A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the parcels of land described in the Schedule hereto were, by an order of the Native Land Court made on the second day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, duly laid out as road-lines, in pursuance of section one hundred and seventeen of the Native Land Act, 1909:

And whereas by section two of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1918, it is

provided that where any road-line has heretofore been laid out under the said section one hundred and seventeen and has not been proclaimed as a public road, then such road-line may be proclaimed as a public road under section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, subject, however, to the conditions prescribed by section fifty-one of the last-mentioned Act and section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas the said Court is of the opinion that in the public interest the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads, and a notification to that effect has been forwarded to the Minister of Lands, in terms of section fifty-one of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913:

And whereas one month's notice in writing of the intention to proclaim the said road-lines as public roads has been given by the Surveyor-General to the local authority of the district concerned, in terms of section fifteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914:

And whereas it is now expedient that the said road-lines should be proclaimed as public roads:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section forty-eight of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, do hereby proclaim as public roads the road-lines described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

APPROXIMATE area of the road-lines proclaimed: 4 acres 0 roods 11 perches.  
Portions of Parawai No. 1 Block, situated in Block XVI, Rotorua Survey District.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the Native Land Act, 1909, the Governor-General may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority so conferred upon me by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land.

*Constituting the Westland Electric-power District.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, that any area or areas of land may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act, and in the manner therein provided:

And whereas a petition, praying that the area described in the First Schedule hereto may be constituted an electric-power district under the said Act, was presented to the Governor-General on the fourteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty:

And whereas such petition was publicly notified in the *Hokitika Guardian and Evening Star* dated the thirty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, newspapers circulating in the proposed electric-power district:

And whereas, after due inquiry, the Governor-General is of opinion that the petition should be granted, subject to the proposed boundaries of the district being altered as herein-after appears:

Now, therefore, I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by section three of the Electric-power Boards Act, 1918, do hereby alter the proposed boundaries, and proclaim the district with the altered boundaries as described in the Second Schedule hereto to be an electric-power district, and I hereby assign to such district the name of the "Westland Electric-power District."

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Westland Land District, Westland County, bounded by the south bank of the Taramakau River on the north, and the south bank of the River Mikonui and a line running east from the head of the said Mikonui River on the south, to the eastern boundary of the Westland County on the east, by the eastern boundary of the said county and the Tasman Sea on the west; but excluding the Boroughs of Hokitika, Ross, and Kumara. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 49361, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, and thereon edged in red.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

WESTLAND ELECTRIC-POWER DISTRICT.

ALL that area in the Westland Land District bounded towards the north by the south bank of the Taramakau River from its mouth to Harper's Pass; towards the south-east by the summit of the Southern Alps from Arthur's Pass to Whitcombe Pass; towards the south-west by the Whitcombe River to its junction with the Price River, thence by a right line to the source of the Mikonui River, and by the north bank of that river to the sea; and towards the north-west by the Tasman Sea: excluding therefrom the Boroughs of Kumara, Hokitika, and Ross.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of October, 1920.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Stock Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council dated the thirtieth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, declaring certain infected areas for the purposes of regulations for the prevention of blackleg amongst cattle, and in lieu thereof doth hereby declare that the areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto shall be infected areas for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations made by Order in Council dated the twentieth day of

December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen; and doth hereby further declare that this Order in Council shall be read together with and form part of the regulations aforesaid, and shall come into force on the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

INFECTED AREAS A.

No. 1 Infected Area A.

ALL that area in the Auckland and North Auckland Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at the mouth of the Puhenua Creek in the Firth of Thames, and proceeding southerly and easterly along the shore of the said firth to the Waiwhakaurunga Stream; thence up that stream to its source, and southerly along the main watershed passing through Trig. Stations 95, 94, 89, 86, and 65 to the south-eastern boundary of the Ohinemuri County as described in the Schedule to Hauraki Plains County Act, 1919; thence south-westerly along that boundary to and along the eastern boundary of the Piako County as described in the above-mentioned Schedule; thence along the north-eastern, south-eastern, and south-western boundaries of the Matamata County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1914, page 1333, to the Waiteti Stream; thence up that stream to its source, and along a right line to the source of the Owairaka Stream, and down that stream and the Puniu River to its junction with the Waipa River; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of the Raglan County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1883, page 1771, to the western watershed of the Waipa River; thence northerly along that watershed to the northern boundary of the Karamu Parish, and easterly along that boundary to the Waipa River; thence down that river and the Waikato River to the northern boundary of the Whangape Parish, and westerly along that boundary and the southern boundaries of Te Akau Nos. A 3 and A 6 Blocks to the sea-coast; thence northerly along the sea-coast and easterly along the shores of the Manukau Harbour to the nearest point to the terminus of Cook Street at the saleyards in the Papakura Town District; thence to that terminus and along Cook and Elliot Streets and the Great South Road to the northern boundary of the Papakura Town District; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that town district as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1919, page 137, and the northern boundary of the Franklin County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1916, page 1135, to the point of commencement.

No. 2 Infected Area A.

All that area in the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts bounded towards the north generally by the Mokau River from the sea to the north-western corner of the Mokau-Mohakatino No. 1g Block; thence by the western and south-western boundaries of that block and the north-eastern boundary of Mokau-Mohakatino No. 1j Block to Tawhiti-raupeka Trig. Station; thence by Blocks IV and VIII, Waro Survey District, to the Tongaporutu-Mangaroa Road; thence by that road to the westernmost corner of Section No. 22, Block V, Ohura Survey District; thence by the eastern watershed of the Tangarakau Stream, over Mahoe-waruaru, Tatu, and Peneta Trig. Stations to the Ohura Road; thence by the said Ohura Road to the Heao Stream; thence by that stream to the northern boundary of the Whangamomona County; thence by the leading spur eastwards to the western watershed of the Ohura River; thence by the watershed to the Wanganui River at Onetea; thence by the right bank of the said Wanganui River to the point where it meets the south-eastern boundary-line of the Taranaki Land District; thence towards the south by a right line to the intersection of the Patea River with the south-eastern boundary-line of the Hawera County; thence towards the south-east by the said south-eastern boundary-line of the Hawera County to the sea; and thence towards the south-west, west, and north-west by the sea to the Mokau River aforesaid.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

INFECTED AREAS B.

No. 1 Infected Area B.

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, being the County of Manukau, the Borough of Otahuhu, and the Town Districts of Papatoetoe, Manurewa, and Papakura, exclusive of that portion of the last-named town district included in No. 1 Infected Area A above.

Also all that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north and east by the above-described No. 1 Infected Area A from the junction of the Puniu River with the Waipa River to the Waikato River where intersected by the West Taupo County boundary; towards the south-east by the said county boundary to the mouth of the Waihora Stream in Lake Taupo; towards the south-west by a right line from

the said Waihora Stream mouth to Trig. Station 1390 (Pureora); and towards the south, west, and north by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the Waitomo County to the junction of the Puniu and Waipa Rivers.

No. 2 Infected Area B.

All that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded towards the north-west generally by the south-eastern boundary of the Hawera County from the mouth of the Manawapou River to where the confiscation-line intersects the Patea River; thence towards the east generally by the said Patea River to the ocean; and thence towards the south-west by the ocean to the place of commencement.

WHEREAS by section sixty-five of the Counties Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that the general election of members of the various County Councils throughout the Dominion shall be held on the second Wednesday in November :

And whereas it is expedient to extend the time for holding such election in certain counties :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section two hundred and seventeen of the said Act, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby extend the time for holding the general election of Councillors for the Counties of Akaroa, Amuri, Ashburton, Ashley, Awatere, Cheviot, Ellesmere, Eyre, Geraldine, Halswell, Heathcote, Kaikoura, Kowai, Levels, Mackenzie, Malvern, Mount Herbert, Oxford, Paparua, Rangiora, Selwyn, Springs, Tawera, Waimairi, Waimate, Waipara, Wairewa, and Waitaki; and doth hereby order and declare that in the aforesaid counties the said general election shall be held and take place on Wednesday, the seventeenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, excepting in the Counties of Akaroa, Mount Herbert, and Wairewa, in which the said election shall be held on Tuesday, the sixteenth day of the said month of November, and the Counties of Amuri, Awatere, Waipara, and Waitaki, in which the said election shall be held on Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of the said month of November.

*Amended Regulations under the Education Act, 1914.*

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of October, 1920.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and the amendments of that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the amendments set forth in the Schedule hereto in the regulations made by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen (hereinafter referred to as "the regulations"), and in all other regulations in force at the making of this order, relating to salaries of public-school teachers, grading and staffing of public schools, temporary and relieving teachers, teachers' house allowances, Native schools, training colleges, pupil-teachers and probationers, and organizing teachers; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, except where it is expressly stated to the contrary.

## SCHEDULE.

## I.—GENERAL.

1. FOR the purposes of these regulations and of the regulations of 17th November, 1919—

A "mixed school" means a school to which all boys and girls of school age are admitted:

A "separate boys' school" means a school to which there are admitted boys belonging to any of the standard classes, or to any of the standard classes above Standard I or above Standard II, but no other pupils:

A "separate girls' school" means a school to which there are admitted girls belonging to any of the standard classes, or to any of the standard classes above Standard I or above Standard II, but no other pupils:

A "separate infants' school" means a school to which there are admitted all pupils belonging to classes not higher than Standard I or not higher than Standard II:

A "side school" is a school which is attached to another school and is distant more than a quarter of a mile, but not more than three miles, therefrom, and to which are admitted pupils up to a class not higher than Standard IV and up to an age not higher than eleven years:

A "main school" is a school to which a side school is so attached: One school is attached to another within the foregoing provisions when they have the same head teacher:

A "part-time school" is one of a group of two or more schools taught by the same sole teacher, each school being situated at least three miles by the nearest practicable means of access from any other school of the same group, all the schools being open for not less than twenty hours a week in the aggregate:

A "relieving teacher" means a teacher employed as *locum tenens* for a teacher granted leave of absence, or a teacher appointed under subsection (3) of section 72 of the Act pending the appointment of a permanent teacher:

The term "temporary teacher" means a teacher temporarily appointed under the provisions of subsection (1) of section 71 of the Act until a teacher who is the holder of a teacher's certificate or a license to teach can be obtained or a teacher appointed temporarily to any position on probation:

The term "relieving position" or the term "temporary position" means the position in which a relieving teacher or a temporary teacher respectively is for the time being employed.

2. If any dispute arises respecting the meaning or effect of any clause of the regulations named in the preamble hereto as amended by this Order, such dispute shall be submitted to the Minister of Education, whose decision thereon shall be final and conclusive.

II.—SALARIES OF PUBLIC-SCHOOL TEACHERS.

3. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the regulations as amended by this Order, the salary of any teacher (other than a relieving teacher) who was employed in a public school of Grade I or a higher grade on 1st April, 1920, or who is appointed after the 31st March, 1920, and before the 1st February, 1921, shall until 31st January, 1921, be determined as follows, and shall be payable from the 1st April, 1920, or from the date of appointment, as the case may be:—

- (a.) Any such teacher shall receive the salary to which he would have been entitled under clause 1 of the regulations had this Order not come into force.
- (b.) In addition he shall receive, if he is the holder of a teacher's certificate or a license to teach, a special increment of £30 per annum, or if he is an uncertificated teacher a special increment of £20.
- (c.) If employed in a school of Grade I, II, IIIA, or IIIB, he shall receive a further addition of £10 per annum.
- (d.) He shall also receive the additions to salary (if any) provided by clauses 2 and 3 of the regulations as amended by this Order.

(2.) On and after 1st February, 1921, the salary of any such teacher shall be determined in accordance with the regulations as amended by this Order.

4. Schedules I and IV of the regulations are hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

5. Clause 1 of the regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclauses:—

“(2.) A deduction of £10 per annum from the salary payable under sub-clause (1) of this clause shall be made in the case of every uncertificated temporary teacher who is not the holder of a license to teach.

“(3.) Wherever in Schedule I of the regulations, as amended by this Order, a higher grade of salary is provided for any position of assistant teacher than the grade of salary provided before the coming into force of this Order, such higher grade of salary shall not be payable till the 1st of February, 1921, and shall not be payable to the teacher then employed in such position unless the Board decides that it is unnecessary to transfer such teacher to another position with a view of appointing a teacher more suitable for and having a better claim to the position.”

6. (1.) Subclauses (2) and (3) of clause 2 of the regulations are hereby amended (a) by substituting “February” for “April” and “January” for “March” wherever they occur; and (b) by deleting the proviso to sub-clause (3).

(2.) Schedule V of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

“(5.) Any uncertificated teacher other than a relieving teacher who, as a result of a classification according to efficiency made at such time and in such manner as the Minister may determine, is shown to possess special merit may be paid by way of addition to the salary payable under clause 1 of the regulations, as amended by this Order, an amount not exceeding £30 per annum.”

8. (1.) Schedule VI of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

(3.) Subclause (4) of clause 3 of the regulations is hereby revoked.

9. Clause 4 of the regulations is hereby revoked.

10. Clause 6 of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted:—

“6. An assistant added to the staff in accordance with clause 44 hereof shall, in the case of an assistant teacher of a special class, be paid a salary not exceeding Grade 3, and in the case of an assistant teacher of a model school a salary not exceeding Grade 4, together with such additions to salary as are otherwise provided under the regulations.”

11. Clause 7 of the regulations is hereby amended (a) by substituting in subclause (1) “£15” for “£12” ; (b) by inserting in subclause (2), after the words “shall be the average attendance,” the words “for the current quarter or” ; and (c) by deleting from subclause (2) the words “or the mean of the average attendance for the four quarters immediately preceding,” and also the proviso thereto.

12. Clause 12 of the regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso to subclause (1) thereof:—

“Provided that if a teacher is transferred to a position to which is attached a higher grade of salary under clause 1 of the regulations as amended by this Order, the total salary payable under clauses 1 and 2 of the regulations as amended by this Order shall in no case be lower than that received by him immediately prior to such transfer.”

13. Clause 13 of the regulations is hereby amended by adding the following provisos:—

“Provided that any teacher employed in a public school of Grade I, II, IIIA, or IIIB on 31st January, 1921, shall, if he remains in the same position, receive as from 1st February, 1921, a further increment of £10, unless such increment would make his salary higher than the maximum of the grade of salary for his position as specified in clause 1 of the regulations as amended by this Order:

“Provided further that the salary payable as from 1st February, 1921, to any teacher employed in a public school shall be made at least equal to the minimum of the grade of salary for the position as specified in clause 1 of the regulations as amended by this Order.”

14. Clause 15 of the regulations is hereby amended by deleting from the first proviso to subclause (1) the words “for a period of two years after such reduction or,” and also the words “whichever period is the longer.”

15. Clause 19 of the regulations is hereby revoked.

16. Clause 14 of these regulations shall operate from 1st November, 1920.

## III.—GRADING OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

17. Clause 20 of the regulations is hereby amended by deleting all the words after "clause 1 hereof."

18. Clause 22 of the regulations is hereby amended by substituting the words "twelve," "eleven," and "ten" for the words "thirteen," "twelve," and "eleven" respectively. This clause shall operate from 1st January, 1921.

19. Clause 28 of the regulations is hereby revoked.

## IV.—STAFFING OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

20. Clause 32 of the regulations is hereby amended by revoking subsection (2) thereof.

21. (1.) Table A to clause 33 of the regulations is amended by omitting all the words and figures after the line commencing "361-400," and adding the words "and so on, adding 40 for each subgrade above Subgrade VD."

(2.) Table C of clause 33 is amended by omitting all the words and figures after the line commencing "361-400," and adding "and so on, adding 40 for each subgrade above Subgrade VD."

22. Clause 38 of the regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "an assistant may," the words "with the approval of the Minister previously obtained."

23. Clause 41 of the regulations is hereby amended (a) by inserting, after the word "service," the words "as an adult teacher"; and (b) by inserting, after the word "appointed," the words "for a period not exceeding two years."

24. Clause 42 of the regulations is hereby revoked.

25. Clause 43 of the regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "not exceeding three months"; and by inserting, after the words "payable to the staff exceeds," the words "by more than the amount of the salary of an assistant of Grade 1."

26. Clause 44 of the regulations is hereby amended by omitting the word "backward"; and by inserting the word "special" after the words "if a," and the words "under section 56 of the Act" before the words "in connection with any public school."

27. Clause 47 of the regulations is hereby amended—(1) By inserting, after the words "at least," the words "two of the first four and"; (2) by adding the following proviso: "Provided that where the staffing of any such school is not at the date of this Order in accordance with this regulation as amended, the Board shall take the earliest opportunity by transfer or otherwise to bring the staff into conformity therewith."

28. Clause 48 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1) thereof, and substituting therefor the following:—

"(1.) The number of assistants employed in the infant department of any school, and the grades of salaries of such assistants (as provided by clause 1 and Schedule I hereof), shall be at least those set forth in the following Schedule VII:

"Provided that if the assistants who are receiving the grades of salaries named in this Schedule are not employed in the infant department at the date of this Order, the Board shall take the earliest opportunity, by transfer or otherwise, to bring the staff into conformity with the Schedule.

"Provided further that, if the circumstances warrant, one of the assistants thus allotted to the infant department, other than the infant mistress, may, with the approval of the Senior Inspector, be employed wholly or partly in any of the standard classes.

V.—TEMPORARY AND RELIEVING TEACHERS.

29. Clause 50 of the regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—

“ 50. The Board may from time to time appoint suitable persons as relieving teachers or temporary teachers; but, unless under exceptional circumstances, and with the approval of the Minister, no assistant teacher holding a permanent appointment in any school may be appointed as a relieving assistant teacher in the same school.”

30. Clause 52 of the regulations is hereby amended by revoking sub-clauses (1) and (2), and substituting :—

“(1.) Every teacher employed as a relieving teacher shall be classified by the Senior Inspector of Schools in one of the grades specified in clause 53 hereof.”

31. Clause 53 of the regulations is hereby amended :—

(a.) By omitting the table from subclause (1), and substituting—

(b.) By revoking subclause (2) thereof, and substituting—

“(2.) A relieving teacher who is first classified in any grade in accordance with clause 52 hereof shall be paid the minimum of the grade of salary, unless the Senior Inspector, with the approval of the Director, shall approve of a higher commencing salary within the grade.”

(c.) By the substitution in subclause (4) of “ £40 ” for “ £30.”

(d.) By the addition to subclause (4) thereof of the following proviso :—

“ Provided that no such payment shall be made where a residence is available and can reasonably be occupied.”

(e.) By the addition of the following subclause :—

“(6.) All relieving teachers employed previous to the 1st November, 1920, and classified in accordance with the regulations previously in force, shall receive as from that date a special increment to their previous salary of £20 per annum, and thereafter shall be deemed to be classified in the same grades under the regulations as amended by this Order.”

32. Clause 58 of the regulations is hereby amended by revoking all the words after “ during the period of absence,” and substituting “ be paid an allowance at the rate of £40 per annum, and a relieving teacher who does not receive this allowance and requires to travel more than four miles daily to school shall be paid actual and reasonable travelling expenses not exceeding £24 per annum.”

33. Clauses 29 to 32 hereof relating to relieving teachers shall come into force on the 1st November, 1920.

VI.—HOUSE ALLOWANCES.

34. Clause 48 of the regulations regarding house allowances made by Order in Council dated 17th December, 1918, as amended by Order in Council dated 8th June, 1920, is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor :—

“ 48. The house allowances payable to head teachers in accordance with section 81 of the Act shall be as follows :—

The regulations for Native schools made by the Order in Council dated 17th November, 1919, are hereby amended as follows:—

1. By revoking Schedule I, and substituting the following:—

“NOTE.—In addition to the salary payable above, there shall be added by way of salary the sum of £35 per annum in the case of every assistant teacher who is obliged to live away from home.”

2. By revoking the proviso to subclause (3) of clause 2, and substituting:—

“Provided that such addition to salary shall be calculated as if a certificated assistant in a Native school receiving a salary of £165-£175 were graded in Group 1, or an assistant receiving £175-£195 in Group 2.”

3. By deleting subclauses (4) and (5) of clause 2, and substituting:—

“(4.) Clause 3 of these regulations relating to the salaries of public-school teachers shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to assistant teachers holding positions in Native schools to which are attached salaries of £165-£175 or £175-£195. Every other assistant teacher shall receive as from 1st April, 1920, an increase in his salary of £20 per annum.”

## VIII.—TRAINING COLLEGES.

The regulations relating to training colleges in force at the coming into operation of this Order are hereby amended as follows:—

1. Clause 4 is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (b) (iv) of subclause (1) the words “a class of backward,” and by inserting in lieu thereof the words “a special class of.”

2. Clause 7 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

“7. (1.) In addition to the staff of the normal school the following shall be the staff of the training college:—

(a.) Principal of the training college, who shall have general control of the training college and of the normal school attached thereto, and who shall, with the concurrence of the University college, act as Professor or Lecturer on Education at the University College. Salary, £700 per annum, rising to £750 per annum by annual increments of £25.

(b.) A Vice-Principal of the training college, who shall assist the Principal in the control and management of the training college and act as Lecturer or Assistant Lecturer in subjects of the approved curriculum for students: Salary, £550 per annum, rising to £625 per annum by annual increments of £25.

(c.) One or more additional assistant lecturers as approved by the Minister. Salary, not exceeding in any case £450 per annum, rising to £500 per annum by annual increments of £10.

(d.) Tutor and Librarian. Salary, £380 per annum.

(2.) The following shall be the staff of the “main school” of the normal school:—

(i.) Headmaster, who shall act as supervisor of students practising in his school, and who shall, if required, act as lecturer on Method or some suitable subject or subjects of the curriculum of students. The headmaster shall receive a salary of £540 per annum, rising to £590 per annum by annual increments of £25, and a house allowance of £60 per annum: Provided that in these regulations the term “headmaster” shall be deemed to include the term “headmistress.”

- (ii.) First assistant, with a salary of £350-£390.
- (iii.) Kindergarten mistress, with a salary of £350-£390.
- (iv.) One assistant with a salary of £320-£340, two assistants with salaries of £290-£310, and one assistant with a salary of £260-£280.
- (v.) Such additional assistants at a salary of £220-£250 as are required to make up the total number of assistants to the number named in column (4) of Schedule II of clause 14 of the Regulations respecting Salaries of Teachers and Staffing of Schools, or to such greater number as the Minister may approve.
- (3.) The following additional assistants shall be appointed to such "model schools" as are approved by the Minister, namely:—
  - (i.) Sole teacher, with salary of £340-£380.
  - (ii.) Assistant mistress, with salary of £240-£270.
  - (iii.) In a secondary department with not more than thirty pupils in yearly average attendance, an assistant with a salary of £300-£320; or in a secondary department with more than thirty pupils in yearly average attendance, a first secondary assistant teacher with a salary of £350-£390, and a second assistant teacher with a salary of £260-£280.
  - (iv.) Assistant teacher, with salary of £260-£280.
  - (v.) Assistant teacher, with salary of £220-£250.

Provided that where circumstances render it advisable the staffing and salaries for a normal school as prescribed in this clause may with the approval of the Minister be temporarily modified.

(4.) All the members of the staff of the normal school shall be deemed to be also members of the staff of the training college, and shall take such part in the tuition, training, and supervision of the students as the Principal may direct; in general, it shall be the duty, *inter alia*, of the staff of the training college as thus defined to conduct the various courses of the curriculum as defined in clause 23 hereof.

(5.) Every associated normal teacher shall, in addition to the salary and allowances otherwise receivable by him, receive by way of salary under these regulations such sum not exceeding £50 per annum as the Minister shall approve.

(6.) A married assistant on the staff of a normal school shall be entitled to additional salary of £40 per annum in the same manner as if he were an assistant in a public school other than a normal school.

(7.) (a.) Any teacher, other than the Headmaster, on the staff of a normal school shall receive by way of addition to the salary hereinbefore provided such amount as he would be entitled to receive under clause 2 of the regulations relating to salaries of public-school teachers if he were a teacher on the staff of a public school other than a normal school: Provided that such addition to salary shall be calculated as if the teacher on the staff of a normal school receiving a salary stated in column (1) of the following Schedule were receiving the salary shown in column (2) of that Schedule opposite to his salary in column (1).

(b.) Any teacher, other than the Headmaster, on the staff of a normal school not entitled to an addition to his salary as provided in paragraph (a) of this subclause shall receive by way of addition to the salary otherwise payable under these regulations an amount not exceeding in any case £50 per annum, as may be approved by the Minister.

(9.) A teacher other than the Headmaster on the staff of a normal school receiving any salary stated in subclauses (2) and (3) hereof shall be entitled to an annual increment of £10 until he reaches the maximum salary provided for his position.

(10.) The provisions of clauses 12 and 13 of the regulations relating to salaries of public-school teachers shall apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to teachers on the staffs of normal schools."

3. Clause 8 is hereby amended by substituting in subclause (2) the figures "£500" for "£350" wherever they occur, and "£300" for "£125."

4. Clause 11 is hereby amended by substituting in subclause (2) the figures "£100" for "£85," and "£30" for "£25"; and by the addition of the following words "provided that there shall be a further addition of £5 to the allowance payable to male students."

5. Clause 12 is hereby amended by substituting in subclause (2) the figures "£80" for "£65," and "£30" for "£25"; and by the addition of the following words "provided that there shall be a further addition of £5 to the allowance payable to male students."

6. Clause 16 of the regulations is hereby amended by substituting in paragraph (a) the word "eight" for the word "six," and by substituting in paragraph (b) the word "six" for the word "four."

7. Clause 19 is hereby amended by inserting the figures "£250" for "£150."

8. (1.) Subclause (1) of clause 33 is hereby amended by inserting, after the word "appointed," the words "for a period not exceeding two years"; and by substituting the figures "£170-£200" for "£140-£170."

(2.) Subclause (2) of clause 33 is hereby amended by substituting the figures "£160" for "£140."

(3.) Subclause (3) of clause 33 is hereby amended by omitting the words "if he is appointed," and substituting therefor the words "on his first permanent appointment."

#### IX.—PUPIL-TEACHERS AND PROBATIONERS.

The regulations made by Order in Council dated 17th December, 1918, relating to pupil-teachers and probationers, as amended by subsequent Orders in Council, are hereby further amended as follows:—

1. Clause 1 is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (2) the words "to the nearest convenient school," and substituting "as far as possible to the school nearest his place of residence."

2. Clause 2 is hereby amended by substituting the figures "450" for "500," and the word "four" for the word "three."

3. Clause 3 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3).

4. Clause 5 is hereby amended (a) by revoking subclause (1), and substituting therefor the following:—

"(1.) Subject to any modification hereinafter made, the term of service of a probationer or pupil-teacher shall be two years, and during the first year he shall rank in the second grade and during the second year in the first grade."

(b.) By revoking subclauses (3) and (4).

(c.) By omitting from subclause (5) all the words after "exceed," and by substituting therefor the words "three years."

5. Clause 6 is hereby amended by the addition of the words "provided that as from the 1st April, 1920, pupil-teachers who were in the third year of their service before the coming into force of this Order in Council shall be deemed to be pupil-teachers of the first grade."

6. Clause 8 is hereby amended (a) by revoking subclauses (1) and (2), and substituting therefor

"(1.) The allowances payable to probationers and pupil-teachers shall be as follows: For the first year £90 per annum, for the second or third year £95 per annum, with an addition of £5 per annum in the case of a male pupil-teacher or probationer."

(b.) By substituting in subclause (3) the figures "£30" for "£25."

7. Clause 15 is hereby amended by substituting the words "four hours" for "three hours."

#### X.—ORGANIZING TEACHERS.

The regulations relating to organizing teachers made by Order in Council dated 29th April, 1919, as amended by Order in Council dated 17th November, 1919, are hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

1. The powers and duties of an organizing teacher shall be as follows:—

(a.) To assist the head or sole teacher of the schools placed under his supervision with regard to organization, schemes of work, methods of teaching, and other matters affecting the efficiency of the school. Also to advise and direct uncertificated teachers with regard to their courses of study.

(b.) To visit regularly each of the schools under his supervision, and to illustrate by actual teaching the matters concerning which he has advised the head or sole teacher.

(c.) To take charge as occasion arises of the whole of the school work in any school under his supervision for a longer or shorter period, not exceeding one week at any one time; and to this end he shall, for such period, be deemed to possess all the powers of the head or sole teacher of the school.

- (d.) With the approval of the Education Board and the Senior Inspector of the district, to call together at convenient times and places any or all of the teachers in the schools under his supervision, and to discuss with them in conference matters relating to the efficiency of their schools.
2. With regard to the general policy and method of directing the work of the teachers in the schools under his supervision, the organizing teacher shall in all cases first obtain the approval of the Education Board and the Senior Inspector of Schools, or of an Inspector selected by the Senior Inspector of Schools, and shall in all respects, so far as circumstances permit, conform in his practice to the policy and method so approved by the Education Board and the Inspector.
3. The organizing teacher shall have a general responsibility for the system of organization, teaching, and control adopted in the schools under his supervision, but the head or sole teacher in each case shall be responsible for the execution of the plan outlined or demonstrated for his guidance and for the efficiency of its application.
4. In December of each year the Senior Inspector shall prepare and submit for the approval of the Education Board and the Director a list of the schools it is proposed to place in charge of each organizing teacher during the ensuing year, provided that in general no such teacher shall have charge of more than fifteen schools.
5. The list of schools allotted to any organizing teacher may, as occasion arises, be altered by the exclusion of schools that have reached a reasonable standard of efficiency and by the inclusion of other schools; provided that all such changes shall first receive the approval of the Education Board and the Director of Education.
6. The Senior Inspector may, with like approval, withdraw any organizing teacher for short periods from his group of schools, and detail him for special duty relating to the methods of teaching or organization in any other school; but no organizing teacher shall, without the permission of the Director, be employed to inspect or examine a school.
7. Organizing teachers shall furnish on diary forms provided for the purpose whatever information may from time to time be required regarding their daily engagements. These diaries shall be submitted each month to the Education Board and to the Senior Inspector, and shall thereafter be forwarded to the Department with claims for the travelling-expenses and travelling-allowances.
8. (1.) An organizing teacher shall receive actual and necessary transit expenses incurred in connexion with the execution of his duty, and shall in addition receive the following allowances:—
- (a.) 13s. per day travelling-allowance for each day of twenty-four hours, and one twenty-fourth of this amount for each additional hour, during which he is absent from his headquarters. In computing the time of absence a fraction of an hour less than half an hour shall not be taken into account, but half an hour or more shall be reckoned as one hour. When an organizing teacher leaves and returns to headquarters the same day, actual and reasonable expenses only shall be paid.
  - (b.) 7s. 6d. per day, horse allowance, for the use of his own horse, and, in addition, actual cost of fodder when the horse is in use away from headquarters.
  - (c.) 3s. 6d. per day, bicycle allowance, together with the actual cost of carriage of the bicycle by train or other necessary means of transport.
  - (d.) 3d. per mile, motor-bicycle allowance, or 10d. per mile motor-car allowance, for the use of his own vehicle.
- (2.) An organizing teacher may return to his headquarters each evening, provided that his claim for expenses is not thereby increased and, in the opinion of the Senior Inspector, the efficiency of his work is not interfered with.
- (3.) The approval of the Director of Education must first be secured before an organizing teacher is authorized to claim any of the allowances specified in paragraphs (b), (c), or (d) above, and payment shall be made only in cases where a public conveyance is not available or is available only at greater cost, or where it is proved to the satisfaction of the Director that other means of transit would be inconvenient and detrimental to the service.
9. Any Education Board desirous of appointing an organizing teacher shall forward to the Department a statement showing the schools which it is proposed that such teacher should supervise.
10. On the receipt of approval by the Minister of the proposal so made the Board shall, by public advertisement, invite applications for the vacant

position, and, after consideration thereof and consultation with the Senior Inspector, shall forward to the Minister a statement showing the names and qualifications of all the applicants, and shall at the same time indicate the applicant whom the Board proposes to appoint to the position, subject to the Minister's approval.

11. An organizing teacher shall, as from 1st April, 1920, receive a salary of £340 to £380 per annum, together with a house allowance of £60 per annum and the addition to salary payable in accordance with clause 2 of the regulations for the salaries of public-school teachers as for a teacher graded in Group 5 under the regulations for the grading of teachers.

12. Clauses 11, 12, and 13 of the regulations regarding salaries of public-school teachers shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to the salaries of organizing teachers.

13. Clauses 1 to 10 inclusive of this part shall come into operation on the 1st November, 1920.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Seaford Coal Company (Limited), (hereinafter called "the company"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore at Puponga, in Golden Bay, in the Provincial District of Nelson, in order to maintain a wharf thereon :

And whereas, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, plans, marked M.D. 2603 (two sheets), have been deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it was proposed to construct the wharf :

And whereas the Governor-General in Council has approved of the purpose for which the said foreshore is to be occupied :

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the company under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark as shown on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf thereon; such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister having charge of the Marine Department, as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908; and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the maintenance of the wharf at Puponga, as shown on plans marked M.D. 2603.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £5, and thereafter an annual sum of £1, payable on the 1st day of March, dating from the 1st day of March, 1917, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty,

shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company, and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for seven years from the 1st day of March, 1917, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days; or
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause three of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section thirty-nine of the Harbours Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that in the case of lands between high- and low-water marks which belong to the Crown, and on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for purposes of navigation, the Governor-General in Council may grant occupation licenses for periods not exceeding twenty-one years, at such rent and on such conditions as he thinks fit, and any such lease may contain a provision authorizing the lessee to reclaim the land the subject of the lease without complying with the requirements of section forty-one of the said Act :

And whereas it is desirable to license Harry Pearson (hereinafter called "the licensee") to occupy a part of the land between high- and low-water marks, belonging to the Crown,

in Omanaia River, Hokianga Harbour, on which at high-water spring tides the depth of water is not sufficient for the purposes of navigation :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby license the licensee to occupy the piece of land between high- and low-water marks of spring tides in the Omanaia River, Hokianga Harbour, containing forty-seven acres, more or less, as shown edged red on plan marked M.D. 5209, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington; and doth also authorize the licensee to reclaim the land, subject to the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The licensee shall pay to the Marine Department a rental in advance each year of 1s. per acre per annum for the first ten years, and 11s. per acre per annum for the last eleven years, of the period of twenty-one years during which this license is in force, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

2. The licensee shall keep any stopbanks which he may construct for the purpose of reclaiming the land included in this license in good order and condition, and shall provide and maintain all necessary outlets for storm-water.

3. The licensee shall keep the land included in this license free from noxious weeds.

4. The licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any right, power, or privilege granted by this license without the previous written consent of the Minister of Marine.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for twenty-one years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, or privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

6. If the licensee commits or suffers a breach of any of the conditions of this license, the license may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council; and publication of a notice of such revocation in the *New Zealand Gazette* shall be sufficient notice thereof to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested in this license, that it has been revoked and determined.

WHEREAS the North Auckland Main Trunk Railway (Kawakawa-Hokianga) has been authorized by the Railways Authorization Act, 1911, to a point near Horeke,



and it is desirable to ascertain the best route for such railway from a point near Te Tio northwards:

And whereas it is also desirable to ascertain the best route for connecting the existing Kaihu Valley Railway with the North Auckland Main Trunk Railway as authorized by various Railways Authorization Acts:

Now, therefore, know ye that I, John Rushworth, Viscount Jellicoe, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, reposing trust and confidence in your knowledge, integrity, and ability, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, constitute and appoint you the said WILLIAM FERGUSON, JOHN BIRD HINE, and JAMES BEGG to be a Commission for the purpose of making inquiry into the matters following, that is to say:—

(1.) To inquire into and ascertain the best route along which the North Auckland Main Trunk Railway from Te Tio northwards should be constructed in the interests of the community as a whole, giving due consideration to the development of settlement, engineering questions, and the volume and direction of traffic.

(2.) To inquire into and to ascertain the best route along which a railway connecting the Kaihu Valley Railway with the North Auckland Main Trunk Railway should be constructed in the interests of settlement, and giving due consideration to engineering questions and the volume and direction of traffic.

(3.) To inquire into and to ascertain with what port or ports the North Auckland Main Trunk Railway northwards of Te Tio should be connected, and the extent to which such railway should now be constructed in the interests of settlement.

(4.) And, generally, to make inquiry into any matter or thing which arises out of or is connected with the subjects of inquiry hereinbefore mentioned, or which in your opinion may be of assistance in fully ascertaining, explaining, and arriving at a fair and just conclusion in respect of the subjects of inquiry.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do hereby appoint you the said WILLIAM FERGUSON to be Chairman of the said Commission.

And for the better enabling you to carry these presents into effect you are hereby empowered and authorized to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents, and at such place or places in the said Dominion as you may deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and to call before you and examine on oath, or otherwise as may be allowed by law, such person or persons as you may think capable of affording you any information in the premises; and you are also hereby empowered to call for and examine all such books, documents, papers, maps, plans, accounts, or records as you shall judge likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject of this Commission, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever. And, using all diligence, you are required to report to me under your hands and seals your opinion resulting from the said inquiry in respect of the several matters and things inquired into by you, or by virtue of these presents, not later than the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, with power to certify unto me from time to time your several proceedings in respect of any of the matters aforesaid, if it may seem expedient for you to do so.

And it is hereby declared that these presents shall continue in full force and virtue although the inquiry is not regularly continued from time to time or from place to place by adjournments.

And it is hereby declared that these presents are issued under and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1908.
