2. All trust moneys and other property held by the old Board in trust for the purposes of any such institution exclusively, and all moneys owing to that Board in respect of

that institution exclusively, shall, without conveyance or assignment, vest on the said appointed day in the new Board of the new district in which such institution is situated.

3. All existing debts or liabilities charged by mortgage or otherwise exclusively on any property so becoming vested in a new Board, and all existing contracts, debts, or liabilities made or incurred by the old Board so abolished in respect exclusively of any institution so becoming vested in a new

exclusively of any institution so becoming vested in a new Board, shall on the said appointed day become the contracts, debts, and liabilities of the new Board.

4. All property, debts, liabilities, and contracts of the old Board hereby abolished (other than those hereimbefore referred to) shall on the appointed day become, without conveyance or assignment, the property, debts, liabilities, and contracts of the new Board of the new Bay of Islands Hospital District, in trust, to divide and apportion the same between itself and all of the other new Boards in shares proportionate to the amount of levy for maintenance purposes made on each of the new districts as the contributing districts made on each of the new districts as the contributing districts of the old Board during the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and the said property, debts, liabilities, and contracts shall be parti-tioned or divided between the new Boards in such proportion accordingly.

5. If any dispute arises in connection with the foregoing

The month was characterized by very changeable weather, frequent westerly disturbances accounting for a prevalence of strong winds between north-west and south-west. The change to the latter direction was at times very sudden, notably about the 21st. Electrical disturbances were experienced at this time in various districts, accompanied by a heavy fall of hail and sleet. Some snow fell on the 2nd and 8th in parts of the East Coast districts of the South Island, and a rather wide-spread and damaging frost occurred on the morning of the 4th, both rare events at this time of the year.

The deaths I January were 335—a decrease of 29 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 189, females 146. Invitation to Chiefs and Representatives of all Tribes of the Maori Race to welcome the Prince of Wales at Rotorua.

To the Maori People of Aotearoa and Te Waipounamu: Greetings.

ON hearing that His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, Son of King George V, will be visiting New Zealand during the month of April next, representatives of various Maori tribes expressed the wish that the Government should Maori tribes expressed the wish that the Government should give the Maori people as a whole an opportunity of welcoming the Prince to Aotearoa and Te Waipounamu. The Government has agreed to grant that request. Following the precedent that was created in 1901 on the occasion of the visit of the present King, then Duke of Cornwall and York, the Government has decided that the welcome of the Maori people to the Prince of Wales shall take place at Rotorua on or about the 21st of April next. The Government, therefore, cordially invites the chiefs and representatives of all the tribes of the Maori race to assemble at Rotorua about a week or ten days before that date. The Government is desirous of having the welcome as warm, and the display of a week or ten days before that date. The Government is desirous of having the welcome as warm, and the display of Native dances as good, as they were in 1901. It is hoped that at least as many Natives will attend the welcome on this occasion as in 1901, which was about 5,000. Contingents from each tribe should consist of the principal chiefs, the haka and poi dancers, and any returned Maori soldiers who can get away, as it is hoped to arrange for a parade of the Maori Pioneer Battalion. No children shall be taken for fear of an outbreak of influenza.

Free transport both going to and returning from the reception will be provided by the Government.

A camp will be formed on the racecourse at Rotorua capable of accommodating 5,000 people.

Those in camp will be provided with food by the Government, so that they need not take any with them.

When the time arrives arrangements will be made by the

When the time arrives, arrangements will be made by the Native Department for transport to Rotorua, of which due notice will be given. The Native Department would therefore be glad of early notice as to the numbers from each centre who are likely to make the journey. The Maori members of Parliament will be asked to see that the invitation of the Company to the Notives in their ntemoers of rarnament will be asked to see that the invitation of the Government is made known to the Natives in their respective districts, and to see that proper arrangements are made for their transport to and comfort at Rotorua.

Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1908.
