A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS a petition has been presented to the Governor-General by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the said petition, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act, 1908:

Now, therefore, I, Robert Stout, Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Tahunanui Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

TAHUNANUI TOWN DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District bounded by a line commencing at the high-water mark of Tasman Bay, at the north-western corner of Section 1, Suburban South District, and proceeding thence along the boundary of the City of Nelson to the easternmost corner of Section 12, Suburban South District; thence south-westerly along a right line to the southernmost corner of Section 19 of the same district, and north-westerly along the north-eastern side of Quarantine Road to high-water mark, and along the said high-water mark to the point of commencement.

1. To facilitate the delivery of letters, a letter-box should be affixed to every house-door. Any person whose house lies back from the street may be required at any time by the Chief Postmaster to provide a box on the street-line for the reception of mail-matter. Failing compliance, such person may be excluded from the postman's delivery. A delivery by postman will not be made above the first floor of any building unless an elevator is available for use, nor to the different rooms or suites on any floor in an apartment house, whether or not an elevator is available. If in such a case delivery by postman is required, a suitable locked box must be provided by the person concerned on the ground floor or some responsible person on the ground floor must be authorized to receive the correspondence. In the case of rural deliveries, settlers off the road-line must either meet the mailman or provide a suitable box on the road-line in which their correspondence can be deposited.

(1) The provisions of paragraph (2), proviso (i), paragraph (2), proviso (iii) (c), proviso (iii) (e), and proviso (iii) (f), of the said Order are hereby revoked so far as they relate to works of which the country of origin is Sweden, and the authors of all such works shall enjoy the same rights as if the said provisions had never related thereto.

(2) In the application of the provisions of paragraph (3) of the said Order to works of which the country of origin

is Sweden, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act and for the commencement of the said Order.

(3.) In the application to works of which the country of origin is Sweden of sections 3 (2) (d) and 25 of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act in section 25 (7) and section 25 (8) wherever that expression occurs.

(4.) Where any person has, before the commencement of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would but for the making of this Order have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interests arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the commencement of this Order, unless the person who by virtue of this Order becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as, failing agreement, may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1913.

(1.) The provisions of paragraph (2), proviso (iii) (a), of the said Order shall apply as if the aforesaid part of the Empire of Morocco were included amongst the foreign countries named in those provisions.

(2.) In the application of the provisions of paragraph (3) of the said Order to works of which the country of origin is the aforesaid part of the Empire of Morocco, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act and for the commencement of the said Order.

(3.) In the application to such works of sections 3 (2) (d) and 25 of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act in section 25 (7) and 25 (8) wherever that expression occurs.

(4.) In the application to such works of the provisions of section 32 of the Copyright Act, 1913, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the said Act wherever that expression occurs in subsection (1) (a), and for the 1st July, 1913, in subsection (1) (b).

Prohibiting the Importation of Goods manufactured or produced in or exported from Germany, Austria, or Hungary.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of section forty-six of the Customs Act, 1913, as extended by section two of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Amendment Act, 1915, and in further pursuance of section three hundred and nine of the Customs Act, 1913, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council of the seventeenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, prohibiting the importation of goods manufactured or produced in or exported from Germany, Austria-Hungary, Bulgaria, and Turkey, and doth make the following provisions and regulations in lieu thereof:—

1. The importation of goods which, whether before or after the date of this Order, have been manufactured in or produced in or exported from Germany or Austria is hereby prohibited except with the consent of the Minister of Customs.

2. "Germany" means the territory of the State of Germany as now constituted.

3. "Austria" means any territory which on the fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, was part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, other than territory which is now territory of the Republic of Czecho-Slovakia, or of the Kingdom of the Serbs, Croats, and Slovenes, or of the Kingdom of Italy.

4. Goods shall be deemed to have been manufactured or produced in Germany or Austria if as much as five per centum of the value thereof, as estimated in accordance with the provisions of the Customs Act, 1913, with respect to goods subject to *ad valorem* duty, has its source in Germany or Austria.

5. If a Collector of Customs has reason to believe or suspect that any goods imported into New Zealand are goods the importation whereof is prohibited by this Order in Council without the leave of the Minister of Customs, the Collector may detain those goods, and they shall not be delivered from the control of the Customs until the Collector is

satisfied, by such evidence as he requires, that the goods are not goods the importation whereof is hereby prohibited, or the Minister of Customs consents to the importation of those goods or to the exportation thereof.

6. If the invoice for any goods imported into New Zealand from any country contains or is accompanied by a certificate signed by the exporter to the effect that less than five per centum of the fair market value in the country of export of each article in its condition as exported has its source in Germany or Austria, such certificate shall be accepted by the Collector of Customs as sufficient evidence that the goods are not goods the importation of which is prohibited within the meaning of this Order, unless the Collector has reason to believe or suspect that the certificate is false or erroneous.

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Nelson.

ROBERT STOUT.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red deer may be destroyed in the Nelson Acclimatization District.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, dated 31st January, 1920, the Secretary of the Nelson Acclimatization Society at Nelson, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such Secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill red deer of either sex and of any age which, in the opinion of the said Secretary or of the said authorized persons, should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.
2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid from 20th October, 1920, to 20th November, 1920, both days inclusive.
3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said Secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates and name of person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed.
4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.
5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MILITARY FORCES OF NEW ZEALAND, 1913.

(1.) PARAGRAPH 88 is hereby amended by adding the following subparagraph:—

“88A. Appointments to commissions in the New Zealand Army Pay Corps will be granted, in the rank of Lieutenant (on probation), on the recommendation of the General Officer Commanding.

“Candidates must (a) be student-accountants who have passed the book-keepers' examination of the Society of Accountants, and (b) have passed the Public Service Entrance Examination.

"Appointments will be confirmed on the completion of six months' service, provided the probationary officers (a) have been satisfactorily reported upon by the O.C. District under whom they have been working and by the Director of Financial Services, and (b) have passed the prescribed examination in military subjects."

(2.) Paragraph 112 is hereby amended by altering the heading of the paragraph to read "Promotion of Officers of the N.Z. Staff Corps, Royal N.Z. Artillery, and N.Z. Army Pay Corps," and by adding the following subparagraphs:—
 "112c. The promotion of officers in the N.Z. Army Pay Corps will be governed by the same conditions as those governing promotion in the N.Z. Staff Corps, except that the necessary qualifying examination will be one set specially for the N.Z.A.P.C.
 "112d. Service as Accountant or Command Paymaster (whether in a civil capacity or otherwise) prior to the coming into force of this regulation shall count towards promotion, but will not absolve officers from being required to pass the promotions and qualifying examinations."

(3.) Paragraphs 104 and 105 are hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

Honorary Aides-de-Camp to the Governor-General.

"104. Officers not exceeding six in number (two from the Permanent Force and four from the Territorial Force) may be appointed Honorary Aides-de-Camp to the Governor-General in recognition of gallantry or distinguished service in the field or meritorious service in the interests of the Dominion.

"Officers eligible for the above distinction must, during their term of office, be on the Active List or the Reserve of Officers, and their rank must not be below that of Lieutenant-Colonel.

"The appointments will be for the term of the appointment of the Governor-General to whom they are attached, and will automatically terminate when that Governor-General vacates office.

"When on duty in connection with their appointment, Honorary Aides-de-Camp to the Governor-General will wear on their right shoulders a special gold-cord aiguillette of a similar design to that worn by Aides-de-Camp to the Sovereign, but will not, unless they are members of the N.Z. General Staff, wear any other staff distinction.

"These appointments will not entitle the officers to any pay or allowances.

Honorary Physicians and Honorary Surgeons to the Governor-General.

"105. Officers of the N.Z. Army Medical Corps or the N.Z. Medical Corps, not exceeding two in number, may be appointed Honorary Physician and Honorary Surgeon respectively to the Governor-General in recognition of distinguished conduct in the field or meritorious service in the interests of the Dominion.

"The conditions as regards eligibility, term of appointment, distinctions in dress, and pay and allowances will be the same as for Honorary Aides-de-Camp."
