IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments, His Excellency the Administrator of the

Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments hereinafter set out in the rules of the Native Land Court dated the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and gazetted on the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, under the Native Land Act, 1909, and its amendments; and doth hereby declare that such amendments shall take effect on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty.

AMENDMENTS TO RULES OF COURT.

1. Rule 1 is hereby amended by omitting the words "Gazetted" means published in the *Gazette* and *Kahiti*."
2. Rule 11 is hereby amended by omitting all the words after the word "*Kahiti*."

4. Rule 13 is hereby amended by omitting the words "and also if he thinks fit in the *Gazette*."

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned landing-stage in good order and repair.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said landing-stage and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such landing-stage, requiring the licensee, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the said landing-stage, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the part of the licensee.

9. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said landing-stage for a period of thirty days; or

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Administrator in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said landing-stage to be removed, and may recover the cost incurred by any such removal from the licensee.

10. The construction of the said landing-stage shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

Regulations under the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, relating to the Movement of Bees from the Auckland District.—Notice No. 2037.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fifteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and published in the *Gazette* of the eighteenth day of the same month, regulations were made relating to the removal of plants and bees from the Auckland District: And whereas it is expedient to make other provisions controlling the movement of bees :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clause four of the aforesaid regulations, and make the following regulation in lieu thereof, and doth hereby declare that this regulation shall be read together with and form part of the aforesaid regulations; and doth hereby further declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

REGULATION.

4. (1.) No bees shall be sent or brought from the prescribed area to any other portion of New Zealand unless such bees have been effectively quarantined for the six days immediately prior to their despatch from that area so as to prevent their having access to any flowers or other vegetation.

(2.) The Director of the Horticulture Division of the Department of Agriculture shall appoint such places of quarantine, and shall prescribe such conditions for their use as he deems necessary.

(3.) Before sending or taking any bees out of the prescribed area the owner shall have them quarantined at one of the appointed places of quarantine.

(4.) After completing the prescribed period of six days in quarantine the bees shall be forwarded direct from the quarantine place to their final destination, an official permit signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture being attached by tag or label to each parcel of such bees.

(5.) No bees shall be accepted for posting or for consignment by rail to an address outside the prescribed area without such official permit being attached to the parcel.

(6.) All expenses of sending bees to a place of quarantine and of forwarding them on completion of their period of quarantine to their destination outside the prescribed area shall be borne by the original sender of such bees, and shall be payable on demand.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations numbered eleven, twelve, thirteen, and fourteen under the heading "Telephone Exchange Connections," and the regulation under the heading "Toll Communications," in the Schedule to the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations and fix the rates and charges set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth declare that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the regulations first herein mentioned, and shall come into force on and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

For every additional quarter-mile or fraction thereof up to three miles the charge is 12s. 6d. per annum; beyond three miles, 17s. 6d. per annum; provided that if a special line of poles has to be erected beyond three miles, for which the subscriber does not contribute to the capital cost, for such portion the charge will be £1 2s. 6d. per annum for each quarter-mile or fraction thereof; provided also that the charge will be 17s. 6d. per annum for each quarter-mile or fraction thereof for any portion of the line for which the subscriber pays half the cost of construction, and 12s. 6d. per quarter-mile or fraction thereof for that portion for which he pays the whole cost of construction, whether a special line of poles is constructed or not.

14. The foregoing regulation is to be read in conjunction with Regulations Nos. 21 and 22 hereof.

Amendments and Additions to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Administrator of the Government in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof made from time to time under the provisions of the said Act, make the amendments shown in the Schedule hereto.

Such amendments shall have effect from and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATION 8E is hereby revoked, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

RATE OF PAYMENT.

8E. The following shall be the rate of payment for overtime, where such payment is sanctioned, and shall apply only to officers of the Professional and Clerical Divisions:—

Overtime shall be calculated to the nearest quarter of an hour.

Officers of the General Division whose cases are not met by special regulation in that behalf may be paid for overtime at such rate as may be fixed by the Commissioner from time to time.

Regulation No. 201 is hereby amended by striking out the figures "£300," and substituting therefor the figures "£350."

Regulation No. 213 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

213. In addition to the salary payable to officers in Subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of Class VII of the Clerical Division, there shall be paid, if officer is stationed away from his home, a lodging-allowance at the following rates:—

If in the First Subdivision	£40 per annum.

Regulation No. 214 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

214. In Subdivisions 1, 2, and 3 of Class F of the Professional Division, the lodging-allowance shall be as follows:—

That the Board doth hereby appropriate and pledge as security for the repayment of the said loan, and the interest, sinking fund, and other charges thereon, the special rate of one twenty-fifth (1/25th) of a penny in the pound sterling on the rateable value (on the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property in the Omapa Road Board District.
