The application must be accompanied by a copy of the magazine and by the registration fee of 5s. Such magazine will be registered in a register to be kept for the purpose, and thereupon the magazine will be entitled to pass through the post at the rates of postage fixed for registered magazines. Unregistered magazines will be charged for at printed-paper rate.

2. A magazine is a publication, with or without advertisements, which contains information of a public character or articles relating to literature, sciences, arts, politics, religion, sport, or some special industry. It must have a legitimate list of subscribers, except in the case of Government publications. It need not be printed or published in New Zealand, but

shall be published in numbers at intervals of not more than three months, except in the case of Government publications issued at less frequent intervals not exceeding twelve months. The title and date or month of publication must be printed on the cover (if any), or, in the absence of a cover, at the top of the first page and on every detached page or piece of paper issued as part of the magazine.

3. Where the title or the place of publication of a registered magazine is changed that magazine must be re-registered.

Warrant vesting Control of the Roadway (up to the Side Channel on the Riccarton Side) of Portion of Lincoln Road in the Christchurch City Council, and apportioning the Cost of Maintenance of the Same.

WHEREAS by section twelve of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), as amended by section thirteen of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1910, it is provided that where a road or street lies along the boundary of two or more districts, whether that road or street is wholly within one or is partly within one and is partly within another of those districts, or is within none of these districts, the Governor-General may from time to time, by Warrant under his hand and gazetted, direct which of the local authorities of those districts shall have control of the road or street or of any part thereof; and may in like manner determine from time to time whether any other of those local authorities shall contribute to the cost of the construction, or maintenance, or lighting, or widening, or reconstructing of that road or street, and, if so, in what proportions:

And whereas portion of Lincoln Road described in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter termed "the said portion of road," forms part of the boundary between the Borough of Riccarton and the City of Christchurch:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner herein-after set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that, from and after the date of this Warrant, the said portion of road shall be under the control of the Christchurch City Council; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of construction, or maintenance, or lighting, or widening, or reconstructing the said portion of road shall be borne in the following proportions—viz., the Christchurch City Council to bear half of such cost, and the Riccarton Borough Council to bear half of such cost, respectively.

And I do also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Riccarton Borough Council shall be paid from time to time, in the proportion hereinbefore prescribed, out of the funds of the said Council, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made

by or on behalf of the Christchurch City Council, and that such payment shall be made from time to time to the clerk of the Christchurch City Council for and on account of the said Borough Council.

And whereas it is considered expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge known as the Tongaporutu River Bridge, together with the approaches thereto, as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the date of the gazetting hereof, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Clifton County Council; and, in further pursuance and in exercise of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge and approaches shall be borne by the Clifton County Council.

Western Samoa Order in Council, 1920.

WHEREAS by the Treaty of Peace between the Allied and Associated Powers and Germany signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June, 1919, Germany renounced, in

favour of the principal Allied and Associated Powers, all her right and title over the Islands of Western Samoa:

And whereas it has been agreed between the principal Allied and Associated Powers that the said Islands shall be administered by His Majesty in His government of His Dominion of New Zealand, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Treaty:

And whereas by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in the said Islands, and it is expedient to determine the mode of exercising such jurisdiction:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1.) This Order may be cited as the Western Samoa Order in Council, 1920.

(2.) The limits of this Order are the Islands of Upolu and Savaii, in the South Pacific Ocean, together with the Islands adjacent thereto situated between the thirteenth and fourteenth degrees of south latitude and the one hundred and seventy-first and one hundred and seventy-third degrees west longitude.

The said Islands shall be known as the Territory of Western Samoa, and shall not be deemed to be included within the limits of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, and any Orders amending the same.

(3.) The Parliament of the Dominion of New Zealand shall have full power to make laws for the peace, order, and good government of the Territory of Western Samoa, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Treaty of Peace.

(4.) Subject to the authority so conferred upon the Parliament of the Dominion of New Zealand, and until that Parliament otherwise provides, the Executive Government of the said Dominion may, by Order in Council, exercise the like authority to make laws for the peace, order, and good government of the said territory.

(5.) His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Regulations for the Testing for Tuberculosis of Cattle imported into the Argentine Republic.—Notice No. 2016.

THE following copy of a decree issued by the Executive of the Argentine Republic on the 31st December, 1919, regarding the testing for tuberculosis of cattle imported into that country, is published for general information.

THE EXECUTIVE OF THE NATION DECREES

Article 1.

THIRTY days after the publication of the present Decree animals of the bovine species, which are imported from overseas, shall be submitted to the following rules:—

(a.) Quarantine for thirty days in the Quarantine Lazaret of the port of the Capital in accordance with the general and special veterinary sanitation regulations.

(b.) Application of the ophthalmic reaction test for diagnosing tuberculosis.

(c.) Injection of tuberculin in the second last or penultimate day of the quarantine, according to the instructions issued by the Directorate General of Live-stock.

(d.) Animals which clearly show reaction to either of the two above-mentioned tests shall be slaughtered.

(e.) Positive diagnosis of reaction to the ophthalmic test is understood to mean those cases in which the animals have a well-defined accumulation of pus (reaction pus) in the inside angle of the eye.

(f.) Animals in which the reaction is not sufficiently clear on which to form an opinion shall be subjected to further quarantine, which shall last for the time necessary to make such new tests as the Directorate General of Live-stock may decide upon.

(g.) The owners, or their representatives, of animals which have been slaughtered on account of showing reaction to the tuberculin test shall not be permitted to view the autopsy, but a detailed report thereon shall be drawn up in each case.

Article 2.

These rules shall not cancel any general rule, but only such as refer to reactions to tuberculin.

DIVISION B, CLASS I.—FOREIGN-GOING STEAMSHIPS CARRYING PASSENGERS AND CARGO. (Page 14.)

1. PARAGRAPH 1 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"1. Foreign-going steamships carrying passengers and cargo will be granted licenses for carrying coal on deck for ship's use and for other approved cargo, when applied for, subject to the General Rules and Regulations and to the conditions herein stated. Such licenses shall be special."

2. Paragraph 2 is hereby amended by adding, after the word "voyage" and the words "coal on deck" respectively, the words "and other approved cargo."

3. Paragraph 4 is hereby revoked, and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

"4. These licenses will be granted to foreign-going steamships with passengers, if approved of by the Superintendent, to carry an amount of coal on deck for ship's use, and for other approved cargo; provided that the quantity of the said coal and approved cargo shall not in the aggregate exceed 5 per cent. of the net register tonnage of the ship. Such coal can be stowed in bulk or in bags as desired."

4. After paragraph 4 add the following paragraph:—

"4A. Approved deck cargo shall mean and include such deck cargo as is approved by the Superintendent, and shall not mean or include such cargo as casks of pelts or similar goods."

In addition, a knowledge of the period of literature 1798 to 1840 will be required. Special attention must be paid to Wordsworth, Coleridge, Byron, Keats, Shelley, Scott, Lamb, Macaulay, and Carlyle; but the other authors in the period are not to be neglected. The literary movements and their leaders, the current types and forms of literature and their representatives, as well as the influence of the ancient classics and of the leading Continental literatures on the English literature of the period, must also be examined.

GREEK.—Plato, "Apology and Crito"; Aristophanes, "Clouds." As an alternative to Aristophanes "Clouds" candidates for the examination in 1921 may read Euripides, "Hecuba."

LATIN.—Tacitus, "Agricola and Germania"; Virgil, "Georgics IV." As an alternative to Tacitus, "Agricola and Germania" candidates for the examination in 1921 may read Cicero, "Pro Murena."

FRENCH.—Balzac, "Les Chouans"; Hugo, "Hernani"; Molière, "Les Femmes Savantes."

GERMAN.—Goethe, "Götz von Berlichingen"; Schiller, "Jungfrau von Orleans"; Fouqué, "Undine."

ITALIAN.—Manzoni, "I Promessi Sposi."

SPANISH.—Ayala, Camprodon, and Eguilaz, "Teatro Moderno Español" (David Nutt); Alarcon, "El Niño de la Bola."

(b.) *January, 1922.*

ENGLISH.—Shakespeare, "Macbeth," "The Tempest"; Spenser, "Faery Queen," Book I; Bacon, Essays; George Eliot, "Romola." In addition, a knowledge of the period of literature 1579 to 1625 will be required. Special attention must be paid to Marlowe, Shakespeare, Spenser, Sidney, Bacon, and Jonson; but the other authors of the period are not to be neglected. The literary movements and their leaders, the current types and forms of literature and their representatives, as well as the influence of the ancient classics and of the leading Continental literatures on the English literature of the period must also be examined. Candidates must have some acquaintance with the general outlines of English literature, including a knowledge and appreciation of the thought and style of standard English authors from Shakespeare to Tennyson.

LATIN.—Cicero, "De Officiis III"; Virgil, "Aeneid VI."

FRENCH.—Rostan, "Cyrano de Bergerac"; Racine, "Andromaque"; Balzac, "Eugénie Grandet."

ROTORUA JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Rotorua Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby revoke the regulations dated the 13th day of February, 1918, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Arawa Park Domain, situated in the district of Rotorua, and known as the Arawa Park Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

- (c.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
- (d.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
- (e.) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house-breaking or pocket-picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act, 1908; and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act, 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act, 1890.
