Authorizing the Sale of Portion of the Inglewood Town Improve-ment Endowment, under the Inglewood Borough Endowment Disposal Act, 1915.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by section two of the Inglewood Borough Endowment Disposal Act, 1915, it is provided that the Governor-General may by Proclamation authorize the Inglewood Borough Council to sell by public auction, within a period expiring on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, any portion of the Inglewood Town A

Improvement Endowment not exceeding in the aggregate twenty-six acres, upon such terms and conditions as he may prescribe or approve :

And whereas the lessees for the time being of the lands described in the Schedule hereto have requested the Ingle-wood Borough Council in writing to offer such lands for sale : And whereas the total area of the said lands authorized to be sold, including the area herein referred to, does not exceed

be sold, including the area herein referred to, does not exceed the limit of twenty-six acres hereinbefore mentioned: And whereas it is desirable to authorize the sale of the said lands: Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and autho-rities conferred upon me by the Inglewood Borough Endow-ment Disposal Act, 1915, and all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, hereby declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereto may be sold by public auction upon the following terms and conditions:— (1.) Every purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer imme-diately after such sale a deposit of one-fifth of the purchase-money of the property purchased by him, and shall, within one calendar month after the date of such sale, complete his purchase, and pay in cash the full purchase-money of the property purchased by him (less such deposit as aforesaid), subject to the provision of clause five hereof. (5.) In the event of the person requesting any sale becoming the purchaser of the fee-simple of the piece of land being sold at his request, he shall pay to the Council, within one month from the date of such sale, the full purchase price in cash less the deposit payable by him as provided in clause four hereof, and also less the value of improvements on the said land. said land.

(6.) In the event of a sale to a person other than the person requesting such sale, the Council shall immediately upon receipt of the full purchase-money from the purchaser of the

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property sold pay to the person requesting such sale the value of the improvements on the land. (7.) The auctioneer's commission and all other charges

(7.) The auctioneer's commission and all other charges incidental to a sale or to the offering of the property for sale shall in every case be borne and payable by the person requesting such offer for sale, excepting where such property when offered for sale as aforesaid at public auction is purchased by a person other than the person requesting such sale as aforesaid, in which case the auctioneer's commission and all other charges incidental to such sale (excepting the cost of valuation and advertising) shall be borne by the purchaser of such property, and be paid in cash on completion of the purchase of such property.

THEREAS by section one hundred and seventy-eight W HEREAS by section one hundred and seventy-eight of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, it is, *inter alia*, provided that where the configuration of any borough is such as that within any particular area or areas thereof it is difficult or inexpedient to construct streets of a width of sixty-six feet, as required by the said Act, the Governor-General may, by Order in Council defining the limits of such particular area or areas, authorize the Council to permit within such area or areas the construction of streets and private streets of a width less than sixty-six feet but not less than forty feet:

less than forty feet : And whereas the configuration of part of the City of Wel-lington is such that within the area described in the Schedule hereto it is inexpedient to construct a street of sixty-six feet in width:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the sums set out therein :

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue :

Amending Regulations made by the Public Service Commissioner for the Examination of Draughtsmen of the Lands and Survey Department.

N pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912, the Public Service Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby revoke the regulations relating to the examination of draughtsmen for a certificate of competency, made on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the tenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and doth substitute for them the regulations hereinafter set forth.

Such substituted regulations shall have effect from and after the date of publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette, and shall form the conditions governing the promotion of officers of the computing and draughting staffs of the Lands and Survey Department.

REGULATIONS.

DEFINITION .- "Commissioner" means the Commissioner appointed under the Public Service Act, 1912.

1. Examinations (limited to officers of the Lands and Survey Department) for certificate of competency as Computer and Draughtsman, as the subjects of Computations and Draughting are practised and understood in the Department of Lands and Survey, shall be held yearly in or about the month of August, at such times and places as the Commissioner may appoint; provided that a sufficient number of candidates for examination shall have sent in applications before the first day of April preceding to sit for examination.

2. The examiner or examiners shall be such person or persons as the Commissioner shall from time to time determine.

3. There shall be separate papers for and separate certificates issued in connection with each subject.

4. (1.) The certificate obtainable in each examination shall be of three grades, viz. :-

1st Grade : Qualifying for a salary exceeding £300 per annum. 2nd Grade : Qualifying for a salary exceeding £180 per annum. Elementary : Qualifying for the position of Assistant Draughts-

man and a salary exceeding £120 per annum. (2.) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this regulation, an officer who has obtained a second-grade certificate in each of the subjects of Computations and Draughting as aforesaid shall be qualified to receive a salary exceeding £300 per annum.

(3.) Nothing in these regulations shall be so construed as to entitle an officer to claim as of right any salary which he may be qualified to receive by virtue of these regulations, or so as to deprive an officer of any qualification to receive a salary of more than £300 per annum which he had acquired before the date of these regulations coming into force; provided that on and after the 31st day of March, 1921, no officer, unless qualified as last aforesaid, shall be entitled to receive a salary exceeding £180 or £300, as the case may be, unless and until he has duly obtained the respective certificate or certificates prescribed in subclauses (1) and (2) hereof, as qualifying him to proceed beyond that salary, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any general regulations made under and by virtue of the Public Service Act, 1912; provided further that in the case of junior officers, preference will be given to holders of the Elementary Certificate.

(4.) Each candidate passing the examination to the satisfaction of the Commissioner shall be entitled to a certificate accordingly.

5. The syllabus for the examinations shall be as set out in the Schedules hereto.

6. In order to obtain a first-grade certificate in Computing a candidate must gain not less than the following percentages in the subjects set out in Schedule A, viz. :-

In subjects Nos. 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12, 50 per cent. And not less than 60 per cent. of the total possible maximum of marks assignable on the whole paper.

In order to obtain a second-grade certificate in Computing a candidate must gain not less than the following percentages in the subjects set out in Schedule A, viz. :

In subjects Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, 50 per cent.

And not less than 60 per cent. of the total possible maximum of the marks assignable on the whole paper required for this grade

Subjects Nos. 6 to 12 are not required for this grade.

7. In order to obtain a first-grade certificate in Draughting a candidate must gain not less than the following percentages in the subjects set out in Schedule B, viz. :---

In subject No. 1 (plan), 80 per cent.

In each subject of the written examination, 75 per cent.

And not less than 80 per cent. of the total possible maximum of marks assignable on the whole of the paper.

In order to obtain a second-grade certificate in Draughting a candidate must gain not less than the following percentages in the subjects set out in Schedule B, viz. :---

In subjects Nos. 1 (plan), 2, and 4, 50 per cent.

In subject No. 3, 40 per cent.

And not less than 55 per cent. of the total possible maximum of marks assignable on the whole paper.

8. In addition to the foregoing requirements of these regulations a candidate for a certificate of competency under these regulations must gain not less than 50 per cent. either in a paper on General Departmental Knowledge or on a special technical subject. An officer who has passed in the latter subject only will not be eligible for any position except in the Magnetic Observatory or as a Computer on Head Office staff. Conversely, an officer who has not passed in the appropriate special subject will not be eligible for the Observatory or Head Office positions.

9. In order to obtain the Elementary Certificate a candidate must gain not less than 33 per cent. in each of the subjects Nos. 1, 2, and 3 of the Computation paper, and Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the Draughting paper.

10. If a candidate sitting for the elementary or second grade of the examination obtains the percentage of marks required for a higher grade in any subject, he shall thereafter receive exemption from that subject in his subsequent examinations or re-examination.

11. Should a candidate fail to pass the examination in not more than two subjects, he may be allowed to sit again to complete the examination in which he has failed, at one or both of the two succeeding examinations, but will not be allowed any further supplementary examination. Should he at a later date present himself, he must take the whole examination again, provided that if he passes in subject No. 1 (plan) in the Draughting examination at any stage he will not be required to pass in it again for that stage.

12. Applications must be made on the prescribed forms as hereunder, which shall be received by the Surveyor-General not later than the 1st day of April in any year :--

SYLLABUS.

13. The scope of the examination is generally set out in the following syllabus, but is not necessarily confined thereto, nor to the subjects dealt with in the text-books suggested for the guidance of officers.

Schedule A.—Computations.

(1.) Elementary trigonometry, to include the solutions of triangles, easy trigonometric equations, and the use of logarithms. (50 marks.)

(2.) Elementary co-ordinate geometry and mensuration, including areas from co-ordinates, elimination of error, and contracted methods of multiplication and division. (50 marks.)

(3.) Instruments: Use and care of arithmeter, eidograph, pantograph, and planimeter (polar and rolling). (50 marks.)

(4.) Methods of keeping a field-book; corrections to be applied to field measurements and observations; limits of error in traverse closures. (50 marks.) (5.) Practical Examples: Reduction of traverses on meridian and perpendicular; calculations of areas; boundary-lines; opposite sides of roads; sides of triangles, &c. (50 marks.)

Advanced Computations.

(6.) Plane and spherical trigonometry; trigonometric series, exponential formula, solution of spherical triangles; Legendre's theorem interpolation. (100 marks.)

(7.) Method of Least Squares: Application to base-line measurements; adjustment of quadrilateral, polygon; astronomical observations for time, azimuth, and latitude, and lines of levels. (100 marks.)

(8.) Geodesy: Reduction of base-line measurement and observations in major and primary triangulation; theory of the figure of the earth; computation of differences of latitude, longitude, and azimuth of points of the spheroid. (100 marks.)

(9.) Elementary Theory of Map Projections: The curve of alignment, the geodesic, error of scale, radius of curvature of meridians and parallels, projections commonly used in map-construction and the calculation of the co-ordinates. (100 marks.)

(10.) Elementary Practical Astronomy: Systems of spherical coordinates, the various kinds of time, the calendar, use of the ephemeris, star catalogues; precession mutation, refraction, parallax and aberration; reductions of observations to the centre of the earth. (100 marks.)

Special subject to be taken by candidates for admission to the Computing division of the Head Office staff.

(11.) Reduction of tidal observations; the automatic tide-gauge record; measurement of the hourly heights, and entry in the computation forms; harmonic analysis of the hourly heights; angles and factors for reduction and arguments at epoch; calculation of the tidal constants for the prediction of the time and height of high and low water. (100 marks.)

Special subject to be taken by candidates for admission to the position of assistant on the staff of the Magnetic Observatory.

(12.) (a.) Theory of terrestrial magnetism; observations of deflection and vibration; calculations of the horizontal force; observations of declination and inclination; use of micrometers; determination of rate of chronometers and clocks. (100 marks.)

(b.) Meteorology: Distribution of temperature; pressure and circulation; atmospheric electricity; atmospheric optics; atmospheric accoustics; meteorological instruments. (100 marks.)

(c.) Seismology: Earthquakes and earth tremors; transmission of waves in an isotrophic solid determination of centrum; instruments; graphic records. (100 marks.)

(d.) Development of photographic films, papers, and plates. (100 marks.)

Stretching paper on drawing-board, method of; advantages of; resu t of over-damping paper n doing so. The colours, vegetable, animal, mineral, and chemical, respective

permanence; permanent, fugitive, and intermediate classes of colours, meaning of "fugitive"; causes of lack of permanence or fading of colours; action of light; impure atmosphere; chemical interaction; bleaching-out colour with chemicals, which colours are insusceptible, effect of doing so on paper substance ; liquid colours, waterproof colours, circumstances under which they may be used, draw-backs to use of; waterproofing ordinary colours with bichromate of potash, how this acts; best paper surfaces for colouring; overcoming greasiness of surface; oxgall, soap; drawbacks of latter; transfer paper, making of.

India ink, characteristics of the best; grain, fracture, colour; differences of fresh and stale ink. (50 marks.)

Protractors, purpose of, rectangular, circular, vernier.

The drawing-board, ebony edge; warping and preventives. The pantograph and eidograph; interrelation of fulcrum tracer and pencil point; positions when reducing or enlarging; rule for setting eidograph; to find scales not on pantograph.

The planimeter fixed and rolling patterns and Coradi compensating pattern; rule for areas on different scales; what unit is the result given in; point in centre and the figure on the weight. (150 marks.)

Practice.

(4.) Lettering and figuring; principal styles used in survey draughting; names and characters and principal uses; best pro-portions. Spacing methods. Designing of titles on maps.

Hill work, vertical hachure, contour-lines, form-lines, difference between these latter, wash methods; conventional lighting, steep hills, precipices, rolling country, plains.

Drawing a straight line, drawing a very long one, producing a line accurately; drawing a right angle accurately in middle of a line, at end of line.

Purpose of maps, selection of a projection, and principles governing the selection. The graticule, method of laying it down, purpose of the graticule (a) in a rectangular system, (b) in a curvilinear system of projection. Plotting by rectangular co-ordinates, by geographical co-ordinates, by protractor, by the natural functions of angles.

The field-book, methods of keeping, exercises in reading and the plotting from; plotting and drawing a map in the examination room. Scaling lines, use of pricker, parallex of edge of scale, plotting to

Scaling lines, use of pricker, parallex of edge of scale, plotting to scale on shrunk or expanded paper, laying down scales on artificial and natural scale for the same map.

Enlarging and reducing a map by pantograph or eidograph, by plotting, by other methods—i.e., photography, radial scaling, elastic band, &c.

Reproduction of maps by photography, outlined sketch of process; character of original required. (150 marks.)

Schedule C.—General Departmental Knowledge.

Administrative divisions of New Zealand-*i.e.*, land districts, names of centres of ; field staff, indoor staff.

Functions of Department; survey and settlement of land; land and forest and reserves administrations; Acts administered by Department.

Details of practice and procedures in work of departmental branches (Land Transfer, Native, Statutory, Titles, &c.).

Organization of Department and Duties of Officers: Permanent Head; technical head; clerical staff, computing staff, draughting staff; maps controlled by draughting staff, the public maps, lithograph maps, county index or tenure maps, sale-plans, professional maps, the working plan and field-book, semi-public maps.

Departmental map indexes, the record map; Crown grant, Land Transfer, and road Record maps are not public maps, but office indexes only.

Kinds of survey—trig., topo., towns, settlement, Land Transfer, Public Works, roads, and railways. Districts required for survey and mapping purposes; meridional circuits; survey districts; survey blocks; irregular or old districts; system of plotting required by departmental regulations; true bearing, magnetic bearing, variation, the unit of length.

The working plan and field-book, their supreme importance, unique value as evidence, basis of title, of reproduction of boundaries, consequent care in preservation and handling; copies valueless as evidence, foundation of subsequent transactions of the Department.

The regulations generally; knowledge of storing of maps in safe; portfolios v. drawers.
