraw his packet and who is unable to attend personally may authorize an and who is unable to attend personally may authorize an agent to act in his stead by means of an order in writing on form Acct. 689. FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharf, and all erections thereon, in good order and repair; and shall at all times permit to be erected and exhibited therefrom any lights for the guidance of vessels, and shall maintain at its own cost any such lights, provided that no new light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf, and any buildings erected thereon, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon his leaving at the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or buildings, or any of them, requiring the Council, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, the said Council shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. The Council shall appoint all officers and servants

required for the management and working of the said wharf.
7. The Council shall not erect or suffer to be erected on the said wharf any building or structure whatever except

the said wharf any building or structure whatever except with the consent of the Minister.

8. The Council shall keep a separate account of the receipts and expenditure on account of such wharf, and shall cause such account to be balanced to the 31st March in each year, and shall send a copy of such account, when balanced, to the Minister, and shall supply any particulars in reference thereto as may be required by the Minister.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder.

tions made thereunder.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years, computed from the 3rd day of October, 1918, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time reby virtue of this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, on giving to the Council three calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor-General or the Minister, or any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at the last known address of the Council, their successors, administrators, or assigns. No compensation or allowance shall be payable in such case.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid during a period of three months from the date hereof.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red-deer so destroyed as afternation. destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of the person whom and the locality in which the deer were

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing

any person to sell any ceer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.


