Lands set apart as Provisional State Forests.

[L.S.] JELLICOE, Governor-General. A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section thirty-four of the War Legislation and Statute Law Amendment Act, 1918, and section two of the State Forests Amendment Act, 1919, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby set apart the national-endowment lands described in the Schedule hereto as and for provisional State forests.

SCHEDULE.

TARANAKI LAND DISTRICT.

Regulations under the Education Act.-Exchange of New Zealand Teachers with Teachers from other Countries, and for granting Leave of Absence to Teachers for certain Purposes.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him under the provisions of the Education Act, 1914, and the amendments thereof, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the exchange of New Zealand teachers with teachers from other countries, and for granting leave of absence to teachers for certain purposes; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

1. THE Education Department of New Zealand shall act as the intermediary to effect exchanges between teachers from abroad and teachers employed in the primary, secondary or technical schools, or in the island dependencies of New Zealand.

2. Applications for exchange will be received by the Director of Educa-tion from New Zealand teachers not later than 30th June of the year preceding that for which engagement abroad is sought.

3. Applications will also be received by the Director not later than 30th September in each year from New Zealand teachers who desire leave of absence in accordance with clause 72 of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers, &c., to visit schools in other countries.

4. Any application for leave of absence under these regulations shall first receive the approval of the controlling authority in whose service the applicant is for the time being employed.

5. Each applicant shall be required to furnish the Director with the following information on a form provided for the purpose, and obtainable from controlling authorities :-

(a.) Name in full.

(b.) Address.

(c.) Age.

(d.) Condition (married or single).

(e.) Number of years service as a teacher.

(f.) Present position.

(g.) Present annual salary. (h.) Kind of work at present engaged in.

(i.) Nature of previous experience.

(j.) List of certificates or diplomas.

(k.) Country, State, or province to which applicant desires to go.

(1.) Nature of work or position (if any) desired abroad. 6. New Zealand applicants will be required to undertake to return to the New Zealand education service for a period of at least three years. 7. Not more than six applicants shall be selected in any one year under

these regulations.

8. In considering the general suitability of applicants, preference shall be given to teachers representative of different branches of school work and to those who have a sufficiently long term of unexpired service, provided that no applicant shall be approved who has had more than thirtyfive years' service in the case of men or more than twenty-five years' service in the case of women. The decision of the Director regarding the selection of applicants shall be final.

9. To the six successful applicants there shall be refunded on their return to the New Zealand education service, or on leaving England for New Zealand, half the amount of their passage money between terminal ports (return fare, second saloon), provided that such refund shall in no case exceed £50. In addition, successful applicants shall also be paid during the time they are unemployed outside New Zealand and engaged in educational investigation, full salary for a period not exceeding two months, and half salary for an additional period not exceeding one month.

10. Any teacher granted leave under these regulations shall be required on his return to New Zealand to furnish the Director with an account of his work and experiences abroad, and the Education Department will reserve to itself the right to publish any or all of these reports.

11. Education authorities abroad shall be requested to furnish the New Zealand Education Department with reports on the character of the work done by New Zealand teachers for whom exchanges have been arranged under these regulations.

12. Leave of absence under these regulations shall not be granted for more than one year, except that in special circumstances, and with the approval of the Minister, such leave may be extended for an additional year.

13. Teachers who are in permanent positions in other countries and who apply for temporary employment in the New Zealand education service, either by way of exchange with New Zealand teachers or otherwise, shall be required to furnish as far as possible the information detailed in clause 5 hereof, and, further, shall, through a responsible authority, furnish reliable information as to their status and efficiency.

14. As far as possible arrangements shall be made either to effect exchanges between teachers whose salaries for the time being are approximately equal, or to find for approved teachers from abroad other positions commensurate with their certified efficiency; but the New Zealand Education Department will accept no responsibility for any loss in salary incurred under these regulations, whether the teacher be a New Zealand teacher or one from abroad.

15. A teacher from abroad appointed temporarily to a position in New Zealand under these regulations shall receive such salary as will, subject to Schedules I to IV of the Regulations for the Salaries of Public-school Teachers, approximate most nearly to the salary he received in his last permanent position.

Regulations for the Expenses of Members of Education Boards.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and its amendments, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations in force for the Expenses of Members of Education Boards, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth below; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty.

REGULATONS.

THE expenses that may be held to be reasonably incurred, in accordance with section 31 of the Education Act, 1914, by a member of the Board in going to and returning from meetings of the Board or of a Committee thereof, or of making any official visit when appointed by the Board to make such visit, are as follows :---

(a.) Fares actually paid, by public conveyance, whether rail, steamer, coach, or tram, by the most direct route.

(b.) Where a public conveyance is not available, or available only at greater cost, the expenses attaching to a member's use of his own horse or vehicle, at a rate not exceeding 8d. per mile, counted both ways, together with stabling allowance of 5s. for each night that a horse has to be kept from home.

(c.) The cost of a special conveyance required by members to make an official visit when appointed by the Board to make such visit, and where a public conveyance is not available.

(d.) When a member is obliged to absent himself from home or from his place of business, living-expenses at the rate of 18s. per day of twentyfour hours, any portion of a day to be reckoned at the rate of one twentyfourth of the full daily rate for each hour of necessary absence. The day shall be deemed to commence at the hour nearest to the time of departure from the place of residence or business.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations relating to incidental expenses of schools made by Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

A. THE incidental expenses of School Committees within the meaning of section 36 of the Education Act, 1914, shall include expenditure under the following heads :---

(1.) Cleaning—namely, the complete and regular cleaning and keeping in order of buildings, furniture, fixtures, apparatus, and appliances in all the school premises, including class-rooms, teachers' rooms, passages, lavatories, libraries, laboratories, workshops, outbuildings, drains, water-tanks, wells, and other appurtenances of the school premises (exclusive of repairs rendered necessary by fair wear-and-tear); the performance of sanitary and other services; the cost of requisites for cleaning; and the cost of fumigation when ordered by the Health Officer or otherwise deemed necessary.

(2.) Heating—namely, cost of fuel and other items connected with the heating of the school premises, such as sweeping chimneys, replacing of coal-scuttles and fire-irons.

(3.) Water-service and sanitary service.—All expenditure on these items when necessary (excluding cost of instalment or replacement of fittings, and cost of water-supply to school baths).

(4.) Grounds.—Repair and keeping in order of the school grounds, fences, hedges, gates, and paths (including the clearing of gorse, broom, brier, and all noxious weeds, but not including the cost of replacing worn-out fences and gates, nor the repair and keeping in order of the teachers' garden or of the school glebe).

(5.) Repairs of all buildings, furniture, fixtures, apparatus, and appliances on school premises that are rendered necessary by wilful or careless damage, and generally all small repairs other than those due to fair wearand-tear, fire, earthquake, or storm.

(6.) Stationery.—The cost of school stationery such as ink, chalk, blackboard dusters, and paper required for examination purposes; cost of stationery used for the transaction of the business of the School Committee.

B. Further, if provision has been made for the cost of all the items specified in A, and funds permit, the incidental expenses of School Committees within the meaning of the said section 36 may include, at the discretion of the Board,—

- (a.) The cost of all paper and other stationery used in school for school purposes, including pens, pencils, slates, erasers, paper, and exercise-books.
- (b.) The salary of a caretaker appointed to have custody of the school buildings and to perform all or any of the duties indicated above; rent of caretaker's quarters, and all repairs to the same.

(c.) The cost of water-supply to school baths.

- (d.) School libraries, pictures for the school walls, asphalting and other improvement of the school premises.
- (e.) Utensils and apparatus used in connection with the provision of hot lunches for children.

August was generally cold and unsettled, being more wintry in character than the two previous months. The most severe storm was the result of an intense westerly low-pressure area, the trough of which passed on the 26th, the barometer reading on that date at the Bluff being as low as 28.54 inches. West to south-west gales were experienced about this time, and very heavy seas occurred on the West Coast of the South Island. Minor disturbances of both antarctic and tropical origin were frequent during the month. Rainfall, in consequence, was above the average over most of the South Island and in all but the middle districts of the North.
