A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of section three of the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, a majority of the ratepayers in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Bruce, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the land comprised in the said area be included in the Matau River District as constituted under the provisions of the River Boards Act, 1908, and its amendments,

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of such river district in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in section three of the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Bruce County, shall on and from the date hereof be deemed to be added to and form part of the Matau River District; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Matau River District, with such addition as aforesaid, shall be those set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work is not required for such public

work the Governor-General may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed within the Otago Acclimatization District, in the Hunter Valley, Dingle, Hawea Flat, and Makarora districts from the 1st day of April, 1920, to the 20th day of May, 1920 (both days inclusive), and in the Greendale, Wart Hill, Upper Pomahaka, and Whitecomb districts from 24th day of March, 1920, to 13th May, 1920 (both days inclusive).

Regulations as to deer "tags," per *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

9. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

Births in 1919.

The number of births registered in 1919 (24,490) is the lowest recorded in any year since 1906, when the mean population for the year was only 919,105, as compared with a mean of 1,136,390 in 1919. The rate for 1919 is easily the lowest on record, being 1.89 per 1,000 less than for 1918, which held the record previously.

The continued duration of the war, with its effect on the marriage rate, combined with the calling-up of married men for service overseas, is reflected in the rapidly falling birth-rate of 1918 and 1919. It might have been anticipated, however, that with the termination of actual hostilities in November, 1918, the birth-rate would reach its lowest point during September quarter of 1919, after which it would begin to show an improvement, and this is what has happened, as will be seen from the following figures. It is reasonable to expect that the improvement indicated by the figures for the last quarter of 1919 will be at least maintained in 1920.

Deaths in 1919.

Although, with the exception of the year 1918 (when the deaths were increased by 50 per cent. on account of the influenza epidemic of the last quarter), the number of deaths registered in 1919 is the highest on record, nevertheless the rate per 1,000 of mean population is not exceptional, and is indeed only 0.10 per 1,000 higher than for the average of the five years 1913-17.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

WHEREAS by section eleven of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, it is provided that when any person has died of an infectious disease the undertaker, or other person having charge of the funeral of the deceased, shall forthwith, after having been informed of the cause of death and before the removal of the body from the building or other place in which it may then be, give notice to the District Health Officer of the fact of death and the cause thereof:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section one hundred and eleven of the Public Health Act, 1908, and by the said section eleven of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. WHERE the cause of death is any infectious disease, the notice required under section 11 of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, shall be given by post, and shall be in the form (A) in the Schedule hereto.

2. Without excluding the operation of Regulation 1, where the cause of death is influenza or acute primary pneumonia, the notice required under section 11 of the Public Health Amendment Act, 1919, shall be given by telegram, and shall be in the form marked (B) in the Schedule hereto.

3. Every notice under the first regulation shall be posted, postage being collect, and shall be transmitted free of charge to the sender; and, similarly, every telegram under Regulation 2 shall be marked "collect" and shall be transmitted free of charge to the sender.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.

The foregoing regulations of the Clifden Racing Club were made and passed by the Clifden Racing Club on the 22nd day of August, 1919, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.

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SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director : Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
