and hereinafter called "the area of supply," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, or any regulations hereafter made in substitution thereof, and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described, such electric lines at present proposed to be erected being indicated by means of broken red lines shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 46249, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 4d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

6. REQUIREMENTS OF BULLER COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the County of Buller except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license, and the regulations relating thereto, as have been or may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Buller County Council.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 29th February, 1920.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said General Manager within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1920.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society at Dunedin, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be

destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1920.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The said Secretary may, with the authority of the said society, authorize the sale, either by auction or otherwise, during the currency of these regulations, of deer destroyed pursuant to these regulations, and of the meat and skins of such deer; provided that the proceeds derived from such sale shall be devoted to patriotic purposes.

4A. The said Secretary shall, on or before the 31st day of January, 1921, furnish a statement of the moneys received from such sale and of the patriotic purposes or purpose to which they were devoted.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

3. On the receipt of any notice of appeal the Clerk of the local authority shall apply to a Stipendiary Magistrate to hear and determine the appeal.
4. The Magistrate to whom any such appeal is referred shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine the same.
5. Due notice of the time and place of the hearing of any such appeal shall be given by the Magistrate to the appellant and to the Clerk of the local authority.
6. The parties to the appeal shall be entitled to be represented at the hearing by counsel.
7. The Magistrate shall certify in writing to the Clerk of the local authority and to the appellant his determination of any such appeal.

Character.—A fixed and group flashing white light showing two flashes every twenty seconds, thus—flash, interval 5 secs.; flash, interval 15 secs.

Elevation.—112 ft.

Visibility.—16 miles.

Power.—Fixed, 500 candles; flashes, 50,000 candles.

Structure.—A white octagonal concrete tower with red lantern.

Remarks.—For half the period of the light—i.e., 10 seconds—a fixed light will be visible through which the flashes will show, for the other half of the period the light will be totally eclipsed.

(b.) Fog-signal:

RESOLUTION MAKING A SPECIAL RATE AT AN ORDINARY MEETING HELD ON THE 6TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1919.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Kaitieke County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of ten thousand pounds (£10,000), authorized to be raised by the Kaitieke County Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of widening, culverting, and metalling portions of the main service, the Hikimutu-Owhango, the Makokomiko, the Tunanui, the Kawautahi, the Waitea, the Waitea Branch, and the Otapouri Roads, and of forming and culverting portion of the Piriaka Road, the said Kaitieke County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of twopence three-farthings (2½d.) in the pound upon the rateable value (being the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the Hunua-Owhango Special Rating Area, comprising, *inter alia*, the townships of Piriaka, Kakahi, and Owhango, and being the rateable properties within the following boundaries,—

Commencing at the north-western corner of Section 33, Block II, Hunua S.D. and running in a north-eastern direction along the north-western boundaries of said Section 33 and Section 34, said Block II, to the North Island Main Trunk Railway; thence by such railway in a southerly direction to the railway-crossing giving access to said Section 34; thence by a straight line running east to the Wanganui River; thence by such river in the direction of its source to the western mouth of the Whakapapa River; thence by the Whakapapa River in the direction of its source to the south-eastern corner of Section 21, Block IV, Kaitieke S.D.; thence by the southern boundaries of said Section 21 and Section 22, said Block IV, to the said North Island Main Trunk Railway; thence in a northerly direction along such railway to a point opposite the south-eastern corner of part Section 23, said Block IV, containing 33 acres, and occupied by one John Prouse; thence by a straight line to such south-eastern corner of said part Section 23; thence generally in a westerly direction along the southern boundaries of said part Section 23 and Sections 24 and 25, said Block IV, to the southern corner of such Section 25; thence along the western boundaries of part Section 25 and Section 26, said Block IV, to the Kawautahi Road; thence by a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the south-western corner of unnumbered Crown Lands Section, Block X, Hunua S.D.; thence along the western boundaries of such unnumbered section, Section 14, said Block X, and Section 26, Block IX, Hunua S.D., to Section 3, said Block IX; thence generally by the southern, western, and northern boundaries respectively of such Section 3 to the south-western corner of Section 8, said Block IX; thence along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries respectively of such Section 8, and crossing the Hikimutu-Owhango Road, to the south-eastern corner of Section 10, said Block IX; thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of such Section 10 and the eastern boundary of Section 11, said Block IX, to the south-eastern corner of Section 6, Block V, Hunua S.D.; thence along the southern boundaries of Sections 6, 5, 4, and 3, said Block V; thence along the eastern, southern, and western boundaries respectively of Section 1, said Block V, to the Makokomiko Road; thence across such road to the south-western corner of Section 20, said Block V; thence along the western and northern boundaries of such Section 20 to the south-western corner of Section 6B, Waimarino Native Reserve; thence along the western boundary of such Section 6B to the northern boundary of said Block V, Hunua S.D.; thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of such Block V to the south-western corner of said Section 33, Block II, Hunua S.D.; and thence along the western boundary of such Section 33 to the north-western corner of such section, being the commencing-point.
