HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section ninety-five of the Public Health Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Order in Council, from time to time prohibit the importation into New Zealand of any material which in his opinion is likely to convey infectious disease :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the *Gazette* on the eleventh day of the same month, the importation of certain materials was prohibited save under the conditions stipulated :

And whereas it is further deemed expedient to absolutely prohibit the importation of certain shaving-brushes in order to prevent the conveyance of anthrax, which is an infectious disease within the meaning of the said Act :

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said section ninety-five, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby prohibit the importation into New Zealand of shaving-brushes wholly or partially manufactured in Japan or exported from Japan, if containing or made from the hair of animals.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby amend, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations under the said Act made on the twentieth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

SCHEDULE.

By omitting the word "first" where it appears in sub-clause (d) of clause 20, sub-clause (e) of clause 22; sub-clause (g) of clause 22, and subclauses (b) and (c) of clause 23 of these regulations.

By adding to sub-clause (b) of clause 23, as amended by Order in Council dated the 7th day of November, 1918, the following paragraph:—

"The provisions of clauses 35 and 36 of these regulations shall apply to the payment of advances made hereunder in cases where the mortgage provides for monthly payments of principal and interest."

By adding the following new clause after clause 28A:—

"28B. In order to encourage the early payment of the instalments of principal and interest payable for any advance granted under the provisions of section 2 of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1917, the following provisions shall apply with respect to every such instalment:—

(a.) If the mortgagor (not being in arrears with any previous instalment or other payment due for any advance made under any Part of these regulations) pays an instalment on or before its due date, or not later than the fourteenth day thereafter, he shall be entitled to a rebate of one-tenth of so much thereof as consists of interest.

(b.) Such rebate may be deducted and retained by the mortgagor from the full nominal amount of the instalment when making the payment.

"(c.) The rebate of interest hereby provided for shall be allowed in respect of so much of all instalments as consists of interest paid in connection with advances made under section 2 of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1917, prior to the coming into force of this regulation; provided that such payments have been made on or before the due date or not later than the fourteenth day thereafter.

"(d.) Not later than one month before any instalment payable half-yearly falls due, the Commissioner of Crown Lands shall post to the mortgagor at his last known address a notice specifying the due date of the instalment, the full nominal amount thereof, the amount of the rebate, and the date on which the right to the rebate will lapse; provided that the rights and liabilities of the mortgagor shall not be affected by the non-posting or non-receipt of such notice or by any error therein."

By adding the following new clause after clause 23:—

"23A. In cases where the security offered for advances is not sufficient to warrant loans being granted for a term of 36½ or 25½ years as provided for respectively in clauses 22 (f) and 23 (b) hereof, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said clauses 22 (f) and 23 (b), advances may be made in such special cases as the Minister may approve, repayable by half-yearly instalments over a period of ten or fifteen or twenty years as may be deemed suitable in the circumstances. Every half-yearly instalment shall consist partly of interest and partly of principal, and shall be calculated and apportioned respectively for the said periods of ten or fifteen or twenty years according to the tables of the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Schedules hereto."

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Rupert George Skilton (hereinafter called "the licensee") did, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, apply to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at the mouth of the Onekaka River, Golden Bay, in order to erect a wharf thereon, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 5021, showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark proposed to be occupied, and the manner in which it was proposed to erect the said wharf :

And whereas the licensee has applied for authority to make an extension to the said wharf in Onekaka River described in the said plan M.D. 5021, and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the said Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 5170), showing the additional foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be so occupied, and the nature and extent of the said extension intended to be made :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan (marked M.D. 5170) has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purpose last aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid ; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said extension to the wharf in Onekaka River is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 5170 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said extension to the said

wharf in Onekaka River, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf extension in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf extension and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf extension shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf extension may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf extension for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice

Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter the said mill, wharves, and structures connected therewith, and view the state of repairs thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such mill, wharves, or erections, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharves shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said mill, wharves, or other structures may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the company.

13. In case the company—

(1.) Commits or suffers a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;

(2.) Ceases to use or occupy the said mill, wharves, or other structures; or

(3.) Is wound up or dissolved,—

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the 1st day of December, 1918, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at

or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf or shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and shed for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. *Regulations as to Licenses for the Taking of Toheroa at Ahipara, on the West Coast of the North Island.*

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations which shall have force and effect either throughout New Zealand or only in such waters or places as are specified in the regulations for, *inter alia*, imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish:

And whereas it is desirable to make the regulations specified in the First Schedule hereto imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of the shell-fish in the areas specified in the Second Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section five of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the First Schedule hereto, imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of toheroa from the places respectively specified in the Second Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. No person, firm, or company shall take toheroa, for the purpose of canning the same, without a license in writing under the hand of the Minister of Marine (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister"), and subject to the regulations hereinafter specified.

2. When any of the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto become available for leasing, a notification that applications will be received for licenses in respect of such areas shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Kaipara district. Should there be more than one application for any of the said areas, the applicant who has a toheroa canning factory in the district shall be given the preference, and if the owners of two or more of such factories apply for the same area the applicant who has had his factory in use for the longest time shall be given preference.

3. No person, firm, or company shall be granted a license for more than one of the areas specified in the Second Schedule hereto:

Provided that when any unoccupied area is advertised for lease in accordance with the foregoing provisions, and the only applicants for such area already have a canning factory in the district, and are the holders of a license in respect of any other of the said areas, the Minister may, in his discretion, grant to one of the said applicants a license for the area so advertised for lease.

4. The licensee shall have the exclusive right to take toheroa for canning purposes from the area included in his license; provided, however, that any persons who desire to take them for their own consumption shall be allowed to do so without charge.

5. The license shall remain in force for a period of ten years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such license is cancelled as hereinafter provided, and the licensee shall not dispose of, assign, or charge his interest in the license without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

6. The licensee shall pay in respect of the license held by him an annual rental of £15 in advance, dating from the date of the license.

7. The licensee shall erect and maintain a properly equipped factory for canning toheroa on or adjacent to the area in respect of which his license is issued, and the factory shall be completed and in full working-order within one year from the date of the issue of the license.

8. The working of the area in respect of which the license is issued shall be under the control of an Inspector of Fisheries, who shall have power to regulate the quantity of toheroa that may be taken, in order to prevent the beds being depleted or injuriously affected.

9. In case the licensee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of these regulations, or any of them;

(2.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 6 of these regulations;

(3.) Take toheroa from any area other than that in respect of which his license is issued without the previous consent of the Minister; or

(4.) Work the beds in such a way that they become depleted or injuriously affected,—

then and in any of the said cases the Minister may cancel the said license on giving written notice to the licensee; and upon such cancellation the licensee shall forthwith remove all buildings and structures from the area in respect of which the license was issued.

AREA No. 1.—Commencing at a point three miles north of Ahipara and extending generally northwards for a distance of approximately twenty-seven miles.

**I**N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and its amendments, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set out below in the regulations made by Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, for the grading of teachers; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## AMENDMENTS.

CLAUSE 4 of the said regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "and assistant" after the words "Group 5—Head"; and by the insertion of the words "and assistant teachers with a salary higher than Grade 7" after the words "with salary of Grade V."

The clause is hereby further amended by the addition of the following words:—

"Relieving teachers classified under clause 53 (1) of the Regulations for Temporary and Relieving Teachers, made by Order in Council dated 17th November, 1919, shall for the purposes of grading be placed in groups as follows:—

"Group I—Relieving teachers classified A or B.

"Group II—Relieving teachers classified C.

"Group III—Relieving teachers classified D or E.

"Group IV—Relieving teachers classified F or G.

"Group V—Relieving teachers classified H:

"Provided that, subject to the provisions of clause 5 (ii) (c) hereof, organizing teachers shall in the first instance be graded in Group 4; but at the next grading in the case of those already graded in Group 4, and at the next grading but one in the case of those graded in Group 3, before appointment as organizing teachers they may be graded in Group 5 on the recommendation of the Senior Inspector."

Clause 9, subclause (f) thereof, is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "for at least one year" after the words "for fifteen marks if he."

Clause 18 thereof is hereby amended by the addition of the following words: "A representative of the Department may be present during the hearing of appeals, for the purpose of giving or of eliciting information bearing on points raised in appeals."

And whereas the Land Board of the North Auckland Land District has duly passed a resolution recommending that the portions of the Waioneke Kauri-gum Reserve and the

Waioneke Kauri-gum Reserve Extension described in the Schedule hereto be excepted from the operations of the Kauri-gum Industry Act, 1908, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

## BIRTHS.

In the *Gazette* of 5th February, 1920, it was pointed out that it was reasonable to expect that the improvement in the birth-rate disclosed by the figures for the quarter ended 31st December, 1919, would be at least maintained in 1920. This anticipation has been more than realized during the quarter ended 31st March, 1920, when the number of births registered was 7,531, an increase of 1,470 over the corresponding quarter of 1919. The birth-rate for the quarter is equal to an annual rate of 25·85 per 1,000 of mean population, as compared with a rate of only 21·55 for the year 1919.
