Land withdrawn from Provisional State Forest Reservation.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and published in *Gazette* of the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, certain lands in the Karangarua Survey District, in the Westland Land District, were, *inter alia*, set apart as and for provisional State forests in terms of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918:

And whereas the lands described in the Schedule hereto (being part of the lands so set apart) are required for settlement, and it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be rescinded in so far as it relates to the lands described in the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by clauses (b) and (c) of subsection (3) of section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby rescind the Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, hereinbefore referred to, in so far as it relates to the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

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mencement. As the same is delineated on plan marked 6/13/4, deposited in the Head Office of the Forestry Department, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

2. When a Magistrate leaves and returns to headquarters the same day, actual and reasonable expenses only shall be paid.

3. Nothing in these regulations shall preclude the Minister from authorizing temporary special rates or amounts for travelling to meet special cases.

4. The cost of transport by land or sea will be paid by the Government, or when paid by the Magistrate travelling the same will be refunded to him on production of vouchers, but no vouchers for such expenses will be required for sums of 5s. and under, and vouchers for railway fares will not be required if the railway travelled upon and the extent of the journey is stated.

5. Public conveyances must be used where available, and the cost of motor-cars or special conveyances will not be allowed unless specially authorized.

6. All vouchers for travelling allowances or expenses must be made out in detail on the proper Treasury form, must state definitely the duty on which the Magistrate is travelling, and must be signed and certified by the claimant, and certified as correct by the Permanent Head of the Department or other authorized authority.

7. No Magistrate shall leave his district without the authority of the Minister of Justice or some officer authorized by him.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, certain parts of the Imperial Coinage Act, 1870 (as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891), were applied to New Zealand: And whereas by the proviso to subsection two of section one of the Coinage Act, 1920 (10 Geo. 5, Ch. 3), a copy of which Act is set out in the Schedule hereto, it is provided that the provisions of that subsection shall not apply as respects any

self-governing Dominion unless and until those provisions are adopted as regards the Dominion by a Proclamation of the Governor-General or Governor: And whereas it is expedient to issue a Proclamation accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Robert Stout, the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by the said Coinage Act, 1920, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of subsection two of section one of the said Coinage Act, 1920, are hereby adopted as regards the Dominion of New Zealand, and shall apply thereto as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

CHAPTER 3. A.D. 1920.

AN ACT to amend the Law in respect of the Standard Fineness of Silver Coins current in the United Kingdom and in other Parts of His Majesty's Dominions.

[31st March, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Alteration of standard fineness of silver coins.
33 & 34 Vic. c. 10. 34 & 35 Vict. c. 72.

1. (1.) The First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two of the Coinage Act, 1891, shall, as regards coins made after the commencement of this Act, have effect as though for the words "thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver, three-fortieths alloy; or millesimal fineness 925," in the column relating to standard fineness there were substituted the words "one-half fine silver, one-half alloy; or millesimal fineness 500," and as though for the figure "4" in the column relating to the remedy allowance in respect of millesimal fineness there were substituted the figure "5."

(2.) Where by virtue of a Proclamation made under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, the whole or any part of that Act is in force in any British possession at the date of the commencement of this Act, that Act shall as from that date apply in that possession as amended by this Act, and any Order in Council or Proclamation directing that any coins which under the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891, are legal tender in the United Kingdom shall be current and legal tender in any British possession shall extend to coins which are legal tender in the United Kingdom under those Acts as amended by this Act:

Provided that the provisions of this subsection shall not apply as respects any self-governing dominion unless and until those provisions are adopted as regards the dominion by a Proclamation of the Governor-General or Governor.

Amendment of law with respect to standard trial plates of silver.

2. The standard trial plates of silver to be used for the purpose of the trial of the pyx shall, instead of being made of a standard fineness in conformity with the provisions of the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891, be made of pure silver.

Short title and construction.

3. (1.) This Act may be cited as the Coinage Act, 1920, and shall be construed as one with the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1891, and those Acts and this Act may be cited together as the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

(2.) In this Act the expression "self-governing dominion" means the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, and Newfoundland.

Bonus for the Production of Quicksilver.

Mines Department (M. 27/2),

In the event of more than one person producing the required quantities of quicksilver before the dates named, inquiry will be made by the officer above referred to, when if it is found that each applicant is equally entitled to a bonus, the amount will be divided in proportion to the quantities produced by each applicant, but in no case shall any bonus be paid until at least forty thousand pounds (40,000 lb.) of quicksilver has been produced in the aggregate.

Amendment to Regulations relating to the Introduction of Stock from New Zealand into Fiji.—Notice No. 2035.

IN the *New Zealand Gazette* of 8th April, 1920, there was published for general information a copy of an Order in Council made by His Excellency the Governor of Fiji in Council on 20th February, 1920, relating to the introduction of stock into Fiji. This Order in Council has been replaced

by one dated 16th July, 1920, which varies the provisions of the previous Order in Council in the following respects:—

“Infected stock” is defined as follows:—

“Infected stock” means any stock which may have been exposed to the infection of disease as above defined, or any stock from countries from which their importation into Fiji is prohibited by these regulations.

The definition of “undomesticated animals” is replaced by the following:—

“Undomesticated animals” means all living animals other than domesticated poultry or game birds not included in the definition of stock.

Regulation 3 relating to the landing of live-stock now reads:—

3. Such foreign live-stock as may by these regulations be introduced into the colony shall be landed only at the ports of Suva, Lautoka, or Levuka, provided that in the case of those animals for which by these regulations a period of quarantine is prescribed they shall be landed only at the port of Suva.

Regulation 34 relating to fees now reads:—

34. The importer of animals shall pay to the Inspector the following fees:—

The total births registered for the four metropolitan areas amounted to 797, as against 840 in July—a decrease of 43. The deaths in August were 522—an increase of 51 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 276, females 246. Eighty-two of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 15.71 per cent. of the whole number. Fifty-eight of these were under one year of age.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Administrator of the Government in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendment shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendment shall have effect from and after the seventeenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATION No. 209 (5) is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

"209. (5.) An officer of the Seventh Class of the Clerical Division, who is in receipt of a salary of not more than £160 per annum, shall be deemed to be performing the duties of a position of a higher class or grade than that in which he is classified, if he performs the duties ordinarily performed by an officer of the same class who is in receipt of a salary of not less than £250 per annum, and may be granted, on the approval of the Commissioner, and subject to the preceding paragraphs of this regulation, payment in addition to salary at a rate of not more than £25 per annum."

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

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UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

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2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
