and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section : And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown, or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license : And whereas, by an Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazatte of the septembers

to take and use additional water from the Waiwakaiho River in the Land District of Taranaki (hereinafter referred to as "the said river") for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and also to extend electric lines within the Taranaki County, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly :

County, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers con-ferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto) a license to take and use from the said river, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding two hundred cubic feet per second at any one time (which quantity of water includes the one hundred and fifty cubic feet which the licensee is authorized to take and use by the said Order in Council dated the fourteent); and also to extend and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses within the area of supply bereinafter described, and subject also to the regulations dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, or any regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor (here-inafter collectively referred to as "the regulations"), and which regulations shall be deemed to be incorporated herein; but nothing herein shall be held to guarantee that the said river contains sufficient water to supply two hundred cubic feet per second hereinbefore mentioned. feet per second hereinbefore mentioned.

- diverted is to be returned to the said river.(c.) Contour-plan showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.

2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be returned to the said river at or near the power-house.

3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said river at the headworks, situated on the left hand bank, in part Section 53, Block X, Paritutu Survey District (Hua and Waiwakaiho Hundred), at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 47602, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license; the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 47602, hereinbefore referred to.

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
 (b.) Tunnel and pipe-line leading from such dam to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
 (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
 (d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of white lines on the said plan.
 (e.) Such further transmission and other lines within the area of supply as may from time to time be required.
- area of supply as may from time to time be required within such area of supply, and after compliance with the provisions of clause 48 of the regulations.

5. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the con-struction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the pro-visions of this license are given due effect to.

6. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

7. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of elec-tricity between the generating-stations and any of the sub-stations to which this license applies.

8. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor-General, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

9. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance In a license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of explicit billter theretor is a sublicensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

10. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of 1s. per annum per kilowatt of maximum output, as re-corded by the wattmeter to be installed by the licensee at corded by the wattmeter to be installed by the licensee at the power-house mentioned in chause 4 (c) hereof, payment to be made yearly on the 31st day of March in each year, commencing from the day electrical power is first supplied. For the purpose of this clause "maximum output" means twice the number of units generated in the half-hour during which the output is the maximum for the year. The said period shall be recorded at the end of each half-hour com-mencing from non of each day

period shall be recorded at the end of each half-hour com-mencing from noon of each day. From the above maximum output in kilowatts shall be deducted 5.000 kilowatts which, under the new conditions, is the equivalent of 150 cubic feet of water per second granted free of rental under the license hereinbefore referred to dated the 14th day of September, 1914; but the minimum rental shall be not less than £10 per annum.

11. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said river, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the license is by this license authorized to take from the said river. the said river.

12. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

13. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all remov-able equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

14. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The retail charge for electrical energy shall not exceed The retail charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 4d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes. The wholesale charge for bulk supply shall not exceed £12 per kilowatt per annum. For the purpose of this license "bulk" supply shall be defined as one for which a consumer guarantees to pay not least than £120 per annum.

defined as one for which a consumer guarantees to pay not less than £120 per annum. At any time upon the expiry of five years from the date of this license, and at the end of every successive period of five years thereafter during the term of this license, the

charges for bulk supply may, if necessary, be reviewed by the Minister, if *prima facie* reasons are shown by the licensee, or any consumers of a bulk supply; that such charges are unremunerative or excessive, or unreasonable or oppressive, and the Minister may, by endorsement on the license, add to, alter, reduce, or amend such charges accordingly, and such addition, alteration, reduction, or amendment shall be enforceable by and against the licensee as effectually as if the same formed part of this license, but no addition, alteration, reduction, or amendment in such charges shall be made until after inquiry and report by a Commissioner appointed for the purpose under the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, but it shall not be obligatory upon the Governor-General to act in 'accordance with the opinion that may be expressed by such Commissioner, or to give effect to any recommendation that may be contained in his report.

15. EXTENDED AREA OF SUPPLY.

The extended area of supply comprises portion of the Taranaki County as indicated by a distinctive border coloured red on the plan marked P.W.D. 47181, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

16. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (e) of clause 3 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 6,600 volts between the terminals.

17. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

18. INTERCHANGE OF SUPPLY OF ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

(a.) In the event of the Minister establishing a hydroelectric power scheme outside the area of supply of a frequency of 50 cycles per second on the three-phase alternating-current system, he may require the licensee to connect that system with the licensee's electrical system in such a manner that an interchange of electrical energy between the two systems may be made from time to time and when required by either the licensee or the Minister, up to at least one-half of the total capacity of the plant installed at the licensee's power-house.

(b.) The licensee shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the licensee's power-house lines between the licensee's power-house and a point on the boundary of the area of supply to be determined by the Minister.

(c.) The Minister shall erect and maintain in good order, at the expense of the Minister, the necessary transmissionlines outside the area of supply, for the purpose of connecting the two systems at the point last mentioned in subclause (b)hereof.

(d.) The licensee and the Minister respectively shall, on demand, and from time to time, as and when required, supply to each other so much of the surplus electrical energy as is then required and is available, but not in excess of one-half of the capacity of the plant installed in the licensee's powerhouse.

(c.) The price to be paid by the licensee or the Minister shall not exceed the following rates :-Between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily : Id. per

19. REQUIREMENTS OF TARANAKI COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licenses that not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric line within the Taranaki County, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Taranaki County Council.

20. COMPENSATION PAYABLE FOR LAND INJURIOUSLY AFFECTED, ETC.

In respect of all land injuriously affected, and in respect of all damages done by the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the licensee by this license, the licensee shall from time to time, as and when any such injury or damage accrues or happens, pay compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Act, 1908, in the same manner (subject to all necessary modifications) as if such licensee were a local authority and the claim was one for injury or damage arising out of the construction of a public work, 21. CROWN NOT LIABLE TO, PAY COMPENSATION.

Nothing in this license shall be held to cast upon or imply any liability upon His Majesty the King or upon the Government of New Zealand to pay compensation to any person, corporate body, or local authority by reason of the exercise by the licensee of the authority hereby granted; but the licensee shall be liable for any loss or damage which any person, corporate body, or local authority may sustain as the result of the exercise by the licensee of any of the powers granted by this license.

22. CONSUMERS ENTITLED TO SUPPLY.

The licensee shall supply and sell to any person, company, or corporate body within the area of supply requiring the same, for any purpose within that area, electricity to the extent to which it may be available; provided that such person, company, or corporate body pays the cost of connecting his or its premises with the transmission-line erected by the licensee in pursuance of this license, or alternatively pays a line rental at a rate not exceeding 6 per cent. on the cost of such connecting line together with any additional transmission-line required to supply such person, company, or corporate body.

23. BED OF RIVER NOT LEASED.

Nothing herein shall be held to constitute a lease from the Grown of the bed of the said river, nor shall the provisions of Part IX of the Property Law Act, 1908, apply to this license.

24. CONTRACT BETWEEN LICENSEE AND CROWN.

This license shall be deemed to constitute a contract as between the licensee and His Majesty the King, and may be enforced as a contract by and against His said Majesty cr the licensee accordingly.

25. TIME FOR SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF WORKS.

The licensee shall substantially complete the works hereby authorized within a period of three years from the date of this license, or within such further time as the Minister may allow in the event of the work being delayed by strikes, lock-outs, breakdowns, or other unavoidable causes not due to any neglect by the licensee.

26. DEFAULT.

If the licensee fails or neglects to observe any of the conditions or obligations imposed by this license, then and in any such case the provisions of clauses 50 and 51 of the regulations shall apply to the breach of any such condition or obligation.

27. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, if found necessary and if duly agreed upon between the licensee and the Governor-General in Council, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council, in which case particulars of such alteration or modification shall be endorsed upon this license and signed by the licensee and the Governor-General, whereupon all the terms and conditions in this license contained (save and except as they may have been so altered or modified by such alterations) shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to such alterations as if the latter had formed part of this license as originally issued.

 Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.
 Any person who commits a breach of any of the pro-visions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
