A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and section two of the State Forests Amendment Act, 1919, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the national-endowment lands described in the Schedule hereto as and for provisional State forests.

SCHEDULE.

WESTLAND LAND DISTRICT.

ALL that area of land in the Westland Land District, situate in Blocks IX and X, Ahaura Survey District, being Reserve 1599, containing 3,450 acres, more or less. Bounded as follows: Commencing at the south-eastern corner of Block X, Ahaura Survey District; thence due north along the eastern boundary of said block for a distance of 60 chains; thence due west to the left bank of the left-hand branch of Nelson Creek; thence generally in a north-westerly direction, following along the left-hand bank of aforesaid left-hand branch of Nelson Creek, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Ahaura Survey District; thence in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern boundary of aforesaid Section 1 to the north-westerly boundary of Section 2, Block IX, Ahaura Survey District; thence along the north-western boundary of aforesaid Section 2 to its most northern corner; thence in a south-easterly direction along the eastern boundaries of Sections 2, 3, and 4, Block IX, Ahaura Survey District, to the most easterly corner of aforesaid section 4; thence following along the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of Section 3178, Block IX, Ahaura Survey District, to a point on the right bank of Nelson Creek in line with the southern boundary of the aforesaid Section 3178; thence generally in a southerly direction, following along the right bank of aforesaid Nelson Creek, to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 2947, Blocks IX and XIII, Ahaura Survey District; thence following along the northern and eastern boundaries of aforesaid Section 2947 to a point on the south boundary of Block IX,

Ahaura Survey District; and thence due east along the south boundaries of Blocks IX and X, Ahaura Survey District, to point of commencement. As the same is delineated on sheet 47, roll plan 450, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered green.

All that area of land in the Westland Land District, situate in Blocks XIII and XIV, Mawheranui Survey District, and Blocks IX and XIII, Ahaura Survey District, being Reserve 1701, containing 14,250 acres, more or less. Bounded as follows: Commencing at the south-eastern corner of Block XV, Mawheranui Survey District; thence due north along the eastern boundary of said Block XV, Mawheranui Survey District, for a distance of 160 chains; thence due east for a distance of 70 chains; thence due south for a distance of 160 chains to the southern boundary of Block XIII, Ahaura Survey District; thence due east along the southern boundary of aforesaid Block XIII, Ahaura Survey District, to the western boundary of Section 3215, Block XIII, Ahaura Survey District; thence in a north-westerly direction along the western boundaries of Sections 3215, 3214, and 3213, Block XIII, Ahaura Survey District, to the most westerly corner of aforesaid Section 3213; thence along the northern boundary of aforesaid Section 3213 to the Taramakau-Grey Valley Road; thence generally in a north-westerly direction along the south-western side of said Taramakau-Grey Valley Road to the most westerly corner of Section 3238, Block XII, Mawheranui Survey District; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of aforesaid Section 3238 to the western boundary of Block IX, Ahaura Survey District; thence due south along the western boundary of aforesaid Block IX, Ahaura Survey District, to its south-western corner; thence due west along the southern boundaries of Blocks XII, XI, and X, Mawheranui Survey District, to the north-eastern boundary of Section 2725, Block XIII Mawheranui Survey District; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of aforesaid Section 2725 to No Town Track; thence generally in a south-easterly direction along the northern side of said No Town Track and the eastern boundaries of Section 2733A, 2735, 2737, and 2739, Block XIV, Mawheranui Survey District, to the southern boundary of Block XIV, Mawheranui Survey District; and thence due east along the southern boundaries of aforesaid Blocks XIV and XV, Mawheranui Survey District, to point of commencement. As the same is delineated on sheet 47, roll plan 450, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered green.

All that area of land in Blocks IV, VIII, XII, Ahaura Survey District, and Blocks I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and XIII, Pohaturoha Survey District, in the Westland

Land District, being Reserve 1606, containing by admeasurement 24,500 acres, more or less. Commencing at the most northern corner of Section 2375, Block XII, Ahaura Survey District, and proceeding along the north-western boundary of the said section, the north-western boundary of Reserve 754, across a road, and again by the north-western boundary of said Section 2375 produced to the right bank of the Ahaura River; thence along the said river-bank to a point opposite the easterly boundary of Section 30; thence to and along the said boundary and the north-western and western boundary of the said Section 30 produced to the right bank of the Ahaura River; thence along the said bank to the western boundary of Block XII, Ahaura Survey District; thence along the western boundaries of said block and Block VIII, 20800 links; thence in a south-easterly direction, 7500 links; thence due north, 19000 links, to the northern boundary of Block VIII, Ahaura Survey District; thence easterly along the said boundary, 5300 links; thence due north to the south-eastern corner of Section 5; thence generally along the eastern boundary of said Section 5 and across a road reserve to the left bank of the upper Grey River; thence along the said river-bank to a point opposite the north-western boundary of Section 4; thence to and along the said north-western boundary, the south-western boundary, and the south-eastern boundary of said Section 4, the latter boundary produced to the Grey River; thence along the left bank of the said river to a point opposite the north-western boundary of Section 3325; thence to and along the said north-western boundary, across a road, and along the southern side of the said road to a point opposite the south-eastern boundary of the said section; thence to and along the said south-eastern boundary produced to the left bank of the Grey River; thence along the said river-bank to a point opposite the north-western boundary of Section 2824; thence to and along the said boundary, across a road, and again by the said boundary; thence along the south-western boundary of the said section; thence along the south-eastern boundary of the said section, across a road reserve, the Clarke River, and again a road reserve, and again along the said boundary; thence along the north-eastern and northern boundaries of said section 2824 produced to the right bank of the Clarke River; thence along the said bank to the confluence of the Clarke and Grey Rivers, and along the left bank of the latter river to a point opposite the north-western corner of Section 3063; thence to and along the western boundary and the southern and eastern boundaries of the said section, the latter boundary produced to the left bank of the Grey River; thence along the said river-bank; thence across the said Grey River and along the northern boundary of the Westland Land District, 18500 links; thence in a south-easterly direction, 26400 links; thence in a westerly direction, 25000 links; thence due north to the southern boundary of Block III, Pohaturaha Survey District, and along the said boundary of Block III and the southern boundary of Block II, 29200 links; thence due south, 11000 links; thence due east to the eastern boundary of Block V, Pohaturaha Survey District; thence along the said block boundary to its south-eastern corner; thence in a north-westerly direction to the western boundary of Block I, Pohaturaha Survey District, 38500 links; thence to the south-eastern corner of said Block I; thence along the southern boundary of Block IV, Ahaura Survey District, 4500 links; thence due south to the southern boundary of Block VIII of the said survey district; thence in a south-easterly direction to a point near Trig. M.E (Mount Elliot), 45000 links; thence due east to the eastern boundary of Section 3081, and along the said boundary to the southern boundary of Section 3242; thence along the said boundary to the south-eastern corner of the said section; thence along the eastern boundaries of said Section 3242 and Section 3241; thence across a road reserve, and again along the eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 3241; thence across a road reserve, across Safety Camp Creek, and again across a road reserve; thence along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 3240, 3239, and 3048 to a road reserve; thence by the southern side of the said road reserve, crossing to the south-eastern boundary of Section 2375; thence to the eastern corner of the said section; and thence along the north-eastern boundary of said Section 2375, across a road reserve, across Granite Creek, again across a road reserve, and again along the said north-eastern boundary to the point of commencement. As the same is delineated on sheet 34, roll plan 450, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Forestry, at Wellington, and thereon bordered green.

REGULATIONS.

1. IN addition to the terms prescribed by the said regulations of the 13th March, 1911, the term of any advance may be ten years, and every instalment in respect thereof shall be calculated and payable in accordance with the table in the Schedule hereto.

2. The Board may, on any half-yearly date on which an instalment is payable in respect of an advance made under the said section 274, pay any sum of not less than £100, or a multiple of £100, in reduction of that advance.

3. All moneys so paid shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of the future instalments in the order of their due dates in the following manner:—

(a.) In the case of each instalment of principal which is wholly satisfied, and on which no interest has actually begun to accrue, the corresponding instalment of interest shall not be payable.

(b.) The instalments unsatisfied in whole or in part shall, as to both principal and interest, be deemed to be due and payable at half-yearly intervals computed from the due date of the instalment next preceding the instalment that is first satisfied in whole or in part, and there shall consequently be no break in the periodical continuity of the payments to be made by the Board.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1920.

The rainfall for the month was below average in the West Coast and southern half of the South Island and about Cape Egmont in the North Island; in all other parts it was in excess, the greatest difference above the mean being in the northernmost districts. Dull, misty, and wet weather was experienced from the 5th to the 11th, when disturbances of moderate intensity were in evidence both north and south of the Dominion. On the 5th and 6th very heavy rains occurred over most of the North Island, causing high floods in the central parts. Between the 19th and 27th a very intense and extensive westerly storm area ruled, and this proved the most unsettled period during the month; rain fell generally, and snow occasionally, on the high country of the South Island. Fair weather was general during the first four and the last three days of the month, and between the 12th and 18th. Some severe frosts were recorded about the middle of the month.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

The regulations hereby made shall have effect on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Such allowance shall cover a period of twenty-four hours from the time of departure or before the time of return, or the whole period occupied in travelling if such period is less than twenty-four hours."
