In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Counties Act, 1908, and amendments thereto, and all other Acts and powers whatsoever it in that behalf enabling, and with the approval of the Chief Surveyor of the district as provided for by the Counties Amendment Act, 1915, and subject to the consent of the Governor-General in Council, the Raglan County Council hereby resolves as follows:—
