HEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor General may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that purpose any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section: And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown, or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twentieth And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twentieth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twenty-third day of the same month, the Patea Borough Council was authorized to erect electric lines within the Borough of Patea and portion of the Patea County, in terms of section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911:

And whereas the said Patea Borough Council (hereinafter, with its successors and assigns, referred to as "the licensee") has applied for a license under section five of the Public

has applied for a license under section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, to take and use water from the Mangaroa Stream, in the Land District of Taranaki (hereinafter referred to as "the said stream"), for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient

to issue such license accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto) a license to take and use from the stream aforesaid, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding five cubic feet per second at any one time.

The licensee shall, before the works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

(c.) Contour plan showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.

2. Utilization of the Water.

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

3. Location of Headworks.

The said water shall be taken from the said stream at the headworks, situated in Section 459, Block II, Carlyle Survey District, at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 46683, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license; the position of the said works being indicated on the plans marked P.W.D. 46683 and P.W.D. 48478, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Wellington Land District:

(a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
(b.) Race leading from such intake to the power-house dam.

(c.) Raising existing dam at the power-house.

5. Inspection of Works.

Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

9. RENTAL.

The licensee shall in respect of this license pay to the Public Works Engineer, Stratford, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental at the rate of ls. per quarter per kilowatt of maximum output occurring during the year as recorded by a wattmeter to be installed by the licensee in the power-house, with a minimum payment of \$100 per appears. ment of £10 per annum.

10. Granting of other Water-rights.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said stream, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

11. Fines.

If the licensee fails or neglects—
(a.) To use or maintain the said works, after competion, so as to secure the full benefit of the undertaking; or (b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein

imposed,-

then and in any such case the licensee shall be liable to a fine of £50 for every week or part of a week during which such default or neglect continues; or the Governor General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

12. Service of Notice.

Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, this license shall not be revoked, and no proceedings shall be taken for the recovery of a fine in respect of the breach thereof, unless and until notice in writing of the intention so to revoke the license or to take such proceedings has been served upon the licensee, or placed upon some principal or conspicuous part of the works, and default has been made by the licensee in repairing or remedying the breach or breaches specified in the said notice for the following periods: periods

(a.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor-General can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.

(b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor-General is of such a nature as to require the revoca-tion of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice,

Notice to Persons visiting France.

THE following is published for general information. W. FRASER, For Minister of Internal Affairs.

PROHIBITION OF EXPORTATION OF MONEYS IN GOLD, SILVER, OR BANK-NOTES.

It is forbidden to export moneys, either French or foreign, in gold or silver under pain of imprisonment of from one month to two years and of a fine of from 100 to 5,000 francs, or of one only of these two imprisonments. Further, the gold or silver seized are confiscate as well as the means of transport. (Act of 17th August, 1915, and Decree of the 12th July, 1919.)

Save by special authority of the Minister of Finance (Ex-

change Committee), it is also forbidden to travellers going

abroad to take away a sun greater than 1,000 francs per head in notes of the Bank of France, or the approximate value of this sum in notes of foreign banks. (Act of 3rd April, 1918, and Order of the 3rd July, 1918.)

An exception is made in the case of silver to the maximum amount of 10 francs per head.

Travellers not conforming to these directions run the risk of imprisonment and a heavy fine.

of imprisonment and a heavy fine.

The following modification of the above was advised by

the Imperial Government under date of the 3rd June, 1920:

In virtue of a French law of 3rd April, 1918, the sum of money which may be taken out of France by persons leaving the country is limited to 1,000 francs. This limitation is a source of considerable inconvenience to foreign commercial travellers, who frequently recover, just prior to leaving the country, a sum of money which they were obliged to deposit on entering the country as duty on samples, with the result that the total sum in their possession exceeds 1,000 francs.

The French Customs authorities have now, however, issued

instructions that foreign commercial travellers visiting France may, on leaving the country, be permitted to export freely the sums which they deposited on entering the country, even when the addition of this sum to the money they are already carrying raises the total above 1,000 francs.

In pursuance and in exercise of all powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Coal-mines Act, 1908, and its amendments (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act and its amendments"), His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following an endment to the regulations made under the said Act and its amendments on the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen; and doth hereby declare that the amendment to the regulations hereby made shall be read as part of the said principal regulations, and shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATION 134 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following paragraph:

"The term 'permitted explosives' shall for a period of six months from the 24th June, 1920 (unless this amending regulation is sooner revoked), include the explosive known as Monobel No. 1, manufactured at the works of Nobel's Explosives Company (Limited) at Modderfontein, South Africa; provided that the u-e of such explosive is only permitted subject to the following conditions,—

"(a.) The said explosive shall in all respects be manufactured in strict conformity with the schedules to

factured in strict conformity with the schedules to the British Home Office Order dated the 14th November, 1919.

"(b.) The greatest weight of explosive which may be used in any one shot-hole shall not exceed 8 oz, and each cartridge shall be marked with words to that effect.'

By His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia.

Whereas by the Quarantine Act, 1908–1915, it is enacted that the Governor-General may, by Proclamation, prohibit the importation into Australia of any animals or plants, or parts of animals or plants, and that the power of prohibition shall extend to prohibition generally, or with limitations as to place and subject-matter, and either absolutely or subject to any specified conditions or restrictions:

And whereas by a Proclamation published in the Gazette of 23rd December, 1915, the importation of certain plants was prohibited, or conditionally prohibited:

And whereas it is desirable to modify the said Proclamation:

Now, therefore, I, Sir Ronald Craufurd Munro Ferguson, the Governor-General aforesaid, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby repeal paragraph 2 of the said Proclamation with respect to pear-trees, and I do hereby prohibit the introduction into Australia of pear-trees, appletrees, or only portion thereof, which were grown trees, or quince-trees, or any portion thereof, which were grown in any country in which pear-blight (Bacillus amylovorus)

For the purpose of this Proclamation any State of the United States is deemed to be a country.

This Proclamation may be cited as Quarantine Proclamation

Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

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The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
