No private box may be held for the purpose of conducting a betting business; and if any box is known to be used for such purpose, or if the holder of a box is believed to conduct any such business, the holder may be deprived of the use of the box without notice. No person shall be permitted to engage a private box for Sunday or for a certain day or certain days only or for a certain day or certain days only.

TELEPHONE EXCHANGE CONNECTIONS.

5. The Minister of Telegraphs may refuse to connect with the telephone exchange and may disconnect from the tele-phone exchange any place of business, house, or premises which in the opinion of the Minister is or are used for any illegal, immoral, or improper purpose, and may, either with or without previous notice, exclude from the telephone exchange any subscriber who allows the telephone instru-ments in his custody or control to be damaged or destroyed, or put to any improper use, and may remove or cause to be removed any instruments allotted to the use of such subremoved any instruments allotted to the use of such sub-scriber. Any person who uses or allows to be used a tele-phone for the purpose of making a bet, inscribing a betting transaction, or otherwise for the purpose of gambling on the result of a horse-race or other sport or pastime, shall be regarded as putting the telephone to an improper use. No person shall have any claim for damages or otherwise what-soever in consequence of the refusal of the said Minister to connect our place of burges whether to maximum with the connect any place of business, house, or premises with the exchange for any of the causes aforesaid, or in consequence of the removal of any instruments, or the exclusion of any subscriber as aforesaid.

NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, dated 31st January, 1920, the Secretary of the Waitaki Acclimatization Society of Oamaru, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period herein-after mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of are deformity, or other physical imperfection

age, deformity, or other physical imperfection. 2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from the date hereof to 31st December, 1920.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.

4. The said Secretary may, with the authority of the said society, authorize the sale, either by auction or otherwise, during the currency of these regulations of deer destroyed pursuant to these regulations, and of the meat and skins of such deer; provided that the proceeds derived from such sale shall be devoted to patriotic purposes.

4a. The said Secretary shall, on or before the 31st day of January, 1921, furnish a statement of the moneys received from such sale and of the patriotic purpose or purposes to

which they were devoted. 5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the pro-visions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Amended Regulations made by the New Zealand Institute of Architects (Incorporated).

Regulations relating to the Introduction of Stock from New Zealand into Fiji.—Notice No. 2003.

Department of Agriculture, Wellington, 30th March, 1920. THE following copy of an Order in Council made by His Excellency the Governor of Fiji in Council on 20th February, 1920, relating to the introduction of stock into Fiji, is published for general information.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

THE Governor in Council, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Foreign Animals Importation Ordinance, 1886, and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, hereby orders as follows :---

Interpretation.

- In this Order, if not inconsistent with the context,—
 "Cattle" means any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf,
 and the carcase or any portion of the carcase thereof
 - respectively : " Disease " means actinomycosis, anthrax, blackleg,
 - catarrh, contagious pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, glanders, hog-cholera, Johne's disease, mange, influenza, pleuro-pneumonia, tick-infestation (Boophilus bovis or other species), rabies, rinder pest or cattle plague, scab, surra, swine-fever, tuberculosis, epizootic or lymphangitis : ' Horse '' means any horse may
 - orse" means any horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, foal, ass, or mule, or the carcase or any portion thereof
 - respectively: neep" means any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb, and the carcase or any portion of the carcase thereof respec-"Sheep
 - "Stock " means horses, cattle, and sheep, as hereinbefore respectively defined, and goats, deer, llamas, antelopes, buffaloes, and other ruminants, dogs, and swine of any age or sex, and the carcase or any portion of the carcase of any stock.
 - of the carcase of any stock : Swine " means any boar, barrow, sow, or pig of any age or breed, or the carcase or any portion thereof respectively :
 - "Undomesticated Animals" means all living animals
 - ¹ Weterinarian ¹ means and fiving animals not included in the definition of stock :
 ¹ Veterinarian ¹ means any person holding the diploma of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, London, or a qualified veterinarian holding some other diploma which is approved by the Governor.

Introduction of Stock, &c.

2. The introduction into the Colony of any stock or animal manure, or of any fodder, litter, fittings, or other things which have or may have come into contact with any stock, is which have or may have come into contact with any stock, is absolutely prohibited except where such introduction takes place in accordance with the following regulations: Provided that these regulations shall not apply to any meat which has been frozen, cooked, or preserved, or to any portion of a carcase manufactured into articles of commerce, or to any manufactured animal manure in which all animal product ingredients have been properly sterilized ingredients have been properly sterilized.

Landing of Live-stock.

3. Such foreign live-stock as may by these regulations be introduced into the Colony shall be landed only at the Ports of Suva, Lautoka, and Levuka.

Importation of Animals.

4. (1.) Subject to the provisions of these regulations horses, mules, and asses may be introduced into Fiji from New Zealand, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Tas-mania, the United Kingdom, Canada, and the United States of America, and asses may also be introduced from France, Spain, and Portugal. (2.) Every shipment of such horses must be accompanied

(2.) Every shipment of such horses must be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the Form No. 1 in the First Schedule hereto made by the shipper of such horses, setting forth the kind, number, sex, and brands or marks of such horses, and the name of the State or district in which such horses have been for the six months immediately preceding the date of shipment and declaring that such horses are, to the best of his belief and knowledge, at the time of shipment, and have been during the preceding six months, free from all infectious or contagious disease, and have not during the six

months immediately preceding shipment been in direct or indirect contact with any stock infected with any such disease. (3.) On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a

certificate in the Form No. 2 in the First Schedule hereto, signed, in the case of horses from New Zealand, Tasmania, Australia, and Canada, or the United States of America, by a Government Veterinarian, and in all other cases signed by a veterinarian practising in the district in which such horses have been domiciled for the six months immediately preceding the date of their shipment to the Colony, or by a veteri-narian practising in the district from which they start for the port of shipment, certifying that he has within the thirty days immediately preceding the date of shipment examined such horses, and has found them free from symptoms of in-fortious, and has found them free from symptoms of infectious or contagious disease; and in the case of horses, mules, or asses from the United Kingdom, Canada, the United States of America, France. Spain, and Portugal, that he has tested with the mallein test such horses and has found them

free from any suspicion of glanders. (4.) The declaration and certificate provided for in this regulation must be delivered to the master of the vessel in which the stock are conveyed to Fiji.

Cattle from New Zealand, the United Kingdom, Canada, or India.

5. (1.) Subject to the provisions of these regulations cattle may be introduced into Fiji from New Zealand, the United Kingdom, Canada, or India.

(2.) Every shipment of such cattle must be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the Form No. 1 in the Second Schedule hereto made by the shipper of such cattle, setting forth the kind, number, sex, and brands or marks of such cattle, and declaring that all such cattle have been during the preceding six months, or from birth, in the country from which shipment is made, that they are at the time of shipment and have been during the preceding six months free from all infectious and contagious diseases, and that they have not during the six months immediately preceding shipment been in direct or in-

direct contact with any stock infected with any such diseases. (3.) On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate in the Form No. 2 in the Second Schedule hereto signed, in case of cattle from New Zealand, Canada, and India, by a Government Veterinarian, and in all other cases by a veterinarian practising in the district in which such cattle have been domiciled for the six months immediately preceding the date of shipment to Fiji, certifying that he has within the thirty days immediately preceding the date of shipment to Fiji examined and tested with the tuberculin test such cattle and has found them free from all symptoms of infectious and contorium dimensions. contagious disease.

Delivery of Declaration and Certificate.

6. The declaration and the certificate provided for in the last preceding regulations must be delivered to the master of the vessel on which the stock are conveyed to Fiji.

Importation of Sheep, &c.

Importation of Sheep, &c. 7. (1.) Subject to the provisions of these regulations sheep, goats, swine, and dogs may be introduced into Fiji from the United Kingdom, New Zealand, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Tasmania. (2.) Every shipment of such sheep, goats, swine, or dogs must be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form No. 1 in the Third Schedule made by the shipper of such sheep, goats, swine, or dogs, setting forth the kind, number, sex, and brands or marks of such sheep, goats, swine, or dogs, and de-claring that all such sheep, goats, swine, or dogs have been during the preceding six months or from birth in the country from which shipment is being made; that they are at the time of shipment and have been during the preceding six months free from all infectious diseases; and that they have not during the six months immediately preceding shipment been during the six months immediately preceding shipment been in direct or indirect contact with any stock infected with diseas

(3.) On every such declaration there shall be inscribed a certificate in the Form No. 2 in the Third Schedule hereto certificate in the form No. 2 in the finite Schedule hereto signed, in the case of sheep, goats, swine, or dogs, in the United Kingdom by a veterinarian practising in the district in which such sheep, goats, swine, or dogs have been domiciled for the six months immediately preceding the date of their shipment to Fiji, and in all other cases by a Government Veterinarian, certifying that he has within the fourteen days immediately preceding the date of shipment to Fiji explanation and a shipment the date of the figure the date of the shipment the fourteen days immediately

Undomesticated Animals.

9. (1.) Before any shipment of undomesticated animals is made, a permit must be obtained from the Superintendent of Agriculture, in Fiji, by the person intending to introduce them; such permit to be handed to the master of the vessel conveying such undomesticated animals or birds for delivery

to the Inspector at the port of entry in Fiji. (2.) Every shipment of such undomesticated animals or birds must be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto made by the shipper, setting forth the kind, number, sex, and marks of such un-domesticated animals or birds, the location and environment of such animals during the six months immediately preceding shipment and declaring that such animals are at the time of shipment free from contagious or infectious disease. The declaration provided for in the last preceding regula-tion must be delivered to the master of the vessel conveying

the animals for delivery to the Inspector of Stock at the port of entry in Fiji.

Procedure while Foreign Live-stock are on the Sea or in Fiji Waters.

10. (1.) No live-stock the introduction of which into Fijⁱ is prohibited by these regulations (whether such live-stock are intended for introduction into Fiji or not) shall be taken or allowed on board any vessel carrying live-stock to Fiji while such latter live-stock are on board.

(2.) No live-stock being carried to Fiji shall be taken or allowed on shore at any place from which the introduction into Fiji of live-stock of the same kind is prohibited.

(3.) When a vessel on which there are any foreign live stock arrives in Fiji waters the following provisions shall apply and remain in force while the vessel continues in Fiji waters, and the master of such vessel and the importer of live-stock shall be severally liable for any breach thereof. (4.) Such foreign live-stock shall be kept securely con-

(4.) Such foreign live-stock shall be kept securely con-fined on board until they are removed or otherwise disposed of by order or permission of an Inspector : Provided that in the case of ship's dogs or other ship's animals, and of all live-stock intended for ship's use, such dogs, animals, or live-stock shall be detained on board and held in such secure manner as shall be approved by an Inspector or shall be otherwise disposed of as the Government direct.

Death of Animal.

11. In the event of any animal dynamic. 11. In the event of any animal dynamic on or escaping from any vessel while the vessel is in port in Fiji immediate notice of such death or escape shall be forwarded by the master of the vessel by telegraph or other expeditious means to the Superintendent of Agriculture. Any such animal which has escaped or the carcase of any such animal which has died shall be destroyed or removed to a quarantine ground or be otherwise dealt with as the Superintendent of Agriculor be otherwise dealt with as the Superintendent of Agriculture directs.

Report of Master.

12. Immediately on arrival at the first port of entry of any vessel on which there are foreign live-stock the master such vessel shall report to the Inspector at the port the occurrence of the death or loss of any animal on board during the voyage, giving in the report full particulars.

Inspection of Foreign Live-stock.

13. All foreign live-stock on such vessel shall forthwith be inspected by the Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector, who shall make a report in the form in the Fifth Schedule hereto, giving a description of the live-stock and stating whether they are free from disease and whether they are infected stock.

Notice of Arrival.

14. On the arrival of a vessel on which there are foreign stock at the port at which the stock are to be landed, the master of such vessel shall give notice of arrival to the Inspector at the port, and shall in conjunction with the attendant on such foreign live-stock make a declaration in the form in the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating—

 Whether or no any of the live-stock on such vessel has been during the voyage or is at the present time infected with any disease.
 That no live-stock the introduction of which into Fiji is prohibited has been or is on board such vessel since the shipment of the live-stock proposed to be landed in Fiji.

- (3.) That during the voyage none of the live-stock to be landed in Fiji has been taken or allowed on shore at any place from which the introduction into Fiji of live-stock is prohibited.

Delivery of Declaration.

15. The master of the vessel shall deliver the declaration referred to in the last preceding regulation, together with Е

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any other declarations or certificates which in accordance with these regulations should be in his possession, to the Inspector.

Release of Live-stock.

16. If the Inspector is satisfied that the several declarations or certificates provided for by these regulations are in order, and that the provisions of the Foreign Animals Importation Ordinance of 1886 and these regulations have been complied with, and if the report of the Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector, as provided for in Regulation 13 hereof, states that the live-stock on such vessel are free from disease and are not infected stock, the Inspector shall arrange for the live-stock to be released to the con-signee or his agent or to be removed at the importer's expense to the quarantine ground, there to undergo such

expense to the quarantine ground, there to undergo such period of quarantine as may be provided as necessary for the several kinds of foreign live-stock. Provided that before such removal the Inspector may require the importer to execute a bond with two approved securities for ensuring that the Inspector of Live-stock will, as regards such live-stock, faithfully carry out the conditions contained in these regulations, and will pay all the expenses and charges in connection with such live-stock incurred in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, or the Inspector may, before authorizing such removal as afore-said, require the importer of such live-stock to deposit with him such sum of money as the latter deems sufficient to pay all such charges and expenses

Power of Destruction.

17. If the Government Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspec-tor empowered by Regulation 13 hereof to inspect all the live-stock on any foreign vessel on arrival in the Colony of Fiji reports that any of the live-stock on board are diseased or infected stock, all the live-stock on board shall be de-stroyed or sent to a quarantine ground, or otherwise disposed of as the Government, on the advice of the Veterinary Officer directs Officer, directs.

Quarantine of Live-stock introduced into Fiji.

18. The following classes of live-stock the introduction of which into Fiji is permitted in the terms of regulations shall respectively undergo at a quarantine ground the period of quarantine hereinafter in this regulation set opposite to each such class :

Such period as may hereafter be declared by Order in Council or be required in pursuance of the last preceding regulation.

Period of Quarantine.

Ouarantine.

19. All live-stock introduced into Fiji which are required by these regulations, or by a subsequent Order in Council, to undergo a period of quarantine, shall, if the Inspector so directs, be washed and disinfected, and shall then be conveyed at the importers expense to a quarantine ground.

Payment of Expenses, &c.

20. While undergoing the period of quarantine imposed by these regulations, or any subsequent Order in Council, live-stock shall be housed, fed, and otherwise managed as directed by an Inspector, and shall undergo such examina-tion and treatment as the Government Veterinary Officer may direct.

Treatment.

21. Such examination and treatment may include any of the diagnostic methods or means of treatment used in veterinary practice.

Tests.

22. Each examination and treatment may include, in the case of-

(a.) Any horse, ass, or mule, the mallein test.(b.) Any cattle, the tuberculin test.

These tests will be carried out only by the Government Veterinary Officer

Treatment of Cattle, &c.

23. In the case of cattle, sheep, and goats the treatment may include-

(a.) Shearing.

(b.) Dipping on at least two occasions (with an interval of not more than fourteen days) by thorough immersion in an approved solution.

Destruction of Live-stock.

24. If any live-stock while undergoing quarantine react to one of the prescribed tests, or if in the opinion of the Veterinary Officer such live stock is diseased, such live-stock shall be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Veterinary Officer directs.

Notice of Destruction.

25. Before any live-stock is destroyed pursuant to the last preceding regulation, the Inspector shall, if practicable, give to the importer of such live-stock not less than two days' notice in writing of the intention to destroy such live-stock, and on the destruction of the live-stock a post-mortem examination shall be made by the Government Veterinary Officer, who shall report the result to the Superintendent of Agriculture. 26. If the post-mortem examination of any animal dest

26. If the post-mortem examination of any animal destroyed as being diseased discloses that such animal was free from disease the Government may authorize the paytree from disease the Government may authorize the pay-ment of such compensation as they think fit to the owner of the animal; provided that the amount of such com-pensation shall not in any case exceed the original selling price to the importer of such animal in the country whence it was imported, together with all charges for freight, keep, &c., up to the time of destruction.

Release of Live-stock from Quarantine.

27. On the expiration of the period of quarantine here-inbefore prescribed, or at any future time to be prescribed, for the several kinds of imported live-stock, such live-stock shall be examined by the Government Veterinary Officer, who shall ascertain whether all the requirements of these regulations in respect of such live-stock have been fully complied with, and whether such live-stock are not infected stock and are from furgence and if here is satisfied in these complied with, and whether such the stock are not infected stock and are free from disease; and if he is satisfied in these respects he shall sign a certificate in the form in the Seventh Schedule hereto; and if such live-stock are not infected stock and are free from disease, and if the charges and expenses due have been paid, such live-stock may (but not otherwise) be released.

23. If any importer refuses or fails for seven days to remove his live-stock from quarantine on the expiring of remove his live-stock from quarantine on the expiring of the period thereof, and on being notified that he may do so, or if he refuses or neglects to pay any charges or expenses incurred with respect to such live-stock, they may be sold by order of the Government and the proceeds paid into the Treasury: Provided that if the amount realized from the sale of such live-stock is more than the total amount of charges and expenses payable in respect thereof, the balance of the proceeds, after deducting the amount of charges and expenses, shall be paid to the importer or other person entitled thereto. entitled thereto.

entitied thereto. 29. Any live-stock carried, conveyed, or brought from any quarantine ground without compliance with these regulations may be seized and placed in quarantine by any Inspector of Stock, Officer of Customs, or member of the Police Force, or may be destroyed or otherwise dealt with as the Government direct.

Introduction of Fodder, Fittings, or Things that have been in contact with Foreign Live-stock.

30. Fodder in unbroken packages and compressed, on a vessel in connection with live-stock that may be lawfully introduced into Fiji without quarantine, may be introduced with such live-stock, provided such fodder is the product of a country or State from which the introduction of live-stock into Fiji is not prohibited.

a country or state from which the introduction of five-stock into Fiji is not prohibited.
31. Fodder in unbroken packages and compressed, on a vessel in connection with live-stock for which a period of quarantine is prescribed, may on the issue of a permit by the Inspector be removed from such vessel to the quarantine ground for the use of such foreign live-stock during its detention in quarantine.
32. Clothing, fittings, utensils, crates or boxes, kennels, harness, saddlery, implements, or any other appliances or things used on any vessel in connection with any foreign live-stock introduced into Fiji, may be destroyed, refused admission, or, on the issue of a permit by the Inspector, may be introduced into Fiji; provided, however, that such clothing, fittings, utensils, crates or boxes, kennels, harness, saddlery, implements, or other appliances must, if allowed to be introduced, be subjected at the expense of the importer to such treatment and disinfection as the Government Veterinary Officer deems necessary and directs.
33. All loss sustained with respect to any imported live-

33. All loss sustained with respect to any imported live-stock while being conveyed to or from or while in quarantine (whether by accident or by sickness arising from natural causes or contracted from other live-stock, or by the destruction or detention in quarantine, or dipping or dressing

of such live-stock to prevent the spread of disease) shall be borne by the importer of such live-stock, and no Inspector shall be liable for any loss or damage occasioned to any importer of live-stock by any act of such Inspector unless such loss or damage has been by his wilful neglect or default. 34. OTAGO HARBOUR.-LIGHTS ESTABLISHED AT ENTRANCE.

Marine Department, Wellington, N.Z., 7th April, 1920. WITH reference to Notice No. 63 of 1919, the Otago Harbour Board notifies that two unwatched Aga lights have been erected to mark the course clearing the end of the mole, the structure and light formerly marking the end of the mole having been washed away. The front light, flashing every two seconds, is situated in red beacon No. 2 to the southward of Harrington Point. The rear light, flash-ing every second, is placed in a rectangular beacon situated on shore above the Kaik Dairy Factory. The seaward face of both beacons is painted with black and white horizontal stripes.

The line of flashing lights 186° (S. 11° 30' E. magnetic) intersects the line of main leading-lights at a point where the line of mole if produced would cut.
Inward-bound vessels should keep the main leading-lights in line until the flashing lights come into line. At this point the vessel is off the mole-end and hauls up as usual. Outward-bound vessels after passing Harrington Point should keep the flashing lights in line until the main leading-lights come into line, then they proceed as usual.
