WHEREAS it is provided by section twenty-four of the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act, 1913, that where anything is omitted to be done or cannot be done at the time required by or under the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, or is done after such time, or is otherwise done irregularly in matter of form, or sufficient provision is not made by or under that Act, the Governor-General may, by Order in Council gazetted, at any time before or after the time within which such thing is required to be done, extend such time, or may validate anything so done after the time required, or so irregularly done in matter of form, or may make other provisions for such case as he thinks fit :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 52, of the twenty-second day of the same month, regulations were made governing the election of members of Harbour Boards by electors of combined districts, and providing that the provisions of sections five to sixteen inclusive, eighteen to twenty-six inclusive, thirty to thirty-two inclusive, thirty-five, thirty-six to thirty-nine inclusive, and forty-five to fifty-four inclusive, of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, as amended by the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1913, and of section two of the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act, 1911, and of sections two to twelve inclusive, thirteen (subsection two), and sixteen to twenty-four inclusive, of the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act, 1913, shall apply to the elections of those members ; provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in section seven of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, public notice of any election to fill any vacancy shall be given not less than twenty-one clear days before such election, and the date for the nomination of candidates shall be not less than fourteen clear days before such election :

And whereas by the hereinbefore-recited Acts and regulations it is provided that any notice of any election to fill any vacancy on any Harbour Board for a combined district shall be given not less than twenty-one clear days before such election, and the date for the nomination of candidates shall be not less than fourteen days before such election :

And whereas public notice of an election of two members of the Wanganui Harbour Board, as representatives of the combined district of the Counties of Wanganui and Waimarino, was through an error not given within the period of

twenty-one clear days, and the date for the nomination of candidates for the said election was given as seven days instead of fourteen days before such election, as prescribed in the hereinbefore-recited regulations:

And whereas at the said election which was held on the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, Allan Robinson and Frederic Hanson Allen were duly elected members of the said Board as representatives of the said combined district, and it is desirable to validate such election:

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-nine of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that in the case of lands between high- and low-water marks which belong to the Crown, and on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for purposes of navigation, the Governor-General in Council may grant occupation licenses for periods not exceeding twenty-one years, at such rent and on such conditions as he thinks fit, and any such lease may contain a provision authorizing the lessee to reclaim the land the subject of the lease without complying with the requirements of section forty-one of the said Act:

And whereas it is desirable to license Charles Burrows (hereinafter called "the licensee") to occupy a part of the land between high- and low-water marks, belonging to the Crown, in the Wairupe Creek, Hokianga Harbour, on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for the purposes of navigation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license the licensee to occupy the piece of land between high- and low-water marks of spring tides in the Wairupe Creek, Hokianga Harbour, containing five acres, more or less, as shown edged red on plan marked M.D. 5150, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington; and doth also authorize the licensee to reclaim the land, subject to the following conditions.

CONDITIONS.

1. The licensee shall pay to the Marine Department a rental, in advance each year, of 1s. per acre per annum for the first ten years, and 2s. 6d. per acre per annum for the last eleven years, of the period of twenty-one years during which this license is in force, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

2. The licensee shall keep any stop-banks which he may construct for the purpose of reclaiming the land included in this license in good order and condition, and shall provide and maintain all necessary outlets for storm-water.

3. The licensee shall keep the land included in this license free from noxious weeds.

4. The licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any right, power, or privilege granted by this license without the previous written consent of the Minister of Marine.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, or privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

6. If the licensee commits or suffers a breach of any of the conditions of this license, the license may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council; and publication of a notice of such revocation in the *New Zealand Gazette* shall be sufficient notice thereof to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested in this license, that it has been revoked and determined.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Kaipara Farmers' Co-operative Lime Company (Limited), (hereinafter called "the company"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of the Arapaoa River, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 5149) showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said wharf:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the company under the said Act, for the purposes aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5149 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of the said wharf as shown on the plan marked M.D. 5149.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty,

shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
 - (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
 - (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
 - (4.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved,—
- then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the said wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the company of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Special Order altering the Boundaries of the Pukekawa, Whangape, and Pukemiro Ridings, and fixing the Representation of such Ridings on the Council of the County of Raglan.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Counties Act, 1908, and amendments thereto, and all other Acts and powers whatsoever it in that behalf enabling, and with the approval of the Chief Surveyor of the district as provided for by the Counties Amendment Act, 1915, and subject to the consent of the Governor-General in Council, the Raglan County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That the present boundary of the Pukekawa Riding be altered by the addition to that riding of certain sections deleted from the Whangape Riding; that the present boundary of the Whangape Riding be altered, first, by the deletion of certain sections from such riding and the transfer of same to the Pukemiro Riding, and, secondly, by the addition of certain sections to such riding deleted from the Pukemiro Riding; and that the present boundary of the Pukemiro Riding be altered, first, by the addition of certain sections deleted from the Whangape Riding, and, secondly, by the transfer of certain sections from the Pukemiro Riding to the said Whangape Riding; such alterations to take effect from the 4th day of October, 1920, with the representation of one Councillor each for the above-mentioned Pukekawa, Whangape, and Pukemiro Ridings on the Council of the County of Raglan.

The boundaries of the aforementioned ridings shall be as follows, from the 4th day of October, 1920:—

Pukekawa Riding.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, Raglan County, commencing at the northernmost corner of Allotment 60, Onewhero Parish. Bounded towards the east generally by the left bank of the Waikato River to its confluence with the Opuatia Stream; thence towards the south generally by the aforesaid Opuatia Stream; thence towards the west generally by part of Opuatia No. 4 Block, Section 22, Opuatia Special Settlement, Opuatia No. 8B Block, across a public road, again by the last said block, across a public road, and again by the aforesaid block, by Allotment 157, Onewhero Parish, across a public road, by Allotments 156, 150, 149, Parish of Onewhero, across a public road, and by Allotments 166, 96, and 95 of the aforesaid parish and the eastern boundary-line of the last-mentioned allotment produced to the Waikato River; thence towards the north generally by the left bank of the Waikato River aforesaid to the place of commencement.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, Raglan County, commencing at the confluence of the Waikato River and Opuatia Stream; thence towards the north-east and east generally by the left bank of the Waikato River to the north-east corner of Whangape Lot 17B; thence towards the south generally by Whangape Lot 17B aforesaid and that boundary produced across a public road, and by that road, by Whangape Lot 17B, Whangape Lot 17C, Allotments 68 and 80, Parish of Whangape, to the Roto-ngaro Lake, thence by the said lake to a point the production of the southern boundary of Section 10, Block VI, Rangiriri Survey District, and by that line to and across a road to the south-east corner of said Section 10; then bounded by Section 5, Block VII, Rangiriri Survey District aforesaid, by Section 11 of Block VI, Rangiriri Survey District aforesaid, and that boundary produced across a road, and by that road to the north-east corner of Section 9 of Block VI aforesaid, by Section 9 aforesaid, and Section 7 of aforesaid Block VI, Allotment 22, to the Whangape Lake; thence by the southern and western banks of the said lake to the Awaroa Stream; thence by the said Awaroa Stream to the north-west corner of Allotment 47, Parish of Whangape; thence towards the east generally by said Allotment 47, Allotments 58A, 58B 1, 59B 2, 59B 1, 59A, Parish of Whangape, to the Pukemiro Riding boundary as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 81, 22nd October, 1908, page 2678; thence along the western boundary of the Pukemiro Riding

aforesaid to the north boundary of the Waingaro Riding, as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* aforesaid; thence towards the south generally by the Waingaro Riding aforesaid to the south-west corner of Allotment 216, Parish of Pepepe; thence towards the west by the Te Akau Riding as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 61, 31st July, 1902, page 1613, and Port Waikato Riding as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 91, 31st May, 1917, page 2185; and towards the north generally by the Onewhero Riding as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 91, 31st May, 1917, page 2186, and the Pukekawa Riding above described, to the place of commencement.
