A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereto as and for provisional State forests.

SCHEDULE.

AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 5,900 acres, more or less, situated in Colville, Moehau, and Harataunga Survey Districts. Bounded towards the north and north-east generally by H.P.L. 75, Block I, Colville Survey District, Section 3, across a public road, and by that road to the southern boundary of Section 10, Block I, Colville Survey District; thence by Sections 10 aforesaid, 7, 6, Sections 15, 6, 8, of Block I, Harataunga Survey District, the western boundary of Tangiaronui Block, the north-eastern boundary of Paraemaiku, the north-western boundary of that block, and the north-western boundaries of Moehau No. 1H and 1G 1 Blocks; thence by Sections 1, 3, and 5, Block IV, part of the southern, the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of forest reserve of 2,720 acres to the north-eastern boundary of Section 7, Block I, Moehau Survey District; thence by Sections 7, 6, 8, 4, Block I, Moehau Survey District, and 2, Block I, Colville Survey District, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 288 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks II and IV, Moehau Survey District. Bounded towards the north by forest reserve of 2,720 acres in Block II, Moehau

Survey District; towards the south-east by Section 5, Block IV, Moehau Survey District; and towards the south-west by Moehau No. 1K Block to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 962 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks VI and VII, Harataunga Survey District. Bounded towards the north by the Matamataharakeke Block, from the westernmost corner of that block to the intersection of the northern boundary of Moehau No. 2B; thence towards the south-east by the last said block to the Whareroa Stream; thence towards the south generally by that stream to the north boundary of Moehau No. 2A No. 2 No. 2B; thence by that boundary to Section 8, Block VI, Harataunga Survey District; and towards the west generally by that section to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 262 acres, more or less, situated in Block I, Coromandel Survey District. Bounded towards the north-east by the road forming the south-western boundary of Section 17, Block VIII, Harataunga Survey District; thence by Section 14, Block I, Coromandel Survey District, and Section 8, Block I, Coromandel Survey District, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,525 acres, more or less, situated in Block II, Coromandel Survey District. Bounded towards the north by Section 7, Block I, Coromandel Survey District; towards the north-east generally by the Harataunga West and East Blocks to the Waikoromiko Stream; thence by that stream to Section 13, Block II, Coromandel Survey District; and towards the south generally by Sections 13 and 11, Block II aforesaid, Section 22, Suburbs of Buffalo Township, and Sections 10, 14, and 12, Block II aforesaid, to a public road, and by that road to its intersection with a public road, and by that road and Section 7 to the road forming the eastern boundary of Section 5, Block II, Coromandel Survey District; and towards the west by that road to the place of commencement: excepting Sections 1 and 6, Block II, Coromandel Survey District. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,034 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks IV and VII, Otama Survey District. Bounded towards the north-east by Section 6, Block IV, Otama Survey District; towards the south-east by Kautunu No. 6 Block;

thence towards the west generally by a road and Section 3, Block VII, and the Kawakawa, Otanguru, and Opu Blocks, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 9,414 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks III, IV, V, VII, VIII, and IX, Hastings Survey District. Bounded towards the north generally by south-western boundary of Kakaterahae Block; thence by the south eastern boundary of a block of 1,000 acres to the Waiparapa Block, and by that block, Sections 7 and 1, Block IV, Hastings Survey District; thence towards the east generally by a stream to and by the southern boundary of Section 5, Block IV; thence by Section 17, Block V, Hastings Survey District, a block of 50 acres, and again by Section 17, Block V aforesaid, the abutment of a road, and Section 13, Block IX, Hastings Survey District, and the northern boundary of the Taranoho Block, and by that block to the county boundary; thence towards the south generally by the Thames County to Section 1, Block VII, Hastings Survey District; and towards the west generally by Section 1 aforesaid and Manaia No. 2 Block to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 497 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks VI and VIA, Whitianga Survey District. Bounded towards the north by the north portion of timber-lease area in Block VI, Whitianga Survey District; thence towards the east generally by Section 23, Block VIA, the Tasman Sea, to Section 1, Block VIA; thence by Sections 1 and 2, the northern boundary of the southern portion of timber-lease area aforesaid and Whenuakiti No. 2 Block to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 67, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 7,600 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks III, VII, VIII, XI, and XII, Hastings Survey District. Bounded towards the north generally by the Coromandel County from the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block VI, Hastings Survey District, to the south-western boundary of Taranoho Block; thence towards the east generally by that block, Sections 1 and 5, Block XII, to a point due east of the northern boundary-line of L.B.T.A. (revoked by *Gazette*, 1917, p. 4019) in Block XII, Hastings Survey District; thence to and by the northern boundary aforesaid to the Waipatukahu River, and by that river to Section 7, Block II, Hastings Survey District; thence by Sections 7 aforesaid and 5 of aforesaid block, H.P.L. of 400 acres, the eastern and north-western boundaries of Section 2, Block VII, Hastings Survey District, the north-western boundary of kauri-timber area of 80 acres, and again by Section 2 aforesaid to Te Mata River; thence by Te Mata River, Mata Block H.P.L. 80, and Section 1, Block VI, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 68, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,680 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks XI, XII, XIV, and XV, Hastings Survey District. Bounded towards the north generally by Sections 4, 40, 20, Block XI, Hastings Survey District, the road forming the southern boundary of Section 7, Block XI aforesaid, and by that road and Section 36, Block XI aforesaid, to the western boundary of Block XII; thence by that boundary to the southern boundary of L.B.T.A. Section 1 of Block XII, and by that boundary to a track which intersects that boundary; thence by that track to the northern boundary of W.T.A. Section 9, and by that section, W.T.A. Section 3, Section 39, Block XI aforesaid, and H.P.L. 167 to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 68, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 6,028 acres, more or less, situated in Block IV, Waihou, and Blocks I, II, and V, Ohinemuri Survey Districts. Bounded towards the north generally by L.B.T.A. 6, Block I, Ohinemuri Survey District, the northern boundary of Ohinemuri Survey District, Section 5, Block XIII, Tairua Survey District, and Section 1, Block XIV, Tairua Survey District, Tairua River Section 3, Block II, Ohinemuri Survey District, Wires track Section 3, Block V, and Section 9, Block I, Ohinemuri Survey District, and again by Section 3, Hikutaia No. 1 Block, Section 1, H.P.L. 430, Sections 3, 2, 2, Block I, Ohinemuri Survey District, and Section 2, Block IV, Waihou Survey District, Whangamata No. 1, Sections 55, 4, 5, Block I, Ohinemuri Survey District, again by Section 4 and Omaha W. Block to the place of com-

mencement. As the same is delineated on plan 68, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 9,083 acres, more or less, situated in Whitianga and Tairua Survey Districts, commencing at the north-western boundary of H.P.L. 49, Block II, Tairua Survey District; thence by right lines through pegs III, IV, V, Ben Bolt VI, Trig. Station 96, Tanehua, pegs VIII, IX, and X; thence by timber lease of 2,150 acres, Pepe Block, H.P.L. 301, Papatawatawa Block, the Tairua Harbour, Section 8, H.P.L. 92, Sections 2 and 5, Block XIII, Whitianga Survey District, Section 9 of aforesaid block, and the road forming the western boundary of that section to H.P.L. 85; thence towards the south generally by H.L.P. 85, Sections 1, 2, and 1, Block XII, Whitianga Survey District, Sections 14 and 56, Block II, Tairua Survey District, a block of 50 acres, the Tairua River, and H.P.L. 49 to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 68, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 33,200 acres, more or less, situated in Tairua, Whitianga, and Ohinemuri Survey Districts. Bounded towards the north-west generally, commencing at the north-western corner of Wharekawa East No. 4, by the Tairua River, Section 25, Block II, Tairua Survey District, a block of 60 acres, Sections 20, 24, 21, 23, 16, 15, H.P.L. 29, 19, Block II, Tairua Survey District, middle portion of Tairua Block, Sections 7, 5, and 6, Block III, Tairua Survey District, again by 5, Tairua Harbour, a block of 50 acres in Block XIV, Whitianga Survey District, Sections 6, 3, and 4, Block XIV aforesaid, to the sea; towards the east generally by the sea, Section 1, Block IV, Tairua Survey District, a block of 106 acres 1 rood 7 perches, Section 2 of Block IV, again by Section 1 and the sea, a scenic reserve, H.P.L. 87, Sections 5, H.P.L. 100, 4, and 6 of Block VIII, Tairua Survey District, the Wharekawa Harbour, H.P.L. 113, a block of 100 acres, Section 1, Block VIII aforesaid, blocks of 250 acres, 100 acres, and 100 acres, H.P.L. 114, blocks of 160 acres and 36 acres, H.P.L. 123, the Wharekawa Harbour, H.P.L. 118, again by the sea, H.P.L. 117, again by the sea, Section 1, Block XII, a block of 1,000 acres, Whangamata Harbour, Section 2, Block XII, Whangamata Harbour, Sections 7, 2, 8, 6, H.P.L. 40, Block XVI, Tairua Survey District, 3, 2, Block XV, Tairua Survey District, 3 and 1, Block III, Ohinemuri Survey District, to the county boundary; thence towards the south by the county boundary to Section 3, Block II, Ohinemuri Survey District; thence towards the west by Sections 3, 2, 1, timber lease of 1,893 acres, State forest reserve of 3,190 acres, Section 1, Block XI, Tairua Survey District, a block of 160 acres, again by the aforesaid forest reserve, timber lease of 2,873 acres, timber lease of 5,089 acres, a block of 200 acres, a block of 500 acres, a block of 355 acres, timber lease, H.P.L. 299, timber lease area of 5,089 acres, and Wharekawa East Nos. 4 and 5 Blocks to the place of commencement: save and excepting a block of 100 acres in Block II, Tairua Survey District, a block of 100 acres in Blocks XV and XVI, Tairua Survey District. As the same is delineated on plan 68, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 19,776 acres, more or less, situated in Ohinemuri Survey District, commencing at the confluence of Maratoto Stream and the Waipaheke Stream; thence by the Thames County boundary, the Whangamata No. 4 Block, H.P.L. 176, again by Whangamata No. 4 Block; thence by the sea, Section 1 of Block VIII, Ohinemuri Survey District, Whangamata 6B No. 3 Block, Mataora Block, Section 14 of Block XII, H.P.L. 51 and 164, Section 6 of Block XI, Sections 10, 8, 5, of said Block XI, H.P.L. 73, Section 9 of said Block XI, and Sections 3, 2, Block VII, Ohinemuri Survey District, Whangamata 6B No. 1, Block VII, Ohinemuri Survey District, Section 3, Block VII aforesaid, Whangamata 6B No. 1, and Sections 2, 6, and 3, Block VII aforesaid, H.P.L. 50, 338, 253, 319, and Sections 34, 4, and 5, Block VI, Ohinemuri Survey District, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 69, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 760 acres, more or less, situated in Block X, Ohinemuri Survey District. Bounded towards the north by H.P.L. 338, thence by Grace Darling Stream, thence by Section 17, H.P.L. 249 and 253, all in Block X, Ohinemuri Survey District. As the same is delineated on plan 69, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 742 acres, situated in Block XIV, Ohinemuri Survey District. Bounded towards the north by Sec-

tion 46, Block XIV, Ohinemuri Survey District, Section 19 of aforesaid block, a public road, Section 43 of aforesaid block, and again by a public road to Section 36, Block XIV aforesaid; thence towards the east, south, and west generally by Section 36 aforesaid, Waikino Water-supply Reserve and Karangahake Watershed Reserve, and a watershed reserve in Block XIII, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 69, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,036 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks X, XI, XIV, and XV, Ohinemuri Survey District. Bounded towards the north generally by a public road from the southernmost corner of Section 7, Block X, Ohinemuri Survey District, the water-supply reserve, and again by the public road aforesaid, Sections 64, 65, 4, 3, 8, Block XV, Ohinemuri Survey District, 12, 13, and 11, Block XIV aforesaid, to the place of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan 69, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 499 acres, more or less, situated in Block XV, Ohinemuri Survey District. Bounded as follows: Section 64, Block XV, Ohinemuri Survey District, a public road, Sections 29, 50, and 19 of aforesaid block, Waitete Stream, a public road, Sections 59, 5, and 65, all of Block XV, Ohinemuri Survey District, to the place of commencement. All that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,843 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks III, VI, and VII, Aroha Survey District. TARANAKI LAND DISTRICT.

All that area of Crown land in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 19,600 acres, more or less, situate in Blocks X, XI, XII, XIV, XV, and XVI, Waro Survey District, and Blocks II and III, Pouatu Survey District. Bounded towards the north by Sections 4 and 5, Block X, Waro Survey District, Mount Damper Road, national endowment land in Blocks XI and XII aforesaid (see New Zealand Statutes, 1908, No. 94), Sections 22 and 10, Block V, Ohura Survey District; towards the east by Section 1 (F.R.), Block IX aforesaid, Section 1, Scenic and Forest Reserve, Block XII, Waro Survey District, Sections 1 (E.R.) and 3, Block XVI aforesaid; towards the south by proposed scenic reserve one mile from Tangarakau Stream in Block XVI, Waro, and Blocks IV and III, Pouatu Survey Districts; towards the west generally by Section 5, Block III, Pouatu Survey District, Rangi Road, Block XV, Waro Survey District, Section 9, Block XIV, Waro Survey District, by Mount Damper Road, Block X aforesaid, Section 8, Block XIV aforesaid, Okau Road, and Sections 2 and 1, Block X aforesaid. As the same is delineated on plan marked 85, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of Crown land in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 6,500 acres, more or less, situate in Blocks V, IX, and XIII, Aria Survey District. Bounded towards the north by Sections 11 and 12, Block V, Aria Survey District; towards the east by Sections 13 and 9, Block V aforesaid, Sections 1 and 2, Block IX aforesaid, Sections 1, 2 (E.R.), and 3, Block XIII aforesaid; towards the

south by Section 2, Block I, Ohura Survey District; towards the west by Mohakatino-Parinihi I Block, Blocks X, VI, and II, Mokau Survey District. As the same is delineated on plan marked 85, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of Crown land in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 4,850 acres, more or less, being Section 3, Block X, and Section 9, Block VI, Aria Survey District. As the same is delineated on plan marked 85, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of Crown land in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 3,964 acres, more or less, being Sections 6 and 7, Block V, and Section 9, Block VI, Waro Survey District. As the same is delineated on plan marked 86, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of Crown land in the Taranaki Land District, containing by admeasurement 350 acres, more or less, situate in Block XIV, Opaku Survey District. Bounded towards the north and north-east generally by Sections 13, 12, 15, and Maben Road, Block XIV aforesaid; towards the south by Run No. 1; towards the west by Section 14, all being in Block XIV aforesaid. As the same is delineated on plan marked 86, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

HAWKE'S BAY LAND DISTRICT.

All that area of land in the Hawke's Bay Land District, containing 2,200 acres, more or less, situate in Blocks IX and X, Hikurangi Survey District. Bounded towards the east by the Mangaokura Stream; towards the south by Sections 1, 2, 3, and 5, Block XIV, Hikurangi Survey District; towards the west by the Ruatahunga Stream; and towards the north by a line from the Ruatahunga Stream on a bearing of 82°, for a distance of approximately 270 chains, to the point of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan marked 87, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of land in the Hawke's Bay Land District, containing by admeasurement 11,650 acres, more or less, situate in Blocks I, II, V, VI, and IX, Tuahu Survey District. Bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of a forest reserve, thence north-easterly along the boundary between the Hawke's Bay and the Auckland Land Districts to the south-western corner of the Tahora Block; thence generally easterly along the southern boundary of that block and the Mangakahikatoa Stream and the Waipaoa River to its intersection with the western boundary of Small Grazing-run 114; thence southerly along the western boundary of that small grazing-run to the Gisborne-Waikaremoana Road; thence south-westerly along the northern side of the road to its intersection with Small Grazing-run 94; thence westerly and southerly by the northern and western boundaries of that small grazing-run to its intersection with the aforesaid Gisborne-Waikaremoana Road; thence south-westerly along the northern side of that road to its intersection with a forest reserve; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that reserve to the point of commencement. As the same is delineated on plan marked 88, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of land in the Hawke's Bay Land District, containing by admeasurement 1,500 acres, more or less, situate in Block V, Makaretu Survey District. Bounded by a line commencing at the most southerly point of Small Grazing-run 101, and proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction along the southern boundary of the said Small Grazing-run 101; thence southerly to a point on the north bank of the Tukituki River distant about thirty chains; along the said bank of the said river from the south-western corner of Section 2, Block V aforesaid; thence along the said river to the south-western corner of Section 2, Block V, Makaretu Survey District; and thence in a north-easterly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 2 and 1, Block V, Makaretu Survey District, to the point of commencement. As the same is delineated on the plan marked 89, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

NELSON LAND DISTRICT.

All that area of Crown land in the Nelson Land District, containing by estimation 1,920 acres, more or less, situated in Block XI, Inangahua Survey District. Bounded towards the north-west by the boundary of the Inangahua County; towards the south-east by national-endowment lands; and towards the south by the southern boundary of Inangahua Survey District. As the same is delineated on the plan

marked 82, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of Crown land in the Nelson Land District, containing by estimation 2,560 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks I and V, Reefton Survey District. Bounded towards the south-east generally by national-endowment lands and Section 14 (in red); towards the west by Maimai Survey District; and towards the north by Inangahua Survey District. As the same is delineated on the plan marked 82, in green, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

All that area of Crown land in the Nelson Land District, containing by estimation 37,800 acres, more or less, situated in Blocks II, III, IV, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XIII, and XIV, Maimai Survey District. WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, that any area or areas of land may be constituted an electric-power district or outer area of such district under the said Act, and in the manner therein provided:

And whereas a petition, praying that the area described in the First Schedule hereto may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act, and that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto may be constituted an outer area of such electric-power district, was presented to the Governor-General on the tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty:

And whereas such petition was publicly notified in the *Wairarapa Standard* and *Featherston Advocate*, the *Wairarapa Age*, the *Daily News*, the *Wairarapa Daily Times*, and the *Martinborough Star* of the nineteenth December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, respectively, being newspapers circulating in the proposed electric-power district:

And whereas after due inquiry the Governor-General is of opinion that the petition should be granted:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, do hereby proclaim the district with the boundaries as described in the First Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Wairarapa Electric-power District";

and I do further proclaim that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall be an outer area of such electric-power district.

And whereas the Havelock Town Board (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect lines within the area of supply as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the area of supply," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, or any regulations hereafter made in substitution therefor, and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described, such electric lines at present proposed to be erected being indicated by means of alternate long and short broken white lines shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 43663, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

6. REQUIREMENTS OF THE PELORUS ROAD BOARD.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Pelorus Road District, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as have been or may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Pelorus Road Board.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said landing-stage and shed and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such landing-stage or shed, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said landing-stage shall be taken away by the Council and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion; doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5127, so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said slipway thereon; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the construction of the slipway as shown on plan marked M.D. 5127.

In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of 10s., payable in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said slipway without payment.
5. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned slipway in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.
6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said slipway and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such slipway, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
7.  - (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
 - (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

12. The erection of the slipway shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 734, as against 893 in January—a decrease of 159. The deaths in February were 306—a decrease of 29 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 167, females 139. Forty-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 14.71 per cent. of the whole number. Thirty-four of these were under one year of age.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1920.

During January beneficial rains fell, particularly between the 18th and 24th, when a small westerly low-pressure area and subtropical disturbance were in evidence. Unsettled conditions were also experienced generally from the 1st to the 4th, and between the 9th and 15th, the result of two somewhat intense westerly "lows." On the 14th and 15th snow fell on the higher levels in both the North and South Islands, and light falls were experienced on some of the low-lying country in the east coast districts of the South Island, a most unusual occurrence for midsummer.

The aggregate month's rainfall was generally considerably above the average, but Otago and scattered places in the Gisborne and Westland districts recorded a deficiency.

Both sunshine and temperatures were below the average, but except for occasional high winds the month was a fairly calm one,

Fatal Accident, Brighton Coal-mine, Dunedin.—Notice of Suspension of Mine-manager's Certificate.

WHEREAS a Court at Dunedin held an inquiry on the 6th day of February, 1920, before Mr. H. Y. Widdowson, Stipendiary Magistrate, and James Carruthers and William Braidwood, Assessors, into the accident at the Brighton Coal-mine on the 26th day of August, 1919, resulting in the death of Robert William Smith:

Now, therefore, after hearing the evidence of witnesses, notice of the following judgment is given by the Stipendiary Magistrate to the Minister of Mines in terms of section 7 of the Coal mines Amendment Act, 1914:

"I hereby give you notice that upon an application in that behalf made by the Inspector of Mines, and dated the 2nd day of January, 1920, a Court duly constituted under the provisions of section 7 of the Coal-mines Amendment Act, 1914, this day held an inquiry under the said section into the matter of an accident in the Brighton Coal-mine on the

26th day of August, 1919, resulting in the death of one Robert William Smith. And the said Court found that the said accident was caused by the non-observance by David McNeill, the holder of a second-class mine-manager's certificate, of Special Rule No. 21 in the Second Schedule of the Coal-mines Act, 1908, and by his negligence, and in the circumstances the Court disqualified the said David McNeill by suspending his said certificate for a period of seven days as from the date hereof.

THE PANAMA CANAL.—U.S. NAVAL RADIO STATION PUERTO OBALDIA IN OPERATION.

1. The U.S. Naval Radio Station Puerto Obaldia, located at Puerto Obaldia, on the Atlantic Coast of the Republic of Panama, two miles from the Colombian border (latitude $8^{\circ} 50'$ north, longitude $77^{\circ} 40'$ west), is now in operation. The station call is NRK.

2. Puerto Obaldia is operated by the U.S. Naval Communication Service, and is prepared to handle U.S. and Panaman government despatches free of charge. The station also handles commercial traffic at rates which may be obtained from the Naval Radio Station, Balboa, C.Z.

SPECIAL ORDER AMENDING TRAFFIC BY-LAWS.

WHEREAS the body corporate called the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Raglan is satisfied that the use of chains and other such appliances affixed to the tires of motors when used upon the metalled roads in the said county is attended with risk of damage to such metalled roads:

The body corporate called the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Raglan, in pursuance and exercise of all powers vested in it by the Counties Act, 1908, and the Public Works Act, 1908, the Motor Regulation Act, 1908, and the respective amendments to the said Acts, and all other Acts and powers whatsoever in it in this behalf enabling, doth hereby make and ordain by special order the by-law following, to come into force on the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty:—

1. It shall be unlawful for any person, being the owner or driver of a motor, to have placed, attached, or affixed on or to any of the wheels or on any of the tires of the same, when proceeding on or along any metalled road within the county, any chain, rope, grip, or any other device or appliance whereby the surface of the road is gripped or held whilst the motor is proceeding on or along the same.

2. For the purpose of this by-law "motor" is hereby defined as "any vehicle propelled by mechanical power if it does not exceed four tons in weight unladen, whether such vehicle is used alone or in order to propel or draw one or more vehicles whose weight together with that of the motor vehicle does not exceed five tons unladen. In calculating for the purpose of this Act the weight of a vehicle unladen, the weight of any water, fuel, or accumulators used for the purposes of propulsion shall not be included."

3. Any person committing a breach of this by-law shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
